1997 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING February 8, 1998

The annual Parish Assembly meeting was convened immediately following Church Services. The Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr. Nubar Dorian, conducted the meeting. The Chairman asked for nominations for the chairman and secretary for the Parish Assembly. Mr. Nubar Dorian and Mr. Philip Arpiarian were unanimously elected to the positions of Chairman and Secretary, respectively.

The meeting was adjourned to the Church Center and reconvened at 1:15PM, with the Very Rev. Vazken Karayan, presiding as President of the Assembly.

Following a prayer, a motion was made and passed to close the ballot box at 1:30PM.

The current number of voting members is 95. A total of 45 voting members voted, which represents 47%, constituting a quorum. In addition to the 45 voting members, there were 18 non-voting members for a total of 63.

The Chairman dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the 1996 Annual Assembly and then invited Hayr Soorp to present his annual

Hayr Soorp commented on several significant issues, namely:

- Ordination or Acolytes
- Holy Cross Name Day Dinner
- Women's Guild contributions to the Church
- Organization of the Armenian Youth Group
- The Akhtamar Dance Group now sponsored by Holy Cross
- Acknowledged the work of the Parish Council and Parishioners

The Chairman added some comments relating to the organizing meetings which were held regarding the Armenian Youth Organization (AYO), and then entertained a motion which was seconded to accept the AYO as an affiliate organization of the Holy Cross Armenian Church. The motion was passed. Mr. Dorian then invited the Chairman of the group, Mr. Pierre Berberoglu to make a few comments. Mr. Berberoglu thanked the Assembly and said they were ready to work in support of the Church.

The Chairman dispensed with the reading of the report except for the acknowledgements. The Chair was questioned regarding the Christmas party which was not held during the year. A motion was made and passed directing the new Parish Council to organize and conduct a Christmas Party in 1998. A motion was and seconded to conduct the 50/50 Raffle on a different night than the Bazaar. Motion was defeated.

AUDITING COMMITTEE

Ms. Lucy Bozoian reported that all the accounts of the organizations: Parish Council, Women's Guild, Sunday School, Senior Citizens and Choir were in order and complimented all the Treasurers for their excellent work.

ENDOWMENT FUND (attached)

The Endowment Fund report was distributed to those present at the Assembly. Mr. Azmelian highlighted some of the important issues:

- Endowment Fund return 1997 was 10.23%
- \$50,000 was transferred from the Fund to the Church to cover operating expenses
- \$3,550 was donated by parishioners to the Fund in 1997.
- The current value of the Fund is \$1,561,214.56

1998 BUDGET

Ms. Mary Shalakian presented the 1998 Budget. The parishioners <u>increased</u> the budget in the following areas:

- \$20,000 building improvements with a top priority on replacing the Altar curtains. Other items approved included new chairs for the Church Annex, new curtain for Church Center, new stoves in Center kitchen, and a freezer for the Center.
- \$2,500 donations to St. Nersess and St. James Seminaries.

NEW BUSINESS

The Assembly moved and passed the following:

- Directive to Parish Council to put <u>parking facilities</u> as one of the top priority items.
- Directive to actively investigate why some of the Church members are no longer active in Holy Cross and where they now attend Church services.
- Increase dues new schedule of dues to be \$100.00 per person with the exception of Senior who will pay \$50.00 per person. (A motion to increase dues to \$75.00 per person was defeated).
- Directive to Parish Council to conduct a Christmas Party (on a Sunday following Church services with a nominal charge).

1997 PARISH ASSEMBLY - The minutes of the Parish Assembly held on February 8, 1998, are included in the Annual Report. The following issues were voted for this year:

- 1. <u>Christmas Party</u> A directive to Parish Council to conduct a Christmas Party on a Sunday following Church services with a nominal charge.
- 2. <u>Membership Dues</u> Increase dues to \$100.00 per person with the exception of a Senior Citizen who will pay \$50.00 per person
- 3. <u>50/50 Raffle</u> A directive to Parish Council that it should be conducted during the Bazaar and <u>not</u> on a different night
- 4. <u>**Parking</u>** Directive to Parish Council to put parking facilities as one of the top priority items.</u>

- 5. **Building Improvements** Top priority will be given to replacing the Altar curtains. Other items included new stoves and a freezer in Center kitchen.
- 6. <u>Computer</u> A new computer and accessories will be purchased for the Church office.

<u>**CHURCH PROPERTIES</u>** - Andrew Avedesian, Zaven Hovsepian and Pablo Taura, caretaker, continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center, and the Parish House. During the year the following repairs, renovations and additions took place:</u>

- 1. Church Center new dishwasher with automatic soap & detergent dispenser
 - new freezer (48 cubic feet)
 - new microwave
 - new exhaust fan in kitchen area
 - new fully automatic coffee machine (to be replaced)
 - new hot water heater
 - major electrical work updating faulty wiring

HOLY CROSS NAME DAY BANQUET - On Sunday, October 18, 1998, our Church celebrated Holy Cross Name Day. Upon the request of our Pastor, His Eminence Khajag Archbishop Barsamian, Primate, celebrated Divine Liturgy. Following the Badarak, His Eminence gracefully ordained two dedicated altar servers, Hacik Sariminasyan and Hovhannes Hovsepian, as sub-deacons. During the Banquet at the Church Center, the following dedicated parishioners of Holy Cross Church were honored: Dn. Hagop Hovsepian, Areknaz Sarajian, Alice Najarian, Arpena Sbarbaro, Alice Yigitkurt, Richard Tarzian and Sylvia Bozoyan. Ann Dadaian, Banquet Chairlady, and all the committee members made this unforgettable event a huge success.

BAZAAR - The Bazaar, held on October 30 and October 31, was one of the best bazaars we have had, both socially as well as financially, due to the hard work of chairlady, Alice Bozoyan. The Women's Guild contributed a great deal of time, effort, and expertise for its success as well.

<u>PICNIC</u> - Since we were not able to reserve a Sunday in June at St. Leon's Church in Fair Lawn, we scheduled to hold the picnic on Sunday, July 12 on their grounds. Unfortunately being the middle of the summer with many parishioners on vacation, the picnic was cancelled. We hope to continue to have our picnics every year following the tradition of holding it on the first Sunday in June or possibly the second Sunday.

<u>RAFFLE</u> - On Friday evening, November 6, the drawing of the 50/50 Raffle took place in the Church Center. Philip Arpiarian, chairman, with Alice Yigitkurt, co-chairlady, did a wonderful job in attending to all the details of the raffle and once again 300 tickets were sold with the Church's income in excess of \$14,000. We also express our appreciation to all those who helped sell these tickets: Philip Arpiarian, Harold Azmelian, Apo Boghossian, Arto Can, Charles Genjian, Zaven Hovsepian, Armen Kalbian, Yetkin Pashalian, and Alice and Migir Yigitkurt.

ARMENIAN SCHOOL DINNER-DANCE - On Saturday, May 30, the Armenian School sponsored a dinner-dance as a fund-raiser with Alice Yigitkurt as its chairlady.

<u>CHRISTMAS</u> PARTY - Christmas party was cancelled since the three major social functions (Holy Cross Name Day, Bazaar and the 50/50 Raffle) were scheduled too close to one another.

<u>VISION</u> - Our pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan, as editor of the VISION, with the assistance of Ann Dadaian and Sylvia Bozoyan once again have done an outstanding job in preparing the VISION. The new format of the VISION, printed every two months, continues to be very appealing and extremely well received by the readers. In addition to Sylvia Bozoyan, the teaching staff consisted of Caroline Ak, Tanya Gullep and Diane Pekmezian (Spring semester) and during the Fall semester - Nubar Dorian and Melissa Kulhanjian.

MAYOR RAUL RUDY GARCIA - Newly elected Mayor of Union City, his wife Nicole, and Board of Education member, Lenny Calvo participated in prayers during Divine Liturgy on Palm Sunday, April 5.

WOMEN'S GUILD: As pastor, we attended Women's Guild meetings, whenever possible, to provide guidance, assistance and support. We also took time to offer presentations on different church related topics and subjects. As in the past, once again this year, we graciously acknowledge their generous donation of \$10,000.00. For their tremendous and outstanding God-pleasing mission they certainly deserve our blessings and sincere appreciation.

SENIOR CITIZENS: Occasionally on Tuesdays, Senior Citizens met in the Church Annex for socialization. We gladly took time to visit and socialize with them. It was a gratifying feeling to see them healthy and in good spirits.

MESROBIAN ARMENIAN SCHOOL: Our primary and ultimate aim was and always will be to provide the best linguistic and cultural education to our students. For years we took the initiative to teach religious and cultural courses every Saturday. Under our pastoral care and supervision Saturdays School is functioning. Due to lack of parental efforts, our students enrollment unfortunately declined. This, however, does NOT mean that we will cease from our mission and responsibilities by closing the school down. On the contrary, we must perpetuate and pursue our goal in increasing the enrollment and provide cultural and linguistic education. I urge you not to be spectators; but, supporters. Alice Yigitkurt submitted her letter of resignation as of June. We deeply appreciate the commitment of outgoing superintendent Alice Yigitkurt and outstanding dedication of the teaching staff: Sela Nazarian, Maggie Nazarian, Haiganush Cehreci (Spring Semester) and assistant, Lena Khorozian. We also extend our gratitude to those who provided car pooling for students.

SUNDAY SCHOOL: As pastor and teachers, our mission is to impart the best Christian education to our children so they can grow spiritually in Christian manner and follow Christ's footsteps. This past year our Sunday School enrollment was 19 registered students. However, the enrollment fluctuated – not because we lack in our responsibilities; but, because of the parents who come with endless excuses. Countless times we contacted parents urging them to bring their children to Sunday School. This year we are fortunate to have Diane Pekmezian (Spring Semester) and Melissa Kulhanjian (Fall Semester) be part of our Sunday School staff. Thanks to our talented, committed and dedication Sunday School Superintendent, Sylvia Bozoyan, our Sunday School doors are wide open. She certainly deserves our sincere and deepest appreciation for her superb and outstanding job. If it wasn't for her, we would not be able to have a Sunday School. She deserves credit beyond credit.

CLERGY MEETINGS: Almost every other month we attended clergy meetings in different parishes to discuss about the past and the future of the Armenian Church. During these clergy meetings, cultural, spiritual, pastoral, canonical, doctrinal, administrative and financial issues are discussed. In addition to that, Armenia and Jerusalem were discussed in detail – particularly the topic of a Pilgrimage to Jerusalem in the year 2000. Needless to say, the Centennial Anniversary of the Eastern Diocese of North America was a main topic. Furthermore, as in the past, the lack of the youth and faithful within the Armenian Church is still the grave concern of the clergy. These meetings were not only enlightening and informative; but, also gave an opportunity to share our grave concerns in order to improve the quality of life in each and every parish community.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS: For pastoral visitations we have been invited by many parishioners on both good or bad, happy or sad occasions - such as baptisms, birthdays, graduations, sweet sixteen's, engagements, weddings, anniversaries, home and store blessings, funerals and Karasoonks. During our pastoral visitations our aim and goal was: a) To emphasize the mission of the Armenian Apostolic Church and their vital role as well as to participate and contribute as parishioners in the Church's life. b) To urge families to attend Church services, enroll their children in Mesrobian Armenian and Sunday Schools. c) To instruct and remind them that the success and the perpetuation of this divine and sacred institution depends and lies solely on them and to enroll them as Church members. Not responding to our visitation requests due to their busy schedule and personal reasons, some families were contacted by phone. At times, some pastoral visitation requests were

unfortunately either canceled, postponed or simply neglected. Occasionally we accommodated parishioners by visiting them during business hours in their place of work. The purpose was to inform them that we were aware and concerned about their absence from Church. Hospital and Nursing Home visitations were our priority and were made periodically upon request and voluntary. We visited patients at their convenience providing them with Prayers, Holy Communion, Pastoral and spiritual counseling. We made sure to schedule our monthly visitation to the Armenian Old Age Home in Emerson, NJ conducting morning services, delivered homilies and gave Holy Communion. The faithful, on numerous occasions, brought to our attention that our pastoral visitations were uplifting, encouraging, and fruitful. We didn't hesitate to provide our pastoral and spiritual care for those who were eager and willing to seek assistance and guidance during emotional, physiological, financial and spiritual times. We graciously acknowledge those who expressed their appreciation and positive commitment and remarks in person and in writing.

VISION AND SUNDAY BULLETIN: Our official newspaper, VISION, is a bridge to communicate and convey pastoral messages and to inform about community activities to our parishioners in English and Armenian as the quality and the contents have been improved. Our informative and enlightening VISION and Sunday Bulletin are appreciated by both clergy and lay people. We humbly and proudly acknowledge and appreciate compliments and the generous donations from our parishioners as well as our friends.

AGHTAMAR DANCE GROUP: The Aghtamar Dance Group, under the capable, talented and dedicated director and instructor, Sylva Assadourian, had an outstanding performance on Sunday, May 3rd, in the Church Center following Church Services before an audience of nearly 200 guests. They also presented a spectacular selection of dances at the Holy Cross Name Day Celebration.

AREMENIAN YOU'TH ORGANIZATION (AYO): As pastor we attended their meetings to provide assistance and guidance in their endeavors. We are proud to inform to our community that AYO had orientation, increased their membership to nearly 50, organized picnics and sponsored the New Year's Eve Party in our Church Center with an outstanding number in attendance. During our pastoral visitations to newlywed's houses, we urged them to attend Church and support community activities. We deeply commend their success and financial support to Holy Cross Armenian Church.

RELIGIOUS, CULTURAL & SOCAIL EVENTS

BIBLE STUDY: We have conducted Bible Study classes periodically. The first five books of the Holy Bible (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy) were interpreted. In addition, we have studied the Gospel of St. Matthew and emphasized historical, cultural, theological, ethical and social issues. The Divine Miracles performed by Jesus was the core interpretation of this Gospel.

HOLY CROSS NAME DAY CELEBRATION AND ORDINATION: His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian was the celebrant on Sunday, October 18th, on the occasion of Holy Cross Name Day. Following the Badarak, His Eminence ordained Hacik Sariminasyan and Hovhannes Hovsepian as Sub-Deacons.
