1995 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 12, 1995

The Annual Parish Assembly was held on February 12, 1995, at the Church Center.

The Meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM by Mr. Nubar Dorian, Parish Council Chairman. Our Pastor, the Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan presided.

Mr. Dorian asked for nominations for Chairman and Secretary of the Parish Assembly. Mr. Edward Sahagian and Ms Kay Derderian were elected Chairman and Secretary respectively.

The Chairman requested motion to close the ballot box. Motion was made and passed to close balloting at 1:15 PM.

The Chairman dispensed with the reading of the Minutes of the 1994 Meeting and invited our Parish Priest, the Very Rev. Fr. Vaxken Karayan to present his Report.

Hayr Soorp indicated it was a delight and privilege to serve the Holy Cross Church family, and proceeded to review his Report highlighting objectives.

- To continue to improve and strengthen the Saturday and Sunday Schools;
- To continue to provide linguistic and cultural and education, and religious and adult education through video;
- The importance of Christian education was stressed;
- Parents urged to bring children to school;
- Home visitations were made enroute to office or home;
- Pastoral visitations to Old Aged Home were uplifting and fruitful:
- All financial contributions were acknowledged re: ecclesiastical items;
- Lecture series well received and would continue.

Hayr Soorb acknowledged and expressed his appreciation to the Assembly and thanked all who helped and worked with him.

The Chairman then invited Mr. Nubar Dorian, Parish Council Chairman to present Report of the Parish Council.

Mr. Dorian reviewed the Report highlighting the acknowledgements and asked if there were any questions. There being none, the Chairman invited various Parish organizations to present their Reports.

<u>WOMEN'S GUILD</u>: Ms Arpena Sbarbaro reviewed the Report highlighting activities. She reported that the sum of \$7000.00 which should have been presented to Parish Council in 1995 was done so in 1994 in order to close Treasurer's books.

ARMENIAN SCHOOL: Mrs. Alice Yigitkurt reported the School had enjoyed a successful year due to the untiring efforts of Hayr Soorp and staff. Religious instructions were given. School has 30 students, 4 classrooms. Tuition is \$100.00 per student, including books. She appealed to the Assembly for renovations of classrooms, such as painting, etc. She reported that tentative plans were underway for the presentation of a play by a drama group from Bayside, to be held sometime in April as a Fund raising event.

The Chairman noted the tremendous job Mrs. Yigitkurt is doing and asked that we all extend our support, both morally and financially.

SUNDAY SCHOOL: Sylvia Bozoyan reviewed the Report and expressed appreciation and gratitude to Hayr Soorp who had been instrumental in the revitalization of the School. Because of his encouragement and implementation of new programs, enrollment had increased to 26 students.

SENIOR CITIZENS: Mrs. Bertha Najarian expressed appreciation to Pastor and Parish Council for their support, and to the members for their continued help and contributions.

CHOIR: Ms Ann Dadaian reviewed Report and thanked Pastor and Parish Council for their continued support. She invited all who enjoy singing to join the Choir and participate.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Harold Azmelian reviewed receipts and disbursements for the year 1994 and answered pertinent questions. The Report was accepted with appreciation.

ENDOWMENT FUND: Mr. Harold Azmelian presented the latest status of the Fund and answered questions raised. The Assembly thanked the Messrs. Harold Azmelian, Philip Arpiarian, and Armen Kalbian for overseeing our Endowment Fund in a most competent manner.

Mr. Sahadian invited the Treasurer Mr. Harold Azmelian to present the 1995 proposed Buddet (copy attached). After several clarifications and questions, the new Buddet was unanimously adopted.

OLD BUSINESS:

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- 1) Annual Christmas Party Taking into considerations the expense, parking, etc.. it was decided by unanimous vote not to hold a Christmas party.
- 2) Picnic Due to circumstances and our inability to sponsor joint picnic with St. Leon's Church in 1994, the matter came up for discussion. Street Fair was suggested. Motion made and passed to hold one in 1995.

The Chairman commended all the organizations for their tireless efforts during the past year.

NFW BUSINESS:

Mr. Sahagian introduced the following recommendations from Parish Council:

- 1) The adoption of separate dues of \$25.00 to be specifically designated as "Voting Membership Dues". We would still maintain the Annual Membership Dues and Pledge System, the Christmas and Easter Donations. Following discussion, motion was made and passed to adopt separate membership dues to be called "Voting Membership Dues" at \$25.00 per person, per annum.
- 2) To reduce the number of Parish Council members from 11 to 9 due to lack of interest was taken into consideration. Following vote the Parish Council membership will remain at 11.
- 3) Renovation of Center and Classrooms: A list of urgent renovations to the Center was called to the attention of the Assembly as were other renovations needed. Motion was made and passed to have Parish Council review the matter.

- 4) Recommendation by Mr. Nubar Dorian to move Annual Assembly in 1996 from the month of February to the month of March, citing inclement weather as the reason was approved with motion made and passed accordingly.
- 5) Armenian Missionary Fund:
 Mr. Philip Arpiarian reported the amount of \$10,600.00 in the Fund, and recommended \$5000.00 be given to FAR (Fund for Armenian Relief); \$4000.00 to Armenia Fund, and the balance to the Japanese Earthquake Relief. The reason for this one time donation to the Japanese Relief Fund was in response to the generous donations made by the Japanese people to the Armenian earthquake of 1988. This recommendation was enthusiastically received and unanimously approved.

ELECTION RESULTS:

Mr. Sahagian asked Mr. Philip Arpiarian, Nominating Committee Chairman, for the results of the election. Mr Arpiarian reported 50 ballots were cast with one write-in-vote. Results follow:

Thanks to Sunday School Superintendent - Sylvia Bozoyan - and a dedicated staff, our Sunday School doors are wide open every Sunday. Our mission is to impart the best Christian education to our precious children in order to guide them in Christ's footsteps.

On numerous occasions we contacted parents whose children were absent by phone and in person. We indicated and alarmed them about the importance and the necessity of Christian education and urged them to bring their children to Sunday School EVERY SUNDAY ON TIME!

On June 4, 1995, the Sunday School was extremely proud to graduate Caroline Ak, Tanya Gullep, and Berta Yigitkurt.

ACYOA

The re-established ACYOA was active and busy with chocolate sales and social programs throughout the year. On different occasions as a group, we had the opportunity to socialize. Their activites included trips to Central Park and ice-skating at Rockefeller Center in New York City as well as having a pizza party.

CLERGY MEETINGS

We attended clergy meetings monthly in different parishes to discuss past and present pastoral, spiritual, doctrinal, and canonical issues. We have to admit that we all have the same positive and negative issues in each parish. These meetings were extremely informative and enlightening. This was an opportunity to share our concerns, problems, and difficulties in order to improve the quality of life in every community.

VISITATIONS

We had the privilege to be invited by parishioners to visit over 38 families and meet their family members on different occasions. During our pastoral visitations, our aim was a) to emphasize the mission of the Armenian Church and their vital role and contribution as parishioners in the Church's life. b) To urge the family members to attend Church services, enroll their children in our Mesrobian Armenian and Sunday Schools, and attend our Church. c) To remind them that the success and the perpetuation of this divine and sacred institution is solely dependent on them. In short, we ask them to keep the torch lit. Not responding to our visitation requests due to their busy schedule and personal reasons, some families were contacted by phone. At times, some pastoral requests were unfortunately visitation neglected. Occasionally, we accommodated parishioners by visiting them during business hours in their place of work. The purpose was to inform them that we were aware and concerned about their absence from Church.

Hospital visitations were made periodically upon request and voluntary. We visited more than 27 patients at their convenience providing them with prayers, Holy Communion, and pastoral counseling. The first Tuesday of each was reserved for pastoral visitation to the Armenian Old Age Home in Emerson, NJ conducting morning services, delivered homilies, and gave Holy Communion. Our pastoral visitations were uplifting, encouraging, and fruitful. We provided our pastoral spiritual care and counseling for those who were willing to seek help and guidance. We graciously acknowledge those who expressed their appreciation and made positive comments in person and by phone.

LECTURE SERIES

During the year, we had the following successful video presentations and lectures: Elise Antreasian, Director of Religious Education of our Diocese, led the faithful through the Divine Liturgy in narrated form; The Very Rev. Dr. Fr. Krikor Maksoudian, Director of the Zohrab and Clara Information Center, lectured on "The Election of the Catholicoi - Past and Present"; and Julie Ashekian, director of Children of Armenia Sponshorship Program (CASP), gave a video presentation on this project.

BAZAAR AND 50/50 RAFFLE

These activities were extremely successful due to Dr. Edward Sahagian and Philip Arpiarian's efficiency and hard work. Guests enjoyed the evening's entertainment, food, and especially, each other's company.

VISION & SUNDAY BULLETIN

Vision is the official newspaper of our parish which is a bridge of communication to convey pastoral messages and to inform about community activities in English and Armenian. As we promised in the passed we improved the quality and the content. Certainly we all felt and enjoyed the great progress and change. We proudly acknowledge and appreciate compliments from our parishioners as well as non-parishioners. Likewise, the Sunday Bulletin is neat and in great shape.

We wish our faithful a Happy, Healthy and Prosperous Year and are looking forward to working with you for the Glory of God.

1994 PARISH ASSEMBLY - The minutes of the Parish Assembly held on February 12, 1995, are included in the Annual Report. Issues discussed at the Assembly requiring action by Parish Council were carried out as follows:

- a. <u>Christmas Party</u> Based on the last Annual Parish Assembly decision, the Christmas Party wasn't held this year. It is up to this Assembly to reconsider last year's decision.
- b. <u>Voting Members</u> The Annual Membership meeting has adopted "voting membership dues of \$ 25." The Parish Council instituted this procedure and commencing with this Parish Assembly, only those who have paid or identified \$ 25. membership dues were permitted to vote.
- c. <u>Parish Council Members</u> The proposal to have nine instead of eleven members to constitute the Parish Council having been defeated, the Parish Council directed the Nominating Committee to bring in the number of nominees accordingly.
- d. <u>Armenian Missionary Fund</u> Based on the decision of the Annual Assembly, the \$10,600. in the Armenian Missionary Fund last year was distributed as follows:

Fund for Armenian Relief (FAR) \$5,000. Armenia Fund \$4,000.

Japanese Earthquake Fund \$1,600. (balance)

The latter is to be a one time donation in response to the generous donation Japanese people made to the Armenian Earthquake of 1988.

e. <u>Parish Assembly Date</u> - Responding to the wishes of last Assembly, the Parish Council changed the date of the Annual Membership meeting from February to March.

<u>CHURCH PROPERTIES</u> - Harold Azmelian, Andrew Avedisian, and Pablo Taura, caretaker, continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center, and the Parish House. During the year the following repairs were made:

1. Church

- rest rooms were renovated

 Armenian School / Sunday School rooms were painted during the summer

2. Parish House

- new ceiling in one room of the Church office

wasfixed

- hallway was painted

- new linoleum was replaced in the hallway

3. Church Center

- new gate at the entrance doors

<u>PICNIC</u> - Due to lack of communication and circumstance beyond our control, we were unable to have a picnic.

<u>BAZAAR</u> - Once again the Bazaar, held on October 27 and 28, was successful socially as well as financially. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the Chairman, Dr. Ed Sahagian and all those who contributed to help make the Bazaar both enjoyable and profitable.

<u>VISION</u> - Our pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan, as editor of the VISION with the assistance of Ann Dadaian and Arpena Sbarbaro once again sacrificed a great deal of time and effort to ensure the printing of the VISION on a regular basis. Upon the recommendation of our pastor, it was decided to change the VISION from monthly to every two months with more interesting contents and additional pages. You have already received the first two issues of the VISION and to date the acceptance has been excellent. Hayr Soorp is responsible for the success of the VISION.

SUNDAY BULLETIN - As in former years, the Sunday Bulletin was distributed every Sunday to those attending Church services. Each issue was replete with current information on Church activities, simple explanation of the meaning of each Sunday and other pertinent matters of interest such as listings of Hokehankisd to our Church members. Our pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan, deserves special thanks for undertaking this important task. The new format of the Sunday Bulletin was introduced by our Pastor with a lot more interesting and inspiring messages and details.

<u>ARMENIAN SCHOOL</u> - Alice Yigitkurt, Superintendent, along with three teachers made this year's Armenian School a truly a successful one. Parish Council continued to underwrite the expenses of salaries and the weekly bus service cost. More details are available under the Armenian School report.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> - Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan and Sylvia Bozoyan, our superintendent, made it a priority to have a viable Sunday School. Fortunately their efforts succeeded in increasing the total enrollment to 26 students. In addition to Sylvia Bozoyan, the present teaching staff consists of Phil Arpiarian, Nubar Dorian, Caroline Ak, and Arthur Manoukian (during the Spring semester).

<u>RAFFLE</u> - Phil Arpiarian and Arto Çan, chairmen, did a superlative job in attending to all the details of the raffle and once again 300 tickets were sold and the Church's income was in excess of \$ 15,000. Following the success of the previous year, the raffle was held during our annual Bazaar instead of the usual raffle drawing reception held in previous years.

<u>ENDOWMENT FUND</u> - As the annual report of the Endowment Fund indicates, we had excellent results with our Endowment Fund. This is due to the efforts of Harold Azmelian as chairman and Armen Kalbian and Phil Arpiarian as members of the Endowment Fund committee.

<u>DINNER DANCE</u> - On Saturday, June 17, 1995, the Mesrobian Armenian School sponsored a dinner dance co-chaired magnificently by Alice Yigitkurt and Apo Boghosian to raise money for the school. Their deligence and hard work made this a sold-out event which featured MANUEL and Jacques Kodjian.

Parish Council thanks Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan, our pastor, who during the past year gave us continued spiritual leadership and attended to the needs of the Parish.
