HOLY CROSS ARMENIAN CHURCH 1987 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 7, 1988

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The annual meeting of the Parish of the Holy Cross Armenian Church of Union City was called to order following church services on Sunday, February 8, 1988. Motion was made and seconded for Mr. Harold Azmelian and Mrs. Claire Hovsepian to serve as Chairman and REcording Secretary, respectively, of the Parish Assembly. The meeting then was adjourned for lunch.

The meeting was reconvened at 1:15 p.m. with a short prayer by Fr. Diran Papazian. A total of 54 parishioners were in attendance representing a quorum. Motion made and seconded to close the ballots at 1:30 p.m.

Harold Azmelian, Chairman, requested a moment of silence in memory of two recently departed extremely active members of our church, Mrs. Victoria Tukmanian and Mr. Deran Chopoorian. Also, Mrs. Arpena Sbarbaro read a short touching letter written by Mr. Levon Manoukian to Mr. Chopoorian when he was hospitalized several years ago.

Fr. Diran Papazian read the Pastor's report for 1987, putting special emphasis on the fact that each year the number of funerals are at least double the amount of weddings and baptisms combined. This presents a challenge to the parishioners to think of ways of increasing our church membership.

Mr. Hagop Hovsepian requested that future reports (especially the Pastor's) be printed both in English and Armenian.

The Parish Council Chairman was asked to present the Parish Council report. The assembly was asked to raise only relevant questions at this time. Other points raised would be reviewed under the heading of "old business: and "new business" after the reports of the various organizations were read.

The reports of the various organizations were read and accepted as submitted. Mrs. Arpena Sbarbaro, Chairlady of the Women's Guild, presented the Chairman with a check in the amount of \$5,000.00 for which Harold Azmelian thanked her profusely.

Mrs. Alice Najarian, Chairlady of the Educational Society, asked that we insert in the record the fact that the Armenian School held a Cultural Day this past of year which included a light luncheon and Yeretzkin Rosalie was the principal speaker. The tide of the control of th

Mr. Armen Kalbian, Auditing Committee Chairman, reported that the Treasurer's reports for the various organizations were in good order. He had not audited the Senior Citizen organization nor the Choir, as they had limited financial activity.

Mr. Kalbian made a point of stating that the financial status of the Church is deteriorating and suggested that the first step should be to try to get an increase in pledges from the parishioners.

On behalf of the Parish Council, Mr. Nubar Dorian expressed the council's frustrations due to its inability to work with Pastor Papazian. Among other items he listed several requests of the Parish Council which Pastor did not follow in over 2 years.

- 1. Adhere to regular office hours, 10AM to 1PM.
- 2. Arrange the publication of our newspaper, the Vision, monthly and not once in three months.
- 3. His unwillingness to contact church members by regular visitations.

During the Parish Council meetings the Council Members discussed and took action on all matters relating to the needs of the Holy Cross Armenian Church.

The disposition of the motions passed at the last Parish Assembly was as follows:

- a. Pastor's Report English and Armenian because we do not have a permanent parish priest as of this date, a Pastor's report is not included in this annual report.
- b. Financial Report should include details on salaries. This year's financial information will reflect the information.
- c. Rental Church Center there was discussion regarding this issue which resulted in the following conclusions: higher insurance costs and lack of volunteers to assume the management of the center.

- d. ACYOA Seniors Library there is no ACYOA activity in our parish at this time. There were no volunteers to undertake this project.
- e. Annual Dinner/Dance A Valentine's Day affair was held on February 13, 1988 with 300 people in attendance. Under the co-chairpersonship of Alice Yigitkurt and Mardiros Barsamian a very enjoyable and successful affair netted the Holy Cross Armenian Church in excess of \$14,000.

The following represents the significant events which were important to the Holy Cross Armenian Church and its members:

Parish Priest - Regrettable our parish was without a priest when Fr. Papazain left our parish in July. During the annual meeting several issues were raised regarding the performance of the priest. The Parish Council attempted to resolve these issues with Fr. Papazian without success. It was mutually agreed by the Council and Fr. Papazian that it was in the best interes of our Church to sever our relationship. Since July, through the dedicated efforts of Arpena Sbarbaro we have had no interruption in the celebration of the Divine Liturgy.

The Parish Council has been actively pursuing a replacement with the Priamte. These activities have most recently been interrupted because of the earthquake in Armenia.

Picnic, Bazaar, Raffle - These affairs represent a major source of income for our parish. We are grateful to the chairpersons and their committees who strive to make these activities both enjoyable and profitable.

<u>Vision</u> - The Vision has been published faithfully and on a regular basis for the past year. We are grateful to Ann and Arpena and their committee for keeping us informed.

<u>Membership</u> - Our parish boasts of a faithful membership. Many parishioners attend church regularly, participate in the auxilliary organizations and attend the various affairs. It is important that everyone who considers themselves a member participate in the Pledge system and use the weekly envelopes.

ACYOA Seniors - There has been no significant activity regarding the formation of an ACYOA Seniors group.

<u>Maintenance</u> - The maintenance on Church properties during the past year included the replacement of the roof on the Church Annex, painting the exterior of the Church, and overhaul of the Church heating system. We anticipate that during the next year, 1989, there will be more activity on maintaining of Church properties.
