1992 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 7, 1993

The Annual Parish Assembly Meeting was called to order by Chairman of the Parish Council, Nubar Dorian, with sixty members present and presided over by Father Carnig Hallajian. Also present was Father Arnak Kasparian. Mr. Dorian asked for nominees for the election of officers of the Assembly. Mr. Armen Kalbian and Ms. Satenig Karagosian were elected Chairman and Secretary respectively.

Following a delicious luncheon prepared and served by members of the Women's Guild, the meeting proceeded.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Chairman Nubar Dorian presented the report. He stated that all business assigned to it by the 1992 Assembly was successfully concluded.

On the subject of parish priest, he acknowledged that while there is a shortage of clergy, the parish council is working diligently looking for potential candidates to be assigned as our pastor. The Search Committee hopes to accomplish this within the next year.

The exterior of the church was painted, windows were replaced in the parish house and a new copy machine was purchased for the office.

Last year's picnic, which was held jointly with the St. Leon Church in Fair Lawn, was a success. It will be held jointly again this year.

The bazaar was also a success thanks to the efforts of Gary Burggraf and Ed Sahagian, Co-Chairmen.

This year's main raffle was cancelled because of the 90th Anniversary Celebration.

The VISION is printed regularly and the Bulletins are made available to parishioners every Sunday.

The Armenian School is progressing nicely, and has tripled in enrollment. The Sunday School, however, is lacking in students and more emphasis must be placed to enroll them.

The 90th Anniversary Banquet was as huge success. It was presided over by both Primates of the Eastern and Western Dioceses, Abp. Khajag Barsamian and Abp. Vatche Hovsepian, respectively. We were also honored by having one of our dedicated and hard working parishioners, Harold Azmelian, receive the St. Nersess Shnorhali medal and an encyclical from His Holiness Vazken I.

REPORTS OF CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS

Arpena Sbarbaro, Chairperson of the Guild, thanked the Executive Committee for its excellent work during the year. She also thanked Nector Kalustian, Isabel Keshguerian and Mary Kharpertian for running the flea markets.

The Women's Guild presented the Parish Council with a \$10,000 donation. A correction was made in last year's Assembly minutes: The Women's Guild donation to the Parish Council was \$10,000 not \$5,000. Motion was made and passed to amend the minutes.

On behalf of the Women's Guild, Arpena Sbarbaro stated that the Women's Guild had donated \$5,000 to the Armenia Missionary Fund at last year's meeting. This amount was given with the intention that it be an addition to the \$15,000 pledge made by the Parish. After discussion, the Assembly voted that this \$5,000 be considered part of the \$15,000. Arpena Sbarbaro asked that her dissent on behalf of the Guild be recorded.

The Senior Citizens presented the Parish Council with a \$500. donation.

A motion was made and passed to accept the organization reports as presented.

AUDITING COMMITTEE

Armen Kalbian stated that the Auditing Committee examined the books and records of all the organizations. He thanked them for their outstanding record keeping; especially citing Harold Azmelian for the church records and Artemis Koundakjian for the Women's Guild. It was announced that Artemis Koundakjian was retiring as treasurer of the Guild and Mr. Kalbian commented that it was going to be very difficult to fill her shoes. The Assembly commended her for her fine work during the many years that she held the position and gave her a standing ovation.

Harold Azmelian went over the Financial Report for the Church. The missionary fund in 1992 was over \$21,000. and the donation to St. Nersess was \$3,000.

The amount of \$15,000 in the 1993 budget for missionary work was questioned by Philip Arpiarian. He wondered where this was coming from. He said we would have to run more affairs and our parishioners would have to donate more in order for us to give this amount. The Assembly passed a motion to raise \$15,000 for Missionary work. Any short fall will be covered by Church funds.

Der Carnig spoke about his raising funds in this area for Armenia. It can be done either independently or through the Holy Cross Church. Philip Arpiarian stated that you can make checks payable to Holy Cross and designate for "Armenia Fund".

A motion was made and passed to donate \$3,000 to St. Nersess Seminary.

The 1993 Budget was presented with a \$10,000 shortfall which will be covered through the interest of the Endowment Fund. Motion made and passed to accept the 1993 Budget. If we get a permanent pastor, the 1993 budget would have to amended to reflect the new situation.

A question was raised by Mary Kharpertian regarding late distribution of the collection envelopes for 1993. Zaven Hovsepian suggested that a note be included by each parishioner in the envelope stating their year-to-date contribution so that the amount may be properly recorded.

NEW BUSINESS

The idea of having a soup kitchen for the needy in Erevan was discussed by Der Carnig. He said our church should sponsor a soup kitchen and this could eventually be extended to other cities later.

After some discussion on this subject, a motion was made and passed to have a special soup kitchen fund sponsored by our church so that we could get credit. even though there are several committees formed by the Primate.

ENDOWMENT FUND

For clarification purposes, it was again stated that this Fund is for the sole purpose of perpetuating our church as a religious and historic site and was not to be touched. The interest from this Fund can be used. Harold Azmelian was commended for doing an outstanding job as Chairman and Treasurer along with his committee, Armen Kalbian and Philip Arpiarian.

1992 PARISH ASSEMBLY - The minutes of the Parish Assembly held on February 7, 1993 are included in the Annual report. Four business issues discussed at the Assembly requiring action by Parish Council were carried out as follows:

a. <u>Endowment Fund Prayers for Donors</u> - Hokehankisd prayers for the deceased donors and prayers of thanksgiving for the living donors will be offered as usual during a Sunday in February after the Annual Assembly.

- b. <u>Armenian School</u> In line with the Assembly decision Parish Council as a whole acted as the administrator of the Armenian School and has appointed Alice Yigitkurt to act as liaison in addition to being appointed superintendent.
- c. <u>Annual Christmas Party</u> Following the dictates of the Parish Assembly, Parish Council re-inaugurated the Christmas Party in memory of Mrs. Betty Nalband. Phil Arpiarian acted as Chairman and did a magnificent job. This party was held on Friday, December 3rd.
- d. <u>Armenian Missionary Work</u> Parish Council, in line with the motion passed at the 1992 Parish Assembly, began a campaign headed by Phil Arpiarian to raise funds for Armenia Missionary Work. Based on Assembly decision, our Church's obligation will be once again \$15,000. and then any shortfall from donation through this campaign would be underwritten by the Parish. Mr. Arpiarian did a superb job in launching this campaign and raised \$11,368. This means our own Church's contribution will be only \$3,632.

PARISH PRIEST - We were once again fortunate to have Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian's continued support, interest, and assistance to our Church. Parish Council was also grateful to have Rev. Fr. Arnak Kasparian, former pastor of St. Thomas Church to celebrate Divine Liturgy. Between Fr. Hallajian and Fr. Kasparian, we had Divine Liturgy celebration every Sunday until the appointed by His Eminence Khajag Barsamian of the Very Rev. Vazken Karayan as the pastor of our Church on December 19th when he celebrated his initial Divine Liturgy following which Parish Council arranged a reception in his honor. We now have a full time pastor and Parish hope is that our Church community will be re-vitalized.

<u>CHURCH PROPERTIES</u> - Harold Azmelian and Pablo Taura, caretaker, continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center, and the Parish House. During the year the following repairs were made:

- Church Center new roof and new water cooler
- 2. Parish House painted hall and replaced floor covering

<u>PICNIC</u> - For the second time our picnic was held jointly with St. Leon Armenian Church in Fair Lawn on Sunday, June 6th. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to chairmen, Bob Borgeson and Zaven Hovsepian and all the workers who helped tirelessly to make this event enjoyable. As of yet, no decision for next year's picnic has been made.

<u>BAZAAR</u> - Once again the Bazaar, held on October 29 and 30, was successful socially as well as financially. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the Chairpersons, Gary Burggraf and Ed Sahagian and all those who contributed to help make the Bazaar both enjoyable and profitable.

<u>VISION</u> - Ann Dadaian and Arpena Sbarbaro as co-editors of the VISION once again sacrified a great deal of time and effort to ensure the printing of the VISION on a regular basis.

Fr. Carnig was a great help in taking care of the Armenian language portion as well as the lay-out of the VISION.

<u>SUNDAY BULLETIN</u> - As in former years, the Sunday Bulletin was distributed every Sunday to those attending Church services. Each issue was replete with current information on Church activities, simple explanation of the meaning of each Sunday and other pertinent matters of interest such as listings of hokehankisd to our Church members. Ann Dadaian deserves special thanks for undertaking this important task.

<u>ARMENIAN SCHOOL</u> - The same Superintendent, teachers, and assistant teacher made this year's Armenian School a truly a successful one. Parish Council continued to underwrite the expenses of salaries and the weekly bus service cost.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> - The lack of Sunday School students have been one of the great disappointments of the Parish Council. In spite of our Superintendent and Parish Council efforts, we have been unable to increase the number of enrolled students which remains at 10 with regular attendance at 4. Parish Council is immensely thankful to Sylvia Bozoyan for not giving up and being available every Sunday to conduct Sunday School activities. It is the belief of Parish Council that with our pastor Very Rev. Vazken Karayan at the helm, this sad situation will change and our Church will have a viable Sunday School.

RAFFLE - Unlike last year, Parish Council decided to have a 50/50 Raffle this year and was thankful to Phil Arpiarian who once again accepted the responsibility of acting as chairman. As usual with great effort, all tickets were sold and the Church made \$12,000. This event was held jointly with the Christmas Party on December 3rd.

<u>ENDOWMENT FUND</u> - As the annual report of the Endowment Fund indicates, we had excellent results with our Endowment Fund. This is due to the Endowment Fund committee and specially to the efforts of Harold Azmelian who as usual is acting as chairman.

The Women's Guild continues to actively participate in all phases of the annual CHURCH PICNIC and BAZAAR.

Our successful FLEA MARKETS are organized by Nector Kalustian with the assistance of Isabel Keshguerian and Mary Kharpertian. The Women's Guild tables are supervised by Mary Shalakian ably assisted by Diana Burggraf, Mary Kaprielian, Lucy Saradarian, Vickie Bohajian, Lucy Nalbandian and Rose Sahagian (all around helper). Bertha Najarian stocks our pantry with staples for the refreshment counter and with the help of Alice Muhibian, Gladys Bagdasarian, Arax Chirkinian and Virginia Hajeian sees to the preparation and serving dealers and workers. Let us not forget the ever-ready Areknaz Sarajian who is always available for all our needs.

The MEMBERS ONLY FLEA MARKETS allow our own members to sell their items by renting tables at a nominal fee. Mary Shalakian has been handling the responsibilities of this phase of our operation.

Our RUMMAGE SALE was ably chaired by Rose Sahagian. We would like to remind our parishioners that clothing left from these sales are picked up by the Deacon of the St. Francis Workshop and distributed via a network of homeless shelters to the needy in these environs, then shipped to various areas of the United States and ultimately to the needy in Africa.

The Guild, once again, played Santa Claus and donated \$100.00 to the Division of Youth and Family Services to purchase toys for needy children in the Hudson County Area.

In February of this year, the Guild donated a total of \$15,000 to the Parish Council. Another \$5,000 is being given today with the request that all these monies be used towards refurbishing, replacing and purchasing new items needed in the Center and other areas of our Church.

Under the auspices of the Women's Guild Central Council and the approval of the Parish Council, our Guild sponsored a child, namely TIGRAN H0VHANNISIAN, through the CASP (Children of Armenia Sponsorship Program). Tigran is 8 years old. He lives with his father and brother in Yerevan (his mother is deceased). He will be sponsored by us until he reaches 18 years of age.

We continue to support our PROJECT SHARE whereby members and parishioners are urged to fill food baskets which are then distributed through the Division of Youth and Family Services to needy families with children.
