# THE ST. THOMAS ARMENIAN CHURCH PARISH COUNCIL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1971

We are happy to report that the year 1971 proved to be another successful one for St. Thomas Armenian Church. We were able to meet our financial obligations, maintain and improve our Church property, increase our membership, and continue to serve our Parishioners spiritually. This was accomplished during a year in which our country went through an economic recession, where unemployment in our geographic area was severe, and where the population in general reduced its spending in response to the economic uncertainties both at home and abroad.

We are proud of these accomplishments because they were made possible through the combined efforts of the dedicated members of our Church Organization, the Parish Council, Father Arnak Kasparian, and our Parishioners.

Immediately after the Parish Assembly elected the members to the Parish Council for the year 1971, the Parish Council was organized. We would like you to know the members of the Parish Council and the positions they held during the past year.

#### THE PASTOR'S REPORT

a) <u>Worship Services</u> have been conducted every Sunday from 10:30 a.m. to noon, with the celebration of the Divine Liturgy and a sermon. During the year, we had as guest celebrants: Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, on the occasion of our sixth anniversary of the consecration of the church; we also had Reverend Vasken Karagazian of Armenia on June 6, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan on June 13, and Reverend Levon Arakelian on October 10. Fr. Arnak Kasparian celebrated Badarak at the Home in Emerson twice, on Armenian Christmas day and on Maundy Thursday of Holy Week. He also had Grape Blessing services at the Home. On Armenian Christmas we had the Gomidas Choir.

b) <u>Sacramental Services</u>. During the year, 23 baptisms were performed (compared to 21 last year): 14 marriages were blessed (14 the previous two years); 11 funerals took place (8 last year). We shall cherish the memories of Martin Goomrigian, Isabel Kratlian, Armenuhi Tatarian and Khosrof Attarian who were members of our Parish.

c) <u>Administrative</u>. As ex-officio president of all Church organizations, Rev. Arnak Kasparian attended and presided over all the meetings. He directed and advised and, in many cases, he helped in implementing decisions. He attended the Diocesan Assembly in **Mystreal**, Canada with our delegates: Edward Bashian, Vahan Najarian, Nazar Nazarian; and Richard Turnamian.

d) <u>Publications</u>. With the help of Yeretzgin Violet, Fr. Arnak publishes the Bergen Beacon monthly and puts out the flyers for our various affairs. Mrs. Martha Saraydarian, Mrs. Mary Ann Saraydarian and Mrs. Jaime Ohanian have been most helpful in assisting with typing, addressing, and various other office work whenever called upon. Our heartfelt thanks for their cheerful assistance. Our mailing list is approximately 890 addresses.

Our Pastor has been reelected as the President of the Tenafly Clergy Fellowship. On many occasions, Der Hayr has led various groups on tour of the church telling them about the Armenian Church in general and St. Thomas in particular.

The Pastor wishes to bring to your attention that an examination of this annual report reveals the obvious fact that each of the branches of our church organization has been rather successful.

During the past year, to say the least, all church activities have been operating and run in a most harmonious manner with a minimum of friction usually present as a natural part of the operations of a church. This has been largely due to the type of leadership we have had. All the members and officers of the **Parish** Council have contributed to making this a successful year.

A very special tribute must be paid to the untiring efforts of our Chairman, Vahan Najarian, who has shown tact, diplomacy, and an understanding of the problems that confronted us during the past twelve months. Without his faithful and guiding leadership we would not have had a successful year.

#### REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEES

<u>Membership</u>: Since our last parish assembly meeting, 9 new families have been added to our Membership list which now totals 239 families. We thank Fr. Arnak Kasparian for his concerted efforts to encourage new families to join our Parish.

# Coordinator of Church Activities and Rental of Church Property: The responsibility for

this function rests with one individual, who performs it so smoothly and with so little fanfare that his efforts go almost unnoticed. Mr. Arthur Otchy has done another tremendous job for our Church this past year. We express our thanks to him and hope that he continues in this capacity for many years.

Building and Grounds; Improvements made to our Church grounds were primarily the result of the personal efforts of Mr. Ray Kreppel. This year, as in past years, he has worked many hours to beautify our Church grounds. He has delivered many truckloads of fill, leveled it with his bulldozer, and has taken steps to preserve our trees. Dedicated and perservering men such as Ray are rare; our Church is truly fortunate to have him.

The Asbeds of St. Vartanantz have offered to contribute 50% of the cost of draperies for our Church auditorium and the two adjacent rooms. The Parish Council has accepted this generous offer and is moving ahead with plans to buy the draperies. The draperies will certainly enhance the appearance of our Church. They will have the added benefits of improving the acoustics of the auditorium and reducing our heating bills in the colder months.

The Parish Council currently has under review the insurance policy which covers the Church and the parsonage. We seek to know the details of our coverage so that we may determine if it covers the replacement cost of our Church. Based upon our findings, we may increase the coverage in order to protect our investment.

<u>Pledges</u>: The pledge program made positive strides in 1971 under the capable leadership of Mr. Hagop Jebejian. He focused his attention upon increasing the pledges and upon following up with gentle reminders to those who were in arrears. The Parish Council feels that his program still has an enormous room for growth. This form of financial support is essential if our Church is to become more financially sound, and less dependent upon special activities to meet its annual expenses.

# PARISH COUNCIL SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

The Parish Council had the responsibility of being in charge of two major events this past year. They were as follows:

A. The Sixth Anniversary Dinner on March 7, 1971. This annual dinner marking the anniversary of our Church is a team effort where every Church organization is involved. As in the past, the Anniversary dinner was a social and financial success. The Chairman of the Dinner was Zaven Poosikian. The principal speakers were our Primate Archbishop Torkom Manoogian and Victor Arzoomanian. The highlights of the afternoon was the presentation of the St. Thomas Armenian Church Plaque to Victor Arzoomanian for outstanding service to our Church, and the presentation of the Primate's Commendation to Mrs. Floraine Halejian for outstanding service to the A.C.Y.O.A.

B. The Annual Bazaar was co-chaired by Mr. Albert Keusey and Mrs. Dorothy Stchy. Under the able leadership of these two individuals, the Bazaar netted over \$11,000. for our Church.

During the year the Parish Council sought new ways to bring our Church community closer together. The following steps were taken:

- 1. The Men's Club, Women's Guild, and A.C.Y.O.A. meetings were held on the same evenings, with a joint activity following the individual meetings.
- 2. Dick Barnett of the New York Knickerbockers Basketball team spoke to a large group of fathers and sons in our Church auditorium in May.
- 3. A "Get to know your fellow parishioners" Cocktail Party was held in October.
- 4. Coffee and cake has been served after Church services.
- 5. A concert was held in our Church in January with talented Armenian artists performing.
- 6. A monthly dinner program has been established by Sonia Keusey and Yeretzgin.

The Parish Council has under consideration other activities which we hope will be equally well received.

#### CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS

The Parish Council graciously acknowledges and thanks the many individuals who have worked so diligently in our Church Organizations. From the organizations' reports that are appended to this publication, you will agree that we have the most intelligent, devoted, and successful leaders and assistants working for the good of our Church. We are happy to state that each of our organizations has made large contributions both in services and in finances during the period of this report. We are grateful to all the groups. ## RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE :---

We have set forth the following recommendations which we feel should be a guide to the incoming Parish Council.

- 1. Develop a formal Membership Program. Have one individual in charge as a permanent chairman.
- 2. Work towards getting the newly formed Building and Finance Committee off the ground.
- 3. Continue the program to increase the pledges and develop a follow-up system to promote collections.
- 4. See that the plans to A) erect a "St. Thomas Armenian Church" sign outside the Church, and B) install the draperies are achieved.
- 5. Complete a booklet about St. Thomas Armenian Church to include the story depicted in our windows.
- 6. Looking into the feasibility of hiring a full time caretaker.
- 7. Look into the feasibility of hiring a part time secretary.

Rather than express our thanks to specific individuals and run the risk of unintentionally omitting deserving names, we would like to express our sincere thanks to all those who have given of themselves in the Service of our Churchi
