ARMENIAN CHURCHES SPORTS ASSOCIATION

St. Thomas with six other Armenian Churches in the metropolitan New York-New Jersey area has formed a sports association during this last year. The association is run by a council made up of representatives from the member churches. St. Thomas is represented by Jack Tatarian, Dick Kabobjian and Vahan Zarifian. During the season, there is a basketball game every Sunday. For home games the Ft.Lee Intermediate School gym is used. We also have an excellent cheerleading squad. At the end of the season we have an annual all star tournament.

In 1968 we also had a track and field meet at Roosevelt Stadium in Union City at which there were over 100 participants from all the churches. This will be an annual activity of the association.

The purpose of this association is to bring the Armenian youth together and create better relations among all the Armenian churches of this metropolitan area.

After an initial entry fee of \$250 there is an additional \$100 annual assessment for expenses, paid by all participating churches to cover insurance, gym, professional referees, uniforms, etc. ;
