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MINUTES OF 1985 PARISH ASSEMBLY

The annual Parish Assembly of the Armenian Church of Our Saviour convened January 27, 1985 immediately following the Divine Liturgy. The meeting was called to order at 11:00 AM with Rev. Fr. Aved Terzian presiding and chaired by hold-over Chairman Francis Najarian.

Following prayer by Der Aved, the Chairman asked the Nominating Committee for presentation of a slate of candidates to officiate at the current assembly. Seth Bilazarian responded with the following:

Candidates for Chairman: Francis Najarian Gilbert Markarian

The Nominating Committee did not offer candidates for position of secretary and therefore called for nominations from the floor.

For Secretary: Bartev Bagdasarian was nominated. There being no others, a motion was made and seconded to close the nominations. Vote was affirmative.

The Assembly then proceeded to vote by secret ballot for the Office of Chairman only, since Bartev Bagdasarian was duly declared elected by virtue of being the only candidate on the ballot. Results of the vote for Chairman confirmed that Gilbert Markarian was elected Chairman, whereupon the two persons took up their office.

Mr. Markarian, thanked the outgoing Chairman Francis Najarian for a job welldone, then commented upon the necessity of new and younger members of the Parish becoming involved in holding office so as to gain experience in church related matters and perpetuation of this heritage, our Church.

It was agreed that at 11:20 PM we would recess for the purpose of sealing the Ballot Box and to give time for the qualified members present, to vote on Parish Officers for the ensuing year. Accordingly, the Nominating Committee presented the following:

Elizabeth Naroian Second session was called to order at 12:35 PM following voting period and lunch which was prepared by Mrs. Elizabeth Kazarian and her committee. Thanks were expressed to all of them.

The Nominating Committee was asked to adjourn with the Ballot Box which was unsealed by Fr. Terzian premitting them to proceed with tabulation of the vote.

The Agenda for this Assembly which had been prepared in advance was approved and accepted. See Exhibit A. The Chair called for items of new business under number 10 of the Agenda which will now be recorded and discussed at the proper interval. Five items of new business were offered and approved by majority vote for inclusion and they are as follows:

Number One: By Abraham Sivazlian

It was proposed that the Parish Council immediately persue the engaging of a qualified individual to assist the Pastor in the areas of Christian Education Programs for all levels such as adult and youth activities, programs and special projects at the discretion of the Pastor and the Parish Council.

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Number Two: By Arthur Elloian

It is proposed that the Parish Council consider means of improving acoustics in the Cultural Center.

Number Three: By John Toromanian

That consideration be given to a Centennial Observance and reported at the next Assembly by the Parish Council or a committee appointed by them.

Number Four: By Berjoohie Zakarian

That consideration be given to convening the Annual Assembly at a date in February in order that there be time to assemble reports, publish them and forward to parishioners prior to the meeting.

Number Five: By Mark Markarian

That the Parish Council study the feasibility of providing easier access to the Church proper and the lower hall for elderly and incapacitated persons desiring to use the facilities.

At this point, in order to insure a quorom being present, a physical count determined that 140 persons were in attendance, with 10 additional persons involved in tabulating votes outside of the meeting for a total of 150.

A motion was made, seconded and voted affirmatively that:

Reading of the individual reports of the Pastor, Parish Council and various organizations of the Church be dispensed with but that each will be considered page by page and questions regarding them or information required by Parish members will be answered by the parties involed with the report.

The 1984 published Annual Reports are made a part of these minutes. Accordingly, the Chair called for questions on the minutes of the previous meeting and there being none were declared approved and accepted.

The Pastor's Report was considered, approved and accepted with thanks by the Assembly.

Consideration was next directed by the Chair to the Parish Council Report. A question was raised by Mr. Arthur Yagjian, member of the Parish Council, that there was not unanimity in Council deliberations regarding rehabilitation of the Parish House. He indicated that an excellent committee report had been prepared by Messrs, Alexanian, Stepanian and Migridichian on the project and suggested that this report be made available to the members present. Accordingly, Mr. Alexanian was asked to inform the members about their study of the matter. Mr. Alexanian presented a statistical and financial picture of repairs which in the opinion of the committee were immediately necessary to repair the building. Under consideration were the roof, siding and window replacement. They had inquired of several contractors about costs for these items and a composite analysis of these figures are presented in Exhibit B of these minutes. The Committee did not attempt to make a conclusion since their charge had been to only study the rehab question and present their report. This has been done and the Council in the process of implementing those findings. After some discussion, the Chair ruled that the matter seemed to be a difference of opinion among the Parish Council members and as such was not a proper matter for the Assembly. There being no objections, the matter was dropped.

It was suggested that a solution to one of the concerns of the Council re: Married Couples and Young Peoples Groups, could be a supplemental committee to assist the Pastor in carrying out this assignment.

It was recommended that the "Outreach Fund" should appear with the name of Mary Manoogian as donor.

An explanation was given by Leon Kachadorian that the loss figure shown in Schedule H for the Picnic activity was offset by inventory of assets from that affair which have been used to advantage at other Church functions.

Several questions on the financial aspects of the Parish Council report were raised and answered by the Treasurer with satisfaction to the members. There being no other inquiries, the Parish Council report was approved and accepted by majority vote of those present.

The Auditing Committee report was accepted and typographical errors were noted in their names which had been published incorrectly. They should have read as follows: Henry Shooshan, Tina Bilazarian, Ruth Kaprelian and Norman Noorjanian.

Upon consideration and discussion the following list of reports from various organizations were approved and accepted with thanks by majority vote of the members present:

The Chair then opened discussion on the proposed Operating Budget of the Parish for the year 1985.

Mr. Harry Sogigian proposed that the budget be amended to show an increase of \$10,000.00 in pledges in order to fund a position or expenses that may be incurred to advance "Christian Education for Adult & Youth". Under this heading there is also to be added a line item under Disbursement in the Proposed Budget in the amount of \$10,000.00.

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After some discussion, it was voted to amend the proposed budget by increasing PLEDGES by \$10,000.00 and adding an item under DISBURSEMENTS of "CHRISTIAN EDUCATION FOR ADULT AND YOUTH" of \$10,000.00.

The amended budget in the total amount of \$204,000 was approved by majority vote of the assembly.

Chairman Gilbert Markarian then proposed that the items of New Business which had been offered earlier would now be taken up individually for consideration.

New Business Reference No. One:

A motion was made and seconded that a qualified person be engaged to assist the Pastor in carrying out the intentions of the proposalto provide "Christian Education for Adult and Youth". Vote was affirmative.

New Business Reference No. Two:

A motion was made and seconded that the Parish Council undertake the study to implement means of improving acoustics in the Cultural Center.

Vote was affirmative.

New Business Reference No. Three:

A motion was made and seconded that the Parish Council consider a Centennial Year Celebration which may include:

- A. An invitation thru proper channels to His Holiness Vasken I Catholicos of All Armenians to attend the Centennial Year Celebrations of this Parish.
- B. An invitation to the Diocesan Assembly to convene in Worcester in 1990 in observance of our Centennial Year.
- C. The erection of a monument on land between the Church and Parish House dedicated to the Martyrs.
- D. The erection of an appropriate marker at a downtown location commemorating the spot where the first Badarak was held in America.
- E. To direct the Parish Council to create a committee to start work on the observance of our Centennial Year and to incorporate the existing committee of Harry Sogigian and Torkom Boyajian who are accumulating historical data for observance.

Vote was unanimously affirmative.

New Business Reference No. Four:

A motion was made and seconded that the next Annual Assembly be held in the middle or late February and to direct the Parish Council to prepare and release the Annual Reports at least two weeks before the Assembly so that the parishioners may be better prepared to discuss matters at the Assembly.

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Vote was affirmative.

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New Business Reference No. Five:

A motion was made and seconded that a feasibility study be made to determine a means of reaching the Church level and the Cultural Hall level without excessive steps to aid the elderly and the handicapped.

Vote was affirmative.

During and interim period waiting for the results of the election some comments were recorded as follows:

Mrs. Bulbulian suggested that the Parish Council make an effort to re-open the Armenian Language School. Citing the need for preserving language and that even though there may be a small enrollment it would be worthwhile.

It was suggested that the Diocesan Delegates be instructed to bid for the Diocesan Assembly in the Centennial Year.

Mr. Van Aroian suggested that the working committee of two people now working on a history of the Worcester Parish be implemented with additional personnel as the task is considered most important and should have more active participation.

Mr. Steve Krikorian, Church School Co-ordinator indicated that attendance this year showed an upward trend with an enrollment of 74 children of whom approximately 75% were in school each week. He mentioned that there was a continuing need for support by parents or anyone who might be of assistance to operate more efficiently.

Miss Tara Stepanian, Church School Co-ordinator also, spoke on behalf of the Sunday School mentioning particularly the need for teachers and assistants.

Louis Mikitarian briefed the Assembly on plans of the ACYOA for the Sports Weekend coming up in September this year and it having Worcester as host again, the first in thirty-three years. It was indicated that the Marriott Hotel would be headquarters, a gala dance is planned for Mechanics Hall and that the South High athletic facilities would be the location for the games. A request was made for Parish and community support to make this a successful affair.

The Chair now received the tabulated report of the Nominating Committee Chairman Seth Bilazarian as follows:

THE 83rd ANNUAL DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY REPORT

The 83rd Annual Diocesan Assembly convened Thursday, May 2, 1985, at the Holy Martyrs Armenian Church, Bayside, Long Island.

Invocation was given by the Primate to start the meeting. Elections of Assembly officers were held. The minutes of the 82nd Assembly were approved with corrections.

During elections of various committees, Mr. Zarvin Kasparian was re-elected to the Diocesan Council and Mr. Seth Bilazarian won election to the Proposals Committee. ACEF reported that their total funds was \$3,293,560 and \$558,000 was given to the Diocese and \$360,000 was disbursed to churches and community charities.

The 1986 Diocesan Assembly will convene in Racine, Wisconsin, and Worcester was awarded the 1990 Annual Assembly to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the first parish in the United States.

The "High Rise Project" was discussed. This is a project which involves the construction of a "multistory" on the grounds of the cathedral property. The intent of this project is to provide a guaranteed annual income to the diocese. Further study will be made and brought back to the assembly.

The total projected annual budget for the year 1986 is \$1.9 million.

A letter was sent to the President of Turkey requesting the release from the Turkish prison of the Armenian clergyman known as the Very Rev. Father Manuel Yergatian.

A letter was also sent to President Ronald Reagan expressing the dismay and outrage regarding the reversal of his position concerning the plight of our people during the years of the massacres.

PRIMATE'S VISITATIONS

His Eminence visited our parish in August of this year for the ACYOA Assembly and Sports Weekend. The Primate presided over the meetings, each of the banquets and attended as many sports functions as time allowed.

On Sunday, September 1st, the Primate celebrated Badarak in our Church, and on that day ordained four young boys to the rank of acolyte.

His Eminence visited the homes of several elderly parishioners while in Worcester for which they were each very grateful.

We are always thankful to our beloved Primate for the fatherly love and concern he continues to show us. We pray always for the Holy Spirit to grant him good health and peace so that he may continue to guide us, his faithful flock.

VISITATIONS

As part of our ministry, I have made regular weekly visitations to all Worcester area hospitals. I have visited the parishioners in all eight of the area nursing homes during the Christmas and Easter seasons to offer them Holy Communion. On many occasions, I have been accompanied by Frances Elloian whose company I always welcome on these visitations. Mrs. Elloian also takes my regards to the nursing homes' inhabitants when she visits them on occasions that I cannot join her.

I have also visited both area cemeteries to bless graves of departed loved ones at the request of the bereaved families.

In addition, I shared joyous evenings in the homes of many of our parishioners.

COUNSELING

On various occasions, I offered counseling and assistance to individuals and families who were facing difficulties. We have also provided pre-nuptial and marital counseling, counseling of bereaved families, pre-baptismal counseling of the godfather, and counseling of the sick, the needy and elderly. We pray that the Holy Spirit grant them all comfort and peace.

PUBLICATIONS

Our Church monthly publication "The Messenger" is mailed to all members of our parish. Our sincere thanks and congratulations to Harold Gregory and his staff who work diligently on the quality of the material entered into each issue. The dedication of their time and talent is evidenced by the fact that the publication has become an informative and enjoyable collection of articles.

The Sunday Bulletins are prepared in our office and distributed each Sunday to our congregation, informing them of the day's requiem services, Bible readings and coming events. This year we included the English translation of the day's Gospel reading. Special fliers and announcements for various occasions are also sent to our parishioners to inform them of parish activities. These are prepared by our Church Secretary Norma Hohne, and formerly by Penny Kasper and Beth Bilbilian.

ECUMENICAL RELATIONS

Our relations with all non-Armenian Churches throughout the Worcester area, are mainly through the Ecumenical Council of Churches in which we continue our membership.

EDUCATION

In fulfillment of two of our 1985 goals, we have re-established Armenian language classes for children and adults of our parish.

The Saturday Armenian Language Classes begin at 10:00 a.m. taught by Ani Donikian, Anahid Bogosian and Herman Purut assisted by myself and Mary Kalashian – as substitute teachers. As we feared, the enrollment is but a few ambitious students, but we pray that more parents will encourage their children to learn our beautiful language through this effort.

Adult Armenian Language and Culture Classes are held on Thursday evenings from 7:00 to 9:00. There are beginners, intermediate and advanced classes taught by: Herman Purut, Arpi Aprahamian and myself respectively. Again, enrollment could be better, but we are happy that we have these eager students and hope there will be more next year.

Our Armenian language is a beautiful one indeed and should not be lost. We pray that our parishioners teach, speak and learn it.

ACOLYTES TRAINING

We have successfully established a training program for Acolytes and with the assistance of Steve Migridichian our efforts have culminated in the ordination of four young boys as acolytes this year.

LENTEN PROGRAMS

During the Lenten Season, we enjoyed very good attendance at special educational lectures which were held following a Lenten meal on Wednesday evenings after Church Services. The guest speakers were well versed in their respective fields and held the interest of all. The average attendance of each dinner was 100 people. It was encouraging to see an increase over last year's attendance and pray that it will continue.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Under the continued direction of Tara Stepanian and Steve Krikorian, the Sunday School has increased its enrollment this year, especially in the very young grades. Their dedication, along with the invaluable support of the Sunday School teachers, continued to provide spiritual nourishment and enlighten our children in their faith. We thank those representatives of the Sunday School for their participation in the regional and and educational programs to increase their knowledge which they will use to guide our children's paths. May God grant them all strength, knowledge and patience.

YOUTH GROUPS

Unfortunately, due to lack of interest and organization, the ACYOA Juniors of our parish have dispersed. It is our plan to assist those interested in reorganization of this group and revitalize it next year.

As a result of this need for guidance, concerned individuals under the direction of Tara Stepanian have undertaken an especially difficult project to heighten awareness in youth ministry. It is our plan to continue to support programs to activate the youth and keep them together.

70TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ARMENIAN MARTYRS

Many of our parishioners joined the New England Region Churches in worship at Holy Trinity Armenian Church in Cambridge on the evening of April 23rd to pray and respect our Armenian Martyrs. The then Archbishop Law of Boston was a guest speaker at the service.

Also, in remembrance of our martyred forefathers, our youth planted a tree, which was blessed by His Eminence the Primate in September.

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This year's Holy Thursday Washing of the Feet Service participants were men who survived the massacres.

A Special Divine Liturgy was offered on April 24th for the souls of the departed massacre victims.

CLARK UNIVERSITY

I made myself available to the Armenian students and the Dean of Clark University for counseling. In informal and formal discussions I offer my advice and spiritual guidance. They are presently reorganizing an Armenian Club.

OTHER

Our Church Organizations and Special Committees are the backbones of the Church. Their success and stability are vital to our Church's future. I take a personal interest in each organization and meet with their chairpersons and attend general meetings regularly. We pray that each organization remains strong in numbers and spirit.

We thank also those who worked on the annual events of the Parish, the Bazaar, the Picnic and the New Year's Eve Dinner. Their tireless efforts are rewarded by the success of each event.

Another very successful event which was first this year was the Rug Sale. We sincerely appreciate the hard work and concern of Margaret Zakarian who planned and undertook the entire project. We thank her and her energetic committee for their labor and for showing us that we are capable of accomplishing great things if we all work together for the betterment of the Church.

The first was to continue the sales of Worcester Memories, a book about the early immigrant family life in our city. Our second program for the year was to encourage our parishioners to establish a growing personal library in every Armenian home. These projects create an opportunity for our English speaking American-born youth to learn of their roots and traditions. Both programs are essential for our Church to keep on growing and prospering.

WORCESTER MEMORIES

This project was jointly undertaken by the Library Committee and the Cultural Organization of our Church. Since 1985 was the second year of selling this book, our sales compared to the first year were much less. We are confident that the remaining books will be sold in the future with the cooperation and efforts of both groups. The amount realized from the sales will be used for cultural and educational programs for our people.

MINI BOOK SALES

The concept of this project was first set forth by our Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, in his annual report delivered to the Diocesan Assembly in May 1984. Speaking of the challenges the Armenian Church and its people face in the United States, he suggested that a growing personal library be established in every Armenian home for our youth to read and become more knowledgeable of their heritage.

The Library Committee felt it could do something useful about our Primate's suggestion. We planned two mini book sales which were held on October 20 and December 1. At both of these occasions our parishioners responded with enthusiasm and showed interest to learn more about their past history and their roots. We will continue to have book sales from time to time and look forward for the support of our people.

We gratefully acknowledge the members of our Cultural Organization who helped us at our mini book sale affairs.
