THE 1987 PASTOR'S REPORT

By the grace of God, another year has ended, marking 26 years of my service to St. Thomas Armenian Church. I have seen numerous changes in our Parish during those years. New faces have come forward to enlarge our St. Thomas family; at the same time we must never forget those who are no longer with us. We celebrated the 23rd anniversary of the building of the Church sanctuary in April.

A hearty "thank you" to church organizations, and all the untiring members of our Parish. Each organization has submitted its own report, and our Parish Council Chairman, Peter Ajemian, has acknowledged their service in his report; therefore I shall report mainly on the sacramental and pastoral activities of the past year.

WORSHIP SERVICES: Divine Liturgy was celebrated every Sunday but 3. There was no Badarak on June 28 (my vacation) and October 24 and November 1 (visit of His Holiness Catholicos Vazken I). We had two guest celebrants during the year: Fr. Mardiros Chevian on March 15, while I want to Holy Martyrs in his place, and Fr. Arshen Aivazian on December 13, while I traded places and went to St. Leon's. Deacon Joseph Kalemkerian conducted services when I was on vacation and delivered the sermon several other times during the year as well, always receiving favorable comments.

A special service of thanksgiving honoring our deacons and altar servers was held on December 20, the feast of St. Stephen. Special thanks to Deacon Joseph for his continued dedication in preparing acolytes and altar servers. On january 18 the churches of Tenafly conducted an ecumenical service for Christian Unity at Mt. Carmel Church, at which I was the preacher.

SACRAMENTAL SERVICES: During the year 36 baptisms were performed out of which 2 were adult confirmation (26 last year); 15 marriages were blessed (17 the previous year); 25 funerals took place (18 the year before).

At this time let us remember our departed members: George Gavejian, Lucy Chakmakian, Apraham Guluzian, Vartan Coloian, Ashan Victoria Bostonian, Dorothy Seferian, Dorothy Horasan, and Susan Goomrigian.

ADMINISTRATIVE: As ex-officio President of all church organizations, I attended many of the meetings. I directed, advised, and in many cases helped in implementing decisions. I attended the Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly in Springfield, Mass, in May. I served as chairman of the Clergy Conference. I participated in the various activities and religious services connected with the visit of His Holiness the Catholicos, and also served on the Banquet Committee.

<u>PUBLICATIONS</u>: We have published the Bergen Beacon monthly and prepared flyers for our various affairs. Each month the Beacon is mailed to our college students residing on campus. A special thanks to Alyce Parseghian for providing most of the photographs, and to Gregory and Richard Saraydarian for preparing the photographs for publication.

This year there has been more enthusiasm shown to our parishioners to volunteer and accomplish projects. This is due to our Parish Council, particularly to the leadership of Peter Ajemian. Peter has been a God-send at the crucial time of our expansion project. He has brought wisdom, humor, drive, and maturity. He has been a person who does not seek recognition in any way. Thank you, Peter, for all you have done.

In September, we were pleased to expand our staff to include Anita Anserian as Office Manager and Louise Kalemkerian as Pastoral Assistant. This has enabled us to increase our service to the community. Anita has ably taken care of our secreterial needs, as well as worked on the computer, bringing all our financial and other records up to date.

Six months ago, I made an ardent plea for a pastoral assistant. The Parish Council was kind enough to abide by my wishes. I am pleased with the results of Louise's help to me in my pastoral work.

She has arranged various programs for the benefit of our parishioners and the Community, including a film on the Shroud of Turin, "The Silent Witness". A panel discussion on "Has the Christian Faith Been Detrimental to the Armenian National Existence?" and a forum on the church's efforts to reach young people entitled "Is there Life After Sunday School?".

She has organized two gatherings for college students. She has worked with me every week on my sermons. We have done numerous home and hospital visitations together, and she has made many home and hospital visitations alone. The vast majority of the new members who joined St. Thomas during these last few months of 1987 are as a result of our home visitations, personal contact and recruitment efforts. I welcome many of them to today's meeting.

She edits the <u>Beacon</u>, prepares the Sunday bulletin and works with the ACYOA Jrs., & Srs., planning programs and projects. Together we conduct Bible Study twice a month, which is attended by people from other churches, as well as St. Thomas.

Louise has been of assistance and support in all aspects of my pastoral work with the exception of performance of the sacraments. I am positive that these efforts will continue and bear greater fruit for the betterment of St. Thomas Church.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The year 1987 marks my 6th consecutive year as Parish Council Chairman of St. Thomas Armenian Church. Grace Hagopian and Virginia Victoria also are serving their last term with me, because of the statute of ,imitation in our Diocesan By-Laws. I would like to take this opportunity at the outset to thank them sincerely for their dedicated service to the Council and our Church.

The passing away of our Builder, Mr. John Keseli has left the final negotiations of Construction Project incomplete; however the landscaping is nearing completion. During the course of the year we did expand the role of the Trustees and have formed a permanent committee to handle all future maintenance and repairs to our complex.

This past year our Office finally became 100% computerized thus insuring a smoother operation in the future. We will now be able to give accurate updates to our membership on their pledges and all donations.

We are still working with the original Construction loan which we obtained at 7 1/2 % interest. The interest rate has gone up to 8 3/4% and we are now considering a permanent fixed mortgage. This will be decided at the 2nd session of our Parish Assembly.

Most of our parishioners and friend have made pledges towards our Building Project, and they have met them. However there is still a small group that has not participated. Recently we received a letter from one of our parishioners stating that at the time of our drive they were not able to contribute, however, things are better now, and they sent a check in the amount of \$1,000.00, indicating, that there is always hope.

We are happy to report that with the combination of our Membership Committee, and our Administrative Pastoral Assistant we have been able to recruit over 50 members into our Parish this year. We still say that no one can do a better recruitment job than our present members.

A. CHURCH SCHOOL

The Church School began its academic year on September 13, with an enrollment of 97 students (compared to 107 last year). A number of new families joined the Church School. The students are divided into 11 classes, plus Nursery. Classes are held on Sunday mornings from 10:15 to 12:15. The program was expanded this year to two hours. The students' courses of study are prescribed by the Diocesan Department of Religious Education. This year brand new textbooks published by the Diocese are in use in the Church School, which convey the faith and teachings of the Armenian Church.

One of the goals of the Church School is to help its young people develop into worshiping members of the Armenian Church. To further this goal, the students have been attending Divine Liturgy every week for at least 45 minutes as part of the regular Sunday morning schedule. An important benefit of this is that children have begun to feel part of the worshiping community. Assembly programs conducted by Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian include opportunities for learning the hymns and songs of the Badarak, as well as learning about the performance of the rituals themselves. Students of the eighth, ninth, and eleventh grades again read the Scripture lessons during Christmas Eve and Easter Eve Services.

The Junior Choir, under the direction of Mrs. Rose Mekenian, met regularly during the first six months of the year, and learned liturgical as well as folk songs. They sang the Badarak at St. Vartan Cathedral for Poon Paregentan, at church services, and at the Anniversary Dinner.

Five young people received their Diocesan graduation diplomas in June, upon completion of all the requirements for graduation, including a year of service to the parish.

The Church School is blessed with dedicated teachers who try to provide our children with a firm Christian foundation, especially by their own example. Their devotion deserves the thanks and gratitude of the entire St. Thomas family. It is heartwarming that several Church School "alumni" are members of the teaching staff. The staff meets periodically for meetings and training sessions.

For fourteen consecutive years, the students have been buying gifts and foodstuffs for needy families at Christmas. This project is coordinated by Lorraine Kapakjian of the Division of Youth and Family Services of the State of New Jersey. The children also raised money through "Trick or Treat for UNICEF" in October. Non-perishable foodstuffs were collected at Thanksgiving for the Center for Food Action in Englewood. A sizeable Lenten Offering was divided between a national hunger agency and a local one.

The Church School children participated in the special Divine Liturgy and Youth Day program at St. Vartan Cathedral on the occasion of the visit of His Holiness Catholicos Vazken I, on October 24. The students of the seventh and eighth grades participated in the special procession and commemoration of Martyrs Day, April 26.

A trip to the Emerson Home for the Armenian Aged took place in March, allowing the children to meet with some of the residents. The students sang some Badarak songs, prayed and worshiped with the residents, and then socialized with them before returning to St. Thomas.

Annual events of the Church School include: Armenian Christmas Eve Supper, Easter Communion Breakfast, Pot Luck Supper, Christmas Dinner and Program, bus trip to St. Vartan Cathedral for Poon Paregentan, joint Sunday School-Armenian School picnic, and graduation reception. We are thankful for the support and cooperation of the entire parish family which ensures the success of these events.

B. ADULT EDUCATION

A series of three adult education forums on the Future of the Armenian Church and community in America, entitled "2001" The Armenian Future" were held in February- March- April. A program and discussion on the topic of "Adolescent Suicide" was held in April. All four were very well received.

A monthly periodical, AVEDIS, published by the Diocesan Department of Religious Education, was distributed to all Church School families and other interested parishioners throughout the year.

The monthly newsletter, DAY BY DAY, which resumed publication in

September, is mailed to all Parish families.

Eight adults and young people participated in the CROP Walk for Hunger on October 18, along with Christians from all the communities around Tenafly. St. Thomas is the first and only Orthodox congregation that has ever participated in the northern NJ CROP Walk, and our parishioners raise \$1,082.50 through pledges and donations for the cause!

The Narek Prayer group organized in May 1986, continues to meet monthly to read Scripture and pray together for persons and concerns brought to its attention. A locked box marked "prayer requests" has been placed in the narthex to receive such petitions.

ST. THOMAS ARMENIAN CHURCH - CASPAR KASPARIAN MEMORIAL FUND

The purpose of this fund, which was established in 1979 is to provide scholarship assistance to the youth of the St. Thomas Parish to attend religious study conferences, retreats, and other educational activities in the church.

During the summer of 1987, 18 youngsters were awarded scholarship assistance by the Board of Directors to attend the St. Nersess Summer Study Program in New Rochelle, NY. Some of the youngsters were attending for the first time. During the program the participants had the opportunity of learning more about their church while at the same time sharing their experiences with youngsters from other Armenian communities. During the past eight years the fund has assisted 128 youngsters from our parish in this manner.

Each year during the fall a retreat for Junior High age youngsters has been held. During 1987, due to a lack of space at St. Nersess we were unable to schedule the retreat. Instead it has been rescheduled for a weekend in January 1988.

Through activities such as the Summer Study Program and the Retreat, the Fund seeks to expand the religious education experience of St. Thomas youngsters and encourage them to grow in the Armenian Christian faith.

- Even though the project may seem outwardly complete, there were still many unsettled matters which were accomplished during the vear.
- Due to the death of John Kiseli (our contractor), before settlement of the project, there is on-going negotiation between the Technical Committee and the Kiseli Estate regarding loose ends and payments.
- Ed Luders (our architect) was given his final payment. Owed \$8,000.00 he was paid \$7,000.00 with \$1,000.00 being paid as an accoustical consultation fee to another firm.
- The Church footbridge was rebuilt by Jerry Keosayian and his son Paul for under 1,000.00. The job was done quickly and competently and saved the church at last \$1,5000.00
- The back area was graded and paved with additional parking alloted. The Parish driveway's front circle was repaved with handicapped parking provided according to Tenafly ordinance.
- Four column speakers were installed in the Atrium in March .
- Thanks to Al Victoria, trees in the back area were trimmed, cut and removed at a great savings to St. Thomas. Lawncutting maintenance was Landscaping at a cost of approximately \$30-40,000.00 will continue in the spring. It must be mentioned that many costs are determined by State mandates.
- A letter was sent in October to all who have pledge, thanking them if they had completed payment, or asking them to if they had not.
- Stage curtains are currently being tailored, with full installation due shortly. Also, verticals have been ordered for Der Hayr's office to obscure the office equipment from view from the outside.
- Future projects we must deal with have also been discussed and will be acted upon in 1988:
 - 1. Disrepair of the Parish House
 - 2. Additional storage space
 - Repair of area surrounding Church dome
 - Construction of a Church library facility.
- Most importantly, by advice of the Building Committee and Trustees, the Parish Council has agreed to assume a mortgage on outstanding debt of the Project.

1ST ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PARISHIONER RELATIONS COMMITTEE December 21, 1987

This Committee was formed by vote of the Annual Parish Assembly-1987. Its purpose was to "hear and act upon" the "Concerns" of parishioners; to address them in a comprehensive, constructive, and unbiased manner.

The Parish Council assigned the task of forming a functional committee to a small group headed by Joanne Torigian, now its Chairperson. Other members include: Sam Demirjian, Joseph Kalemkerian, Leon Nigohosian Esq., Richard Papazian, Ara Pekmezian and Dr. Puzant Torigian.

The Committee "hears" concerns of our parishioners and based on its findings makes recommendations to appropriate groups of the church for their action.

The Committee has set up the procedure for presentation of "Concerns" and the committee's guidelines for their resolution.

The Committee is independent of any person or groups and functions in full CONFIDENTIALITY acting as a Committee, not as individuals. All "Concerns" are presented in writing directly to the Chairperson - mailed to her home: Joanne Torigian, 2 Horizon Road, Fort Lee, NJ 07024.

If a parishioner requests confidentiality, from all but the Chairperson, the written "Concern" will be presented to the rest of the Committee--anonymously. If confidentiality is not requested the parishioner will be invited to make a personal presentation to the Committee. All parishioner "concerns" will be acknowledged by the Chairperson and a specific appointment will be arranged for the parishioner to make their presentation personally, if they so desire.

The Committee has held numerous meetings throughout the year, addressing various "Concerns" brought forth by parishioners.

One such "Concern" (after much consideration by the Committee) has resulted in the initiation of a "Good Samaritan Fund". Our Committee members have already made pledge for monies to seed this essential fund. This confidentially administered Fund will act as a last resort source of emergency financial assistance to a parishioner who is in dire need. The Fund is to be managed by our Pastor, the Committee chairperson, and one other member of the committee. It is further planned that a network of assistance' will be assembled for parishioners who find themselves in financial, medical, legal, emotional etc. difficulty.

This 'Samaritan Network' will act as omnbudsmen seeking the special resources of other parishioners to help resolve a difficulty that has not been overcome through the usual sources.

The Committee hopes that the entire parish membership will support this effort by offering financial and/or professional assistance to the Network' and the Committee requests that the membership assembly vote today, to implement this "Good Samaritan Fund and Network".
