## ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY Sunday, February 2, 1992

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was held on Sunday, February 2, 1992, following Church Services, in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall. Two hundred eight dues-paying members were present.

The Assembly was called to order by Albert Zouranjian, Chairman of the Parish Council, at 12:50 p.m. He welcomed and thanked the parishioners for their attendance.

The Opening Prayer was offered by Reverend Father Mampre A. Kouzouian, Pastor, who asked those present to join with him in reciting the prayer in English and Armenian.

George W. Haroutunian, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the slate for the day's Tivan as follows:

Chairman: Donald Tellalian and Eugene Raphaelian Recording Secretary: Carol Krikorian and Rose Minassian

Eugene Raphaelian declined his nomination. Additional nominations for Chairman of the Day were asked from the floor. There being no further nominations, a Motion was made and seconded that Donald Tellalian be elected Chairman of the Assembly. MOTION PASSED.

Rose Minassian declined her nomination for Secretary. Additional nominations were asked from the floor. Mabel Tashjian was nominated. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed. There was an open vote for Recording Secretary with Carol Krikorian being elected.

Donald Tellalian, in addressing the Assembly, thanked the Nominating Committee and the Assembly on behalf of himself and Carol Krikorian for electing him Chairman and Carol Krikorian, Secretary. He stated that he appreciated their vote of confidence and hoped to conduct the Assembly in a fair and effective manner.

A motion was made and seconded to amend the Agenda for the Assembly to:

- Add "Appoint a Parliamentarian" between Nos. 2 and 3.
- Change No. 3, "Reading" to "'Approval' of Minutes", etc.
- Add "and reading of the Minutes" to No. 10.
- Add "Old Business and New Business" between Nos. 10 and 11.
- Add "and closing of Meeting" to No. 13. MOTION PASSED.

The following were nominated for Parliamentarian for the Day: Mary Killelea, nomination seconded; Robert Goshgarian, George Alexander, Walter Vartanian, Peter Talanian, and Gerald Ajemian all declined. Nominations were closed. A motion was made and seconded to accept Mary Killelea as Parliamentarian for the Day. MOTION PASSED.

A motion was made and seconded that the reading of each and every report would be suspended, except for those that would be elaborated upon at the appropriate time. MOTION PASSED.

#### MINUTES OF 1991 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY

The Chairman of the Assembly called for a reading by the Recording Secretary of portions of the Minutes of the 1991 Annual Assembly; specifically, pages 2a to 2d - Stewardship Program, 2h, and 2i. Upon the reading of the Minutes, the Chair asked if there were any additions or corrections. Grace Kaprelian referred to page 2.c., where there had been a request to list the names of the clergy receiving stipends and their positions in the Annual Report. She stated that in the 1991 Annual Report, the clergy stipends were listed under one sum and that parishioners have asked that they be listed separately. The Chairman noted that this issue was going to be addressed later in the report, but since it had been brought up now, he asked the Treasurer of the Parish Council, Phyllis Martins, to give the breakdowns. Referring to page 5d, Clergy Stipends, total sum of \$85,416.20, the breakdown of stipends is as follows: Rev. Fr. Mampe A. Kouzouian, Pastor - \$54,876.12; Rev. Fr. Papken Maksoudian, Pastor Emeritus - \$17,109.84; Very Rev. Fr. Oshagan Minassian, Choir Director - \$13,430.24. It was noted that the Pastor's stipend includes a housing allowance of \$12,500.00. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Minutes as amplified. MOTION PASSED.

For Parish Council, it was noted that Robert Borzakian, Jr., instructed the Assembly that should he win, he will not be able to serve his term. Asking for nominations from the floor in all categories, James Kalustian was nominated for the Parish Council, and the nomination was seconded. He declined the nomination. Motions were made and seconded to close nominations in all categories. MOTIONS APPROVED. It was noted that for Diocesan Delegates, James Kalustian, was not listed on the sample ballot that was mailed out to members. However, his name did appear on the day's ballot.

It was stated as a point of information, that in the race for Auditing Committee, as directed by the Diocese and the Catholicos, the first of the three people elected to this Office will serve a term of three years; the second, two years; and the third, one year.

#### CORRECTIONS TO ANNUAL REPORT

The Chairman noted the following corrections that should be made to the Annual Report:

- Page 5a, under Hall Gifts General, the Actual Column should read: "\$7,970.00" instead of "\$8,370.00", and under Special Gifts, the Actual Column should read "\$3,955.00" instead of "\$3,550.00". Four hundred dollars in rental security deposits was inadvertently moved from Special Gifts to Hall Gifts.
  - Page 5h, Cash on Hand should read "December 31, 1991".
- Page Bl, under Women's Guild Executive Commmittee, Advisors, add "Margaret Atamian".

Following an interval at 2:00 p.m., for voting purposes, the Annual Assembly was again called to order by the Chairman at 2:35 p.m., stating that the Ballot Box had officially closed at 2:30 p.m.

#### Pastor's Annual Report for 1991

The Pastor gave an overview of his report both in English and Armenian. A motion was made and seconded to accept the Pastor's Report. MOTION PASSED.

At this time, June Piranian, on behalf of Dorothea Piranian who was not present, asked if there was any answer to Ms. Piranian's request at the 1991 Assembly, included in the 1991 Minutes on page 2h, asking if it were not possible to stagger the Church Office hours from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., instead of from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. The Chairman of the Parish Council stated that the Parish Council, in reviewing this request, had decided that it was not necessary to stagger the hours of the staff, and that the Office will remain open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. He noted that we do have an answering machine and that the Pastor is available 24 hours a day.

#### Parish Council Activities Report for 1991

At this time, the Parish Council Chairman addressed a past request that the position of Executive Director be reviewed in the future as to its need. He stated that in reading the Parish Council Report, one can see that our Executive Director, Nancy D. Kasarjian, has played a very vital role in bringing income into this Church. He commented that enough cannot be said about her capabiltiies, that she is a very dedicated and valuable employee, and that they intend to keep her as Executive Director. He also stated that the position of Executive Director is here to stay and that the duties of this position entail working under the Pastor and the Parish Council, overseeing the Church Office personnel and responsibility for the hiring and firing and needs of same, and the needs of the Church; a close-working relationship with our bookkeeper; the negotiation of leases, such as in the case of the addition of the (Fayerweather) School lease that was persistently pursued by our Executive Director, bringing in additional income of \$39,000.00 this year, and \$42,000.00 next year; the overseeing of the maintenance of our Church properties making sure everything is running smoothly and is kept clean; and public relations in regard to maintaining good relationships with our neighbors. The Parish Council Chairman stated that everything that had been asked of our Executive Director, has been done and done well. He also commented that all of Holy Trinity Church's employees are very dedicated and that they put in many more hours than those for which they are paid.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Parish Council Report as given. MOTION PASSED.

#### Parish Council Financial Report for 1991

It was suggested that on page 5d, the terminology be clarified for "Miscellaneous Services Paid by Parishioners". The Treasurer stated that this represents monies received by our parishioners for deacon services, organist, and soloists that were paid to the deacons, organists, and soloists.

To foster calm and clear communication among all present, a suggestion was made by Aetna Tashjian, Diocesan Delegate, that the Parish Council and the Diocesan Delegates listen carefully to each question and that they should then determine which one among them is best suited to address the Assembly with the answer.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Parish Council Financial Report as presented. MOTION PASSED.

#### Trust Fund Report

The Treasurer of the Trust Fund, George D. Hagopian, gave an overview of his report commenting that in 1991, we had reached a milestone by surpassing the \$2,000,000.00 mark. He stated that in the 17 years the Trust Fund had been operating, it took 13 years to make the first million and four years to make the second. He said that the Trust Fund contributed \$130,000.00 to the Church which represented 26% of the Church's total income, compared to 22.2% in 1990 and 16.5% in 1989.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Trust Fund Report. MOTION PASSED.

#### Special Parish Assembly, December 1, 1991

The Chairman of the Assembly requested that the Parish Council Secretary, Cathy Minassian, read the minutes of the Special Parish Assembly that was held on December 1, 1991, regarding the status of the Pastor Emeritus, Rev. Fr. Papken Maksoudian. The minutes were then read.

A request was made to add to the Minutes that a request had been made at the Special Assembly for a reading of the minutes of the Parish Council meeting that had discussed a change to Father Papken's status and that the Assembly was told that there were no minutes.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Minutes of the Special Parish Assembly held December 1, 1991, as corrected. MOTION PASSED.

At this time, Diran Zahigian read the report of the Committee that had met to resolve this issue.

Discussion was held at this time, during which it was disclosed that a letter had been sent certified mail from Father Papken Maksoudian to the Chairman of the Parish Council, with copies sent to His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate; the Very Rev. Ghevont Samoorian, Vicar of New England; Rev. Fr. Mampre Kouzouian, Pastor; the Diocesan Delegates; and the members of the Parish Council. It should be noted that Diran Zahigian, member of the committee to meet with Father Papken, and Cathy Minassian, Parish Council Secretary, stated that they had not received a copy of Father Papken's letter. Dialogue ensued as to whether or not the letter should be read without the author's permission, since it was sent to an individual. It was the opinion of the Chairman of the Assembly that since the letter was sent to the Parish Council Chairman in his capacity as such, its contents, therefore, had relevance to the issue at hand. At this time, Margaret Atamian stated that she did have the author's permission to read the letter. With the advisory and recognition that not all would necessarily agree with some of the issues in contention within the letter, and that in this forum it should be neither appropriate nor helpful to argue the specifics of the letter, the Chairman of the Assembly read the letter in its entirety.

A motion was made for the Assembly to receive and approve the report of the Committee and approve the recommended lifetime pension to Father Papken. George Alexander asked for an Amendment that stated that the Holy Trinity

Armenian Church pay a lifetime pension which represents the sum and total compensation of \$1,500.00 a month for a total of \$18,000.00 a year to Father Papken Maksoudian. Amendment seconded. Chairman Tellalian called for an intermission at 4:45 p.m., for the purpose of voting by secret ballot. After the ballots had been tabulated, the Chairman notified the Assembly that there were irregularities in the voting. Ballots were distributed to 164 members and there were 166 ballots in the box. He had no other recourse, but to ask for a revote, indicating that this issue was of such importance that the irregularity was out of order. The Assembly took a break at 5:35 p.m. to revote. Results: 154 ballots were distributed, 153 ballots were cast and checked off. Yes - 69; No - 84. AMENDHENT NOT PASSED. A return was made to the original motion by Dan Dorian and seconded which stated that the Holy Trinity Church shall pay a lifetime pension which represents the sum and total compensation of \$1,000.00 a month for a total of \$12,000.00 per year to Father Papken Maksoudian. There was an intermission at 6:10 p.m., for the Assembly to vote. Results of the voting: 139 ballots were distributed; 138 were cast. Yes - 98; No - 39; Blank - 1. MOTION PASSED.

Jack Keverian stated that Father Papken, in his letter, had stated that he was resigning from the title of Pastor Emeritus and since that title was conferred on him, it was appropriate for the Assembly to entertain a motion to accept that resignation, accept it with regret, or not accept it. At this time, Mr. Keverian made a motion that stated: "Let the will of this Assembly of the Holy Trinity Church of Greater Boston be known that Rev. Fr. Papken Maksoudian is beloved by its members and the entire Church community; that his resignation is respectfully refused; that he is requested to withdraw his letter of January 12, 1992, and rejoin our Church Parish community as Pastor Emeritus with all of the love, respect and privileges this postion entails". Motion seconded. Ayes had it by acclamation. MOTION PASSED.

At this time, the Chairman of the Assembly stated that he was charging the Tivan of the Parish Council and the Special Committee that was brought together before, to meet and pull together the language of a letter that would be on Church stationery informing Father Papken of the actions that were taken at this Assembly, the acceptance of all eight individuals pulling that letter together and the sending of that letter. Diran Zahigian, a member of the Special Committee, indicated that he would not be here, but would go along with the Committee.

In response to a question as to how the three-way tie for Alternate for the Diocesan Delegates would be resolved, it was stated that according to the Diocesan By-Laws, the Pastor would have the deciding vote.

Chairman Tellalian expressed his thanks to the Nominating Committee Chairman and his Committee for their efforts and, also, congratulated all those who lent their names to this process.

#### New Business

In response to questions regarding the awarding of scholarships from the Gregory Archie & Rose Kolligian Trust Fund and other such funds requiring the distribution of funds, a motion was made that when a Scholarship Trust Fund is set up, that the patron(s) be part of the committee to award whatever distribution needs to be awarded. After a discussion, an amendment to the motion was made that would restrict the motion to include one trust, the Gregory Archie & Rose Kolligian Scholarship Trust Fund, and that Trust only. Amendment seconded. MOTION PASSED.

Robert Goshgarian commented that since there is no way of knowing how many secret ballots may be necessary at any given Assembly, he put forth a motion that multiple ballots be given to each parishioner (dues-paying member) so that they may tear one off, cast their vote and pass it in. Motion seconded. MOTION NOT PASSED. In response to this motion, a suggestion was made that we think through some clever way to be more efficient.

Because of his concern over statistics showing a long-term trend of an almost 2-to-1 ratio of funerals to baptisms, Robert Goshgarian made a two-part motion: 1. To put forth a proposal for submission to the 90th Diocesan Assembly in 1992, submitted by Holy Trinity Church of Cambridge, MA, proposing that the Diocesan Council or its designee analyze the growth or decrease in Church membership of the Diocese in recent years and report its findings along with a plan as to how growth may be encouraged, to the 91st Diocesan Assembly in 1993; and 2. That the Parish Council or its designee analyze the growth or decrease in Church membership of the Parish in recent years and report its findings along with a plan as to how growth may be encouraged, to the 1993 Parish Assembly. Motion seconded. After some discussion and concern as to how this project would be funded, the motion was put to a vote. MOTION PASSED. The author was asked to put his proposal in writing and submit it for forwarding to the Diocese.

Robert Goshgarian made a motion that we include in our Budget for the coming year, 1% of the budget for charities and outreach as the Parish chooses, with the following year to show an increase of 2%, and the third year 3%, at which point it would remain. Motion seconded. After a discussion, a motion was made and seconded to table the above motion. MOTION PASSED.

Richard Zeytoonjian put forth a recommendation for consideration by the Parish Council that a Church Advisory Board be set up for the purpose of advising the Parish Council, when called upon, pertaining to matters that may arise. He also suggested that the Parish Council members wear some sort of pin, bearing the following: Parish Council, their name, and the words "Welcome", and that this should be worn on Sundays and at all Church functions.

#### Proposed Budget for 1992

A motion was made that Father Papken Maksoudian's stipend be eliminated from the clergy stipend (minus one month) and that whatever he will be getting be listed in a new line item. Motion seconded. MOTION PASSED.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the 1992 Budget as adjusted. MOTION PASSED.

The closing prayer was offered by Father Mampre, following his comments commending the Chairman of the Assembly, Donald Tellalian, for the excellent manner in which he conducted the Assembly. He also thanked the Secretary of the Day, Carol Krikorian, and the Parliamentarian, Mary Killilea. He expressed his thanks to the Chairman of the Parish Council, Albert Zouranjian, for his dedication and leadership, and extended his appreciation to all the outgoing members of the Parish Council, Auditing & Nominating Committees, and Diocesan Delegates. He also offered his congratulations to the newly-elected members of the Parish Council, Auditing & Nominating Committees, and Diocesan Delegates, wishing them all well.

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was declared adjourned at 7:35 p.m.

#### PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1992

I would like to give thanks to God Almighty for giving me the good health, the wisdom, and the patience to serve Him and His flock this past year. I ask you to pray for me to be able to carry on His work in our midst.

Herewith, I would like to present to you my Annual Report for 1992. All that has been done in our Parish, is with your cooperation. I am grateful to you for your support and encouragement. I thank you for all that you have done this past year for our beloved Church.

#### 1. Church Services

As in previous years, every Sunday, on high holidays and on special occasions, we conducted Church Services according to the traditions and canons of our Church. Sermons were given in Armenian and in English.

The following is a list of clergymen who have celebrated in our Church, as well as a listing of special Church Services and events held during 1992:

- a. On February 9, His Grace Bishop Karekin Nersisian, the Vicar of the Pontifical Diocese of Yerevan, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon. Following Church Services, a Reception was held in the Charles & Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall, in honor of our high-ranking clergyman, where he appealed to the community to financially assist him in organizing and carrying out his mission within the boundaries of his Diocese. On this occasion, on behalf of our Parish, a check in the amount of \$5,000.00, contributed by five individuals in our Parish, was presented to His Grace.
- b. On Monday, February 24, on the Eve of St. Ghevont and Companions, Vesper Services were conducted, presided over by our Primate with the participation of the Reverend Fathers of the New England Region. Following Church Services, the Haighouhi Otyag of the Daughters of Vartan hosted a Reception for our guests.
- c. On Thursday, February 27, on the Feast of St. Vartan and His Companions, Divine Liturgy was celebrated with the members of the Senior Women's Guild receiving Holy Communion prior to their monthly Luncheon Meeting.
- d. On March 1, following the Poon Paregentan Badarak, the ACYOA sponsored, with the participation of our parishioners, the traditional Pre-Lenten Carnival in the Charles & Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.
- e. While I was on vacation, the Divine Liturgy was celebrated on March 8, by Fr. Garen Gdanian of Watervliet, NY, on March 15, by Fr.

Carnig Hallajian of NJ, and on March 22, by Fr. Arnak Kasparian of Tenafly, NJ.

- f. On Holy Thursday, Divine Liturgy was celebrated in our Church with the members of the Senior Women's Guild receiving Holy Communion, followed by their monthly Luncheon Meeting.
- g. During Holy Week, Church Services were conducted according to the traditions of our Church.
- h. On Sunday, May 3, while I was attending the Diocesan Assembly, Father Oshagan Minassian conducted Morning Services and delivered the sermon. Following Church Services, our children, ACYOA members, young adults and parishioners participated in Project Bread's annual "Walk for Hunger". This was the first time that we, as a Parish, took part in the "Walk for Hunger". We intend to make this an annual event for our Church.
- i. On May 10, His Grace, Archbishop Houssig Santourian, the Grand Sacristan of the Cathedral of Holy Etchmiadzin, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon. A Reception was held following Church Services in honor of our Guest. Archbishop Santourian remained in our Parish for one week.
- j. On Wednesday, May 27, on the Eve of the Ascension of our Lord, I celebrated the Divine Liturgy at Sts. Vartanantz Church in Chelmsford, MA.
- k. On Thursday, May 28, on the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord, Divine Liturgy was celebrated in our Church. The Senior Women's Guild received communion, followed by a Luncheon and the traditional celebration of Ascension.
- 1. On Tuesday, July 14, His Grace, Bishop Krikoris Bounyatian, the Primate of Goumayrie (formerly Leninagan, Armenia) visited our Church.
- m. On Sunday, August 2, Fr. Mesrob Benlian of Bulgaria, celebrated Divine Liturgy.
- n. On Sunday, August 23, and on other occasions, our Choir Director delivered the sermon.
- o. On Sunday, September 20, Family Reunion Day was observed in our Church followed by a Complimentary Brunch underwritten by the Trustees of the Jack H. Kolligian Memorial Fund.
- p. On October 25, on the 31st Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church, His Grace, Bishop Houssig Bagdasian of Livingston, NJ, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and, following Church Services, presided over the Anniversary Banquet held in the Charles & Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.
- q. On Sunday, November 1, on the occasion of the Choir Association's Annual Assembly, hosted by our Choir, His Grace, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, our Primate, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon, followed by a Brunch in honor of the delegates prepared and served by the Women's Guild.

- r. On Sunday, November 22, Thanksgiving Family Service was conducted in our Church followed by a "Turkey Dinner", hosted by the ACYOA Juniors.
- s. On Sunday, December 20, Christmas Family Service and Carolling took place in our Church, followed by presentation of the Sunday School's annual Christmas play and a Reception hosted by the Parish Council.
- t. On Sunday, December 27, Fr. Arsen Barsamian of St. James Armenian Church, Watertown, MA, celebrated the Divine Liturgy.

On Christmas and Easter eves, I conducted a short service and administered Holy Communion to the children of our Armenian and Sunday Schools.

I must call to the attention of our parishioners, that one of the most important things in our Parish life is our worship service where we should come together to praise the Lord and give thanks to Him for His blessings. It is my fervent desire to see that more and more parishioners attend Church Services. This is where we receive our spiritual nourishment and spiritual strength. I urge you to attend Church Services more often.

I would like to publicly express my appreciation to our Choir Director, the Very Rev. Fr. Oshagan Minassian, to our Deacons, Altar Servers, Choir Members, and Organist, for their dedication and commitment. We are pleased that our Deacons are training some of our Sunday School boys as Acolytes and future Altar Servers.

#### 2. Sacraments and Services

During 1992, the following sacraments and services were performed in our Church:

Baptisms: 25 Weddings: 13 Funerals: 27

Bethrothal services conducted by me: 2

During these sacraments and services, I met with individuals and families to counsel them, share their joys and, sometimes, their sorrow. I performed 13 wedding rehearsals before weddings.

#### 3. Counseling Services

On 85 different occasions, I held counseling sessions with individuals and families, as well as with young couples who intended to marry and with adults who wanted to be baptized or confirmed in the Armenian Church.

The Pastor is available to counsel individuals and families when they go through personal crisis due to sickness, death of loved ones, or when there are family problems. I have tried to reach out to parishioners who were in need of our help by praying, supporting, advising and counselling them. Through this service, the Church reaches out to its faithful to guide and support them.

#### 4. Pastoral Visitations

During 1992, I made 327 pastoral visitations to the homes of our parishioners, to hospitals, to nursing homes, and to rehabilatation centers to pray and conduct services. I also visited, with our parishioners, cemeteries to bless the graves of their loved ones and to pray for them.

On special occasions, such as Christmas, Mother's Day, Thanksgiving, and others, I have reached out to the members of our community, especially the sick, the elderly, the shut-ins, and those who had been missed in our Church, by telephoning them. These calls and my visitations have been appreciated by our parishioners.

#### 5. Meetings

During this past year, I presided over and participated in 157 Parish-affiliated meetings which included all the Church-affiliated organizations, their standing committees, executive bodies, and various individuals.

I also participated in the Annual Clergymen's Conference and Diocesan Assembly held at St. David's Armenian Church, Boca Raton, FL, and, participated in Regional Clergymen's Conferences on different occasions.

#### 6. Cultural and Educational Programs

Next to its spiritual mission, the Armenian Church serves, encourages, and promotes Armenian culture.

On Saturday, April 25, the Gomidas Quartet of Armenia, under the auspices of the Diocese of the Armenian Church, performed in our Church in commemoration of Martyrs' Day.

On Sunday, June 7, I was a guest speaker at St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Church in Haverhill, MA.

On Sunday, June 21, Ara Kalaydjian, Editor of the Armenian Mirror Spectator, spoke to our people on the critical situation of our brothers and sisters in Artsakh (Karabagh).

On Saturday, July 18, I spoke, in Shahe Hall, to the Deacons of the New England Region.

On Sunday, October 4, we offered an explanation of the Divine Liturgy which was narrated by Susan Derderian, Esq., and Sona Tashjian so that our parishioners may understand the meaning of the Badarak.

On October 16-18, we held an exhibition of the paintings of the well-known and respected artist, Levon Mnazakanian.

On December 13, we presented in the Church our traditional Christmas Concert, performed by the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra under the direction of our Choir Director, Father Oshagan Minassian.

We continue to publish the <u>Dajar</u>, our Church's monthly publication, which serves to inform and educate our community.

During the monthly meetings of our Church-affiliated organizations, we either invite individuals to present lectures or conduct informative talks with our parishioners. Bible Study is conducted at the monthly meetings of the Senior Women's Guild and, also, on Sunday mornings, by Gregory Tashjian, for our Sunday School parents and parishioners.

We also provided scholarships for higher education to worthy and needy students from our Parish. Funds were also made available for Deacon Training Programs and for our Seminaries for preparation of clergymen for the Armenian Church. The Church also provided partial scholarships for our Armenian and Sunday School students who attended St. Vartan Camp.

#### 7. Assistance to Armenia

As Armenians, as well as an Armenian Church, we must show some concern and interest in the welfare of our motherland and the Mother Church in Etchmiadzin where the land, the people, and the Church are going through turmoil. This is a very critical time in the history of our people where, individually and collectively, every Armenian and every Armenian Church must support our people and our Churches in Armenia, for no Armenian or Armenian Church in the Diaspora can survive without a land. It is my recommendation that we, the Holy Trinity Church, adopt a Church in Armenia as a sister Church and contribute money and materials.

When Bishop Karekin Nersisian, the Vicar of the Pontifical Diocese of Yerevan, was a Guest Celebrant in our Church, we presented a check in the amount of \$5,000.00 to him to use for his Christian mission within his Diocese. This gift was contributed by five individuals from our Parish. We also sent monies to Holy Etchmiadzin for the Seminary of the Mother See to prepare clergymen for the Armenian Church. We also sent monetary contributions to Armenia, donated by our parishioners, to be distributed to the needy.

During this year, I had an audience with His Eminence, Cardinal Law, Archibshop of the Catholic Church of Boston, to intercede with the American Government and the Catholic Relief Services to help Armenia and Artsakh. As a result of this audience, the <u>Pilot</u>, the official publication of the Archdiocese of the Catholic Church, interviewed me for its August 14 issue.

Our Parish is also assisting refugees who have fled from Bakou, Azerbaijan, and settled in the Boston area. We have made Shahe Hall available to them for their bi-monthly meetings. Their children attend our Armenian School where they are taught both Armenian and English, and they are enrolled in our Sunday School.

We pray that God will protect our motherland and our people in Armenia.

#### 8. Our Schools

I am pleased to inform you that this year our enrollments have increased in both our Sunday School and Armenian School. A group of dedicated teachers, staff members, and volunteers help teach our children their Christian faith and the Armenian language and culture. I would like to express my appreciation to all the teachers, as well as to the capable Superintendent of our Sunday School, Seta A. Buchter, and to Araxi Janjigian for her dedicated service to our Schools. Araxi has moved to Florida, and Mr. Abgar Potookian has been appointed Superintendent of our Armenian School.

Both schools are tuition-free and we encourage our parishioners to take advantage of this opportunity and bring their children to both of our schools.

Twice during the year when we had Guest Celebrants, I visited the Sunday School and conducted assemblies for the children.

#### 9. Youth Ministry

Paula Jurigian, a graduate of St. Nersess Armenian Seminary, is our Youth Director. Both Paula and her sister, Lana, who has volunteered her time to assist in our Youth Ministry, work hard to bring together and organize our young people. However, they need the support and the encouragement of our parishioners and the youth of our Parish.

On Poon Paregentan, the youth sponsored our Pre-Lenten Celebration. During Lent, on three Wednesdays, the ACYOA Seniors organized Lenten dinners, lectures and Services in our Church. They hosted the Palm Sunday Banquet and the Thanksgiving Dinner in November. The ACYOA also helps at our Picnic and Bazaar, as well as at Church Banquets. We express our appreciation to Paula, Lana, and our young adults.

#### 10. Special Events

On October 25, we celebrated the 31st Anniversary of the consecration of our Church and honored Rose Mary Aznavorian as "Man of the Year". Rose has been a dedicated servant of our Church to whom we express our appreciation and gratitude. On this occasion, Bishop Houssig Bagdasian, who had just been ordained a Bishop of the Armenian Church, was our Guest Celebrant and presided over the Annual Banquet.

From October 29 to November 1, our Choir hosted the Annual Assembly of the Association of Armenian Church Choirs of America. They also celebrated the 80th anniversary of our Choir. On this occasion, His Holiness, the Catholicos of All Armenians, issued an Encyclical commemorating the 80th anniversary of our Choir. His Grace, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, our Primate, presided over the meetings and the Banquet. He also celebrated the Divine Liturgy on November 1 and delivered the sermon in our Church.

#### 11. Church Office

The Church Office is open five days a week, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with a staff of nine people, who work full-time or part-time, to carry out the work of our Parish. Nancy D. Kasarjian continues to serve our Parish in the position of Executive Director. Under her capable leadership and through the dedicated services of our employees, we continue to meet the needs of our Parish, parishioners and our Church-affiliated organizations. Holy Trinity is fortunate to have a capable, efficient and devoted staff. I extend my gratitude and appreciation to Nancy Kasarjian, Rose Mamishian, Carol Krikorian, Seta A. Buchter, Paula Jurigian, Harvinder Jassal, Ara Dermovses, head custodian, and his staff, William Serrano and Krikor Demirciyan, for all their help during the year. I would also like to express my appreciation and sincerest thanks to the many volunteers who are called upon during the year for special projects.

#### 12. Appreciation

I wish to extend my personal gratitude to all our parishioners for their prayers, for attending Church Services, for supporting cultural and social events of our Church, and for their continued generosity in contributing to our Church to help us carry out our Lord's mission within the Holy Trinity family. I also wish to thank Father Oshagan Minassian, our Choir Director; Albert Zouranjian, Chairman of the Parish Council; the members of the Parish Council; our Diocesan Delegates; the Board members of our Trust Fund; the teachers and staff of our Schools; the members of our Choir; the Altar Servers; our Organist; the Executive Members of our Church-affiliated organizations; and the many volunteers who come and work at Church affairs and functions, for their dedicated service to the Holy Trinity Church. May I also thank all the benefactors of our Church through whose financial contributions we are able to undertake special projects within our Parish. May God grant you all good health and long life to serve our Lord and our people through our beloved Church of the Holy Trinity.

The 1992 Parish Council respectfully submits the following Annual Report to the parishioners of Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Greater Boston. As Trustees, our responsibility is to oversee the management of our Church Parish and the many activities it undertakes to sustain itself. Our involvement in these activities has shown us that our Parish is blessed in the fellowship of the Christian Spirit.

This year we embarked upon a mission to try to meet with parishioners to listen to their concerns and find out how we can encourage Church attendance on Sunday mornings for Christian fellowship. In May, we held two meetings: the first with the Executive Committees of the Church-affiliated organizations, and the second with former Parish Council members and Diocesan In November, we met with a group of young couples from our Parish. At each one of these meetings, we were impressed with the love of the Church that was shown and how meaningful it can be to work with others for the Church in the spirit of God's love for one another. We encourage all our parishioners to attend Church regularly and to participate in the many Churchaffiliated organizations and activities to share in this fellowship.

To enable families with young children to attend Church Services and Bible Study on Sunday mornings, we supported the establishment of a "Family Room" in our Sunday School this past fall. Thanks to the efforts of Diane English to coordinate this, this "Room" became a reality in November.

The annual Church events held in 1992 were all enjoyable.

In September, the "Trinity Festival" was held on the Church grounds. The Committee served shish kebab, losh kebab and kheyma with tables set up outside between Johnson Hall and the Parish House. The weather was beautiful and everyone enjoyed being outdoors, the food, friends and family, and dancing to the music of the Hye Echoes inside the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.

Armenian Cultural Month began in October with an Explanation of the Divine Liturgy during Badarak on Sunday, October 4. The 12th Annual Oriental Rug Sale was held October 15-18. This event has continued to be a viable fund-raising activity for the Parish and this year's Committee of Debra Stevens, Chairman, George Hagopian, Treasurer, George Haroutunian, Jeanne Jamgochian, Robert Proodian, the Church Office staff and many volunteers should be congratulated on a job well-done. During the weekend of October 16-18, an exhibit of the paintings of Levon Mnazakanian was held in Shahe Hall. This event was sponsored by the Church's Cultural Committee. This Committee has always provided outstanding events for the Parish and should be commended for their efforts.

On Sunday, October 25, the Annual Church Stewardship Banquet was held. Rose Aznavorian, a long-standing Choir member and Sunday School administrator and teacher, was recipient of this year's "Man of the Year" Award. Rose, who had recently returned from Armenia where she helped train Sunday School teachers at the request of the Diocese, spoke of her trip and experiences. We were honored to have as Guest Celebrant, His Grace Bishop Houssig Bagdasian, who had just recently become the first American-born clergyman to be elevated to Bishop.

The Choir of our Church hosted the 46th Annual Assembly of the Armenian Church Choir Association on October 29-November 1. The Parish fully supported our Choir during their events. On Sunday, November 1, we were honored to have our Primate, His Grace Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, celebrate Badarak in our Church with the accompaniment of our Choir and many guest Choir members. The Women's Guild hosted a "farewell luncheon" for the Choir delegates, parishioners and friends.

The Parish Council supported outreach programs to the local community. On May 3, parishioners participated in Project Bread's "Walk for Hunger" to help raise money for this worthwhile cause. In the spirit of the Thanksgiving season, we sponsored a Food Drive to collect non-perishable food to be donated to the Cambridge Food Pantry for distribution to the local community. The recipients of the Parish's donations were very appreciative of our efforts.

The "Trinity Christmas Bazaar" was held on Friday, December 4, and Saturday, December 5. It was great to have Marilyn Takvorian and Karen Martin as Co-Chairmen this year. They did an outstanding job and thanks to the efforts of all the Bazaar volunteers and members of the Church-affiliated organizations, the Bazaar was very successful both financially and socially.

The Parish celebrated the Christmas season with its annual Christmas Concert on Sunday, December 13. Once again, the community filled the Church for the performance of traditional Christmas and Armenian works by the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra under the direction of Father Oshagan Minassian. On Sunday, December 20, the Sunday School presented its annual Christmas play after Church Services. The Parish Council hosted a reception for parishioners after the performance. On December 27, a "Sunday School Reunion Sunday" was held for all former Sunday School students and graduates.

This year, the Church-affiliated organizations unified their efforts to sponsor "First Night at Trinity", a New Year's Eve Dinner-Dance. It was held in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall and was a great success. We would like to thank the Committee, under the leadership of Bob Takvorian, Greg Tashjian, and Mark Sahagian, for a wonderful evening.

The maintenance of our Church complex continues to be of ongoing concern. In April, the underground fuel tank in the parking lot was removed and replaced with three smaller indoor tanks. The original lighting system for the Church dome had to be replaced. The Church sanctuary continues to be plagued by water leaks from underground water and heating pipes. In September, a committee met with Shooshanian Engineering Co. to review the situation and make recommendations. We were advised to repair the leaks as they occurred since they appear to be isolated incidences. The Parish Council will need to monitor this carefully.

Some other maintenance projects that were undertaken include: continuation of Church window glazing and painting; repair of Church carpeting following water problems; replacement of water heater in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall complex; replacement of water heater in the Parish House; new burner for Parish House, which was donated and installed by Craddock Heating (Juskalian Family); and refurbishment of third floor bathroom in Parish House.

The maintenance staff continues to deal with the many ongoing needs of a large and demanding complex.

In the future, we face a major undertaking of renovating the Parish House due to its age and the fact that very little has been done to date except what has been absolutely necessary.

Plaques were placed under the stained-glass windows in Church noting the title of the window, the donor's name and the name of the person in whose memory the window was donated. The Parish Council is happy to report that the Monument Committee has met and decided to purchase a khatchkar from Armenia as a monument to our martyrs. Initial communication has been made with Armenia to obtain a khatchkar to meet our specifications.

Mrs. Charles Talanian and family have fulfilled their commitment of \$400,000 for the refurbishment and naming of the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.

The Parish Council reviewed this year the position of Executive Director for our Church and found it to be a needed one. We are pleased with the leadership and performance of Nancy Kasarjian in this role and continue to look to her to oversee the maintenance of Church property, supervision of the Office and Custodial staff, and negotiation with outside contractors, under the direction of the Parish Council.

We would like to acknowledge our hardworking, capable and dedicated employees: Rose Mamishian, Administrative Assistant; Carol Krikorian, Secretary; Harvinder Jassal, Bookkeeper; Seta A. Buchter, Sunday School Superintendent; Paula Jurigian, Youth Director; and our Custodians, Ara Dermovses, William Serrano, and Krikor Demirciyan. Each person is vital in his/her separate

role and all work together to see that the Church and all its needs are met on a day-to-day basis.

According to the decision of the 1992 Parish Assembly, \$1,000 per month was allocated to the Pastor Emeritus, Reverend Father Papken Maksoudian, as a lifetime pension. On three separate occasions, this money was sent to him and each time he refused to accept it by returning it to the Church. Therefore, \$12,000 is not included in the 1993 Budget.

The Pastor and Parish Council wish to thank all the parishioners who serve as volunteers for the many activities held during the year and whose efforts, through the Church-affiliated organizations, support our Parish.


