

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

FEBRUARY 6, 1983

The Annual Meeting of the Parish of the Holy Cross Armenian Church of Union City was called to order following church services on Sunday, February 6, 1983 by the Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr. John Hovsepian. A motion was made and seconded that Mr. Philip Arpiarian and Mrs. Arpens Sbarbaro serve as Chairman and Recording Secretary of the Parish Assembly respectively. Motion was carried. Mr. Hovsepian then opened the floor for nominations to be added to the slate for the election of Parish Council, Nominating and Auditing Committees. Since there were no nominations made, a mation was made and seconded that nominations be closed. Motion was carried. The meeting was adjourned for lunch.

The meeting was reconvened at 1:30 PM at the Church Center by Mr. Philip Arpiarian, Chairman. Motion was made by Virginia Shenllogian that the balloting be closed at this time. Motion was seconded and carried.

Our Pastor and President, Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian said a few words before discussion on the agenda. Father Carnig commented that it should be the duty and obligation of all our parishioners to attend the meetings and become active participants in the parish. Even though things are sound financially, our faithful should not shirk their responsibility to actively work in the parish. We should especially try to encourage the newcomers and make them feel a part of parish life. He closed his remarks by thanking all those who are actively contributing in the parish at this time.

Thomas Dabakian made a motion to approve the Minutes of last year's meeting. Motion was seconded and carried.

The Parish Council's report was reviews by John Hovsepian. Mr. Armen Kalbian pointed out that on the Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements Page 12, the figure under 1982 Rug Sale should be \$37,030.00.

Mr. Ludwig Shahbazian commented that the Permanent Trust Fund shows an appreciable increase from last year.

Mr. Philip Arpiarian commended all the Parish organizations for their help and support of our parish during the past year.

The Auditing Committee was asked to give comments on the treasurer's books of the organizations. Claire Hovsepian, Chairman of the Committee, noted that all the books had been checked and found to be in good order. It was noted however that the Senior Citizens did not submit a summary of their receipts and disbrusements for the year and that they be asked to do so next year. Armen Kalbian prepared their statement for thus year. It was suggested that a form be drawn up as a guideline for all our parish treasurers.

OLD BUSINESS

1. The matter of the repair of the chimes was brought to the floor. The

difficulty is that the company is in Philadelphia. They came once, and they will be reminded to return in the near future.

- 2. The date of the Annual Parish Meeting could not be changed. It seems that the Diocese needs the time between the parish meetings and the Diocesan Assembly to prepare its reports to that body.
- 3. Mr. Arpiarian commended the Women's Guild for their \$10,000.00 donation to the Parish.
- 4. ACYOA Seniors Richard Bohajian informed the meeting that a joint group had been formed with the St. Leon's, St. Mary's and St. Thomas' Seniors. They have held some successful affairs and hope to increase their membership in the forthcoming year. We have no active ACYOA Junior group. If we see the desire for one to be formed, we will take the necessary steps.

NEW BUSINESS

- Parishioners who have not already don so were urged to make their donations to the St. Nersess Seminary drive. Mr. Harold Azmelian is the chairman for our parish and letters have been sent to all parishioners. There is a very real crisis in the shortage of clergy in our country.
- 2. Armen Kalbian commented on the proposed budget and how the figures were reached. Two large improvement expenses are the brick facing of the center and the frames around the stained glass windows of our church.

Mathilde Kalbian made a motion that the proposed budget be accepted. The motion was seconded and carried.

CHURCH PICNIC: A beautiful day in June and an opportunity to spend an enjoyable day in the company of family, friends and fellow parishioners made our annual picnic a truly special occasion. Many thanks to Bob Borgersen, Zaven Hovsepian and PARISH ANNUAL REPORT (cont.)

the members of their committee for making this year's picnic one of the most financially successful ever.

ANNUAL BAZAAR: Co-Chairmen Charles Shenloogian, Haig Najarian and their committee did a fine job organizing and running the bazaar. Once again, members of the Women's Guild did an outstanding job in preparing various types of Armenian food --always one of the highlights of the bazaar. The merchandising booths, a rug sale and several raffles added to the festive atmosphere. As always, members of all of our church organizations volunteered their services in support of the event.

PARISH CHRISTMAS PARTY: Our annual Christmas party --- an event started in 1982 was continued this year on December 2. Approximately 250 members of the parish attended an extraordinary party organized by co-chairpersons John and Vivian Hovsepian. A buffet dinner was prepared by the women: wine, beer and soft drinks were available, as well as, a band for dancing and entertainment. In view of its popularity and the good will and camaraderie generated by this affair, it looks as if this will be an annual tradition for many years to come.

"GOLD RUSH" RAFFLE: A successful raffle netting over \$17,000 was held on June 11. Rather than raffling a car, a decision was made to offer a first prize of \$10,000 in gold kruggerands. The raffle was very ably chaired by Lucy Soovajian. We thank her and her committee for a job well done. Part of the proceeds were earmarked for renovation of church properties.

PLEDGE/ENVELOPE SYSTEM: Offering envelopes were distributed to individuals and families. For the year 1983, a total of \$11,720. was collected via the Pledge/Envelope System. This is a very valuable and important project of the Parish Council and all effort will be given this year to increase this aspect of our financial strength.

ENDOWMENT FUND: The Church's Endowment Fund continues to grow and is being supported more and more by a growing number of our parishioners. A complete financial report on the fund by chairman Lud Shahbazian is included in this report booklet.

CHURCH RENOVATIONS/MAINTENANCE: The Building Maintenance Committee headed by Deran Chopoorian and Harold Azmelian did an outstanding job in overseeing that the repairs on all church properties has been carried out properly. According to the plan developed at the beginning of the year, their activities concentrated on the maintenance of the church center. Repairs included the cementing of damaged brick facing, replacement of basement sewer pipes, and reparis to the roof and ventilation system.
