Nancy Kasarjian, Chairman of the Parish Council presided. The Opening Prayer was offered by Very Reverend Father Oshagan Minassian.

The Chairman stated if there were no objections from the floor, formal readings of each individual report would be omitted. However, he stated, questions could be addressed to the Chair. No objections were expressed.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept Armenian School Annual Report for 1986 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Sunday School Annual Report for 1986:
It was noted the name of Mark Krikorian as teacher was omitted from this Report. This correction being noted, a Motion was made and seconded to accept the Sunday School Annual Report for 1986. MOTION PASSED.

Trinity Couples Club Annual Report for 1986:
A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Trinity Couples Club Annual Report for 1986 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors Annual Report for 1986:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors Annual Report for 1986. <u>MOTION PASSED</u>.

A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors Annual Report for 1986:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors Annual Report for 1986 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

The Chairman of the Assembly then asked those present if there were any Proposals which they wanted submitted to the Annual Diocesan Assembly. There were none.

The Chairman announced there would be an addition to the Agenda to be labelled lla. This will be a presentation by Aetna Tashjian, chairman of the Renovation Committee, who was invited to address the Assembly.

Mr. Tashjian stated the Parish Council had appointed a committee for the for the refurbishment of the Church complex. He stated he would present the findings of this committee and asked for the complete support of the parishioners. The committee consists of Cynthia Kazanjian - Kitchen; Gerald Boghosian - Foyer and Lavatories; Queenie Raphaelian - Adamian Hall and Classrooms; John Soursourian - Johnson Hall and enlargement of Kitchen; and Nancy Kasarjian as Chairman of the Parish Council. He added Charles Talanian has been asked to serve on the Committee.

The plans for the Renovation Committee include retaining the Basket Ball facilities with folding nets coming from the ceiling which will be used when the facilities are not in use.

The Foyer will be refurbished and a Men's Room added adjacent to the Ladies Room.

It is planned to have new style thermopane windows for Cultural Hall, a new wooden floor and a new wall between Cultural and Johnson Halls which can be raised when more space is necessary. Mr. Tashjian stated there will be a total face lift with new draperies, painting of the facilties and new doors. He stated the gross amount which is anticipated is \$618,000.00 if the kitchen is not enlarged and \$810,000.00 for a larger kitchen. He added these figures are an estimate and are not supported by bids. James Kalustian, a member of the Parish Council, informed the Assembly the Parish Council has not allocated any amount for the project.

In discussion the question was asked when this project will be started and Mr. Tashjian answered the Diocesan Annual Assembly will be held in our Church facilities in May of 1988 and the committee would like the project completed before that date.

The need for storage space is vital, Mr. Tashjian stated, and the question was raised whether consideration had been given to having storage space below the ground level and the answer was storage space had to be floor level.

There was discussion on plans to eliminate the Cloak Room. There were objections to this being done and Mr. Tashjian stated the Committee will take this into consideration.

Father Oshagan stressed the need for a Music Room and asked the Committe to take this into consideration. The Music Room, he stated, would be used for rehearsal and should have a piano in it and cabinets for musical materiels. He also asked the committee to request improving the acoustics of Cultural Hall and Johnson Hall. Mr. Tashjian stated this is being done and suggested that possibly Johnson Hall could be used as a Music Room.

Regarding the classrooms, Mr.Tashjjin informed the Assembly that this sub-committee headed by Queenie Raphaelian is working with interior designers in addition to classrooms improvements and Adamian Hall and lavoratories improvements. Also, in consideration there are plans for a lounge for teachers and senior students.

Araxie Janjigian, Superintendent of the Armenian School, expressed her concern for the facilities of the School. She stated there have been losses of valuable books and several volumes have disappeared.

The need of a loading ramp was brought to the attention of the Committee and it was pointed out that this is possible since we do have the right of way for trucks to enter this area.

Donald Tellalian who by profession is an architect was invited by the Chairman of the Renovating Committee to address the Assembly. Mr. Tellalian stated that all Renovation Plans are based on a "wish list" and not all projects satisfy everyone. He stated we must consider Scheduling, Phasing, Budget and Priorities.

Among the items Mr. Tellalian commented on were:

New wooden floor for Cultural Hall should take into consideration the maintenance of the floor since the bouncing of basket balls would cause unusual movements and would require added maintenance.

Regarding storage space and classrooms, Mr. Tellalian suggested the architect check with the building codes limitations.

Small Thermopane windows, Mr. Tellalian, pointed out means matching of the bricks. He suggested the cost of this be taken into consideration. Also, he recommended a mechanical engineer be asked to look into the probable savings in having such windows.

Regarding the Kitchen Loading Dock, Mr. Tellalian recommended the architect check the "Right of Way". Also, a legal opinion should be obtained.

Regarding the Cloak Room, Mr. Tellalianfelt it was sensible to retain it if the architect could use the space without a counter.

Mr. Tellalian advised the Committee to have the architect check the legal property line. before expansion is considered.

Nr. Tashjian informed the Assembly a meeting will be held in three or four weeks to further discuss renovation plans. This meeting will be opened to all parishioners.

The Chairman, Mr. Vartanian, then invited Dr. Kolligian to announce voting results. Those elected were as follows:

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1987

Dear Parishioners:

I present to you my eleventh (11th) Annual Report for the year 1987. I give thanks to Almighty God for giving me the health to work with you for another year as your Pastor.

My pastoral activities are divided into the following categories:

I. Church Services

Every Sunday Church Services were conducted in our Church according to the rules of our Church, with sermons delivered in two languages (Armenian and English) either by me or by other clergymen. On special occasions, invited clergymen celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon. Father Papken Maksoudian, Pastor Emeritus, and Father Oshagan Minasian, Choir Director, have assisted in the Services along with the altar servers and members of the Choir.

During 1987, the following clergymen have conducted Services and delivered the sermon:

- 1. On January 4th, our Primate Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, celebrated the Divine Liturgy for the youth and the children of the Greater Boston and Merrimack Valley Armenian Churches. Many young people and children attended the Services and received Holy Communion. Following the Divine Liturgy, the Primate's Christmas Party was held in our Cultural Hall hosted by His Eminence.
- 2. While I was in California, the following clergymen conducted Church Services:

January 25 - Father Krikor Maksoudian
February 1 - Father Oshagan Minasian
February 8 - Father Krikor Maksoudian
February 15 - Father Carnig Hallajian
February 22 - Father Papken Maksoudian
March 1 - Father Papken Maksoudian

- 3. On April 5th, Father Krikor Maksoudian delivered the sermon.
- 4. On May 31st, on the 40th Anniversary of the Association of Armenian Church Choirs, the Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon. That day, the combined choirs of our Churches sang the Khorenian version of the Divine Liturgy for the first time.
- 5. On July 5th, Father Diran Papazian of Union City, N.J., celebrated and delivered the sermon.
 - 6. On July 19th, Father Krikor Maksoudian.

- 7: On July 26th, Father Papken Maksoudian.
- 8. On August 2nd, Father Tateos Abdalian of Greenfield, Wisc.
- 9. On August 30th, Bishop Kuid Nakkashian, Primate of Paris, France, celebrated and delivered the sermon.
 - 10. On October 11th, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan delivered the sermon.

The Divine Liturgy was celebrated on Christmas and Easter Eves.

On January 6th, on the Feast Day of Christmas and Epiphany, the Divine Liturgy was celebrated. The members of the Senior Women's Guild received Holy Communion, and then held their Annual Christmas Luncheon and Program.

During Lent, Holy Week and special days which occurred during the week, Services were conducted for the members of our community.

On March 6th, the Church Women United conducted their Annual Service in our Church, hosted by our Women's Guild.

On March 11th, our Women's Guild hosted the Women Saints Day for the Armenian community of Greater Boston and the Merrimack Valley area. A luncheon and program followed the Church Services.

On Holy Thursday, the Divine Liturgy was celebrated. The members of the Senior Women's Guild received Holy Communion which was followed by a luncheon program.

Father Krikor Maksoudian conducted the Washing of the Feet Service in our Church.

On Easter Eve, a special service was conducted for the children of our Armenian and Sunday Schools where they received Holy Communion followed with a breakfast sponsored by the Women's Guild and hosted by the Couples Club.

On Mother's Day, Thanksgiving Day and the Sunday preceding Christmas, Family Service was conducted in our Church.

On May 28th, on the Feast Day of Ascension, the members of the Women's Guild received Holy Communion followed by the traditional festivities of Ascension.

On September 20th, Family Reunion Sunday, a complimentary luncheon was served in our Cultural Hall hosted by the Jack Kolligian Foundation Trustees.

II. Sacraments and Services

During 1987, the following sacraments and services were performed in our Church:

Baptisms: 21 Engagements: 2 Weddings: 14 Funerals: 35

On these occasions, I have tried to be with our parishioners to share their joy or grief, to counsel or console them.

" III. Counselling Services

On 55 occasions, I held counselling sessions with individuals and families. I held premarital counselling sessions with those individuals or couples who intended to get married in our Church. I also had preconfirmation counselling with adults and individuals who had personal or family problems.

IV. Pastoral Visitations

During the past year, I made 351 pastoral visitations to the homes of our parishioners, to hospitals and to nursing homes to visit and pray for the sick and the elderly. I also visited cemetaries with families to bless the graves of their beloved ones. On several occasions, I visited and conducted services at the Armenian Nursing Home and other nursing homes.

On many occasions I have reached out to the members of our community by calling them on the telephone, particularly the sick, the elderly, the shut-ins and those that I haven't seen in Church for awhile, to show our concern and interest in their welfare. For a few years now, I have also been doing this just before Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day and Thanksgiving.

These calls and visitations have been appreciated by our parishioners.

V. Meetings

I presided and participated at 296 meetings during 1987. These meetings were with either parish-affiliated organizations, their executive bodies, or their chairmen and different committees. I also participated at the Diocesan Assembly in Springfield, Mass., for one day.

VI. Cultural and Educational

For the last ten years, our Parish has been celebrating the Armenian Cultural Month in October with a !"Celebrate Armenian Heritage"! Cultural Program with scheduled events every weekend. These events have been very successful. In December we had our Annual Christmas Concert in Church.

On April 24th, we commemorated the Armenian Martyrs Day at the State House with the participation of government dignitaries.

We wish to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to our Armenian and Sunday School Superintendents, teachers and staff for their dedicated services. May God bless them and reward them.

The monthly publication of our Parish, the "Dajar", has been utilized for educational and informational purposes.

On different occasions I have utilized the meetings of our Church organizations to speak to them on various subjects.

On April 1st, I took part in a panel discussion at Sts. Sahag & Mesrob Armenian Church of Providence, R.I., and talked about the Unity Issue within the Armenian Church in the U.S.A.

On August 8th, at our Church, the Department of Religious Education of our Diocese conducted a workshop for Sunday School teachers and staff members of the New England Armenian Churches to introduce and explain the new curriculum.

On various occasions I was interviewed by newspaper or T.V. reporters about Armenian affairs. On January 5th, the largest Jewish newspaper, in Boston, interviewed me about Jerusalem. In October and November, the British Broadcasting Company of London, England, interviewed me about His Holiness' visit to Boston. On October 18th, Channel 7, television network, taped the Divine Liturgy in our Church.

VII. Youth Ministry

During the year, the Parish Council and I have been looking for a part-time Youth Director. We received an application for this job but unfortunately, the candidate was not qualified for the position. We desperately need a Youth Director to take care of the needs of our youth. On different occasions, I have participated in the ACYOA Seniors and Juniors meetings. We need help from the parents, particularly with the ACYOA Jrs.

VIII. His Holiness' Visit

His Holiness Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, paid a Pontifical visit to the New England Armenian Churches from November 19-21.

On November 19th, His Holiness arrived at Logan Airport where he was met by clergy, dignitaries and parishioners. A Hrashapar Service was held in our Church that evening for the parishioners of the eleven Armenian Churches of New England. Over one thousand people were gathered in our Church to receive His Holiness' blessings and hear his Pontifical message. That same evening a reception was held at the St. James Cultural Center in Watertown.

On Friday, November 20th, in the Charles & Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall, a luncheon/reception was held in His Holiness' honor attended by the

Armenian clergy, members of the Parish Council, Diocesan delegates and benefactors. Cardinal Bernard Law, Archbishop of the Catholic Church of Boston, was also present. The luncheon was hosted by some of our women. That same evening, a Youth Gathering took place at St. James Cultural Center for the youth and children of the New England Armenian Churches. In the afternoon, Cardinal Law gave a reception at his residence in honor of the Catholicos.

On Saturday, November 21st, His Holiness departed from Boston to Detroit.

We express our appreciation to those parishioners who diligently worked on different committees to welcome His Holiness in our midst. This was the third Pontifical visit of His Holiness Vasken I to our Church. The first visit took place in 1960 when our Church was being built. The second, in 1968, when he celebrated the Divine Liturgy at Holy Trinity, and the third on November 19th of this year.

His Holiness' visit created great enthusiasm and interest amongst Armenians and non-Armenians in the Greater Boston area.

IX. Important Events

- On May 18th, our Parish hosted a reception for the delegation from Yerevan, Armenia, who were visiting Cambridge. The Cambridge-Yerevan Sister City Project, served as hosts for the delegation from Armenia.
- We are grateful to twelve (12) parishioners each of whom donated \$10,000 towards the stained-glass windows for the dome of our Church. The stained-glass windows are a reproduction from the 17th Century paintings adorning the front of the bema of the main altar of the Cathedral of Holy Etchmiadzin. Sandon Studios of Little Valley, New York, has been commissioned to do this work. It is expected that the windows will be completed by Easter.
- Naming of the Cultural Hall. According to the decision made at the Special Assembly last May, we were able to find a benefactor to underwrite the renovation expenditure of our Cultural Hall. The late Charles Talanian and his family generously donated \$400,000 towards this project. Last December, we received the first payment of \$250,000. The remaining \$150,000 will be donated in the next few years. In appreciation of the Talanians' generosity, and based on the Assembly's decision, our Cultural Hall with henceforth be known as the "Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall". On behalf of our community, we express our deep appreciation to the late Charles and Nevart Talanian and their children for their generosity.

X. Bible Study Session

From September to May, Bible Study Sessions were conducted every Sunday morning from 10:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. The Bible Study was led by Greg Tashjian with approximately ten individuals participating in these sessions. After each session, the attendees were urged to participate in the Divine Liturgy. I wish to express my appreciation to Greg Tashjian for his help.

XI. The Financial Condition of Our Parish

I wish to express my appreciation to our parishioners for supporting their Church with their prayers, participation and monetary gifts. During 1987, we were fortunate to obtain generous gifts from many parishioners. I would like to take this opportunity to mention the following individuals:

- 1. Mr. Sam Babayan generously donated \$100,000 to the Holy Trinity Trust Fund in memory of his late brother, Harry Babayan.
- Albert and Virginia Zouranjian donated \$50,000 to the Trust Fund.
- 3. Robert Zaven and Isabel Zartarian donated \$20,000 in memory of their loved ones.

The complete list of the donors to our Trust may be found in the Annual Financial Report of the Trust Fund.

I would like to inform our parishioners that our Trust Fund has reached \$1,200,000. May God reward you all for your generosity and support.

XII. The Church Office

The ever-growing needs of our Parish has put a heavy burden on the staff and volunteers of our Parish Office. We need additional employees to take care of the needs of our Parish.

The Pastor and Parish Council have been searching for a Youth Director to take care of the needs of our young people. An application has been received from an individual and we are looking into this. We need an additional full-time secretary for our busy Office. A Director is needed to attend to the overall needs of our Church and to supervise the activities of our Community. We express our appreciation to our Church Secretary, Rose Mamishian, who has been serving our Parish for the last 18 years. Our bookkeeper, Harvinder Jassal, continues to take care of the bookkeeping aspects of our Church. A group of parishioners and friends volunteer their services to the Office whenever needed. We express our gratitude to them. Seta Buchter continues to take care of our Sunday

School on a part-time basis. We express our appreciation to Seta for her leadership and dedication.

XIII. Appreciation

My appreciation is extended to our Pastor Emeritus, Rev. Father Papken Maksoudian, for his help in carrying on my ministry in our Parish. Also, to Father Oshagan Minasian for his services. I would like to express my appreciation to the Chairman of our Parish Council, Nancy Kasarjian, to the Tivan, and to the members of the Parish Council for their dedication and leadership.

For the Holy Trinity Church, 1987 was a year marked with significant activity and progress in the renovation and maintenance of our church, grounds, and facilities. These activities have and will continue to generate marked expenses that the Parish Council has to deal with. Holy Trinity is a growing, dynamic church thanks to its hard-working parishioners who are committed to sustain and build it. The Parish Council has attempted to provide the leadership to take Holy Trinity Church into the next decade.

This year the problem of the leaking church dome windows was corrected by installing new frames and protective lexan windows. To do this the old windows had to be removed and a decision had to be made whether to repair the old windows or replace them with new ones. Father Mampre was able to find donors and successfully raise the funds needed to underwrite the entire cost of new stained glass windows depicting the twelve Apostles. A contract has been signed with Sandon Studios of Little Valley, New York and the new windows should be in place by April 1988.

The Maintenance Committee tended to other items involved in the physical upkeep of our buildings and grounds. Among these items were: the painting of the parish house; a new porch and exterior carpentry work for the parish house; repair of the leaded glass windows at the entrance of the parish house; repair

of a heating system leak in the Baptistery; painting and carpeting of the Baptistery, with carpeting donated by Robert Proodian; replacing the skylight and fixing the kitchen walls in Shahe Hall; repair of concrete walkways and steps; installation of an exhaust fan in the kitchen; resurfacing and line painting of the parking lot, which was donated by Arthur & Helen Maranian; installation of a fence, gate, and bumper in the back parking lot; and the building of a storage shed for maintenance equipment with John Shazade donating his labor for the project; and the installation of a computerized thermostat for the church heating.

The significant amount of activities that are a part of the maintenance for the church facilities has raised the need to employ a manager to coordinate and oversee this work. The Council is actively looking for a person for this position.

In March of 1987 a Special Parish Assembly was held to discuss the renovation of the Cultural Hall. The Renovation Committee presented a proposal which outlined a three phase project over a 2 - 3 year period. Plans for remodeling the Cultural Hall, Johnson Hall, the kitchen, and Adamian Hall were discussed. A second Special Parish Assembly was held in May to discuss budgeting and financing for needed repairs and renovations. At this special parish assembly a motion was passed that if the Parish Council found an individual or family to donate funds in the vicinity of \$500,000 towards the renovation of the Cultural Hall, that the hall be named in their honor. The family of the late Charles Talanian, knowing of his discussions with Father Mampre regarding a major donation toward the renovation of the Cultural Hall, was able to commit \$400,000 to the renovation of the Cultural Hall. The Parish Council voted to accept this donation and have the Cultural Hall named the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.

The Renovation Committee, under Chairman Aetna Tashjian, started the wheels in motion for Phase I of the renovation. Activities for Phase I Renovation include: new floors, windows, basketball equipment, tables, and lighting for the main hall; remodeling the bathrooms and foyer; new rugs and school furniture for Adamian Hall classrooms.

In 1987, the Parish Council sponsored a number of cultural events. On Monday, May 18th, Holy Trinity hosted a reception for the Mayor of Erevan and a delegation of artists and representatives from Armenia who were visiting Cambridge as part of the Cambridge-Erevan Sister City Program. The event was well-attended by the surrounding Armenian and American community. Jim Kalustian coordinated the activities for Holy Trinity and worked with the Sister City Committee.

His Holiness Vasken I, Catholicos of all Armenians visited New England on November 19 - 21, 1987. Harashapar services were conducted at Holy Trinity on the evening of the Vehapar's arrival with the church filled to capacity with the faithful from all of

the New England parishes. A luncheon banquet with the Vehapar for the Clergy, Parish Councils, and Diocesan Delegates of the New England churches and major donors for the pontifical visit was held in the Charles & Nevart Talanian Hall on Friday, November 20th.

Other traditional church social events that took place in 1987 were: the annual Church Picnic chaired by Helen Donabedian held on Sunday, September 13th; the Rug Sale held October 1 - 4, 1987 chaired by Martin Kalustian; October Cultural Month activities; Stewardship Sunday Banquet on October 25th which honored Charles Talanian, posthumously, as Man-of-the-Year and was co-chaired by Martha Boghosian, Esther Jamgochian, Mimi Kalustian, and Arax Najarian; an Arts & Graphics Show, chaired by Arthur Maranian, Sr., on October 30th - November 1st; the annual Church Bazaar on Saturday, December 5th, co-chaired by Nancy Young, Ann Shazade, and Natalie Pittman; and the Christmas Concert performed by the Erevan Choral Society under the direction of Father Oshagan Minassian on Sunday, December 13th.

September 1987 marked the beginning use of the new Department of Religious Education curriculum in the Holy Trinity Sunday School. The Sunday School now has a full-time Superintendent, Seta Buchter. In addition, there is an active search going on for a part-time youth director.

Some interest was shown in a piece of property left to the Church in Tewksbury. Based on advice from a professional appraisal and a local lawyer, the Church was able to sell the lot for \$50,000 and deposit the money in the Trust Fund. Delphi Academy requested to extend their lease of Adamian Hall, and the hall was rented to the school thru June 1988.

Also in 1987 the Diocesan Assembly Committee, under the chairmanship of Helene Dorian, began to work on the arrangements and setting up sub-committees for the May 12 - 15, 1988 Assembly that will be hosted by Holy Trinity.

The Pastor and the Parish Council wish to express our thanks to the parishioners and to all of the Church-affiliated organizations for their untiring efforts and support. A special note of thanks also goes to the staff of Holy Trinity. Their loyal efforts to keep Holy Trinity running efficiently are appreciated.
