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1991 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 2, 1992

The Annual Parish Meeting was called to order by Acting President Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian at 12 Noon who turned the chair over to the Mr. Nubar Dorian, Chairman of the Parish Council, for the election of Assembly Chairman and Secretary. Dr. Edward Sahagian and Mrs. Alice Yigitkurt were elected Chairman and Secretary, respectively.

Mr. Nubar Dorian adjourned the meeting which was to be reconvened at the Church Center after lunch.

The meeting was reconvened at 1:30PM by the Chairman, presided over by Acting President Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian. Motion made and passed to close the balloting at 1:35PM.

Dr. Sahagian, Chairman, expressed the thanks and appreciation of the Assembly to the Women's Guild, and especially to Diane Burggraf for the delicious luncheon.

The Holy Cross Church was privileged to have present at our meeting the Rt. Rev. Bishop Karekin Nersisian, Primate of the Diocese in Yerevan, Armenia. Also present were Mrs. Louise Simone, President of the AGBU, who was named an honorary member of the Holy Cross Church by Nubar Dorian, Chairman of the Parish Council. Another guest present at our meeting was Mr. Sarkis Gabrellian.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Mr. Philip Arpiarian, Secretary of the Parish Council, presented the report and commented on the actions taken by the Parish Council regarding the motions passed at last year's Annual Meeting.

A motion was made and passed to accept the Parish Council Report and the Minutes of the 1990 Parish Assembly.

Mr. Harold Azmelian, Treasurer of the Parish Council, presented the Treasurer's Report, discussing each item line by line. A motion was passed to donate the remaining \$13,500.00 allocated for Missionary Work (\$15,000 was budgeted in 1991) to Bishop Nersisian for his Fund. The other \$1,500.00 had been given to him previously. A motion was passed to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented along with the thanks and gratitude of the Parish to Mr. Harold Azmelian for his outstanding and dedicated work in his record keeping of the books.

1991 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY FEBRUARY 2, 1992

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AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Armen Kalbian, Chairman of the Auditing Committee, reported that the treasurer's books of all the organizations were examined and found to be in order. On behalf of the committee he thanked the treasurers of all the organizations for their good work.

ANCILLARY ORGANIZATION REPORTS

WOMEN'S GUILD - Ms. Arpena Sbarbaro, Chairperson, reviewed the report and closed by announcing a donation of \$5,000 on behalf of the Guild to the Parish Treasury. The Guild also pledged a donation of \$5,000.00 to Bishop Karekin Nersisian.

ARMENIAN SCHOOL - A report in Armenian was presented by Mrs. Alice Yigitkurt, Chairperson. She announced that there will be a fund-raising dinnerdance (for the first time) on Saturday, February 22, 1992 in our Church Center. The goal of the school is to raise \$10,000.00.

SUNDAY SCHOOL - Parishioners reviewed the report. There were no comments.

CHOIR - Parishioners reviewed the report. Ms. Ann Dadaian on behalf of the Choir donated \$500.00 to Bishop Nersisan earmarked for the Diocese of Yerevan.

SENIOR CITIZENS CLUB - Parishioners reviewed the report.

Motion made and passed accepting all the Ancillary Organization reports as presented.

1992 BUDGET

Mr. Harold Azmelian, Treasurer of the Parish Council, presented the 1992 Proposed Budget, discussing each item line by line. Upon the recommendation of Father Carnig, this year also a motion was made and passed that a \$15,000 item be added to be used for missionary purposes. With this addition, the budget went up from \$101,000.00 to \$116,000.00. A motion was passed to accept the 1992 Proposed Budget as amended.

1991 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY FEBRUARY 2, 1992

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PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND

Mr. Harold Azmelian, Chairman of the Endowment Fund, presented the report which was accepted as presented. Our thanks and appreciation to Mr. Azmelian and his committee members, Philip Arpiarian and Armen Kalbian for their conscientious work in maintaining and caring for the Fund.

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Nubar Dorian stated that we are still actively searching for a permanent pastor, and he is in touch with the Primate on a regular basis about this situation. Once again this year we are grateful to Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian for helping us serve the needs of our parish for at least 26 weeks of the year as well as the duties relating to the VISION, Sunday Bulletins and all other activities of the parish. Mr. Nubar Dorian also expressed his appreciation to Rev. Fr. Arnak Kasparian who has accepted our offer to serve our parish for the remaining 26 weeks of the year.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Philip Arpiarian discussed the Parking Lot issue. He reported that we have been actively looking for parking lot property but nothing has happened. Several ideas have been suggested:

- That we look into possibility of renovating center by raising existing building and putting parking space below. This project would only accommodate 15 cars and the cost woould run from \$800,000 to \$1,100,000. Motion was passed not to pursue this idea.
- 2. Use of Daniel Webster School parking facilities in Weehawken. Mr. Azmelian has been in touch with the Board of Education, and we are still awaiting word.
- 3. Some kind of agreement with the Public Service.
- 4. Some kind of agreement with the Mormon Church which now has approval to start building.

1991 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY FEBRUARY 2, 1992

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Mr. Nubar Dorian announced that Holy Cross would be celebrating its 90th Anniversary on Sunday, October 18, 1992. The Primate has already accepted the invitation to preside over the festivities. Mr. John Malool has been appointed Chairman of the affair, and he and his committee are making plans for this banquet. Details will be announced as they become available.

1992

During the calendar year 1992 the Parish Council met 10 times with a quorum present.

During the March meeting the following Parish Council members were elected to the Executive Committee:

<u>1991 PARISH ASSEMBLY</u> - The Minutes of the Parish Assembly held on February 2, 1992 are included in the Annual Report booklet. Four new business issues discussed at the Assembly requiring action by the Parish Council were carried out as follows:

a. <u>Endowment Fund Prayers for donors</u> - Hokehankisd prayers for the deceased donors and prayers of thanksgiving for the living donors will be offered as usual during a Sunday in February after the Annual Assembly.

- b. <u>Armenian School</u> In line with the Assembly decision the Parish Council as a whole acted as the administrator of the Armenian School and appointed Alice Yigitkurt to act as liaison in addition to her being Superintendent of the Armenian School.
- c. <u>Annual Christmas Party</u> Following the dictates of the Parish Assembly the Parish Council re-inaugurated the Christmas Party in memory of Mrs. Betty Nalband. Zaven Hovsepian acted as Chairman and did a magnificent job. This party was held on Friday, December 18.
- d. <u>Armenian Missionary Work</u> Parish Council, in line with the motion passed at the 1991 Parish Assembly, began to make contributions to Armenian Missionary Work and has to date spent \$8,000. of the \$15,000. authorized by the Assembly and underwrote Father Carnig's expenses for travel to Armenia.

<u>PARISH PRIEST</u> - The Search Committee continues its activity. This Committee met with the Primate on several occasions and is hopeful that this coming year we will resolve this situation.

We are fortunate that in addition to Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian's continued support, interest, and assistance to the Parish, he gave us Divine Liturgy 26 Sundays. Parish Council was also happy to arrange to have former pastor of St. Thomas Church, Rev. Arnak Kasparian to celebrate Divine Liturgy the remaining 26 weeks. We are delighted to advise the community that this arrangement has worked well and hopefully will continue until the assignment of a permanent priest to our Church.

In addition, we had the privilege of having as celebrants the Primate of Yerevan and the Primate of Karabagh.

<u>CHURCH PROPERTIES</u> Harold Azmelian and Pablo Taura, caretaker, continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center, the Parish House and the Church Center. During the year the following repairs were made:

1. Church - The exterior was painted.

Parish House - A new copy machine was purchased.
 All the windows were replaced.

PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT - 1992

<u>PICNIC</u> - For the first time we had our picnic jointly with St. Leon Armenian Church in Fair Lawn on Sunday, June 7. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the Chairperson and all the workers who helped tirelessly to make this event enjoyable. Next year's picnic will once again be conducted jointly with St. Leon Armenian Church.

<u>BAZAAR</u> - Once again, the Bazaar, held on November 6 and 7, was successful socially as well as financially. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the Chairpersons and all the workers who helped tirelessly to make the Bazaar both enjoyable and profitable.

<u>RAFFLE</u> - Parish Council decided to forego the raffle this year to concentrate its full activities for the success of the $90\frac{\text{th}}{\text{Anniversary celebration of our Church. It is the full intent$ of the Parish Council to resume the raffle in 1993.

<u>VISION</u> - Arpena Sbarbaro and Ann Dadaian as co-editors of the VISION once again did a magnificent job in making sure that regular issues of the VISION were distributed to the community.

Fr. Carnig was a great help in taking care of the Armenian language portion of the VISION as well as the lay-out of the VISION.

<u>SUNDAY BULLETIN</u> - As in former years, the Sunday Bulletin was distributed every Sunday to those attending Church services. Each issue was replete with current information on Church activities, simple explanation of the meaning of each Sunday and other pertinent matters of interest such as listings of hokehankisd to our Church members. Ann Dadaian deserves special thanks for undertaking this important task.

<u>ARMENIAN SCHOOL</u> - The Armenian School has prospered greatly during the year. In addition to the Superintendent and the 2 teachers, we added 2 assistant teachers due to the increase of the enrollment. The underwriting of the weekly bus service expense by the Parish Council has been extremely well received and Parish Council has every reason to believe that the number of enrolled students will increase.

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PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT - 1992

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> - The lack of Sunday School students have been one of the great disappointments of the Parish Council. In spite of our Superintendent and the Parish Council efforts, we have been unable to increase the number of enrolled students which remains at 10 with regular attendance at 4. Parish Council is immensely thankful to Sylvia Bozoyan for not giving up and being available every Sunday to conduct Sunday School activities. It is the belief of Parish Council that only a full time Parish priest, with home visitations and follow through can make our Sunday School a viable one.

<u>90th ANNIVERSARY BANQUET</u> - Due to John Malool's inability to chair this affair, the Parish Council took upon itself to act as the committee in organizing this milestone on Sunday, October 18. To celebrate this occasion with us the Primate of the Eastern Diocese Archbishop Khajag Barsamian acted as honorary Chairperson and presided over Divine Liturgy. We were privileged to have Archbishop Vatche Hovsepian, Primate of the Western Diocese accept our invitation to attend this affair as well. He celebrated Divine Liturgy and gave the proper sermon.

Immediately following services, the more than 300 Church members and friends attended the banquet at Schuetzen Park in North Bergen. Chairman of Parish Council, Nubar Dorian, acted as toastmaster.

One of the highlights of the banquet was the granting of the St. Nersess Shnorhali medal along with the encyclical from His Holiness Catholicos Vasken I to Harold Azmelian who had served the Holy Cross Church with exemplary dedication and continues to be active in all phases of our Church life.

The Women's Guild continues to actively participate in all phases of the annual CHURCH PICNIC and BAZAAR.

Our successful FLEA MARKETS are organized by Nector Kalustian with the assistance of Isabel Keshguerian and Mary Kharpertian. The Women's Guild tables are supervised by Mary Shalakian ably assisted by Diana Burggraf, Mary Kaprielian, Lucy Saradarian, Vickie Bohajian, Lucy Nalbandian and Rose Sahagian (all around helper). Bertha Najarian stocks our pantry with staples for the refreshment counter and with the hop of Alice Muhibian, Gladys Bagdasarian, Arax Chirkinian and Virginia Hajeian sees to the preparation and serving dealers and workers. Artemis Koundakjian is always there to oversee our treasury filling up at these Flea Markets, Rummage Sales and Bazaars. Let us not forget the ever ready Areknaz Sarajian who is always available for all our needs.

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The MEMBERS ONLY FLEA MARKETS allow our own members to sell their items by renting tables at a nominal fee. Mary Shalakian has been handling the responsibilities of this phase of our operation.

Our RUMMAGE SALES are ably chaired by Mary Kaprielian. We would like to remind our parishioners that clothing left from these sales are picked up by the Deacon of the St. Francis Workshop and distributed via a network of homeless shelters to the needy in these environs, then shipped to various areas of the United States and ultimately to the needy in Africa.

In addition, the Guild, specifically Mary Shalakian, Diana Burggraf, Lucy Ganguzza and Gary Burggraf, came through to help alleviate the damages wrought by hurricane Andrew by packing up 29 boxes of useful garments and accessories to ship to Florida via Governor Florio's planes set up for this purpose.

These and all our other projects are successful because of the faithful devotion of our Women's Guild members who give of their time and energies to these projects.

We continue to support our PROJECT SHARE whereby members and parishioners are urged to fill food baskets which are then distributed through the Division of Youth and Family Services to needy families with children.
