



ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY Sunday, February 7, 1988

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was held on Sunday afternoon, February 7, 1988, in the Church's Cultural Hall. Nancy Kasarjian, Chairwoman of the Parish Council chaired the meeting. The opening prayer was offered by Reverend Father Mampre A. Kouzouian.

Dr. Kolligian informed the Assembly that nominations in each category would be accepted from the floor. There being none, a Motion was made and seconded to receive the selections as presented by the Nominating Committee. MOTION PASSED.

A supply of copies of the Annual Report covering the period from January 1, 1987 through December 31, 1987 were given out to anyone who needed one, but there were a few copies short. The Chairman informed the Assembly that unless there were objections, formal readings of each individual report would be omitted, and any questions could be addressed to the Chair. There were no objections.

Minutes of the 1987 Parish Assembly:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Minutes of the Annual Parish Assembly held on February 1, 1987, with one addition requested by Father Mampre to add the words "in the absence of the Pastor" following the sentence "The Opening Prayer was offered by Very Reverend Father Oshagan Minassian". This was in the first paragraph of said Minutes. MOTION PASSED.

Pastor's Annual Report for 1987:

Father Mampre reviewed his Annual Report briefly, in English and Armenian, and asked for any questions as he went along. In connection with the visit of His Holiness Vasken I in November, Father Mampre specifically wished to thank all the parishoners once again who worked so hard to make Vehapar's visit a successful one. He also extended special thanks to Father Papken Maksoudian, Nancy Kasarjian, Rose Mamishian and Very Reverend Father Oshagan Minassian.

At this time, Donald Tellalian made a request to have in next year's report, under the heading of <u>Sacraments and Services</u> comparison statistics covering the last ten years of the Stewardship Program (participant numbers, etc.) The Chairman stated that the Parish Council would consider this request.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Pastor's Annual Report for 1987. MOTION PASSED.

Parish Council's Activities and Financial Report for 1987:

Aetna Tashjian, Chairman of the Renovation Committee, wished to report that the new rugs and furniture are "on hold" at this time.

On Page 6h of the Financial Special Account Report, correction was requested to add the first names of the Der Hohanessians, which are Levon and Anna. (Under "Income 1987").

Parish Council Treasurer Albert Zouranjian was called upon to answer any questions from the floor in relation to the Financial Report. On page 6j, the terminology of "Clergy Preparation" was questioned. Father Mampre explained that this means the allocation to the Diocese to prepare interested candidates in becoming clergymen. It was also pointed out, also on page 6j, that the \$150,000. in the Talanian Fund is available and may have additional funds added.

The Trust Fund Report was reviewed by George Hagopian.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Parish Council Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

At this time, Candidates for the various offices were invited to come forward to be introduced to the Assembly. The Chairman announced that the Ballot Box would be opened at 1:30 P.M. and there would be a 15 minute break for voting purposes.

Approval of the 1988 Budget:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Proposed Budget for the year 1988 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

REPORTS OF CHURCH AUXILIARY ORGANIZATIONS:

Stewardship Program:

The Chairman was requested to ask that those who have not made pledges as yet to kindly do so as soon as possible. Question was raised by Albert Oskoian in regard to the pledged amount of \$97,500.00. He wanted to know how much had actually been received, and the reply was approximately \$99,000.00.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Stewardship Program Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Cultural Committee Annual Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Cultural Committee Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Erevan Choral Society Annual Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Erevan Choral Society Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Senior Women's Guild Report for 1987: (Annual Report and Financial Report)

Special compliments were extended to the Senior Women by John Soursourian on the excellent preparation of their reports.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Senior Women's Guild Reports for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Women's Guild Annual Reports for 1987: (Annual Report and Financial Report)

Chairwoman Ann Vartanian wished to extend thanks to everyone for their support during her term of office. John Soursourian complimented the Women's Guild on their wonderful accomplishments.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Women's Guild Reports for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

At this time, Father Papken wished to make a request that in next year's Annual Report, a single page Summary be prepared indicating the total amount of monies received by each organization at year's end.

A Motion to prepare such a Summary Report was made and seconded. $\underline{\text{MOTION}}$ PASSED.

The Chairman now called on Helene Dorian to give a report on the Diocesan Assembly to be held at Holy Trinity Church May 10-15. Mrs. Dorian asked that everyone try to attend the Kick-Off Dinner to be held on Wednesday, February 10th, to hear more of the details for the upcoming Assembly.

Chelsea Women's Auxiliary Annual Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Chelsea Women's Auxiliary Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Lynn-Salem-Peabody Women's Auxiliary Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Lynn-Salem-Peabody Women's Auxiliary Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Trinity Men's Union Annual Report for 1987:

Edward Nahabedian urged any men who might be interested in joining the Trinity Men's Union to come to any of the meetings and become a member.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Trinity Men's Union Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

"Friends of Holy Trinity - 1000 Club" Annual Report for 1987:

Aetna Tashjian informed the Assembly that the "1000 Club" is having some problem in filling the large quota of open numbers and urged members to consider the new "2 for 1" offer that may be coming up soon. Grace Kaprelian felt that loss of membership was maybe due to requests to pay annually or semi-annually instead of monthly. Barbara Sahagian said that while it would make the work easier if people did pay in larger increments, the people could pay in whatever way was best for them. Miss Sahagian went on to say that the \$33,000.00 amount shown in the Financial Report is in escrow.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the "Friends of Holy Trinity - 1000 Club" Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Choir Annual Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Choir Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. $\underline{\text{MOTION PASSED}}$.

At this time, Father Mampre wished to make some comments on the status of the Armenian School. He stated that while there were some 100 students in the Sunday School, there were only about 12 to 15 students in the Armenian School. Even though classes were changed from Saturday to Sunday to accommodate the children and their parents, attendance was too low, and he urged the parents to encourage their children to attend. A suggestion was made to "combine" classes with St. James Armenian Church, but this was not felt to be a practical idea.

Continuing on the subject of Armenian language education, Dan Dorian felt that a good idea for adults wishing to learn, would be a "Berlitz-Type Program" of tapes. He felt the idea should be presented to the Diocese. Susan Kouzouian reported that there is a new class starting up for single adults at a cost of about \$85.00. Donald Tellalian thought Mr. Dorian's idea was very good, and he offered the idea of being able to use the tapes in car tape-decks.

A Motion was made by Robert Zartarian to write an official letter to the Diocese presenting the idea of the "Berlitz-Type Program Tapes, as outlined by Mr. Dorian.

A second Motion was made to present this idea in the form of a Proposal. It was also pointed out that NAASR and AGBU have listings of tapes and maybe these should be checked out first. There was further discussion about this matter, and it was further pointed out if it was done in Proposal form, it would require funding and explanation. The second Motion was amended and then withdrawn.

The original Motion to write an official letter to the Diocese was seconded. MOTION PASSED.

Araxie Janjigian wanted to point out that while the idea of tapes, etc. for the adults was a good one, the primary concern should still be the children and directing their interests in attending the Armenian School.

A Motion to accept the Armenian School Report for 1987 as submitted was made and seconded. MOTION PASSED.

At this time, John Soursourian, Holy Trinity's New England Representative wanted to inform the Assembly of the Raffle tickets he has, and anyone who might wish to purchase one should speak to him. He has 50 tickets at \$100.00 each.

Sunday School Annual Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Sunday School Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

Trinity Couples Club Annual Report for 1987:

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the Trinity Couples Club Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors Annual Report for 1987:

The Chairman appealed to the Assembly to encourage any young person they knew to join the Juniors. Father Mampre requested everyone to support the Poon Paragentan celebration on Sunday, February 14th.

A Motion was made and seconded to accept the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors Annual Report for 1987:

A motion was made and seconded to accept the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors Annual Report for 1987 as submitted. MOTION PASSED.

The Chairman's next item on the Agenda was to determine if there were any Proposals to be submitted to the Annual Diocesan Assembly. There were none.

The Chairman then asked Donald Tellalian to give the Assembly a report on the status of the stained glass windows, and Mr. Tellalian stated that the twelve apostles are being recreated in genuine stained glass for the dome.

At this time, Dr. Kolligian was called upon to announce the voting results of the day. Those elected are as follows:

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1988

Dear Parishioners:

It is with pleasure that I present to you my twelfth Annual Report for the year 1988. This year's report is different from previous years' annual reports in that instead of the usual accounting of how many church services, sacraments, visitations, meetings, counseling services, cultural and educational programs took place in our Parish, I will be emphasizing the major events that occurred within our Parish during the past year.

I give thanks to Almighty God for guiding me in my ministry amongst you during the past year and express my appreciation to you for your love, support, and dedication to your Church.

The following are the major events that took place in our Parish during 1988:

1. The Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall

As you know, through the generosity of the late Charles and Nevart Talanian and their family, we were able to renovate our cultural hall for the enjoyment of our parishioners. The renovation work started in January and from that time until May our center was closed for renovations. The first functions that took place in the "Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall" were the social programs of the 86th Annual Diocesan Assembly which we hosted May 9th through 15th. On Sunday, June 5th, the official dedication of the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall took place followed by a reception hosted by the Talanian family.

The renovation project was headed by our Diocesan Delegate member Aetna Tashjian and Parish Council Chairman Nancy Kasarjian. The architect of the project was Edmond Danielson who donated his professional services to the community. Cynthia Kazanjian oversaw and guided the kitchen renovation while Melanie and Kay Berberian were the interior decorators.

We express our deep appreciation and gratitude to Aetna Tashjian, Nancy Kasarjian and all the volunteers who gave their time and talents for the refurbishment of our Cultural Hall. Needless to say, we could not have accomplished all this work without the generosity of the late Charles and Nevart Talanian and family to whom we express the profound gratitude of our community. The Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall also serves the needs of our youth who play basketball and volleyball there.

2. The Armenian School and Sunday School Classroom Renovations

During the summer of 1988, we started refurbishing the Armenian and Sunday

School classrooms in the Peter Adamian Hall. The classrooms were cleaned and painted: new rugs were laid and new furniture was ordered. The furniture for the Sunday School Office, library and classrooms is now all in place. We are pleased that our children will finally enjoy a clean and attractive environment that is exclusively theirs. The Delphi Academy, our previous tenant, moved out of the Church premises last June. Though their moving is a great financial loss to us, it is important that our children enjoy what belongs to them.

The classroom refurbishment was carried out by Queenie Raphaelian, Roxie Tashjian and Aetna Tashjian to whom we express our deep appreciation for their time and dedication.

3. Church Dome Windows

Our parishioners were aware that the Church dome windows were badly in need of replacement. During the years, the winds caused great damage to the dome. Rain and snow damaged the dome causing it to leak. Fixing the windows were going to be quite expensive. Therefore, we decided to ask for volunteers who would underwrite replacing the twelve stained-glass windows in the dome. We were glad that, within a few months, twelve volunteers contributed a total of \$120,000 for the new stained-glass windows. To do this work, we commissioned the Sandon Studios of upstate New York. We chose the twelve apostles to adorn the dome. They were reproductions from the 18th century Hovnatanian paintings that adorn the front of the Bema of the Cathedral of Holy Etchmiadzin. On Sunday, May 1st, in the presence of the benefactors, we dedicated the new stained-glass windows of the dome.

On behalf of our Parish, we wish to express our gratitude to the twelve benefactors of the stained-glass windows. We wish to remind our parishioners that the names of the original donors of the windows remain intact. We also express our appreciation to architect Donald Tellalian who worked with the Sandon Studios to see that the work was carried out in a proper way. Our appreciation is also extended to Aetna Tashjian for his guidance and advice to protect the new stained-glass windows with latex protective windows.

4. 86th Diocesan Assembly

The 86th Annual Diocesan Assembly was hosted by our Church from May 12th through 15th. Prior to the Assembly, the annual Clergymen's Conference was held from May 9th to 11th at the Espusal Center in Waltham, also hosted by the Holy Trinity Church. It was a monumental task to organize and host the Clergymen's Conference, the Diocesan Assembly, the Church-affiliated organizational meetings (Sunday School, Armenian School, Choir and Women's Guild) the social functions (brunch, lunches, dinners, tours) and the Saturday night Banquet. For the first time, the Archbishop's Basketball Tournament for the youth of our Diocese was held in conjunction with a Diocesan Assembly and was hosted by our A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors. We are grateful to all our Church-affiliated organizations and the many individuals who volunteered their services and time, both before and during, the Assembly.

The Diocesan Assembly Committee, under the capable Chairmanship of Helene Dorian and the Vice Chairmanship of Gregory Hintlian, had worked for over a year to ensure that the Assembly run smoothly. Delegates arrived from different parts of the country for the Diocesan Assembly and its related. functions. On Saturday, May 14th at the Diocesan Assembly Banquet, the Honorable George Keverian, Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, was honored as "Man of the Year" while Senator Edward Kennedy was honored as "Friend of the Armenians". Both of these distinguished guests were present at the Banquet and addressed the audience. His Eminence, the Primate, presided over the Assembly during the six days and addressed the delegates and our parishioners at many of the Assembly's functions. During the Assembly, the two visiting clergymen from the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin celebrated the Divine Liturgy in our Church twice, once for the Feast Day of the Ascension of our Lord, and secondly, for Sunday morning services. At the conclusion of Church Services on Sunday morning, May 15th, a complimentary Brunch was served hosted by the Trustees of the late Jack Kolligian Trust Fund to whom we express our gratitude.

Once again, I wish to express my appreciation to Helene Dorian, to the Assembly Committee, to all the workers, volunteers and benefactors who made this Assembly a huge success.

Church Stained-Glass Windows

Having been encouraged by the community during the renovation of the dome stained-glass windows, the Parish Council decided to replace the existing colored glass windows of the Church with stained-glass windows. The new stained-glass windows will depict important events from the life of our Lord and saints as well as important events from the history of the Armenian Church. Many of the windows will be reproductions from ancient Armenian miniatures. Sandon Studios has been commissioned to do the work for us. There are 49 large and small windows in our Church. Twenty-eight of the large windows have already been donated. We express our deep gratitude to all those who have voluntarily contributed to this noble project. We are confident that the remaining windows will also be donated by our parishioners. We wish to emphasize that the names of the original donors will remain intact in their place. The work is being supervised by our Pastor, architect Donald Tellalian and the Chairman of the Parish Council.

6. Clergy Preparation

a. We are happy that one of our altar boys, Norman Odabashian, graduated this year from St. Vladimir's Orthodox Seminary, having also completed the requirements of the St. Nersess Program. Upon his graduation, His Eminence, the Primate, ordained Norman to the Diaconate of the Armenian Church. On June 19th, a reception was tendered by the Parish Council to honor Deacon

Norman. Presently, Norman is waiting to depart for Etchmiadzin to complete his education at the Seminary of the Mother Church. Upon completion of his requirements, we are confident that Deacon Norman will be ordained into the priesthood of the Armenian Church.

- b. On July 22nd, a second student from our Parish went to Etchmiadzin to study for the priesthood of the Armenian Church at the Seminary of the Mother Church in Holy Etchmiadzin. Alexan Kouzouian, an altar server in our Church and a graduate of Boston University, is presently studying in Etchmiadzin to become a priest of the Armenian Church.
- c. In December, we donated \$4,000 to the Seminary of Holy Etchmiadzin for the preparation of clergy for our Diocese. This gift was made possible through the income of the Trust Fund of the late Karekin and Negtar Der Ohanessian. We hope that more young people will come out of the ranks of our altar servers and Church membership to serve Christ and His Church.

7. Pilgrimage to New York City

Upon the request of the Diocese and the directive of our Primate, a busload of parishioners went to St. Vartan Cathedral in New York City on March 3rd, to take part in a silent procession for the support of our people in Karabagh. In this manner, our Parish was united with our suffering brethren in the Soviet Republic of Azerbaijan who had a just cause.

8. "Man of the Year" Banquet

On October 16th, at the annual consecration Banquet of our Church, our parishioners honored Professor Charles B. Garabedian, Esc., as "Man of the Year". Professor Garabedian has served our Church community, the Creater Boston area Armenians and the Diocese of the Armenian Church for many years as a Parish Council member, Diocesan Delegate, member of the Building Committee of our Church, member of the Board of Trustees of the Diocese, and a leader in the Armenian community. On this occasion, Professor and Mrs. Charles B. Garabedian and his family, his sister Elizabeth Kolligian and niece Joan E. Kolligian, established a Trust Fund in our Church to benefit the Sunday School.

We express our gratitude to Professor and Mrs. Garabedian and his sister and niece, and congratulate Professor Garabedian on this occasion.

9. St. Nersess the Graceful Medal

On October 30th following Church Services, a reception was given in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall by the Parish Council in honor of our delegate John Soursourian. In recognition and appreciation of 50 years of dedicated service to our Church, to our Diocese, and to the Armenian community of Greater Boston, His Holiness Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, granted a Pontifical Encyclical and the St. Nersess Shnorhali Medal to John Soursourian. We extend our congratulations to John and his family and express the gratitude of our community to John for his dedication and services to our Church.

10. Expansion of Office Staff

Holy Trinity is a large and active parish. We are glad that through your support, year after year, we are able to expand our work and add new employees to our offices. We are delighted that this year we were able to add an additional part-time secretary, Carol Krikorian, to assist in our office work. We are also pleased that we have finally found a part-time vouth director to work with the young people of our Parish. Antranig Barsamian, who is presently studying law at Suffolk University, was previously Executive Secretary of the A.C.Y.O.A. at the Diocese. Tony needs the support of our parishioners and, particularly, the parents and youth of our Parish, to make the A.C.Y.O.A. vital and active.

In November the Pastor's family moved out of the rectory. The Parish Council has decided to turn the second floor of the rectory into offices that are urgently needed. The rectory needs some renovations that the Parish Council will carry out during the coming years.

11. Earthquake Relief

The December 7th earthquake in our Motherland shocked the entire Armenian community in Armenia and the diaspora. To collectively share our grief and to reach out and help our brothers and sisters in Armenia, our Parish responded as follows:

- a. On the morning of December 8th, I took part in a press conference that was called by the Honorable George Keverian, Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Along with others, I was interviewed by different television stations.
- b. On the evening of December 8th, a special joint meeting of the members of the Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates was convened at the Rectory to discuss ways of bringing assistance to the earthquake victims. Channel 4 covered the meeting.
- c. On December 9th and in subsequent days and weeks, the Church Office was busy collecting contributions and responding to the news media. Television stations, radio stations, and newspapers within and outside the Commonwealth were showering the Office with questions and requests for interviews. We thank all the volunteers who, during and following the crisis, came and helped us at the Office.
- d. On December 9th, we mailed letters of solicitation to our parishioners asking them to contribute to a relief fund for the benefit of the victims. We are grateful to the thousands of parishioners, members and friends who, responding to our appeal, donated \$270,000 to the relief fund.
- e. On December 11th, I went to the Sunday School to talk to our children about the earthquake.
 - f. On December 11th, over 1,200 people attended our annual Christmas

Concert which was dedicated to the victims of the earthquake. The Concert was given by the Erevan Choral Society under the direction of Very Rev. Father Oshagan Minassian. At the conclusion of the concert, a Requiem Service was conducted in memory of those who perished during the earthquake. His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, presided over the Requiem Service and then addressed the audience. His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Law, Archbishop of the Roman Catholic Church of Boston, who was also present at the concert, spoke to the audience. Cardinal Law pledged to raise \$200,000 for the victims. We are delighted to inform our community that through the assistance of the Cardinal, over one-half million dollars has been raised and has been sent to the Diocese of the Armenian Church for forwarding to His Holiness Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, for the purpose earmarked. The Honorable George Keverian, Speaker of the House of Representatives, also addressed the audience. Speaker Keverian has collected, through his friends, \$50,000. He has also channeled this money through us to the Diocese and subsequently to Etchmiadzin. We are grateful to the Speaker for doing everything in his power to assist the relief aid to Armenia. Nancy Kasarjian, Chairman of the Parish Council, and Albert Zouranjian, Treasurer, presented to His Eminence, on behalf of the Holy Trinity Armenian Church, a check in the amount of \$200,000 to be put at the disposal of His Holiness, the Catholicos of All Armenians, for the purpose earmarked. Our Christmas Program was televised nationwide and covered by the news media. We thank all those volunteers and contributors who in some way tried to alleviate the pain and suffering of our people in Armenia.

At the conclusion of my remarks, I wish to express my gratitude to outgoing Parish Council Chairman Nancy Kasarjian and members Debbie Stevens and Jim Kalustian for their services to our Church. A special thank you to the Chairman, Nancy Kasarjian, for her total dedication and leadership over the past six years.

My appreciation to the Reverend Fathers, Parish Council members, Diocesan Delegates, Executive Committees of the Church-affiliated organizations, the Armenian and Sunday School teachers, the members of the Choir, altar servers, the Office staff, all the volunteers and workers and the members of our community for their absolute dedication and service to our Church. May God bless you and reward you.

The year, 1988, has been an active one for the Parish Council of Holy Trinity. Our parish's growth is evident in all areas of church life and the daily maintenance of its facilities.

In January of 1988 the renovation of the Cultural Hall began, thanks to the generous gift of Charles and Nevart Talanian and family. The renovation committee under its chairman, Aetna Tashjian, worked closely with the contractor, Ferrini Cont. Inc., and architect, Edmund Danielson, to insure the completion of the renovation by May, for the 86th Annual Diocesan Assembly. The renovation project included installation of new hardwood floors, installation of new thermal windows, installation of retractable basketball boards, new lavatory facilities, paint and wall covering for the hall and foyer, new stage curtains, new window drapes, new carpeting for the foyer, new ovens and cooking equipment for the kitchen, and new interior doors opening into the Cultural Hall. The hall was dedicated as the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall on Sunday, June 5, 1988.

Following the 1987 repair of the church dome, new stained glass windows depicting the 12 Apostles were installed and completed in May of 1988. Based on the success of this project, momentum began for replacing the existing windows throughout the sanctuary with stained glass scenes showing the life of Christ and scenes from Armenian church history. Donors have enthusiastically supported this endeavor and a contract has been signed with Sandon Studios to design and install the windows in 1989.

The Maintenance Committee is one the most active committees of the Parish Council. Physical upkeep and some of the repairs for our facilities in 1988 included the following items: installation of walkway lighting for the entrance of the church; installation of an automatic turn-on for the standby boiler; repair of the parish house chimney; repair of the parking lot; repair of the roof on Shahe Hall; installation of window wells and landscaping in area outside of Johnson Hall; repair and replacement of the concrete walkways around church; repair of missing slates on church roof; repair of copper gutters; and temporary repair of the feed line leaks of the church's radiant heating system. This problem has not been completely resolved and plans are underway to correct the problem. In cooperation with the neighbors a new fence was erected between the church and neighboring properties.

There are currently 2 full-time assistants working with our custodian, Ara DerMovses, to handle maintenance duties. The Parish Council is still actively looking for a Manager to coordinate and oversee activities involved in the maintenance of the church facilities.

The office staff of the church has been increased with the addition of Carol Krikorian as a part-time secretary.

In June of 1988 the rental agreement with Delphi Academy expired and the school space in the Peter Adamian Hall was vacated for refurbishing. The school classrooms have been painted and carpeted and new furniture for the Sunday School and Armenian School offices and classrooms has been ordered. To further demonstrate our parish's commitment to its youth, a part-time Youth Director, Antranig (Tony) Barsamian, was hired in October. Tony has been working with the ACYOA Juniors and Seniors and with the college program in our parish. Hopefully, his efforts will encourage more participation from our parish youth.

A number of successful cultural and social events were held in 1988. May 10-15th Holy Trinity hosted the 86th Annual Diocesan Assembly. The Assembly Committee, chaired by Helene Dorian, brought together many, many members from our parish to achieve a very successful and memorable event. On June 15th a recognition dinner was held to thank all the members of the parish who assisted with the Diocesan Assembly. On Sunday, September 11th the annual church picnic was held in the Cultural Hall and on the church grounds for the first time. This also proved to be very successful, and all that attended enjoyed the traditional Armenian food and dancing with family and friends. The event was co-chaired by Helen Donabedian and Ann Hintlian.

The Rug Sale, with rugs provided by Robert Proodian, was held from September 29th - October 2nd this year. Martin Kalustian was the chairman for this fund raising event. October was Cultural Month and a very worth-while program of Armenian speakers and artists was organized. Father Krikor Maksoudian spoke on his publication, "Aghtamar". Levon Mnazakanian exhibited and sold his paintings. A one day Armenian Language Crash Course was run by Sylva Der Stepanian of the Diocesan Armenian Language Lab with over 70 participants. Ted Boghosian, producer of "An Armenian Journey" spoke on the

behind the scenes events associated with his production. Holy Trinity and St. James Churches jointly sponsored a concert featuring guest artist pianist, Avo Kouyumjian.

On Sunday, October 16th the annual Stewardship Banquet was held. Eugene Raphaelian was chairman of the event and Charles Garabedian was honored as Man-of-the-Year, along with outgoing Parish Council members, George Haroutunian, George Hagopian, Barbara Sahagian, Aetna Tashjian, and Harry Yessaian. The Stewardship Program under Chairman Gregory Hintlian successfully raised over \$100,000 towards its 1988 goal.

On Sunday, October 30th the Parish Council hosted a reception honoring longstanding Diocesan Delegate and former Parish Council member John Soursourian, who was granted a Pontifical Encyclical and the St. Nersess Shnorhali Medal from His Holiness Vasken I.

In the Fall, a new car was purchased from Mirak Chevrolet.

The annual Church Bazaar was held on Saturday, December 3rd. This event was co-chaired by Nancy Young, Ann Shazade, and Aram Hintlian, Jr. It was a wonderful coordination of parish efforts. Discussion is being held on the prospect of holding a two day bazaar in the future.

The whole Armenian community felt the devastation of the tragic earthquake that hit Soviet Armenia the first week in December. Holy Trinity devoted its efforts to fund raising for the victims. The annual Christmas Concert held on December 11th was transformed into a solemn occasion in view of the tragedy. We were honored with the presence of His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Cardinal Law of the Catholic Archdiocese, and the Honorable George Keverian, Speaker of the House as well as a throng of listeners. The Armenian and American community responded overwhelmingly with generous donations for the Earthquake Relief Fund. The Parish Council has forwarded the donations to the Diocese in New York, where it will be given to His Holiness Vasken I for his relief work for the earthquake victims in Soviet Armenia.

1988 marks the first year since the inception of the Trust Fund that we have seen a return on the interest of the funds. Up until this time the purpose of the fund was to let the interest remain unused. The Trust Fund has grown to a significant level where the Committee has deemed it necessary and reasonable to the dispense the interest income to the Parish Council for the purposes specified by the donors. Hopefully the interest income can and will be used to offset the growing expenses incurred by the Church.

The Pastor and Parish Council wish to express our thanks to the parishioners and to all of the Church-affiliated organizations for their continued efforts and support.

CELEBRATE ARMENIAN CULTURAL HERITAGE

During the month of October, 1988, an outstanding cultural program was presented. A special audience of parishioners and friends were attracted each week to our variety of special events. Again, this year, a concert was co-sponsored with St. James Armenian Church, Watertown.

The first event in the program was an "Explanation of the Divine Liturgy". At selected intervals during the Badarak, narration was given so that parishioners would gain a greater understanding of the Divine Liturgy.

Rev. Dr. Krikor Maksoudian gave a presentation on "Aghtamar", a recent publication. This was followed by a reception.

Under the direction of Sylva Der Stepanian, Director of the Armenian Language Laboratory of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, a "One-Day Armenian Crash Course: Language, History and Culture" was held. There were five study groups to choose from: (1) Master 300 Armenian Sentences; (2) Learn the Armenian Alphabet; (3) Basics of Armenian Grammar; (4) Introduction to Classical Armenian (Kurapar) and (5) Karabagh - Past and Present. Two of the five instructors were Prof. Richard Hovanessian and Rev. Dr. Krikor Maksoudian. It was an exciting and informative day for all those who attended.

Theodore Bogosian, producer of "An Armenian Journey" gave a lecture on "Taking on Turkey: Behind the Scenes of 'An Armenian Journey'". A reception followed the presentation.

The last event in the month-long program was a concert by Avo Kouyumjian, pianist, in the Church Sanctuary. This concert was co-sponsored with St. James Armenian Church. A reception followed this inspiring concert.

The Holy Trinity Armenian Church's annual Christmas Concert took place on Sunday evening, Dec. 11 in the Church Sanctuary under the direction of Very Rev. Fr. Oshagan Minassian. As a result of the earthquake that had struck Armenia several days before, the Concert became a commemorative one dedicated to the victims of the earthquake.
