THE 1982 PASTOR'S REPORT

This year is a milestone in my pastorate, with 21 years of service in this Parish. These were 21 wonderful years for me and my family. It fills my heart with gratitude and thanksgiving towards God and my St. Thomas family.

St. Thomas has grown in serving our people and has become one of the outstanding churches of our Diocese. Of course, there is always room for improvement, but, in general, I am happy to report that by the Grace of God we have completed another fruitful year. We have a concerned, dedicated and dependable group on which we rely and give thanks for the life in the Church. We have a small group who are here every Sunday and they keep the doors of the Church open for worship. We have a small group who are the backbone of the physical existence of this Parish. Whether in office or out of office they cherish the well being this Church, and, unfortunately, sometimes we take them for granted. A heartfelt "Thank God" for these people. Our thanks go to the Church auxiliary groups and special commendation goes to our Parish Council for their fine cooperation and work. Each group has submitted its report separately. I will report to you mainly about the sacramental and pastoral activities of the past year.

WORSHIP SERVICES have been conducted every Sunday from 10:30 a.m. to noon, with the celebration of the Divine Liturgy and a sermon. During the year we had as guest celebrant Archbishop Torkom Manoogian on Palm Sunday when we celebrated the anniversary of the consecration of our Church. While I was in Armenia, Rev. Nerses Jebejian was our guest celebrant. On November 14 Very Rev. Mesrob Krikorian of Austria, Nuncio of the Catholicos for Central Europe celebrated Divine Liturgy.

During the year I invited Deacons Michael Chevian and Joseph Kalemkerian, Louise Kalemkerian, Sirarpie Feredjian, and Peter Jamgochian to deliver the message for the day.

SACRAMENTAL SERVICES: During the year 36 baptisms were performed (compared to 39 last year); 16 marriages were blessed (18 the previous year); 19 funerals took place, (20 last year).

Michael was a member of our Choir for many years. Eloise A. Stepanian, daughter-in-law of Anne Stepanian and sister-in-law of Rosanne Saxenian; Hamaspure Barikyan, mother of Arto Barikyan. We also mourn the passing of Haig Markarian, husband of Ann. Haig was instrumental in the inception of this Parish.

ADMINISTRATIVE: As ex-officio president of all church organizations, I attended most of the meetings. I directed and advised and, in many cases, helped in implementing decisions. I attended the Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly in New Britain, Connecticut.

PUBLICATIONS: We have published the Bergen Beacon Monthly and put out flyers for our various affairs. Each month our Beacon is mailed to our college students residing on campus. A special thanks to Mary Ann Saraydarian for editing our Beacon. Susan Stoneson has been setting the type for us for the Beacon.

We thank Roseanne Arzoomanian for making the "Mahs" for us every Sunday.

We also thank Ronald Kenderian and Victor Arzoomanian, cochairmen of Bazaar '82. We also thank Edward Bashian for more than doubling our Bazaar profits through his rug sales.

This year there has been more enthusiasm shown by our Parishioners to volunteer and accomplish projects. This is due to the Parish Council, but particularly by the leadership of Peter Ajemian. Peter has brought a fresh approach with his ability, experience, and humor.

Despite the economic conditions that prevail throughout the country and the world, we, at St. Thomas Armenian Church, enjoyed a very productive year. With the guidance of our President and religious leader, Rev. Arnak Kasparian, the Parish Council managed the business and the activities of our Parish and Church. Many of our annual fund raising events fell short this year, not only due to the economic conditions, but due to the fact that times are changing, and that we do need alternate methods of income so that we will not have to rely on the events in order to fund our Church. PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS & COMMUNICATIONS

The Parish Council met every second and fourth Tuesday as scheduled twelve months of the year. We started all of our meetings on time, and enjoyed good attendance throughout the year. The meetings of the Parish Council were presided over by the President, Rev. Arnak Kasparian and conducted by the Chairman, Peter Ajemian. The Council meetings were open to all interested individuals, Trustees, Delegates and Parish related organizations. The Parish Council also attended meetings of the Church Organizations in order that we may establish closer ties with them. We had two additional Parish Assemblies this year in order to get our new building project under way. They were held on May 23 and September 26, 1982.

PARISH COUNCIL RELATED ACTIVITIES

BUILDING COMMITTEE Nazar Nazarian, Chmn. Vahan Najarian, Co-Chmn.

The St. Thomas Building Committee was formed this past summer following our Parish Assembly in late May 1982. This Committee has met regularly with heads of our parish organizations to find out their needs so that we can incorporate them into our plans. The following members head this group: Nazar Nazarian, Chairman; Vahan Najarian, Co-Chairman and Treasurer; Michel Izmirly, Secretary; Richard Turnamian, Finance and Fund Raising Chairman; and many professional members of our Church offering their services for this project. We have a more detailed report by the Committee in this Parish Assembly Report.

MEMORIAIS COMMITTEE Edward G. Bashian, Chairman

This latent committee was revived after laying dormant for many years. Already a few unsponsored Memorials were sponsored and we hope that this Committee can generate additional funds for our Church. If you would like to participate in this project, please contact the Committee and lend your support.

ACYOA SENIORS Douglas Tashjian, Chairman

The ACYOA Sr. group was formed during this past summer by a group of past ACYOA Jr. members who now reside in the New York-New Jersey Metropolitan area. After preliminary organizational meetings this group highlighted the year with a successful New Year's Eve Dance where the youth of all the Armenian Churches in our area attended. We congratulate the committee for their success which only comes with good planning and hard work.

ST. NERSESS ARMENIAN SEMINARY Lillian Kasparian, Chairperson

The need for more clergy has now become critical, in our Diocese and throughout the world. Lillian Kasparian is the St. Thomas liaison with the St. Nersess Armenian Seminary and her function is to raise funds so that we may support this worthy project. The Parish Council has made provisions in our new budget for this group. However, we still would like to create additional funds so more seminarians may be accommodated.

ST. THOMAS TRUSTEES Edward G. Bashian, Chairman

During the course of this past year, the Trustees met regularly, and with the Parish Council when necessary. Ed Bashian has been very helpful to the Council, and through his experience we were able to tie up many of the loose ends that existed. The Trustees have taken care of our investments, consolidated all of our funds so that we gain maximum interest for our monies. The Trustees also make up the core of our Building Committee, and help conduct the "Cake Sales" during the year.

STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

The Stewardship Program is one where a member of the Church will make it a practice of giving of one's talents, time and material possessions back to God. At the outset of this report I indicated that we need an alternate source of income so that we will not have to rely on fund raising events. The Stewardship Program is that alternate source, and with the help of our St. Thomas Parish we hope that we will be able to institute this program in the near future.

ST. THOMAS ARMENIAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND Peter Ajemian, Chairman

The St. Thomas Armenian Church Endowment Fund was formed in the fall of this year, where a member with the minimum donation of \$100. was able to start their Family Fund in their name. This St. Thomas ACEF Fund afforded everyone the opportunity to participate, thus

insuring an annual income to the St. Thomas Armenian Church year after year in their name. To date we have 26 families with a *\$2,800.00 contribution. We expect to add to the Fund with new members, and additional contributions from previous members. We also expect to transfer all of the Memorial Funds into the St. Thomas ACEF in the very near future.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE Victor Arzoomanian, Chairman

We are fortunate to have the leadership of Vic Arzoomanian as Membership Committee Chairman, who already has taken a positive approach in this matter. Vic's committee, which includes a member from each of our Church organizations, has gone through the church records, listing all of the marriage and baptisms for the last 7 years. The Committee will contact these individuals to become members of our Church and Sunday School and related organizations. We will also recruit members that use the St. Thomas facilities but are not members. Another part of the Committee's work will be to contact past members that have not been attending services.

PARISH COUNCIL MEMBERS

Vice Chairman - Peter Jamgochian is the Council Liaison for ACYOA Jrs. This year we were fortunate to enlist the services of JoAnne Daghlian to advise this group. While we feel that the ACYOA Jrs. are on the right track, we are in need of parent participation. Many of these youngsters are too young to drive and the lack of transportation creates problems, getting to meetings and during field trips. I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Peter Jamgochian for all of the help he gave me this year, and for never saying "No" to any request made to him.

SECRETARY - Paul Pinajian is the Council Liaison for the Men's Club. Paul also served as Secretary for the Council. Those that know Paul know that he is one of the hardest workers in our Church. Despite his heavy schedule, he is present at every meeting and delivers his minutes impeccably. When we mention Secretary we also remember Dikris Malool who gives the Church much of her time writing letters, handling all of the mailing, duplicating, folding, setting up the monthly calendar, etc. If she ever decides to leave the Church, I could use her in my business. Thanks, Dikris, from all of us.

TREASURER - Grace Hagopian, our Treasurer, has added a touch of professionalism to the Council, and it is needless to say that she, too, is always present and on the job. Grace has the toughest job and not only does she do this with ease, but with accuracy. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Alice Arzoomanian for working with Grace on this monumental job. Sona Doudoukjian served as Chairlady of the Bookstore. Despite the economy, our Bookstore showed a profit this year. She has maintained a current and attractive Bookstore. Thank you, Sona.

BUILDING & GROUNDS - Moses Kazanjian, our pride and joy, has done a tremendous job on both buildings and grounds. We recently upgraded the west end of our hall property, and filled in the northwest part also. Moses is an engineer by trade, and his professional advise is essential in our building project.

RENTAIS & CALENDAR - Virginia Victoria has been a great asset to the Council. She has organized the rentals so that it has cut confusion and made the venture profitable. Virginia is also very active in every facet of Church activities. Despite her busy schedule, she never refuses a request. Many thanks.

CASPAR M. KASPARIAN MEMORIAL FUND

The Caspar Kasparian Memorial Fund was established in 1979. The purpose of the fund is to provide scholarship assistance for the youth of the St. Thomas parish to attend religious study conferences, retreats and other educational activities in the church.

During the summer, the Board of Directors awarded scholarship assistance to 13 young people, ages 15-20, to attend the St. Nersess Summer Study Programs at the Ouzoonian House in New Rochelle, N. Y. Those attending received the opportunity to learn more about our church while also having the opportunity of meeting youngsters from other Armenian communities in the U. S. The past three years, 42 youngsters have attended these programs with our assistance.

During the weekend of Oct. 15-17, the 3rd annual retreat was sponsored by the fund for Junior High School age youngsters from our parish. It was held at the Ouzoonian House and attended by 10-youngsters. The theme of the weekend was, "Crossroads--Which Way?" and was led by Deacon Michael Chevian who was assisted by Louise Kalemkerian, our Director of Religious Education. The Senior ACYOA of Northern New Jersey got its start in February 1982 with the guidance of the Executive Director of the Armenian Diocese, Frank A. Stoneson; the Executive Secretary of the ACYOA, James Magarian; and the 1981-1982 ACYOA Central Council Chairman. Mark Kazanjian.

A Planning Committee, with members from St. Thomas, Holy Cross (Union City), St. Leon, and St. Mary, decided that the best way to involve young Armenian adults in the northern New Jersey area was to work jointly rather than attempt to operate four separate chapters. A treasury was created with each of the 4 churches loaning \$125; St. Thomas advanced an additional \$375.

A "Kick-off Party" was held at St. Thomas in May, free of charge, with the purpose of attracting members. Over 200 people attended. Two weeks later, a business meeting was conducted, and it was decided to appoint officers for the first year. The current Executive Board consists of some original Planning Committee members and others who have expressed commitment to leadership.

The Executive Board set as goals for the first year:

- 1. Develop a mailing list from which to draw members
- Develop a treasury
 Widen the nucleus of people who will take responsibility. This is a means to our end: encourage and develop participation in Church by young adults who will become the next generation of church leaders.

With these objectives in mind, we planned the following events: August, Picnic at Van Saun, 80 attended; Sept., participation in Sports Week-end, 70 attended; Oct. Membership Reception at Clinton Inn, 70 attended; Nov. Off Broadway Play, Dinner at Ararat, 20 attended; Dec., Instructed Divine Liturgy; also, New Year's Eve Party where 300 attended.

Future-plans include a ski trip in Feb., business meeting and Membership Reception in March, and in April we plan to have a retreat at St. Nersess.

Our fund raising events were participation at One World Festival, booths at the Church Bazaars, oriental rug padding sale, and the New Year's Eve Dance.

The Senior ACYOA of Northern New Jersey, in its first year, has become a viable and hard working organization. We are especially grateful for the support we have received from our Churches, without which we could not have grown.

A. Church School

The Church School began its academic year on Sept. 12 with an enrollment of approximately 109 students, divided into eleven classes. Classes are held from 10:30 to noon, concurrently with the Divine Liturgy. The students' courses of study are prescribed by the Diocese, and include the Faith, doctrine and teachings of the Armenian Church, Biblical history, Armenian Church history and Christian living. Regular church attendance and reception of the Sacraments is at the center of the Church School program.

The students' knowledge of and participation in the Divine Liturgy increased by their regular attendance. Students in the 9th grade class read the Scripture lessons at the Easter Eve Service. A Pilot Program of Church Attendance took place for 6 weeks in Oct. and Nov. providing students and staff opportunity to attend the entire Divine Liturgy. During this period classes were held at 10:00 a.m. and the staff and students attended Divine Liturgy together each week.

The Junior Choir continued to grow in 1982, under the direction of Mrs. Lillian Kasparian, the devoted Choirmistress. These youngsters, aged 5-11, meet weekly to learn the hymns of the Divine Liturgy and other services of the Church. They sang regularly during the year, especially on Palm Sunday, and at the ACYOA Christmas Eve Services. They proudly wear their new robes, sewn especially for them through the generosity of parishioners Lucy Nakashian, Nazar Nazarian and Edward Parseghian, and the George Shahinian Memorial Fund.

The newsletter DAY BY DAY continued to serve as a means of helping families learn and grow together in their Faith.

The Church School is blessed with dedicated teachers who try to provide our children with a firm Christian foundation, especially by their own example. Their devotion deserves the thanks and gratitude of the entire St. Thomas family. The staff meets periodically for meetings and teacher education, to help them increase their own knowledge about the Church and provide suggestions for more effective teaching. They attended a Workshop sponsored by the Diocesan Dept. of Religious Education in October.

As in previous years, the students bought gifts and foodstuffs for needy families at Christmas. This project is coordinated through the Bergen County Division of Youth and Family Services. Foodstuffs were also collected at Thanksgiving time for the Englewood-Food Action Center. The children raised donations for UNICEF at Halloween. They collected \$72.67.

A program to train youngsters to serve as acolytes during Divine Liturgy was initiated. At present 7 boys and 3 girls in grades 5-8 are serving on a regular rotation.

Annual events of the Church School include the Fall Pot Luck supper, Christmas Program and Luncheon, Christmas and Easter Communion breakfasts, Pancake brunch, Paregentan party and closing day reception. The Parents' Committee ably coordinated these activities. We are thankful for the cooperation of the entire parish family which ensures the success of these events.

B. Adult Education

Several programs for the adults of the parish were undertaken; some continued from last year, and others newly initiated. The Bible Study group continued to meet weekly. They studied St. John's Gospel.

A Pilot Program of Church Attendance and Adult Education took place for six consecutive Sundays during October and November. At 10:00 during the Program, adult education sessions based upon the theme "Get to Know Yourself: the Church" were held in the Church. The 45 minute sessions were followed by the Divine Liturgy, with the participation of all the children of the Church School.

A trip to Rutgers University in New Brunswick was arranged in April. Fr. Arnak and Louise Kalemkerian visited with the St. Thomas parishioners studying at Rutgers for an evening.
