

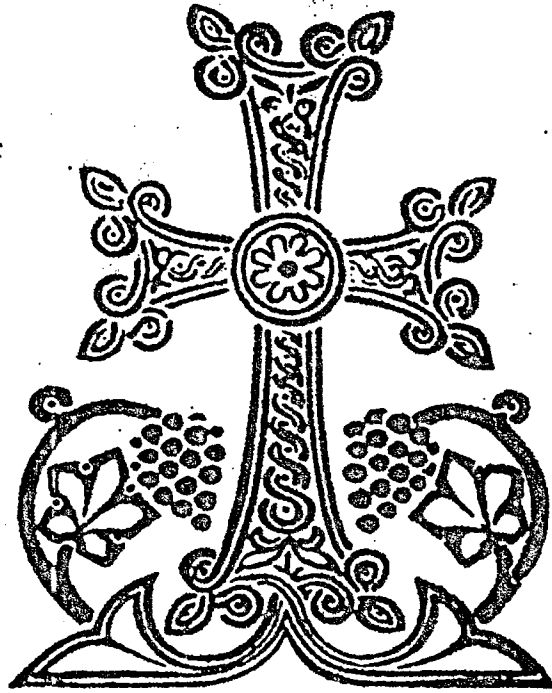

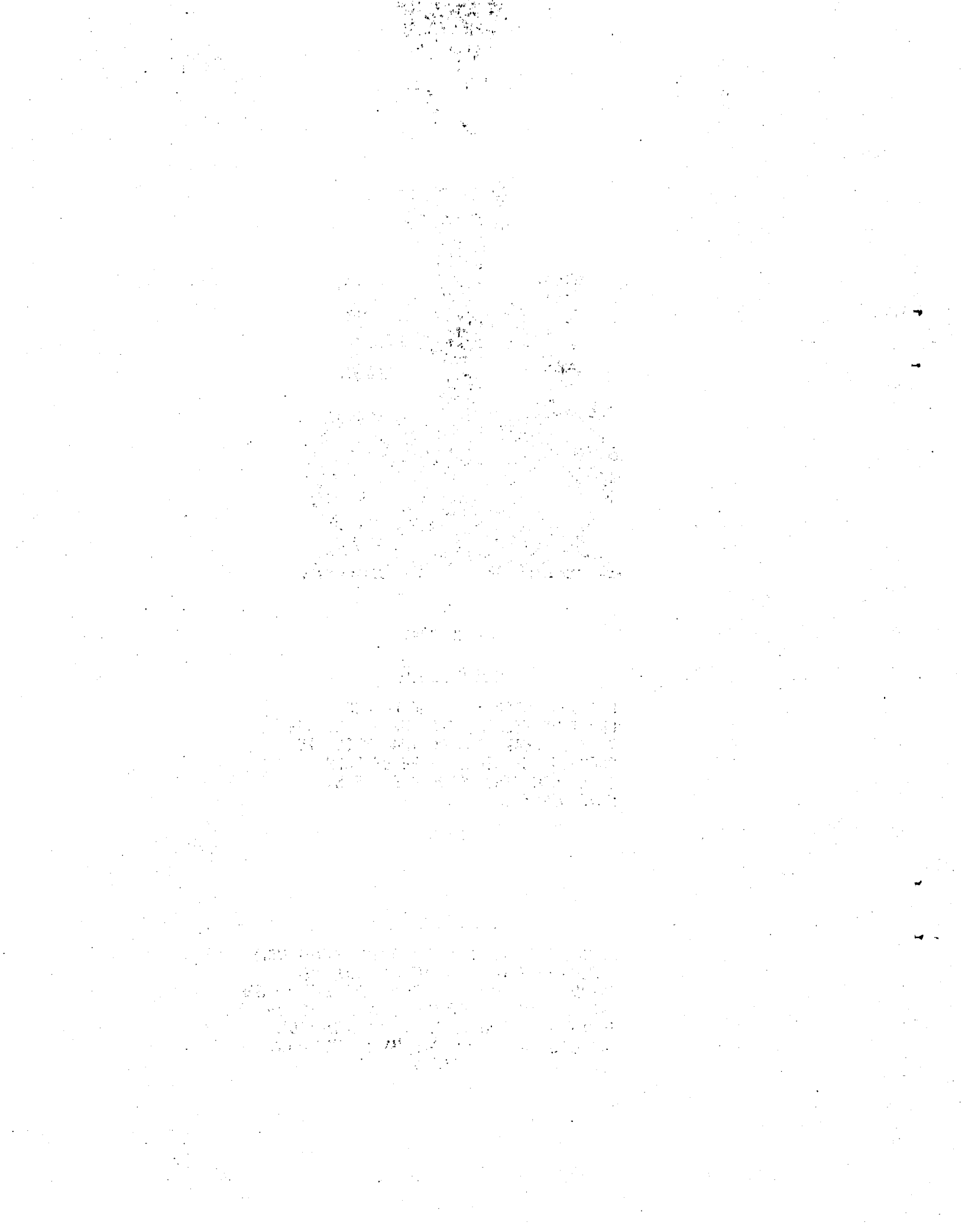

ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY
Sunday, February 3, 1991

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was held on Sunday, February 3, 1991, following Church Services, in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.

The Assembly was called to order by Albert Zouranjian, Chairman of the Parish Council, who welcomed and thanked the parishioners for their participation.

The Opening Prayer was offered by Reverend Father Mampre A. Kouzouian, Pastor, who asked those present to join with him in reciting the prayer.

Dr. Paul Barsam, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the slate for the day's Tivan as follows:

Chairman - Dr. Michael Kolligian, Jr. and Robert Proodian
Recording Secretary - Carol Krikorian

Mr. Proodian declined his nomination. Additional nominations for both offices were asked from the floor. There being no further nominations, a Motion was made and seconded that Dr. Kolligian be elected Chairman of the Assembly. MOTION PASSED. A motion was made and seconded that Carol Krikorian serve as Recording Secretary for the Assembly. MOTION PASSED.

Dr. Kolligian, in addressing the Assembly, thanked the Nominating Committee and the Assembly for electing him Chairman. He stated that, as in past years, the reading of each report would be suspended unless a formal request was made otherwise. There being none, the Assembly proceeded.

MINUTES OF 1990 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY

Seta A. Buchter, Sunday School Superintendent, requested that on page 2c, under A.C.Y.O.A. Srs. Report, the last sentence be amended to read ", the A.C.Y.O.A. membership has increased", leaving out "as well as the Sunday School membership", since the Youth Director was not responsible for the increase in Sunday School membership. Seta stated that the comment made was that because the Sunday School membership is increasing, the ACYOA, Jr's. membership should increase in the years ahead. Corrected as noted.

Dorothea Piranian referred to page 2e and requested that paragraph 6 be reworded to read "Dorothea Piranian suggested that the new position of Executive Director be reviewed in the future as to its need." Reword as corrected. Dr. Kolligian pointed out as a matter of information that this position had been approved in the Budget and that review of this position would be by the Parish Council and Pastor.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Minutes as corrected. MOTION PASSED.

Dr. Barsam, the Nominating Committee Chairman, now called upon the nominees for elective offices as put forward by the Nominating Committee to come forward to

the Assembly. It was noted that for Parish Council, Michael Markarian replaced Charles Garabedian of Andover, who declined the nomination after sample ballots were mailed out to members. Mr. Markarian's name was listed on the day's ballot.

There being no further nominations from the floor for Parish Council, Nominating or Auditing Committees, nominations were closed. Dr. Kolligian thanked Dr. Barsam. Dr. Kolligian stated that all dues-paying members would receive an identification card with their ballots which would enable them to make comments from the floor.

Following an interval for voting purposes, the Annual Assembly was again called to order by the Chairman who also announced that the Ballot Box would remain open until 2:30 p.m.

Pastor's Annual Report for 1990:

Father Mampre reviewed his report in English and Armenian. He wished to verbally express his appreciation to Father Papken Maksoudian, Pastor Emeritus, and Father Oshagan Minassian, Choir Director, who assist him in his ministry, to the Diocesan Delegates, the Chairman of the Parish Council, members of the Parish Council, Board members of our Trust Fund, teachers and staff of our Armenian and Sunday Schools, members of our Choir, altar servers, organist, auxiliary organization chairmen and members, all the volunteers who come and offer their services at various Church functions and to the volunteers who come and help in the Church Office. He expressed his gratitude to all for helping to carry out our mission in the Parish. Father Mampre then asked if there were any comments or questions.

George Omartian thanked him for including the overview of the sacraments that he had requested at last year's Annual Assembly. He commented that for the years

1978 through 1990, there were 252 baptisms, 192 weddings and 483 funerals, noting, unfortunately, that there were twice as many funerals as baptisms. His concern was that something was happening to our Church population, based on these figures: Of those that were born since 1985, 57% were in Sunday School, dropping down to 17% in Armenian School, 40% in ACYOA Jrs., and 21% in ACYOA Srs. Der Hayr pointed out that in using these figures, one has to remember that these children do not start Sunday School and Armenian School until they are 4 or 5 years old, so they are not a true indicator. He also stated that in regard to funerals, the picture is the same in all Armenian communities: there are always more deaths than weddings and births.

Concerning the stained glass windows, Armen Dilan questioned if the windows were of Armenian composition and why weren't Armenian artists used. The Pastor explained that the Parish Council and a group of experts researched and put together a list of artists who make stained glass windows. After careful deliberation, Dr. Sandon of Sandon Studios was selected because of his work with other Armenian churches, our satisfaction with his previous artistic work, and his fame. Father Mampre stated that we have perhaps one of the most beautiful stained glass windows, and that they are reproductions of illuminations of ancient Armenian manuscripts and are being faithfully reproduced - theologically, historically and artistically by Sandon Studios. He also noted that Sandon Studios had recently been commissioned by the White House to produce stained glass windows for the Camp David Chapel. Father Mampre added that Dr. Sandon is a great artist and had been very cooperative.

On page 3h, Seta Buchter stated that the figure for enrollment in the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors for 1990-1991, should read "31" instead of "28". Correction noted.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Pastor's Report as corrected.
MOTION PASSED.

Parish Council Activities and Financial Report for 1990:

Dr. Kolligian called upon Albert Zouranjian, Chairman of the Parish Council, and William Martin, Assistant Treasurer, to address any questions regarding this report.

Dorothea Piranian requested that we list the names of the clergy receiving stipends and their position. She also requested we list the positions as well as the names of all people receiving salaries from the Church for the benefit of new members and for those who might not recognize some of the names. Der Hayr stated that this can be done.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Parish Council Report. MOTION PASSED.

Proposed Budget for 1991:

Dr. Barsam noted that the proposed clergy stipend for 1991 is the same as it was for 1990. In light of the fact that the cost of living continues to increase and the responsibilities on the clergy continue to increase, Dr. Barsam suggested that the Parish Council make an amendment to implement an increase to the clergy stipend. Al Zouranjian stated that there was a freeze on all salaries and that there will be a review June 1, 1991. If the Church is in good financial shape, a cost of living increase will be addressed at that time. Dr. Kolligian noted that it was an encouraging sign that the Church administration is trying to make

overhead and expenses remain within our budget. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Proposed Budget for 1991. MOTION PASSED.

Stewardship Program

Dr. Kolligian called on Nancy Hintlian who is chairing the 1991 Stewardship Program. Nancy stated that the Stewardship Program has been successful for nine years and pointed out the increase from \$96,000 in 1986 to \$108,00 in 1990. However, she noted that the number of participants in the program has not really increased from year to year. She thanked those who have made the Stewardship Program a success; namely, the parishioners who participate, the valuable Stewardship Committee, Rose Kolligian and her Family for the continued use of Distributor Corporation for the telethon, and, under the direction of Nancy Kasarjian, the Church Office staff who provides the statistics, typing, notification of meetings and special activities. She mentioned how people draw closer to the Church when times are bad and sees the 1990's as a light at the end of the tunnel.

One of the things she would like to do is identify the young people who have not had the opportunity to participate in the Stewardship Program, those young adults who might still be living at home and those that have moved away. She asked that parishioners call the Church Office and let them know of any young adults that we can ask to be stewards of the Church. She mentioned that she has added people from her own family to the list. She would like to expand the program without drawing on the same people and is looking for ways to generate income.

Of the 801 participants in the Stewardship Program, Nancy stated that there are 233 people who contribute under \$100, those being mainly senior citizens and those on a fixed income. John Soursourian asked for the actual number of members that we have on record on the Annual Report that goes to the Diocese. Are we identifying between real members and contributing members. He is concerned that we are paying for more than our share. It was stated that the first \$37.00 of Stewardship goes to the Diocese. Father Mampre stated that we are covering some senior citizens, but it was a negligible number. John thanked the Stewardship Committee for the wonderful job they are doing. George Omartian asked if our membership is 800 and what constitutes membership. Der Hayr responded by saying that the By-Laws define membership as those who are baptized, confirmed and abide by the teachings of the Armenian Church. To participate in Stewardship, you do not have to be baptized or confirmed in the Armenian Church. Father Mampre stated that as of the end of 1990, there were 801 participants in the Stewardship Program, and it is possible, as in past years, that we still may have members paying their 1990 dues in October of this year. Mr. Omartian voiced his concern that if membership remains at 800, we are standing still and are stagnating backwards. He would like to see that number grow, because if Stewardship grows, so will Sunday School, Armenian School, and A.C.Y.O.A.

Nancy stated that with the 1200 families that receive the Dajar, there is really no easy way to identify potential stewards from that list. Louise Panosian added that a number of the people receiving Dajar are members of other churches. Nancy mentioned that the Parish Council was working on a form to send out asking for information, but there was a concern about invasion of privacy; however, she would like to see us go forward with this idea.

Dorothea Piranian asked if we would ever consider sending the Dajar to just the members of our Church. Al Zouranjian responded by saying that we use the Dajar.

for public relations, informing everyone of our bazaars, picnics, etc. It was pointed out that if you contribute to the Stewardship Program, you will receive the Dajar. For those who are not members, we have been asking for a separate contribution. Al remarked that we should be proud of the Dajar. Dorothea Piranian stated that we do send separate flyers for our functions and that the Dajar should be kept for members. Robert Goshgarian suggested that the mailing date for the Dajar be moved up in light of the fact that on occasion, it arrives after various functions we are advertising have taken place. Father Mampre stated that the February issue of Dajar had been mailed out the previous Friday, February 1st, and that some people probably will not get it for two weeks. There are some circumstances beyond our control: the printer may have a lot of work to do and we do not have priority; the bindery may take two or three days; and then there is the Post Office who may not deliver up to two weeks. The Pastor also mentioned that the Dajar covers various types of information. There are contributors that want to see their names listed, such as "in lieu of flowers" contributions which are not from only dues-paying members, but from other people as well. The Dajar also includes informative articles as well as messages from the Catholicos and the Primate.

John Soursourian remarked that of the 800 members, there are only about 125 attending the Annual Assembly who are interested in the administration of the Church, and that we have to work on getting the others to attend.

Dr. Kolligian thanked Nancy for a nice presentation.

Trust Fund Report

Dr. Kolligian asked George D. Hagopian to present the Trust Fund Report. George stated that there was an error in the report. On page 6a, a contribution of \$500 from Dr. Martin T. and Anna T. Alexander should be included. He also added that last year's report had requested the listing of the market value of securities of the previous year (page 6b). This was not included, but George stated that the market value based on the same securities was \$172,812.50 last year. This was down \$3,507.00. As of Friday, February 1st, they were \$182,885.00. They have come back in value and are quality stocks paying good dividends. In 1990, six new funds were set up. George said that \$115,000 was turned over to the Church in 1990, and that \$130,000 will be turned over in 1991. The Fund continues to increase and everyone continues to contribute to it. The Trust Fund Board is quite proud of it.

Dr. Kolligian stated that we owe a debt of gratitude to George Hagopian. John Soursourian added that we should give a big hand to the Trust Fund Board because this is all done at no cost to the parishioners. He stated that a bank or brokerage firm would charge us a lot of money for the service that the Board provides.

Auxiliary Reports

At this point, Dr. Kolligian stated that we would wait on motions to approve the auxiliary reports until all reports were covered.

Senior Women's Guild

The Pastor made note at this point that the Senior Women's Guild would be celebrating the 80th anniversary of their founding this year, and that there would be a celebration during the year. He remarked that they have been serving the Armenian community for 80 years.

Women's Guild

Violet Goshdigian, Chairman of the Women's Guild, asked for a correction of their report. On page B1, under advisors, the name "Rose Tashjian" should be changed to "Rose Tikijian". Corrected as noted.

Sunday School

Seta A. Buchter, Sunday School Superintendent, addressed the Assembly, stating that the Sunday School is an active and vital organization that meets weekly, downstairs in the Peter Adamian Hall. It is a cooperative effort among teachers, parents, students, the Parish Council, the Church community and herself. There is currently an all inclusive staff of 33 people which includes teachers, assistants, substitutes and support staff. There is also a class parent for each grade. She mentioned that the Sunday School is extremely fortunate to have a wonderful group of dedicated parishioners as teachers and staff members and involved parents. She noted that half of the staff are non-parents, and that there will be a need of teachers in the fall. She urged those assembled for their help or, if they knew of anyone who could, to contact her at the Church Office. Seta stressed that without a teaching staff, there can be no Sunday School.

Stating that there are 100 children enrolled in the Sunday School this year, she encouraged those present to bring their children, grandchildren, nieces, and nephews to Sunday School so that they may learn about their religion and culture. She stressed the importance of role models for our children who learn from watching others, especially their parents and, if you want your child to be brought up within the Armenian Church, you too must be involved. Church should be a way of life for the entire family, not something children are dropped at on sporadic Sunday mornings.

She thanked the Parish Council and the Church community for their financial support, stating that all of the Sunday School's monetary needs are met through the Church budget, including curriculum books for each of the students. Partial scholarships are also awarded to St. Vartan Camp and St. Nersess Summer Study Seminars to students wishing to attend, as a way of encouraging participation. She mentioned that, for some, these scholarships do make a difference in whether they participate or not. In 1990, a record number of 14 students attended Camp Vartan. Seta feels that these two programs are exceptionally worthwhile ones and should be encouraged and supported. She ended by saying that the Sunday School and Armenian School are the only Church-affiliated organizations that do not require any monetary contributions from its members, and that finances should not be a reason for any child not to be enrolled in the Sunday School.

Arthur Panosian requested a financial accounting for the Sunday School. Seta stated that the expenditure for the Sunday School for 1990 was \$3,500, excluding furniture. Mr. Panosian asked that the financial accounting for the Sunday School be placed at the end of its report where it would be easier for people to visualize instead of in the Church's financial report. George D. Hagopian clarified that years ago, it was decided to make the Sunday School budget a part a of the Church budget, thereby eliminating the need for the Sunday School to have a separate account and a treasurer. This way, the Church pays for everything and the Sunday School need not have to worry about money. It was stated that the \$3,500 covers the cost of books, petty cash, and whatever supplies and overhead

expenses they may need for any ongoing functions. Seta stated that the Parish Council has always come through to support the Sunday School. Dr. Kolligian asked Arthur if he wanted to make a motion regarding the placement of the Sunday School finances. He responded by stating that it was a request, but if nothing is done in next year's report, he would then make a motion. Dr. Kolligian concluded that the addition of the financial exhibit to the Sunday School should suffice.

Armenian School

Araxie Janjigian of the Armenian School was happy to announce the Armenian School was at its best with 15 students for the year 1990, and stated that, since January, they have expanded to 17. She emphasized that they are accomplishing quite a bit by how they are teaching as opposed to what they are teaching. She compared it to a crash course, considering they only have 45 minutes a week. They are giving the students the tools to do it themselves. She ended by saying that the teachers ask for nothing and that their hearts and souls are into it.

Dr. Kolligian thank Araxie and remarked that she had done a noble job.

A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors

Dr. Kolligian asked Ben Saraydarian, our Youth Director, to come forward and address the Assembly. With regard to the Seniors, Ben described them as a very strong, but small core group and that he is working on expanding membership by trying to get more to be involved. He mentioned that a night out to "Catch a Rising Star" in Cambridge, brought new faces and that he is trying to come up with ideas that would attract new members.

A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors

Ben stated that the Juniors are a small group of active people and he can sense that the excitement is starting to grow, which he hopes will encourage more to join. He talked of a recent Sports Weekend in New Jersey, where, with some members of Chelmsford's St. Vartanantz A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors, they won the first-place trophy in basketball. He feels that with this new excitement, things will begin happening. He is hoping to institute a consistency program, where he will be able to get them to come to Church regularly for their activities. A question was raised as to whether there was an active league in area Churches. Ben stated that there was no league as such, but that the A.C.Y.O.A. does compete through Sports Weekends and through different tournaments. Ben mentioned trying to plan a visit from the Juniors of the Armenian Church of the Holy Martyrs Bayside, NY, after Lent, including St. James of Watertown. Ben explained that his overall intentions are to expand membership, have them meet Armenians from other parishes, and to make the A.C.Y.O.A. interesting for them.

Dr. Kolligian thanked Ben very much for his presentation.

Robert Goshgarian thanked whoever was responsible for repositioning the A.C.Y.O.A. reports in this year's Annual Report as he had requested at last year's meeting.

Since there were no comments or questions regarding the reports for the Cultural Committee, Erevan Choral Society, Trinity Men's Union, Choir, 1000 Club, Trinity Couples Club or the Lynn, Salem, Peabody Women's Auxiliary, a motion was made and seconded to accept all the auxiliary reports as printed and corrected. MOTION PASSED.

Proposals for Diocesan Assembly

Dr. Kolligian asked if there were any points to bring forth for consideration for the upcoming Diocesan Assembly that will be held in May. A question was asked if the Parish Council had offered any proposals for those assembled to consider. There were none. It was then asked if perhaps one of the Diocesan Delegates present could give an update to the Assembly present as to the status of things in the Diocese since the last report. Dr. Kolligian asked if it would not be more appropriate to address this after the Diocesan Assembly to which Father Mampre agreed.

Old or New Business

Dorothea Piranian stated that she cannot call the Office until 5:00 p.m., and asked if it were not possible for the Church Office staff to stagger the work hours from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., instead of 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. As Chairman of the Parish Council, Al Zouranjian stated that he would bring it up and see what he could do.

Closing Remarks

Father Mampre thanked the Chairman of the Day for very capably running the meeting.

He also stated that he wished to thank Dr. Kolligian for chairing the Trust Fund Board, and expressed his thanks as well to George D. Hagopian and the rest of the Board members. With regard to finances, Father Mampre remarked on a conversation held outside of Holy Trinity, where the comment was made that Holy Trinity Church is the Church of the future, meaning that the Trust Fund is the direction in which all the churches in the Diocese should go. When there are financial problems, there is financial backing available there for the Church. Father Mampre thanked the Board for its leadership.

The Pastor also thanked the Secretary of the Day, Carol Krikorian, who he mentioned was also secretary at the Church Office. He wished to thank, also, all of the Office Staff: Executive Director, Nancy Kasarjian, Rose Mamishian, Seta Buchter, Harvinder Jassal, Ben Saraydarian, and Ara Dermovses. He expressed his appreciation, as well, to Parish Council Chairman, Al Zouranjian, and the members of the Council.

Election Results

Dr. Kolligian stated that when the results of the election were to be announced, that there would be no winners and losers. That whether they had garnered enough votes to win was incidental and that they all deserved our applause.

Father Mampre congratulated all the newly-elected members of the Parish Council, Nominating Committee and Auditing Committee. He noted that all six members of the Parish Council elected were incumbents. He thanked Dr. Barsam and his committee.

Benediction was offered by Father Mampre.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT
1991

Dear Parishioners:

I present to you my Annual Report for 1991. First, I would like to give thanks to Almighty God for giving me the good health to serve Him and His flock at Holy Trinity Church for another year. I express my appreciation to our parishioners for their devotion and support of their beloved Church. It is gratifying to see that our parishioners are supportive of their Church and dedicated to their Parish.

My pastoral services to the Parish may be divided into the following major categories:

1. Church Services

The most important aspect of our existence as a Christian community is reflected in our spiritual growth through our Church and its Services.

During the past year, we conducted Church Services every Sunday and on special holidays during the week. As in previous years, sermons were delivered in English and Armenian. On several occasions, our Pastor Emeritus, Rev. Fr. Papken Maksudian, and our Choir Director, the Very Rev. Fr. Oshagan Minassian, delivered the sermons and assisted me during Church Services.

I would like to publicly express my appreciation to our Deacons, Altar Servers, Choir Members, and Organist for their dedication and commitment. We are glad that our Deacons have trained some of our Sunday School boys as Acolytes and future Altar Servers.

The following clergymen have celebrated the Divine Liturgy in our Church and/or delivered the sermon on Sunday morning:

- a. On March 10, Father Arsen Barsamian, Assistant Pastor of St. James Church, Watertown, MA, celebrated the Divine Liturgy.
- b. On April 14, our Primate, His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and ordained three Deacons, James Kalustian, Gary Alexander and Edward Marootian, for our Church. On Saturday evening, April 13, our Primate also ordained four Acolytes, Edward Yessaian, Christopher Tashjian, Aram Gupta and Theodore Lepore, for our Church.
- c. On June 23, His Grace, Bishop Aghan Baliozian, the Primate of Australia and New Zealand, delivered the sermon.
- d. On June 24, His Grace, Bishop Barkev Mardirosian, the Primate of Kharabagh, visited our Church.
- e. On August 11, Rev. Fr. Tateos Abdalian, Pastor of St. Peter's Armenian Church, Watervliet, NY, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon.
- f. On November 3, His Grace, Bishop Papken Varjabedian, Diocesan Legate,

Washington, D.C., celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon, on the occasion of the 30th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church, the 85th Anniversary of the Founding of the Senior Women's Guild and the 50th Anniversary of his Ordination to the Priesthood.

g. On December 8, the Very Rev. Fr. Mesrob Semerjian delivered the sermon.

On Christmas and Easter eves, I conducted a short service and administered Holy Communion to the children of our Armenian and Sunday Schools.

On Christmas and Easter eves, we conducted the Divine Liturgy according to the traditions of our Church.

On February 7, St. Vartanantz Day, we conducted the Divine Liturgy and members of the Senior Women's Guild received Holy Communion prior to their monthly luncheon and meeting.

During Lent, Sunrise Services were conducted on Fridays, and Peace and Rest Services on Wednesday evenings. On two Wednesdays, the ACYOA Seniors hosted a Lenten Dinner and Program and then attended Church Services.

On Palm Sunday, Lucine Zakarian, the renowned singer and soloist of the Cathedral of Holy Etchmiadzin, sang in our Church and, again, at the ACYOA Palm Sunday Banquet.

During Holy Week, Church Services were conducted in our Church according to the traditions, rules and canons of our Church.

On April 24, a joint Badarak was conducted at St. James Armenian Church, Watertown, MA, commemorating Armenian Martyrs Day.

On Mother's Day, Family Reunion Day (September 15), Thanksgiving and Christmas, we conducted "Family Services" where the congregation participated in the Divine Liturgy by joining the Choir in singing the hymns of the Badarak. On September 15, following "Family Reunion Service", we hosted a Complimentary Brunch in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall, which was underwritten by the Jack H. Kolligian Trust Fund. On November 24, following our "Thanksgiving Family Service", the ACYOA Juniors hosted a "Thanksgiving Luncheon" in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall. On December 22, following "Christmas Family Service", there was Christmas Carolling in Church and the presentation of the Sunday School's annual Christmas Play, "The Story of Christmas", in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.

2. Sacraments and Services

During 1991, the following sacraments and services were performed in our Church:

Baptisms: 17 Weddings: 12 Funerals: 37

Bathrothal services conducted by me: 2

During these sacraments and services, I met with families and individuals to share their joy, and sometimes, their grief. I performed 12 wedding rehearsals before weddings. I have also counseled couples prior to their marriages and, sometimes, families prior to baptisms.

3. Counseling Services

During this past year, I spent considerable time with families who had personal crises due to the sickness or death of loved ones. These families needed prayers, support and counseling and, as their Pastor, I reached out to help them by praying, advising and supporting them.

On 62 different occasions, I conducted counseling services with individuals and families, as well as with couples who were planning to get married.

These are important moments in my pastoral ministry when the Church extends itself and reaches out to its faithful.

4. Pastoral Visitations

During 1991, I made 424 pastoral visitations to the homes of our parishioners, to their places of business, to hospitals, and to nursing homes to pray and conduct services. I also visited, with our parishioners, cemeteries to bless the graves of their loved ones. Four hundred twenty-four (424) visitations is the greatest number of visitations made by me in one year during my pastorate at Holy Trinity Church.

On special occasions, such as Christmas, Mother's Day, Thanksgiving, and others, I have reached out to the members of our community, especially the sick, the elderly, the shut-ins, and those who had been missed in our Church, by telephoning them. These calls and my visitations have been appreciated by our parishioners.

5. Meetings

During this past year, I presided over and participated in 177 Parish-affiliated meetings which included all the Church-affiliated organizations' standing committees, their executive bodies, and various individuals. Twice I participated in Regional Clergymen's Conferences and at the Annual Diocesan Assembly, Tenafly, NJ, with our Diocesan Delegates.

6. Cultural and Educational Programs

During October, to celebrate "Armenian Cultural Heritage" month, we held two cultural programs. On Sunday, October 6, during Church Services, we offered an explanation of the Divine Liturgy which was narrated by Deacon James Kalustian and Susan Derderian. On Sunday, October 27, we presented a Piano Recital in Church by guest artist, Luise Vosgerchian, a former Professor of Music at Harvard University.

On December 15, we held our traditional Christmas Concert, performed by the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra under the direction of our Choir Director, Father Oshagan Minassian. Our Primate, His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, was present at this Concert and addressed the audience with closing remarks.

Our Church's monthly publication, Dajar, through its articles and information, is another source that serves to educate our community.

During the monthly meetings of our Church-affiliated organizations, we either invite individuals to present lectures or we conduct informative talks with our parishioners. Bible Study is also conducted at the monthly meetings of the Senior Women's Guild and on Sunday mornings, by Gregory Tashjian, for our parents and parishioners.

During the year, students and teachers from universities throughout the Greater Boston area, visited our Church to learn about its history, theology and architecture.

We also provided scholarships to worthy and needy students from our Parish for higher education. Funds were also made available for Deacon Training Programs and for our Seminaries for preparation of clergymen for the Armenian Church. The Church also provided partial scholarships for our Armenian and Sunday School students who attended St. Vartan Camp to encourage their participation.

7. Assistance to Armenia

As Armenians, it is our sacred duty to assist our people in Armenia who are going through a very difficult time. Our parishioners and Church-affiliated organizations have helped us to respond in a Christian manner to the plea of our brothers and sisters in Armenia by sending them money, clothing, medical supplies and food. In November, we sent 50 cartons of warm winter clothing to Etchmiadzin (through the Diocese) to be distributed to those in need. We also appealed to and encouraged our parishioners to send voluntary monetary contributions to the Diocese for food for Armenia.

From the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, we allocated funds for the "Milk Fund of Armenia".

We continue to help families and students who come from Armenia, either as permanent residents or as students, by finding them jobs, giving them temporary shelter or financially assisting them.

On Sunday, April 21, 40 children from Leninakan (Gumayrie) with their supervisors, spent the day in our Church. The group attended Church Services with our Armenian and Sunday School students, visited the Sunday School, and then had lunch with some of our students, teachers and parishioners. The lunch was prepared and served by the Women's Guild. Gifts were then given to each child and to the Children's Aesthetics Center. In the late afternoon, the children presented a "Song and Dance Performance", in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall (which was made available for their use), to benefit the Children's Aesthetics Center" in Leninakan.

On June 27, I participated in a Reception at Cambridge City Hall to honor the Mayor of Yerevan, Armenia.

8. Youth Ministry

Upon the resignation of Ben Saraydarian as Youth Director of our Church, we invited Paula Jurigian, a graduate of St. Nersess Seminary, to be our new Youth

Director. We are glad that Paula, under the immediate supervision of Nancy D. Kasarjian, our Executive Director, has prepared and executed programs for the youth of our Parish.

We make a strong plea to our parents to encourage their children to be a part of the youth organizations of our Church and to take an active part in their spiritual, educational and social growth.

During the year, under the immediate direction and supervision of our Youth Director, the following events have taken place in our Parish, organized by the youth of Holy Trinity Church:

- * Poon Paregentan Celebration (ACYOA Juniors)
- * Lenten Dinners/Programs (ACYOA Seniors)
- * Palm Sunday Banquet and Program (ACYOA Seniors and Juniors)
- * Thanksgiving Luncheon (ACYOA Juniors)

9. Church Schools

Both our Sunday School and Armenian School continue to serve our children and young adults by providing them with instruction in Armenian/Christian religious education and Armenian language and culture, respectively. Seta A. Buchter serves as the Superintendent of our Sunday School and is supported by a group of dedicated teachers and staff. Arax Janjigian, together with Apkar Potookian and Marlene Sefarian, continue to teach our children Armenian language, history and song.

We appreciate the services of all the teachers, staff members and parents of these Schools and thank them for their devotion to our children.

Both schools are tuition-free and parents are urged to take advantage of these opportunities for their children by enrolling their children in these schools.

10. Stained Glass Windows

The third and final phase of our Church's "Stained Glass Windows" was completed and dedicated on Sunday, May 26. This last phase included the windows in the Vestibule, Parish Council Room, Bridal Room, Baptistry and Vestry. Following the Dedication Service, the Parish Council hosted a Reception in honor of the benefactors of these windows and our parishioners. There are still four stained glass windows available for donors.

11. Special Events

a. In response to my appeal to His Grace, the Primate, to ordain three of our Altar Servers as Deacons, the Primate visited our Parish on the weekend of April 13/14. On Saturday evening, April 13, the Primate ordained four Acolytes from our Sunday School (Edward Yessaian, Christopher Tashjian, Aram Gupta and Theodore Lepore), and on Sunday, April 14, His Grace celebrated the Divine Liturgy and ordained James Kalustian, Gary Alexander and Edward Marootian as Deacons for our Church. On Saturday evening, a Reception was held in honor of the newly-ordained Acolytes and on Sunday, a Reception honored the Primate and the newly-ordained Deacons.

b. On Thursday, June 27, Mrs. Deran Hintlian, a Trustee of the Holy Trinity Trust Fund, invited a group of friends to her home for a Dinner/Reception for the purpose of raising money for the Holy Trinity Trust Fund. Mrs. Hintlian was successful in soliciting \$236,000.00 for the Trust Fund. We wish to express our gratitude to Mrs. Hintlian and to all those who responded favorably to her appeal.

c. On November 3, we celebrated the 30th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church and the 70th Anniversary of the purchasing of the Holy Trinity Church building on Shawmut Avenue in Boston (in 1921). His Grace, Bishop Papken Varjabedian, the Legate of our Diocese in Washington, D.C., celebrated the Divine Liturgy. This occasion also marked the 50th Anniversary of Bishop Varjabedian's Ordination to the Priesthood. On this day, the Senior Women's Guild was honored on the occasion of the 85th Anniversary of their founding. At the Banquet, the Minister of Religious Affairs of Armenia was present and addressed the audience.

12. Church Office

The Church Office is open five days a week, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with a staff of nine people, who work full-time or part-time, to carry out the work of our Parish. Nancy D. Kasarjian continues to serve our Parish in the position of Executive Director. Under her capable leadership and through the dedicated services of our employees, we continue to meet the needs of our Parish, parishioners and our Church-affiliated organizations. Holy Trinity is fortunate to have a capable, efficient and devoted staff. I extend my gratitude and appreciation to Nancy Kasarjian, Rose Mamishian, Carol Krikorian, Seta A. Buchter, Paula Jurigian, Harvinder Jassal, Ara Dermovses, head custodian, and his staff, William Serrano and Krikor Demirciyan, for all their help during the year. Our appreciation is also expressed to our Pastor Emeritus, Father Papken Maksoudian, for his services. I would also like to express my appreciation and sincerest thanks to the many volunteers who are called upon during the year for special projects.

13. Appreciation

I wish to extend my personal gratitude to all our parishioners for their prayers, for attending Church Services, for supporting cultural and social events of our Church, and for their continued generosity in contributing to our Church to help us carry out our Lord's mission within the Holy Trinity family. I also wish to thank Father Papken Maksoudian, our Pastor Emeritus; Father Oshagan Minassian, our Choir Director; Al Zouranjian, Chairman of the Parish Council; the members of the Parish Council; our Diocesan Delegates; the Board members of our Trust Fund; the teachers and staff of our Schools; the members of our Choir; the Altar Servers; our Organist, Zavan Mazmanian; the Executive Members of our Church-affiliated organizations; and the many volunteers who come and work at Church affairs and functions, for their dedicated service to the Holy Trinity Church. May I also thank all the benefactors of our Church through whose financial contributions we are able to undertake special projects within our Parish. May God grant you all good health and long life to serve our Lord and our people through our beloved Church of the Holy Trinity.

The 1991 Parish Council respectfully submits its Annual Report to the parishioners of the Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Greater Boston. We urge each parishioner to read closely the Pastor's Report preceding our Report, as well as the Financial Reports and Church-affiliated Organizational Reports following. Within these pages is a brief summary of the status of our Church. The Church is doing well, having been able to sustain itself within its budget despite the tough economic environment. We urge you to attend Church with your families and participate in our Church-affiliated groups and functions, so that you may share with us the spiritual, cultural and social gifts that Holy Trinity Church offers us.

On April 13 and 14, we were honored to have our Primate, His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian present to ordain four Sunday School students, Edward Yessalian, Christopher Tashjian, Aram Gupta, and Theodore Lepore, as Acolytes, and James Kalustian, Gary Alexander and Edward Marootian into the Diaconate. Following the Services on Sunday, the Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates hosted a Reception in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall to honor the newly-ordained Deacons and their families.

All of the stained glass windows have been installed within the Church. To mark the occasion and honor the loved ones in whose memory the windows were donated, a Dedication Service was held on Sunday, May 26. Following the Service, the Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates hosted a Reception for the donors in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall. Plaques will be installed in the coming year.

The Parish Council is pleased to report that a lease was negotiated to rent classroom space in Peter Adamian Hall to the Fayerweather Street School as of July 1, 1991. Our Executive Director, Nancy D. Kasarjian, played a key role in the lease negotiation and the extension of the lease to June, 1993. We appreciate her efforts to secure the additional rental income from the School, along with all other rentals.

September began a season of activity at Holy Trinity. On Sunday, September 8, the Annual Picnic was held in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall. The event was chaired by Cathy Minassian with Ann Hintlian's able kitchen crew preparing the traditional Armenian food for all that attended. There was Armenian music by the Hye Echoes for dancing and games for children coordinated by our Youth Director, Paula Jurigian.

Armenian Cultural Month began in October with an Explanation of the Divine Liturgy during Badarak on Sunday, October 6. Deacon James Kalustian and Susan Derderian gave English explanations at various intervals so that we could better understand the meaning of the Divine Liturgy. The 11th Annual Oriental Rug Sale was held October 17-20. This year's Committee included Debbie Stevens, Chairman; George Hagopian, Treasurer; and George Haroutunian, Jeanne Jamgochian and Robert Proodian. Through the efforts of this Committee, the office staff and the Church volunteers, the Church was able to raise considerable funds from this event. On Sunday, October 27, the Church sponsored a Recital and Reception for Luise Vosgerchian, Concert Pianist and former Professor of Music at Harvard University. Miss Vosgerchian gave an inspiring performance. We were proud to have sponsored this event for Armenian Cultural Month.

The 30th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church in Cambridge was held on Sunday, November 3. At the Annual Banquet, we also celebrated the 85th Anniversary of the founding of our Senior Women's Guild and honored this group of women on this day which was also our Stewardship Sunday. We were honored to have as Guest Celebrant, His Grace Bishop Papken Varjabedian, Diocesan Legate in Washington, D.C., who was celebrating the 50th Anniversary of his Ordination to the Priesthood. Women's Guild Chairman, Violet Goshdigian, and her committee hosted the Banquet which was a huge success.

The Annual Christmas Bazaar was held on Friday, December 6, and Saturday, December 7. Aram Hintlian, Jr., and Marilyn Takvorian did an outstanding job as Co-Chairmen. All of the Bazaar volunteers and members of the Church-affiliated organizations that participated should be recognized for all of their hard work on this successful event. Thank you! The Parish celebrated the Christmas season with its annual Christmas Concert on December 15. The community filled the Church to capacity for the performance of classical and Armenian works by the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra under the direction of Father Oshagan Minassian. On December 22, Christmas Family Services were held and after Church, the Sunday School presented their Christmas Play. The Parish Council hosted a Reception for parishioners after the performance. We would like to thank our Sunday School Superintendent, Seta A. Buchter, and the Sunday School staff for all their efforts on behalf of our children.

Our Church and Cultural Hall are now over 30 years old, and the Parish House and Shahe Hall, both existing structures when the property was purchased, are over 100 years old. The natural aging of the complex has required several refurbishing projects besides regular maintenance to keep up the complex. The Parish Council has sought to identify maintenance needs and try to prioritize and control costs for repair work. We now have in the position of Executive Director, Nancy D. Kasarjian, to oversee the maintenance of the Church property, report to the Parish Council on these issues, supervise the custodians to get projects completed, or, based on the direction of the Parish Council, negotiate with outside contractors. There are two full-time custodians, Ara Dermovses and William Serrano, and one

part-time custodian, Krikor Demirciyan, on staff at the Church. In addition to their normal maintenance duties, they have been able to undertake special projects such as the installation of new parking lot light fixtures, installation of new pneumatic valve in Peter Adamian Hall, and major repair of the emergency electric generator, among others. The Parish Council appreciates the talent and dedication of this crew, and we wish to thank them for their efforts this year. We would also like to note that based on the direction of the Parish Council, the Executive Director coordinated an Energy Audit of the Church complex with Commonwealth Electric and an outside energy consultant, which resulted in the free installation of energy efficient lighting throughout most of the complex.

Our other Church staff members that deserve recognition are our Administrative Assistant, Rose Mamishian, and Secretary, Carol Krikorian. One example of their efficiency and expertise is the fact that this Annual Report is produced within 2-1/2 weeks of the end of the fiscal year (December 31). Rose and Carol, along with the help of Seta Buchter and Paula Jurigian during this extremely busy period, coordinate, verify and type all the Church Reports and those of the Church-affiliated organizations, make all the copies, assemble a team of volunteers to collate, and then mail out the Annual Reports two weeks before the Annual Parish Assembly. During the year, Rose and Carol are the individuals who ensure that you, our parishioners, have a weekly Church Bulletin, the mailings for our Parish events, and the monthly Dajar (which is typed and set-up in-house), plus handle the day-to-day telephone calls and correspondence the Church receives. We would also like to mention the extra services provided by Seta A. Buchter. She not only takes care of all the needs of our Sunday School as its Superintendent, but also is responsible for most Press Releases emanating from our Church Office, as well as the editing of various reports, etc. We thank Seta for the extra help she provides the Office Staff when needed. We would also like to thank Harvinder Jassal, who provides us with all the bookkeeping requirements for our Parish. Harvinder is also responsible for the computer programming and systems maintenance of his records, as well as for those programs he has written for various Church-affiliated organizations.

As part of our commitment to our youth, we have maintained the position of Youth Director. This year, we are pleased to have Paula Jurigian, a graduate of St. Nersess Seminary, fill this position on the Church staff. Paula has revitalized the ACYOA Juniors and is continuing to lead the ACYOA Seniors in many worthwhile activities.

On December 1, a Special Parish Assembly was held in response to a petition regarding our Pastor Emeritus, Father Papken Maksoudian. At this Assembly, a committee was formed to bring forth a recommendation to the 1992 Annual Parish Assembly for the purpose of resolving this issue. We hope and pray that this issue can be put behind us and strengthen our Parish to go forward and do what is good in His eyes.
