#### HOLY CROSS ARMENIAN CHURCH 1989 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 4, 1990

The Annual Parish Meeting of the Holy Cross Armenian Church of Union City was called to order by the Parish Council Chairman, Nubar Dorian, on February 4, 1990 at 12:00 Noon. Mr. Armen Kalbian was elected Assembly Chairman and Miss Satenig Karagosian, Recording Secretary. The meeting was then adjourned f

The meeting was reconvened at 1:15 PM with a total of 60 members participating, representing a quorum. Motion and made and seconded to close the voting at 1:30 PM. Motion passed.

#### Parish Council Report

Philip Arpiarian, Secretary of the Parish Council, read the Parish Council Report. Mr. Arpiarian asked Mary Shalakian to give a report on the Organ Fund. She stated that to date between pledges and actual receipts, the total donated is \$15,687.

Philip Arpiarian went over the Minutes of the previous year's meeting and the following decisions were implemented:

1. The VISION is now being prepared in both English and Armenian.

2. The Theater Group was not formed.

3. Major renovations were completed in the parish house and the church.

4. The dinner-dance held in Atlantic City, the proceeds which are earmarked for the parking lot, was very successful.

Considering the circumstances of the parish, the pledge system is doing fairly well. The pledge committee will be exerting more effort into this project during the coming year.

The Search Committee was able to interview two candidates for pastor of our church. Until a permanent pastor is found, our former pastor, Rev. Carnig Hallajian and other neighboring clergy are willing to perform services and take care of the necessary church duties.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Parish Council Report, Minutes of the 1988 Parish Assembly and all other auxiliary reports as presented. Motion carried.

#### Auditing Committee Report

Mr. Armen Kalbian, as Chairman of the Auditing Committee, reported that they have examined the books of the Parish Council and auxiliary organizations and everything was in proper order. On behalf of the Committee, he thanked all the tresurers for their good work.

#### 1989 Annual Parish Assembly Meeting

On behalf of the Parish Council, Mr. Harold Azmelian presented the Proposed Budget for 1990 and went over all the items - line by line. A motion was made and second to approve the Proposed Budget as presented. Motion was carried.

#### Permanent Endowment Trust Fund

Harold Azmelian presented the report on the Permanent Endowment Trust Fund. The Assembly expressed their heartfelt thanks to Mr. Azmelian for the superb job he is doing with the investing of the endowment donations.

#### Old Business

Mr. Nubar Dorian stated that as far as the parking lot was concerned, we are still using the former Yeshiva School Yard for our parking facilities.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Apo Boghossian and Alice Yigitkurt, Co-Chairmen of the Dinner-Dance affair for their hard work, along with their committee members, in making this fund-raiser a financial and social success. As preivously mentioned, the proceeds of this affair are earmarked for the parking lot project.

#### New Business

Because of the steady growth of our Church endowment fund, a motion was made and seconded that the Assembly empower the parish council to appoint an investment committee, chaired by Harold Azmelian, to take care of the transactions of the Endowment Fund. Motion was passed.

A discussion was held as to whether or not titles or designations, as a form of recognition, should be given to those who donate to the Endowment Fund; for example, Donors, Benefactors or Fellows, according to the amounts given. A motion was made and seconded that a committee be formed to categorize donors of the Endowment Fund and bring back their recommendations to the Assembly next year. Motion was passed.

Discussion took place about ways and means to increase the dues-paying members of the church. This task was turned over to the pledge committee to pursue.

Ms. Arpena Sbarbaro, Chairperson of the Women's Guild, presented the Parish Council with a check for \$7,000 on behalf of the Guild.

Father Carnig Hallajian, in his closing remarks, congratulated the Parish Council and the parishioners for the work they were doing despite the fact that there is no permanent pastor. He then ended the meeting with a prayer.

The meeting was adjounred at 3:00 PM.

<u>PARISH PRIEST</u> - During the year the Search Committee consisting of Nubar Dorian, Harold Azmelian, Arpena Sbarbaro, Ann Dadaian, Philip Arpiarian invited the Very Rev. Shnork Kasparian (suggested by Bishop Barsamian) to meet with them to conduct the Divine Liturgy during the weekend of November 24 and November 25. The committee's recommendation was not to invite him to be the Parish Priest. Accordingly, the Chairman of the Parish Council informed the Primate of our decision.

The Search Committee will continue its search for a new pastor.

During the past year the Divine Liturgy was celebrated every Sunday by Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian and other visiting clergy.

<u>CHURCH PROPERTIES</u> - Harold Azmelian and Pablo Taura (caretaker) continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center and the Parish House to insure they were in good shape. During the year the following repairs were made:

- 1. Church roof repaired - new organ
- 2. Church Center Boiler repaired, new refrigerator and freezer were purchased. The dishwasher has not been functioning - availability of parts has prevented any repairs. The exterior walls of the center are covered with graffiti which cannot be removed without ruining the brickface.
- 3. Parish House the caretaker's apartment was renovated.

BISHOP'S DINNER - In 1990 the Holy Cross Armenian Church had the honor of being the first Parish to host a dinner for Bishop Khajag Barsamian following his consecration to the rank of Bishop in Holy Etchmiadzin. Nubar Dorian and Zaven Hovsepian co-chaired the event which was a social success with 280 people in attendance.

<u>BAZAAR/PICNIC</u> - Both functions were successful socially as well as financially. Although the net gains realized were less than previous years, it is important to continue these functions as a means of providing an opportunity for members of Holy Cross and friends to socially interact.

<u>RAFFLE</u> - An enjoyable evening for all those in attendance and rewarding for all the winners. Needless to say that this function provides a significant income for the Church.

<u>VISION</u> - For the second year in a row, the VISION has been published regularly on a monthly basis. This paper provides our parishioners and friends with news and information on what's happening in the Holy Cross Parish.

<u>ARMENIAN SCHOOL</u> - The Parish Council has assumed a major role in the operation of the Armenian School. There are currently 15 students enrolled and attending on a regular basis. In September the Parish Council took action to provide bus transportation on Saturdays. Our thanks to Alice Yigitkurt who tirelessly supervises the school.

Reorganization meetings are planned for the coming year to establish an executive committee to run the Armenian School in the absence of the Ladies Educational Society organization.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> - Sylvia Bozoyan faithfully teaches a group of 4 or 5 students who attend the Sunday School on a regular basis. We are very grateful for having such a dedicated person to keep the Sunday School program alive.
