WESTCHESTER A.C.Y.O.A. SENIORS Annual Report-1978 February 11,1979

General - The A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors enjoyed a fairly prosperous year. Membership has remained stable (approx. 32 dues paid) although we've experienced a marked turnover with many of our old "regulars" drifting away and being replaced by new faces.

Financially, we've been operating in the black despite some unavoidable financial losses (theft of unsold team shirts - \$80, unsold theater tickets - \$150, forced cancellation of Anniversary Ball - \$400 estimated minimum profit, and poor turnout because of snowstorm at our March retreat - Approx. \$250). Administratively, the A.C.Y.O.A. has had some serious difficulties, operating with as few as three executive board members at a given time (six members are required). This was largely a result of unexpected resignations and it caused a distinct loss of effectiveness. Fortunately, we now have five dedicated members and this has resulted in a visible improvement in the group's activities under the presidency of our Pastor. They are - Steve Sirabian, Chairman; Roz Hewsenian, Vice-Chairperson (recently resigned); Dian Dorian, Rec. Secty; Laura Boghosian, Corr. Secty; Seta Tavitian, Treasurer; Harry Tavitian, Activities Director.

The A.C.Y.O.A. operates on five levels: religious, social, athletic, cultural and service. Two new policies have been adapted by the A.C.Y.O.A. National Assembly held on Labor Day weekend. The first directive is aimed at deeper involvement with Church matters and Parish Council. The latter attempts to strengthen the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors by inviting the older juniors to certain senior functions. We have already implemented both of these policies.

- November -Slide presentation by Fr. Arshen Aivazian on Armenia; theatre trip to "Dracula"; attended Holy Martyr's A.C.Y.O.A. dance.
- December Program at Armenian Home for the Aged in Queens conducted by our Der Hayr; Christmas party at the home of Ohan and Anna Bas.
