ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 1986

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was held on Sunday afternoon, February 2, 1986 in Cultural Hall of the Church complex. Reverend Father Mampre A. Kouzouian, Pastor, presided and offered the Opening Prayer.

The Assembly was called to order by Stephen Panosian, Chairman of the Parish Council. The selection, by the Nominating Committee, of the Tivan for the day was announced by Diran Zahigian, a member of this committee, as follows:

There being no further nominations from the floor, a Motion was made and seconded to approve the above-named. MOTION PASSED.

Mr. Zahigian then presented the slate as put forward by the Nominating Committee:

Mr. Zahigian informed the Assembly nominations for each category would be accepted from the floor. There being none, a Motion was made and seconded to receive the selections of candidates by the Nominating Committee. MOTION PASSED.

Copies of the Annual Report covering the period from January 1, 1985 thru
December 31, 1985 were distributed to those present. The Chairman stated if there were no objections from the floor, formal readings of each individual report would be omitted. However, questions could be addressed to the Chair. No objections were expressed by those present.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Minutes of the Annual Parish Assembly held on February 3, 1985. MOTION PASSED

The Chairman then announced that there being more dues paying members present than required to constitute a quorum, a recess would be declared for voting purposes.

Pastor's Annual Report for 1985:

In his opening remarks Father Mampre expressed profound gratitude to Reverend Father Papken Maksoudian, Pastor Emeritus; the Very Reverend Father Oshagan Minassian; the Choir and Altar Servers. He stated he has made recommendation to our Primate for the elevation to Su-Diaconate the following Altar servers: Gary Alexander, Edward Marootian, Alexan Kouzouian and Robert Nahabedian. there is a need for a Junior Choir and there have been discussions with Father Oshagan regarding this matter.

The Pastor also expressed his appreciation to the Cultural Committee who together with the assistance and financial support of the parishioners have presented such outstanding cultural activities during the month of October. In commenting on the need of a Youth Director Father Mampre stated he and the Parish Council are in the process of interviewing an applicant for this position. He expressed his gratitude to James Kalustian for assisting during the interim.

Activities which highlighted 1985 included celebration of the 35th Anniverof the Ordination of Father Papken to the Priesthood; the observation of
the 70th Anni- Carv of the Genocide. Activities included a Symposium held at
Harvard University with Participation by Armenian and non-Armenian scholars;
ceremonies at the State House with Governor Michael Dukakis and Archbishop Law
attending.

Appreciation was extended to the Parish Council, all Executive Committees of Church-affiliated organizations and to Mrs. Rose Mamishian, Church Secretary, and all the volunteers who come to serve in the office.

A parishioner asked Father Mampre for further details of a recent meeting held with the staff of the Boston Globe and also, what measures have been taken regarding an existing problems with neighbors of the Church. Regarding the meeting with the Boston Globe, Father Mampre stated last April the Boston Globe invited Armenians of many pursuasions to get together with them to determine methods of establishing better relationships with their newspaper. Barbara and Donald Tellaian and Dr. Paul Barsam were present at this meeting which was very fruitful and as a result excellent articles and editorials concerning the Armenian community have appeared in this newspaper.

In September, 1985 Diocesan Delegates, members of the Parish Council and he met with neighbors of our Church and an official from the City of Cambridge. In the past these neighbors have complained about parking violations and unduly noise when activities are held at the Church but so far since this meeting there have been no complaints. Father Mampre urged all parishioners to observe the "no parking" signs and to reduce any level of noise when leaving the premises.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Pastor's Annual Report. MOTION PASSED.

Parish Council Report for 1985:

Stephen Panosian informed the Assembly he would entertain questions regarding this report.

A parishioner noted financial issues were duly addressed. However, he found no information regarding the total number of Church memberships and whether it was growing or declining. Also, there were no statistics on the average age of parishioners, their marital status and how many children were in the families. Mr. Panosian stated he felt this was not an integral part of the Parish Council Report and that questionnaires that were mailed to parishioners recently were sufficient. An attempt is being made to compile such a report with the aid of the computer and he hoped that by next year this information will be provided. Eugene Raphaelian added the Stewardship Committee is also addressing this problem.

Aetna Tashjian, Assistant Treasurer of the Parish Council, was invited to address the Assembly on the Parish Council Financial Report. Mr. Tashjian noted the bottom line of this Report is the \$401,000.00 Budget for 1986 and recommended this information be passed on to the Stewardship Committee. The keynote, he stated, is that our Church is now over 20 years old and extensive repairs are needed.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Parish Council Report as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Trust Fund Financial Report for 1985:

George Hagopian, member of the Auditing Committee, noted the Trust Fund now totals approximately \$712,000.00 and this Fund continues to grow. He added that as of 1986 interest may be drawn from the Trust Fund.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Trust Fund Financial Report as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Stewardship Program for 1985:

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Eugene Raphaelian, member of the Stewardship Committee, stated this program has made tremendous strides. We are looking forward, he added, to new ideas and thoughts from our younger parishioners so they may carry the torch forward in a vigorous manner.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Stewardship Program Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Cultural Program Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Cultural Program Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Erevan Choral Society Report for 1985:

Zabel Odabashian informed the Assembly preparations are being made for the Erevan Choral Society Concert in April and the observaton of the 20th Anniversary of the Society in that month.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Erevan Choral Society Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Senior Women's Guild Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Senior Women's Guild Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Chelsea Women's Auxiliary Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Chelsea Women's Auxiliary Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Lynn, Salem, Peabody Women's Auxiliary Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Lynn, Salem, Peabody Women's Auxiliary Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Trinity Men's Union Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Trinity Men's Union Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Friends of Holy Trinity - 1000 Club Report for 1985:

Barbara Sahagian, Treasurer, informed the Assembly the 10th Anniversary of this organization will be observed in April, 1986. On this occasion, there will be additional prizes including \$2,000.00 in cash or a trip. This year the 1000 Club has donated \$17,000.00 to the Church.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Friends of Holy Trinity - 1000 Club Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Choir Annual Report for 1985:

Zabel Odabashian stated the Church Choir will observe its 40th Anniversary this year and is planning a Regional Workshop which will include all Churches in the New England area. This will be in conjunction with the Erevan Choral Society.

A Motion was made and passed to accept the Choir's Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Armenian School Report for 1985:

Araxie Janjigian informed the Assembly that our Church has maintained the Armenian School for 20 years. Sessions are held every Sunday morning 45 minutes prior to Sunday School classes. This arrangement was made for the convenience of the students' parents. An example of the progress which can be made was emphasized by Mrs. Janjigian commented that after only 2 weeks of rehearsals, the youngsters were able to recite in Armenian poems and other pieces of literature.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Armenian School Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Sunday School Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Sunday School Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Trinity Couples Club Report for 1985:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Trinity Couples Club Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Father Mampre commented that the Trinity Couples Club meets four times a year. Although they have assisted at Church Bazaars, Picnics and other activities, plans are being made to involve this group more actively in the life of our Church.

A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors Report for 1985:

James Kalustian informed the Asembly the amount of members in this organizations as stated in the Report is in error and that there are 20 dues paying members. He stated the age range for the Juniors is 13 yrs. to 18 yrs. For Seniors the age range is 19 years and older.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors Report for 1985:

John Soursourian stated parishioners should compliment the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors for their accomplishments and should thank their parents for bringing them to the meetings. Walter Vartanian added this year the youth plan to celebrate the 40th Anniversary of the A.C.Y.O.A. at their Annual Palm Sunday Banquet in March.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors Report for 1985. MOTION PASSED.

Regionalization:

Zarvin Kasparian was invited to address the Assembly on the Armenian Church, Eastern Diocese Regionalization Program. Mr. Kasparian is Regional Coordinator. He is also Vice Chairman of the Diocesan Council.

Mr. Kasparian explained to the Assembly that his purpose in being present today was to answer questions relating to the brochure on Regionalization which had been mailed to parishioners. He stated the structure of the Regionalization Program is almost complete with 11 Parishes and a Mission Parish in Cape Cod participating. Attention is being focused on establishing 11 departments in this area. Department Regional Directors are responsible to the Coordinator and they will coordinate the activities of Parish Liaisons who will be directly responsible for the implementation of their respective departmental programs within the Parish.

The Chairman of the Assembly then asked the parishioners if they had any proposals they wished to be submitted to the Annual Diocesan Assembly to be held in Racine, Wisconsin on May 1, 1986. There being none Mr. Vartanian invited Diran Zahigian to present results of the election.

Mr. Zahigian informed the Assembly that 105 ballots were cast in addition to one ballot which was voided. The results were as follows:

He also expressed his appreciation and thanks to Bruce Haroutunian, Harry Kaprelian and Arthur Panosian, outgoing members of the Parish Council, all of whom chose not to seek re-electin, for their valuable service to the Church and community. He extend his thanks to George Hagopian, Peter Talanian and Araxie Toomajian for efficiency in the audits they made of financial records of the Church and Church-affiliated organizations. He noted the task of the Nominating Committee was not an easy one and commended them for submitting new names from the Church community.

Congratulations were extended to George Hagopian, George Haroutunian, barbara Sahagian, Aetna Tashjian and Gerald Boghosian on their election to the Parish Council and to those elected to the Nominating and Auditing Committees.

Father Mampre concluded by informing the Assembly that this year marks the 25th Anniversary of our Church and although it is a beautiful Church in structure, it is more important the Christian spirit prevailes. We must make it a worshiping Church and we must reach out to those who cry for help and bring the beautiful Armenian spirit to everyone, he added. Father Mampre noted that Father Papken has devoted 34 years to the Armenian Church and community.

" Benediction was offered by Rev. Father Papken Maksoudian, Pastor Emeritus.

PASTOR'S REPORT JANUARY 1977 - JANUARY 1987

Dear Parishioners:

This year culminates the 10th anniversary of my ministry within the Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Greater Boston. During these past ten years, we have worked together for the glory of God, for the spiritual growth of our people and for the edification of our Church. I give thanks to Almighty God for giving me the good health to serve Him and you to the best of my ability. I am cognizant that during the past ten years we have seen growth and success, as well as shortcomings. Whatever we have accomplished we share with you, the devoted members of our parish. Wherever we have failed or had shortcomings, it should likewise be equally shared by all of us.

From my point of view, the Holy Trinity Armenian Church is one of the most successful parishes within the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America. I consider it a healthy parish and in the forefront of our churches within the Armenian Church. I wish to dwell on the following items reflecting the state of our parish during the past ten years.

I. Church Services

1. The Reverend Clergy and Church Services. It is with great humility, but with pride and joy, that I want to inform you that there has been total respect, cooperation, harmony and support among the three clergymen serving the Holy Trinity Church. I, as the Pastor of the Church, wish to express my appreciation to our Pastor Emeritus, Father Papken Maksoudian, for his total cooperation and devotion to our Church. There has never been any hard feelings between him and the Pastor. I also wish to express my appreciation to our choir leader, Father Oshagan Minassian, for his cooperation and devotion to the Holy Trinity Church.

With the participation of our Reverend Fathers, we have kept the traditions of our Church in tact, conducting services according to the canons and rites of our Church every Sunday and on different holidays that coincided during the week.

2. Family Services. I have initiated Family Services at Holy Trinity Church with the objective of having the faithful participate in the Liturgy. Thus, the individual families who are members of the Holy Trinity Church participate in and become part of the larger worshipping family of our Church. On these occasions, it is the faithful that become the choir of the day and chant the Liturgy.

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- 3. Washing of the Feet Service. I have tried to give a new meaning and a new approach to this beautiful Service within the Armenian Church. On various occasions, I have invited different groups to have their feet washed, such as: survivors of the Genocide; the Armenian police officers; the intellectuals of the Armenian community; Armenian professors in the universities; Armenian students studying in colleges and universities in the Greater Boston area; members of the Parish Council; and the children of our Armenian School and Sunday School.
- 4. On special occasions, I have invited religious and civic dignitaries to preach or talk in our Church.
- 5. I have initiated religious services on television. Christmas services, Blessing of the Water Service, April 24th Commemoration Services, as well as devotional prayers and interviews have been arranged and telecast on T.V.
- 6. During my administration, the total picture of the Altar servers has been transformed. I wish to remember, with much appreciation, the services of the former deacons of our Church. I take great pride in the seven deacons and subdeacons who serve today at the Altar of our Church. They are young men who are knowledgeable in our Church history and Church Services with a love for their Church just as strong as their predecessors.

II. The Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates

I wish to express my appreciation to the members of our Parish Council and our Diocesan delegates who during the past ten years have been my immediate co-workers. They have all been dedicated individuals who have loved their Church. I am proud to say that the spirit of respect and cooperation among the members of the Parish Council, Diocesan delegates and Pastor has been harmonious.

I am happy to inform you that all the chairmen of the Parish Council, during my administration, have been outstanding individuals. They have approached their duties conscientiously and devotedly. Our Diocesan delegates, with equal love and devotion, have represented our parish at the Annual Diocesan Assemblies or at the regional conferences. I am sure this spirit of mutual love, respect, cooperation and dedication will continue.

III. Cultural Programs

The water of the Since my first year at Holy Trinity Church, I have initiated and held annual cultural programs at our Church.

The location of Holy Trinity, which is in proximity to Harvard University and many other renowed colleges of the Greater Boston area,

demands that we keep up with the intellectual community and present to it the culture of the Armenian people. We are a nation of noble history and culture. Others should know us through our spiritual and cultural heritage.

Since October is designated as cultural month within our Diocese, every weekend during this month is devoted to outstanding cultural programs, lectures, exhibits and concerts. We have invited the most outstanding artists of Armenian descent in the U.S.A. to lecture, exhibit and perform in our Church. We are proud that the news media in the Greater Boston area has given good and favorable coverage to our cultural month events.

We have also initiated Christmas concerts in our Church.

We are gratified that many non-Armenians, as well as Armenians, come to enjoy our outstanding cultural programs. These events have served as a model to other parishes within our Diocese. Other parishes have tried to duplicate what happens at the Holy Trinity Church.

We owe the success of our cultural programs to a handful of devoted parishioners who are determined to bring out the best that our people can offer. We are indebted to the past chairmen and members of the Cultural Committee for their leadership and dedication. We are also grateful to our parishioners who have budgeted and contributed specific amounts of money to our cultural programs.

IV. The State of Our Church-Affiliated Organizations

There are twelve organizations and two standing committees within our parish. Some are more active and healthy than others; some need to be encouraged and strengthened. There have been times when our Church organizations have been healthy with many members, but due to circumstances beyond control, some have lost their members, i.e., Chelsea Women's Guild and the Lynn-Salem-Peabody organizations. Other Church-affiliated organizations have had their ups and downs. Often their successes have been due to their energetic chairpersons and their executive committees. These ups and downs in our Church organizations are natural. It can be found in any Church and any organization. We often hear about "many members but few workers". We are grateful to the chairmen, the executive committees and the entire membership of each organization who work diligently for the prosperity of our Church and the spiritual, educational and social enrichment of their members.

V. The State of Our Schools

1. Armenian School. In the past, during the 1940s and 1950s, in various areas of Greater Boston, there have been six to seven Armenian schools. Since then, some of these schools have closed their doors. The gradual lack of interest amongst our parishioners towards the Armenian language and the Armenian School is evident and sad. Today, at the request of parents, we conduct Armenian language classes only on Sunday mornings for 45 minutes. We have two teachers and 15 students. Of course, the Armenian School and our children deserve better than this short period

of class time and few students. If, we see an improvement in the interest of our parents, we may resume our Armenian School on Saturday mornings over a two-hour class session.

2. Sunday School. The Sunday School is and has been in a healthier condition than the Armenian School. This condition prevails throughout the entire Diocese.

During the past ten years, we have had many graduates from the Sunday School. The number of students today is 90 with approximately 20 teachers and staff members. I appreciate the dedicated services of our superintendent, teachers and staff.

VI. State of the Youth

1. A.C.Y.O.A.s. During the past ten years, we hired different individuals to be in charge of our youth and the Sunday School, in addition to some parents and Parish Council members who assumed the responsibility of guiding the youth and the Sunday School.

We are cognizant of the place of our children and the youth within our community. The Jr. A.C.Y.O.A. is in a healthier situation than the Seniors. The condition of the A.C.Y.O.A.'s throughout the entire Diocese is different today than it used to be in the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s. The decline of the chapters and membership is evident. Despite this fact, we have about 54 members in our Jr. A.C.Y.O.A. and about 20 members in the Senior group. Parents must actively support both chapters and encourage their children to participate.

2. Young Singles. Besides the A.C.Y.O.A.s during the past ten years, we formed the '145 Club' for the young single people in our parish. Today, that group has been replaced with the 'Hye Tech' Society which has its own program within the Greater Boston area.

VII. Ordinations Within Our Church

We are proud to say that during the past ten years, we had different ordinations performed in our Church. We are glad that two priests were ordained at Holy Trinity who are presently serving in different parishes and capacities within the Diocese. We also had the ordination of one person to the diaconate and six young men as subdeacons as well as the ordination of a group of young boys as thirs. We are pleased that one of our subdeacons is presently studying at St. Vladimir Orthodox Seminary under the St. Nersess Program. We are confident that others will also attend seminaries in the future to become priests of the Armenian Church. We have made funds available to our young people to follow the Summer Study programs and Deacons' Training Program at the Oozoonian House under the auspices of St. Nersess.

VIII. The Financial Condition of Our Parish

1. Church Budget. Thanks to our parishioners, the Holy Trinity

Church is in a financially healthy position. The Stewardship Program, which began six years ago, is very successful and has set an example within the entire Diocese, thanks to the handful of individuals who had the foresight of starting and implementing the Stewardship Program. Close to \$100,000 is contributed to the Church Budget, by our parishioners, through the Stewardship Program, with 98% to 100% of the parishioners fulfilling their pledges. We express our gratitude to the founding individuals, the chairmen and the members of this Committee.

Ten years ago, the annual operating budget of our Church was in the vicinity of \$100,000. Today, it is close to half a million dollars. This budget is being met through the generosity and love of our parishioners toward their Church.

2. Holy Trinity Trust Fund. Again, ten years ago, there was \$14,000 in this Fund. Today, I am glad to inform you that there is over \$850,000 in our Trust Fund. We intend to increase this amount to \$1 million so that the Fund may generate income of \$100,000 annually to the Church Budget thus alleviating some of the financial burden carried by our parishioners. May I thank the foresightedness of a small group of individuals who started this Fund which has blossomed today, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners.

IX. Outreach Program

We, as a Church, tried to reach out wherever we could - to the young and to the old alike. I have made a special effort to particularly reach the elderly, the lonely or the sick and all those families or individuals who faced problems in their lives. I have made it my duty to either visit or call these people, not only during the year, but also, especially before high holidays.

I am happy that our community, a few years ago, gave shelter, food and clothing to a group of Armenian and non-Armenian immigrants who had come to our shores. For over three months our community reached out to help these individuals. On various occasions, I have reached out and helped Armenians who were incarcerated.

X. Commemoration of Martyrs Days

During the observation of the 65th and 70th Anniversaries of the Martyrdom of our People, we organized outstanding programs for the Armenian people, the academic community and the non-Armenian community. We organized two symposiums at Harvard University in which Armenian and non-Armenian scholars participated. With the help of a handful of individuals, we sponsored programs and interviews on televistion, wrote articles and generated publicity in the newspapers and news media. We conducted various services in our Church, with the Governor and a Senator participating, as well as the Speaker of the House of Massachusetts as a guest speaker. With the Jewish community, we conducted a joint commemoration at the State House.

XI. Educational Programs

For the enrichment of our members over the past years, we sponsored different educational programs including lectures by academic people, our clergymen and parishioners as well as by the Pastor. On many occasions, I have lectured to our Church organizations as well as to different groups within the Greater Boston area. Bible Study sessions were held by our clergy, by our Directors of Christian Education, and by our parishioners. Today, Bible Studies are conducted on Sunday mornings and at the Senior Women's meetings. During my monthly visitations to the Sunday School, I have conducted assemblies and taught in various grades. The monthly publication of our parish, the "Dajar" is also being utilized for this purpose.

X. New Programs and Projects

During my administration, the following new programs or projects have been started at the Holy Trinity Church:

- 1. The bronze doors of our Church were made and donated by the Karchakians in memory of their son, Alan David.
- 2. Television programs on different occasions.
- 3. "Man of the Year." Once a year we honor a dedicated individual from our parish.
- 4. Washing of the Feet Service. We changed the entire concept of this Service by washing the feet of different groups on Holy Thursday.
- 5. Poon Paregentan celebration for the children and young people of our Church.
- 6. Rug Sale. Once a year we have a rug sale that generates over \$30,000 a year to our Church.
- 7. Stewardship Program which is a model within the Diocese. We have shared this Program with other parishes throughout the Diocese.
- 8. Family Services. During the year, on different occasions, I have started Family Services to bring more parishioners to Church and to secure their participation in the Worship Service.
- 9. Christmas Concerts. During the Christmas season, we offer a Christmas Concert to the community, free of charge.
- 10. The October Outstanding Cultural Programs.
- 11. The transformation of the Altar servers at our Church. Today, the Altar servers are all young people. We express our appreciation to the older generation who did their share.

- 12. We have offered explanatory Liturgy on different Sunday mornings for our younger generation.
- 13. Joint Services and Commemorative Program with the Jewish community at the State House.
- 14. The increase in membership of our Church from 614 in 1977 to 860 in 1986.
- 15. Counselling sessions have been established for those desiring baptism, confirmation or premarital counselling, as well as for those individuals with personal or family difficulties.
- 16. We have secured funds for the Holy Trinity Trust Fund.
- 17. The Cultural Center was furnished with air conditioning.
- 18. The Cultural Center was furnished with new and comfortable chairs.
- 19. The Church Office was furnished with a computer and a large photocopy machine.
- 20. An alarm system was put in our Church.

XI. Peaceful and Harmonious Years

I am glad to inform you that the past ten years have been peaceful and harmonious years for our community. There has been good will amongst the organizations and within the community in general. The differences and bickerings of the past years have disappeared. There has been cooperation and good will between the members of the Holy Trinity Church. We are pleased that our progress and programs have set examples within the Diocese for others to follow.

For the Holy Trinity Church, 1986 was a year of milestones and commemorations highlighted by the 25th Anniversary of the Consecration of our new Church in Cambridge. It was also a year in which we looked ahead; evaluating our current facilities with an eye to the future needs of our community.

In an attempt to assess our present capabilities and anticipate the future needs of the parish, the Parish Council established subcommittees to research and make recommendations in several areas. Noteworthy among these were the Cultural Hall Renovation Committee; the Computer Committee; and the Tenant Committee. The Renovation Committee's evaluation is comprised of four major areas: the Adamian Hall and classrooms; the kitchen and storage areas; the Cultural Hall, foyer, and lavatories; and the Johnson Hall. The Computer Committee, with the assistance of the Stewardship Committee, is researching the marketplace to determine which software and hardware products will best meet our increasing computer needs. Our contract with the Delphi Academy, the current tenants in our school area, expires at the end of August 1987. The Tenant Committee is evaluating the current situation to determine how to best meet the financial and educational needs of our parish in the future. The Council is also investigating the feasibility of hiring a part-time or full-time administrator to assist with the general management of our facilities and equipment.

The Maintenance Committee actively tended to the physical upkeep of our

buildings and grounds. Among the many items completed were the following: a new drainage system and asphalting along the walkways between the Cultural Center and Shahe Hall; extensive tree and shrubbery trimming and removal from the Church grounds; landscaping of the Parish House and Shahe Hall courtyard; and the repair and replacement of the fence between Shahe Hall and the Parish House and our neighbors on Riesdel Street. The Committee also made the following purchases: a new sign for the Cultural Center; new coffee urns for the Cultural Hall kitchen; and a chain link fence enclosure for our dumpster. The Committee has also begun a major investigation and repair of the leak to the Church dome.

In 1986, the Parish Council again sponsored a number of successful cultural and social events. On the weekend of May 31 and June 1st, the parish celebrated the Ordination of Dr. Krikor Maksoudian into the Holy Order of Priesthood. Archie Kolligian and John Soursourian chaired the banquet. On Sunday, June 22nd the parish honored Father Oshagan Minassian on the occasion of the 35th Anniversary of his Consecration and Ordination to the Holy Order of Priesthood. The banquet was chaired by Diran Zahigian. The annual Church Picnic, chaired by Zabelle and Norair Odabashian, was held on Sunday, September 7th.

General Vartanian and his committee chaired the Rug Sale again this year from the 2nd through the 5th of October. October was also Cultural Month. The Cultural Committee again arranged for a very successful and informative series of Armenian speakers, musicians, and art exhibits. Sunday, October 26th was Stewardship Sunday and the 25th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church. Robert Zartarian chaired this celebration. On the previous evening, the Church sponsored a reception for those individuals who had either been married or baptized in the new Church. This reception was hosted by three couples: Mr. and Mrs. Tom Stephanian Jr., Mr. and Mrs. Steven Tashjian, and Mr. and Mrs. George Manghis.

The annual Church Bazaar took place on Saturday, December 6th and was co-chaired by Ann Shazade and Natalie Pittman. The annual Christmas Concert was rendered by Father Oshagan Minassian and The Erevan Choral Society on Sunday, December 14th.

The Parish Council continued its commitment to the cultural education of the children of the parish by once again sponsoring deserving Sunday School and Armenian School students for Camp Vartan and The St. Nersess Summer Studies Conferences. The Council also employed the services of Elizabeth Ungermann as a full-time Youth and Religious Education Director. Due to personal commitments, her services were limited to the months of March through August. The Hye Tek Society was organized, under the auspices of Holy Trinity, as a social organization for singles between the ages of twenty-five and thirty-nine. Haig Agababian is the Advisor.

On March 31st, a joint meeting was held between the Parish Council and the various Church-affiliated organization's chairpersons. A variety of topics were discussed to the mutual benefit of all. The parish's Monument Committee was allocated additional funds to continue its efforts in

selecting and constructing a monument to the victims of the Armenian Genocide. A Special Assembly was held on Sunday, September 21st, at which the artist Arto Chakmakjian presented a scaled model of his concept of the monument.

New health insurance benefits were offered to our fulltime employees at fifty percent of cost through The Harvard Community Health Plan. The Parish Council has also hired legal council to obtain a Temporary Restraining Order preventing Mr. Todd Beatty from blocking access to our right-ofway. Looking to the future, Holy Trinity will be hosting the annual Diocesan Assembly from May 5th through the 8th, 1988. Helene Dorian is chairing the Organizing Committee.

The Pastor and Parish Council wish to express our thanks to the parishioners and to all of the Church-affiliated organizations for their continued efforts and support.
