A PLEDGE OF KINSHIP

Welcome pain, welcome...and farewell to Spidag, Leninakan, Stepanavan and the tens upon thousands who perished at 11:41 a.m. on a cold Armenian December.

Sorrow, disbelief, despair and bewilderment engulfed the Armenian world. The children who perished added to the ranks of angels in heaven who greeted them with innocent smiles. Their parents and grandparents have been laid to rest and their souls entered life eternal.

Armenians who constantly strive to follow the path of righteousness and for centuries extalled the virtues of belief, faith and prayer are once again rewarded with misfortune, death and grief. We find ourselves plunged into depths of darkness and despair. Let's not look for the fingerprint of God or reach for simple answers. There are none, just as moral absolutes are not for this life!

This is indeed a crazy world. Through our deportation, torture, genocide, when close to two million of us perished, Armenia was a mere speck in the universe indifferent to all cries for help. A natural disaster puts our little Armenia on the lips of millions, and a thousand million hands are extended in sympathy for grieving Armenians.

The Armenian world indeed is subjected once again to haunting sighs, painful cries and finality of death. Will this disaster somehow help us seek absolution for our past years of indifference towards our homeland? Will this tragedy make us put aside our silly feuds for turf or credit? Will we embrace each other in grief and love no matter our politics or beliefs? In the face of devastation and death will we finally abandon our hatreds, division and discord? Will this misfortune make the indifferent among us stop their non-involvement and come home?

This time around, nature trapped us into a crisis. Our homeland lies prostate and our kith and kin suffer. It is all right to shed tears of grief and pay homage to our dead without forgetting however that our imperative has to be to give comfort to the living. It is our collective responsibility to make certain that their hopes remain uncorrupted and their dignity whole.

Our people are drowning in a sea of uncertainty, confustion and hurt. Their anger at providence creeps down into the subterranean regions of their soul. Ours then is to pledge kinship with their destiny and make the whole again. This is the least we can do.

To give expression to Armenia's deepest need and to demonstrate our real caring for and solidarity with our suffering brothers and sisters, we must forget the state of our bank account, or the quality of wine we should serve our guests for dinner and open our hearts and pockets with unparalled generosity. This will be the only measure of our love towards our heritage and values we claim to have.

Sylvia Bozoyan Named Outstanding Teacher

We are proud to announce that Sylvia Bozoyan, a dedicated Sunday School teacher of our parish for many years, was recently selected as an Outstanding Young Woman of America of 1987 and an Outstanding Teacher through the Governor's Teacher Recognition Program.

The Outstanding Young Women of America are chosen on the basis of their civic, and professional achievement, outstanding leadership, citizenship and dedication. She was once before selected Outstanding Young Woman in 1982.

Sylvia was chosen Outstanding Teacher for having made exceptional contributions as a teacher in the public school system of New Jersey. Selected from a faculty of 85, her school received \$1,000 from the State Department of Education for an educational purpose of her choice. At the Governor's Convocation on Excellence in Teaching on May 10, 1988 at Princeton University, Sylvia received an award certificate and letter of commendation from Governor Thomas H. Kean.

Sylvia received her Bachelors Degree from St. Peter's College and her Master's Degree in Education from William Paterson College of Wayne, NJ. Active in many societies Sylvia was the recipient of many scholarships. She was initiated as a member of the Kappa Delta Pi, an Honor Socity in Education and PiLambda Theta, an honor and professional association in the field of education.

Sylvia is a member of the American Association of University Women, North Hudson College Club and the National New Jersey, Hudson County and Union City Education Associations. She is a member of the AGBU and is Secretary and an instructor with its Antrania Dance Ensemble. She has served as a counselor at the St. Nersess Armenian Seminary Summer Study Conferences in New Rochelle, NY; has been an instructor of language, religion, dance and a counselor at St. Vartan Camp in New Milford, Conn; a member of the Association of Eastern Region Sunday School Superintendents and an Armenian School teacher in our Mesrobian Armenian School. She is a graduate of the Armenian School teachers' Training Program



sponsored by the Armenian Diocese and Helen and Edward Mardigian Religious Institute for the training of Church School Teachers.

Sylvia has visited Armenia three times. She studies with Armenian School students from various overseas countries as guests of the Armenian Government and on another with the ACYOA under the auspices of the Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, His Holiness Vazken I and the Committee for Cultural Relations with Armenians abroad.

The Holy Cross Church family is indeed proud of Sylvia and congratulates her on her outstanding achievements.

WOMEN'S GUILD RUMMAGE SALE

The semi-annual Women's Guild Rummage Sale went on as Scheduled Nov. 18 and 19, 1988 adding greatly to our treasury.

Under the able supervision of Dora Boorojian and a good working crew, the profits
were no surprise. A great deal of endless,
back-breaking work went into this undertaking from the undoing of the bundles,
sorting, setting out, then packing up the
leftovers at the end to move out to the
needy.

The unprecedented portion of this project was the many tightly-packed, good-size cartons plus two racks of outerwear of unsold leftovers from the accumulated merchandise which our good parishioners had donated so generously for sale (and we might add that this generosity has been on-going twice a year for years).

After much searching and investigating over the last two years to make sure these cartons would not go astray, we were assured that the items would be directed into the right areas to reach the needy.

It is now only proper that our people be made aware of these good results: A truck and van manned by the Deacon of St. Francis Workshop and a crew of volunteers from a Jersey City Shelter for the homeless and soup kitchen picked up the cartons for distribution to the homeless and needy in Jersy City and its environs (both in and out of shelters)—then shipped to the Southeast and then Southwest United States and then shipped to the needy in Africa with monetary contributions to cover costs. The items were gratefully received, especially the outerwear.

This was a job well done! Our appreciation to our caretaker, Pablo Taura, for his special involvement and a good round of applause for Dora and the Crew are certainly in order and many thanks from the Guild to all parishioners for their response in offering us their castoffs.
