THE 1985 PASTOR'S REPORT

Another year has ended, marking 24 years of my service to St. Thomas Armenian Church. I have seen numerous changes in our Parish during those years. New faces have come forward to enlarge our St. Thomas family; at the same time we must never forget those who are no longer with us. This year we are going to celebrate the 21st anniversary of the building of the Church Sanctuary and God willing, we shall dedicate our new facilities in March.

A hearty "thank you" to the church organizations, and all the untiring members of our Parish. Each organization has submitted its own report, and our Parish Council Chairman, Peter Ajemian has acknowledged their services in his report; therefore I shall report mainly on the sacramental and pastoral activities of this past year.

WORSHIP SERVICES: Divine Liturgy was celebrated every Sunday except one, when the Jashou Service was offered by the deacons while I was vacationing. A special prayer service for the success of the Reagan-Gorbachev Summit was held on November 10, and a service of thanksgiving for our deacons and altar servers was held on the Feast of St. Stephen, December 22. Special thanks to Deacon Joseph Kalemkerian for his continued dedication in the preparation of acolytes and altar servers.

During the year we had the following guest celebrants: Archbishop Torkom Manoogian on the Anniversary of the Consecration of the Church; Rev. Arshen Ayvazian, on May 19; Rev. Mardiros Chevian, June 23; Rev. Carnig Hallajian on Nov. 10.

SACRAMENTAL SERVICES: During the year 21 baptisms were performed (30 last year); 22 marriages were blessed (23 the previous year); 8 funerals took place (23 the year before).

At this time let us remember our dear departed members: Michael Sarkisian, Leo Bazikian, Assadour Akmakjian (father of Rosine Hovsepian), Souren Mekenian, Charles Garabed Peloian (father of Ann Aljian), Aghavne Guendjoian (mother of Alice Zarifian), and Oursa Dagavarian.

ADMINISTRATIVE: As ex-officio President of all church organizations, I attended many of the meetings. I directed and advised and, in many cases helped in implementing decisions. I attended the Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly in Bayside, New York, in May. I represented our Diocese at the Governing Board of the National Council of Churches of Christ, once in Chicago in May, and a second time in November, in Fort Worth, Texas. It is interesting to note that out of five delegates from our Diocese to the National Council of Churches, two are from our parish, myself and Louise Kalemkerian. I am a member of the Board of Directors of St. Nersess Seminary since its inception, and presently serve as the Secretary of the Board.

PUBLICATIONS: We have published the Bergen Beacon monthly and prepared flyers for our various affairs. Each month the Beacon is mailed to our college students residing on campus. A special thanks to Mary Ann Saraydarian for editing our Beacon.

This year there has been more enthusiasm shown by our parishioners to volunteer and accomplish projects. This is due to our Parish Council, particularly to the leadership of Peter Ajemian. Peter has been a God-sent at the crucial time of our expansion project. He has brought wisdom, humor, drive and maturity. He has been a person who does not seek recognition in any way. Thank you, Peter for all your endeavours.

THE PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The year 1985 was a significant milestone for the St. Thomas Armenian Church. After more than 3 years of initial planning, our Renovation and New Building Project became a reality. Our Building Committee had to climb many hurdles, namely with the Town, County and State levels involving EPA standards, along with securing building materials that were unavailable. However we will be close to finishing our project at the time of our Annual Parish Assembly. Along with the above mentioned problems, and the desire to fulfill the additional needs of our Parish, we will exceed our approved budget of \$900,000.00. Although pledges totalling \$750,000.00 have been made to date, additional pledges are essential so that we can pay-off our Construction Loan. To date, a very good percentage of our parishoners have met their pledges, while a small group have not. The Parish Council wants everyone to be part of this Project, because St. Thomas belongs to everyone. Remember, no contribution in any form can ever be too BIG or too SMALL.

DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY REPORT

The 83rd Annual Assembly of the Diocese of the Armenian Church took place in Bayside, N.Y., May 2-4 hosted by the Holy Martyrs Armenian Church. Approximately 150 delegates representing 45 parishes were present.

The St. Thomas parish was represented by Rev. Fr. Arnak Kasparian and Diocesan Delegates Victor Arzoomanian, Michel Izmirly, Peter Jamgochian, Lillian Kasparian and Joseph Kalemkerian. Prior to the assembly, Father Arnak attended the two day clergy conference which took place at Cathedral College in Douglaston, N.Y.

The delegates elected the following officers for the assembly: Dr. Dennis Papazian, chairman; Dr. Raffi Hovanessian, assistant chairman; and Dr. Garo Garibian, secretary.

Among the major issues discussed by the delegates were the High-Rise Project, Regionalization, Church Unity and Youth Ministry.

The High-Rise Project is a study on the possible construction of a multistory complex above the present Diocesan Office Building. It would not alter the Cathedral or the plaza and would provide the Diocese with a substantial revenue. The assembly authorizes the High-Rise committee to persue the feasibility study further.

Regionalization is a pilot project currently in a trial period in New England. It was cited as a successful role model for other areas that could benefit from the implementation of regionalization.

Unity discussions are currently at a standstill. The delegates voted to continue all efforts towards unity.

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Elected to a new term on the Diocesan Council were Rev. Fr. Karekin Kasparian, Sarkis Bedevian, Daniel Dorian, Zarvin Kasparian, Edward Onanian, Very Rev. Ghevont Samoorian, Very Rev. Baret Yeretzian and Arthur Mardigian. George Mekenian from the St. Thomas parish was elected to a ten year term as a member of the Diocesan Board of Trustees.

During the three days several department workshops were held for the Women's Guild, A.C.Y.O.A., Church School and Armenian School. A number of St. Thomas parishioners were present for those meetings.

At the Armenian School Workshop, the Primate Archbishop Torkom Manoogian honored St. Thomas parishioner Queenie Tashjian for 25 years of service to the Armenian School. During the Women's Guild conference the delegates voted to form an ad hoc committee to structure by-laws for a newly organized Women's Guild Central Council.

The Annual Assembly Banquet was held at Cathedral College in Douglaston, N.Y. and the Hon. Edward I. Koch, the Mayor of New York City was the guest of honor and received the "Friend of Armenians" award. The 84th Assembly is scheduled to be held in May in Racine, Wisconsin

The Committee held weekly meetings along with special Technical Committee meetings and conferences with the Architect, Edward Ludders. Kiseli Builders, Inc. began excavation in March.

Authorization to execute performance of the expansion was granted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on Ma Q 15, 1985, and all count Q and local requirements have been met.

Work has continued at a steady pace, with all delays due primarily to late deliveries by major suppliers. To date, the new classrooms have been erected, the atrium skylights have been installed; the youth room, conference room and offices for our secretary and Der Hayr are being readied; the bathrooms have been remodeled; new thermopane windows have been installed in the social hall and corridor between the Church and Hall; a handicapped ramp and new entrance to the social hall/classroom complex is near completion; the kitchen is being readied and the HVAC system is delivered and partially installed. The openings between the atrium and social hall have been broken and are ready to be finished; and a new ceiling to accommodate cove lighting for the social hall is completed. Telephone, public address, intercom and fire alarm systems were selected. Although many obstacles have arisen throughout this project, the Building Committee has always tried to be prudent and practical in its decisions.

Two mailings were made to parishioners asking for payment of 1985 pledges and including an update of Building Committee progress. A second meeting was held with several women from the Parish invited for their input on the kitchen.

A public relations program has begun, and photographs of the expansion's progress have been taken throughout the year.

An interior design committee is presently coordinating tile, carpet, wallcovering and lighting selections.

A gala ribbon cutting and dedication banquet is being planned for March 22, 1986, for the entire Parish to celebrate its new expansion and growth.

CASPAR M. KASPARIAN MEMORIAL FUND

The memorial fund was established in 1979 with the purpose of providing scholarship assistance for the youth of St. Thomas Parish to attend religious stud C conferences, retreats and other educational activities in the church.

During the summer 17 youngsters were awarded scholarship assistance by the Board of Directors to attend the St. Nersess Summer Study Program in New Rochelle, New York. Some of the participants were attending for the first time. While attending these conferences the young people receive the opportunity to learn more about the Armenian Church while also having the opportunity of sharing their St. Nersess experience with youngsters from other Armenian communities in the United States and Canada. During the past six years our fund has assisted over 90 youngsters from our parish in this manner.

The sixth annual retreat for junior high age young people was held during the weekend of Nov. 22-24 at the Ouzconian House of St. Nersess Seminary. Eleven youngsters from our parish participated, six of whom were attending for the first time. The retreat was led by Fr. Mardiros Chevian, Rector of the Seminary, Fr. Arnak was present on Friday evening fielding questions from the young people.

The participants attended Divine Liturgy on Sunday morning in the Seminary Chapel. The celebrant was Fr. Mardiros, with all of the youngsters receiving Holy Communion.

The retreat provided the Jr. High students an opportunity for Christian fellowship and growth in a relaxed and comfortable setting. The fund contributed to the participation of each teenager.

ARMENIAN LANGUAGE SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT - 1985

The Armenian Language School is an integral part of our Parish, teaching our children the basics of their language and instilling pride and knowledge of their ethnic heritage. The School's success can be credited to the efforts of its Superintendent, Sylva Der Stepanian; its dedicated faculty; the Mother's Committee, Lucy Nakashian, our Parish Council liaison; and the parents who faithfully bring their willing children to class each week.

The School annually sponsors an Armenian Christmas Dinner and program, a hantes and graduation in June, a booth at the Church Bazaar, representation at the Diocesan Assembly, holiday parties for the children, visits to the Diocese, participation in the April 24th, 70th anniversary of the Armenian Genocide. The students also entertained at the Palm Sunday anniversary dinner and two of our students presented a talk to the Women's Guild on their visit to Armenia. A special class has been inaugurated especially for non-Armenian speaking students with an emphasis on conversation. Our successful Club (after-school lunch activities) has temporarily been inactive due to the Building Expansion.

At its Armenian Chirstmas Dinner, the School has established the George Shahinian Award for Perfect Attendance, the Edward Bashian Award for Achievement in Armenian History, the Rupen Saddler Award for Armenian Reading, and this year, the Dr. Harout and Shake Mekhjian Armenian Spelling Award.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - 1985

A. Church School

The Church School began its academic year on October 6, one month later than usual because of the building expansion, with an enrollment of approximately 97 students (compared to 98 last year.) The students are divided into 10 classes. Classes are held on Sunday mornings from 10:30 to noon, concurrently with the Divine Liturgy The students' courses of study are prescribed by the Diocese, and include the Faith, doctrine and teachings of the Armenian Church, Biblical study and history Armenian Church history and Christian living. Regular church attendance and reception of the Sacraments is at the center of the Church School program.

One of the goals of the Church School is to help its young people develop into worshipping member of the Armenian Church. To further this end, the students in grades 5 and up regularly sing with the choir during the Badarak, to familiarize them with the hymns and songs of our worship. Students of the eighth, ninth and tenth grades read the Old Testament Scripture lessons during the Christmas Eve and Easter Eve services.

The ST. THOMAS SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS, a publication of the fifth grade class continued to be produced, under the direction of teacher Douglas Martaian.

Three young people received their Diocesan graduation diplomas in June, upon completion of all the requirements for graduation, including a year of service to the parish. Two of these young people continue to serve the parish as co-teachers in the Church School.

The Church School is blessed with dedicated teachers who try to provide our children with a firm Christian foundation, specially by their own example. Their devotion deserves the thanks and gratitude of the entire St. Thomas family. The staff meets periodically for meetings. Six staff members participated in the Department of Religious Education regional workshop in November, and several participated in a special D.R.E. program for teachers in May at Holy Martyrs Church.

For more than ten consecutive years, the students have been buying gifts and food-stuffs for needy families at Christmas. This project is coordinated through the Division of the Youth and Family Services of the state of N.J. Food stuffs were also collected in April and May, and again prior to Thanksgiving and were given to the Center for Food Action in Englewood.

A trip to the Emerson Home for the Armenian Aged took place in March, allowing the children to meet with some of the residents. The students sang some Badarak songs, prayed and worshipped with the residents, and then socialized with them before returning to St. Thomas.

A program to train youngsters to serve as acolytes during the Divine Liturgy continued throughout the year. At present, 6 boys and three girls in grades 5-8 serve on a regular rotation.

Annual events of the Church School include Armenian Christmas Eve luncheon/supper, Easter Communion breakfast, Pot Luck Supper, Christmas program, bus trip to St. Vartan Cathedral for Poon Paregentan, and graduation reception. Parents of the children coordinated these various events. We are thankful for the cooperation of the entire parish family which ensures the success of these events.

B. Adult Education

The Bible study group met on a weekly basis from January to June. The resumption of their sessions in the fall was delayed because of the building construction. The group explores and studies our Christian faith based upon the Holy Scriptures, as it finds its expression in the Armenian Church.

The newsletter DAY BY DAY continued to serve as a means of helping families learn and grow together in their Faith. DAY BY DAY is mailed to all members of St. Thomas. Another periodical, AVEDIS, a mini-magazine for adults, was made available to all church School families and any other interested parishioners.
