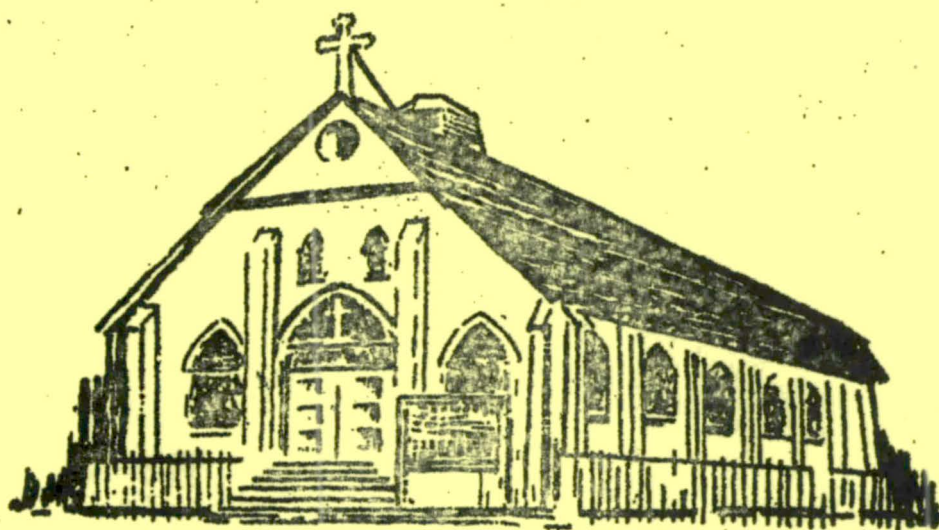

1984 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING

JANUARY 27, 1985

The Annual Parish Assembly Meeting was convened in the Church immediately following the Badarak. The Parish Council Chairman, Charles Genjian, opened the meeting asking for nominations for Chairman to preside over the annual meeting. Mr. Richard Hachadoorian was unanimously elected by the members present. The floor was then opened for nominations for Secretary. Mr. Philip Arpiarian was unanimously elected.

Motion was made and passed to adjourn the meeting to reconvene at the Church Center after lunch break.

The meeting was reconvened by Mr. Richard Hachadoorian at which time he requested that he be relieved of the Chairmanship. The Assembly then unanimously elected Mr. Zaven Hovsepian to be Chairman of the Annual Assembly. There were 62 members present.

The Chair recognized Mr. Thomas Dabakian who made a motion to close the voting for Parish Council Members, Auditing Committee and Nominating Committee at 1:30PM. Motion was seconded and carried.

The Minutes of the 1983 Parish Assembly were accepted as read.

The Auditing Committee report was presented by Mr. Armen Kalbian. The official records of each organization were reported to be in order. Mr. Kalbian praised the excellent job performed by the Treasurer of the Women's Guild, Artemis Koundakjian; and all the Treasurers of the Parish Council, Senior Citizens, the Choir, Sunday School and Ladies Educational Society. Motion was made by Mrs. Alice Foronjy to accept the Auditing Committee Report as presented. Motion seconded and carried.

The Chairman suggested that the reading of the individual organization reports be suspended. Motion made in support of the Chairman's suggestion. Following a second of the motion the members present were given time to read the reports after which the motion was carried.

The 1985 Budget was then presented to the Assembly by the Chairman. Each item of receipts and disbursements were presented to discussion. The following items were explored in detail.

- A. Equipment Replacement - included the acquisition of a computer to aid the Treasurer and Secretary in the preparation and maintenance of financial and historical documents. Motion was made, seconded and carried to retain the budget item.

- B. Maintenance/Renovations - included the cost of installation of a conveyor in the Church Center to facilitate the moving of items and the renovation of the rest rooms in the Church Basement. Motion made, seconded and carried to retain the budget item.
- C. Christmas Party - question was raised regarding the need for the Parish Christmas Party. Following a short discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried to retain the budget item.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the 1985 Budget as proposed by the Parish Council.

The Chairman then opened the floor for the discussion of OLD BUSINESS.

Mr. Lud Shahbazian presented a few brief comments regarding the Endowment Fund urging the continued participation of all the parishioners.

The Chairman then opened the floor for discussion of NEW BUSINESS.

- A. Proposal presented by the Parish Council to reinvest the interest from the Endowment Fund into the Endowment Fund and that a committee be appointed by the Assembly to manage the Fund. After a lengthy discussion, a motion was made and seconded and carried giving the Parish Council the authority to decide on the use of the 1984 interest and the responsibility for creating a set of "Guide Lines" to define the duties, responsibilities and authority of the Endowment Fund Management Committee.
- B. Proposal submitted by the Parish Council to add a "Kumpet" on the Church. Following a discussion which explored costs, feasibility and appearance, a motion was made, seconded and not carried to add a "Kumpet." A second motion was made, seconded and carried directing the Parish Council to investigate and present a new proposal to the Assembly at a special meeting regarding renovations to the skylight.
- C. Mr. John Hovsepian, Delegate, provided a brief description of the proposed "high rise" structure to be constructed on the Diocesan property in New York. He requested a vote from the Assembly to reflect the concensus regarding this structure. Motion was made, seconded and carried against the proposed construction.

PASTOR'S REPORT 1985

Dear members of the Holy Cross Armenian Church of Union City, New Jersey, according to the By-laws of our Diocese, pastor and parish council and other church auxiliary organizations give their report (financial and statistical) once a year and review their activities throughout the year at the Annual Parish Assembly.

It is that time of the year again when we are required to submit to our church membership our Annual Report for the year 1985.

My report will include only the last quarter of the year. As you recall I was assigned to this parish as pastor by our Diocesan Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, in the latter part of the summer; however, I actually assumed my pastoral duties during the second week of October 1985. My first Badarak was on Sunday, October 13th. Therefore, my report will embrace the last 3 months of the year; namely, October, November and December.

I arrived in New Jersey on Tuesday, October 8, in time to attend my first parish council meeting, scheduled for that day in the evening. This initial period of my pastorate involved mainly getting acquainted to my new environment. During this period, however, the church functioned quite normally with the help of some individuals who are always on the forefront when it comes to serve their church.

In conducting day-to-day affairs of the parish, I tried to adapt myself to the established order of the traditions practiced in this parish for many years in order to avoid any unnecessary confusion which sometimes accompanies a sudden change.

WORSHIP AND LITURGY: Every Sunday our worship services continued uninterruptedly with the morning hours and Holy Badarak according to the requirements of our liturgical tradition; sermons were delivered every Sunday in both Armenian and English, with appropriate messages, suggested by the character of the church season.

SACRAMENTS AND RITES: The Sacraments and Rites performed during this period were the following:

CHURCH PUBLICATIONS AND OFFICE MANAGEMENT: Sunday Bulletins were prepared bi-lingually for general announcements for Hokehankisd and information and messages on saints and feasts. In the preparation of these Sunday Bulletins the services rendered by our voluntary church secretary, Ann Dadian, is invaluable. Our church office functions because of her selfless dedication and long-time experience. I hope by working with her, in the course of time, I will be able to be more proficient in handling the different machines in the work room, and thereby be more helpful.

PASTOR'S REPORT - (cont.)

The VISION is the church newsletter of our parish. During this period, we could only publish one combined issue - October-November-December 1985. We hope that in the future the publication of the VISION will be on a more regular basis once things get more normalized.

AUXILIARY ORGANIZATIONS: As for the Church affiliated organizations are concerned, we are happy to state that each one of them continue to function quite normally within its own particular sphere of activities.

The Church Choir sings our beautiful Badarak every Sunday with a smooth rendition. We are fortunate to have several knowledgeable singers with conducting ability - like Arpena Sbarbaro, Ann Dadaian, and Dawn Foronjy who was in the past serving as one of our organists. Our regular organist is Mary Shalakian.

As far as Deacons and singing on the Holy Altar is concerned, our Senior Deacon Hagop Hovsepian is in charge with the cooperation of Richard Bohajian who is in the process of learning the Deacon's part as a future seminarian who already does his part quite efficiently. Unfortunately towards the end of 1985, one of our deacons for many years, Thomas Dabakian, was transferred to Connecticut. Fortunately God provided us at the beginning of 1986, a new Deacon from Istanbul, Mardiros Barsamian, who filled our loss in this respect quite capably.

As for the Women's Guild, it is not an exaggeration if we say that this is one organization which is the backbone of the parish and the right hand of the parish council, as is the case in all our parishes throughout the Diocese. This organization with its varied fund-raising activities for the entire year is a great asset for our parish. Arpena Sbarbaro, as the chairperson, leads the organization.

We have two parish schools; namely, Church Sunday School on Sundays and the Mesrobian Armenian School on Saturdays. These two schools provide religious and Armenian language educational needs for our children. Both schools function regularly by a handful of dedicated teaching staff. Alice Yigitkurt is the principal of the Armenian School and Sylvia Bozoyan and Joyce Henning act as co-superintendents of the Sunday School.

The Ladies Educational Society was organized many years ago solely to serve the needs of the Armenian School. 1985 marked the 80th Anniversary of the Society and this occasion was appropriately observed during the cultural month of October (6th of October). Alice Najarian, as chairperson and treasurer is serving the Society with great dedication for many years.

We also have an organization in our parish known as the Senior Citizens which serves the needs of our older parishioners. Every Tuesday afternoon members and guests socialize in our church annex and are served coffee and cake. The organization just completed its 10th anniversary. On that occasion Hokehankisd was performed for all the deceased members, 28 altogether, on the Merelotz of Armenian Christmas (January 19, 1986). This memorial will be observed annually on the Sunday closest to the formation date of the organization. Mary Seraidarian is the chairperson of the Senior Citizens.

PASTOR'S REPORT - (cont.)

COMPUTER SYSTEM: Recently our Church office acquired a set of computers, which was ready for operation and set up by Father Michael Buttero to whom our parish owes a great deal of gratitude for his generous service. Soon we will be able to operate our church office in a more efficient way once the system starts to function.

IN APPRECIATION: I would like publicly to express my deep gratitude to certain people from our parish who were, in some way or other; instrumental in making the performance of my task easier. These individuals are: Harol Azmelian, who in his capacity as Chairman of the Search Committee, rendered invaluable help in the initial stages of my transfer; Ann Dadaian for her secretarial help; Arpena Sbarbaro for transportation to Church on Sundays during the first month; Deran Chopoorian who as maintenance co-chairman for the church property, was very helpful in meeting various needs and providing the necessary items for the office; to Church Deacons Hagop Hovsepian and Richard Bohajian who were very helpful to the pastor in the performance of the church services; and last but not least the church caretaker, Pablo and his wife, Sonia, who were very cooperative all the time. The pastor greatly appreciated the services of the members of all church organizations and their respective executive officers.



The Women's Guild did an outstanding job in the preparation of the traditional Armenian foods. The merchandising booths and raffles added a festive atmosphere. As always the Bazaar was a financial success, thanks to all of our parishioners who volunteered their services and all who supported us by their attendance.

POT OF GOLD RAFFLE: This was a successful raffle adding approximating \$16,000 to our church treasury. 300 tickets were sold. The efforts of the Chairman Philip Arpiarian and the committee consisting of the entire Parish Council were rewarded.


