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Minutes of Annual Parish Assembly Sunday, February 20, 1994

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was held on Sunday, February 20, 1994, following Church Services, in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall. One hundred twenty-five (125) members were present and one hundred eighteen (118) duespaying members cast their ballot.

The Assembly was called to order by George Haroutunian, Chairman of the Parish Council at 1:00 p.m.. He welcomed and thanked the parishioners for their attendance.

The Opening Prayer was offered by Reverend Father Mampre A. Kouzouian, Pastor, who asked those present to join with him in reciting the prayer in English and Armenian.

Donald Tellalian, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the slate for the day's Tivan, as follows:

Chairman: Aetna Tashjian and Albert Zouranjian

Additional nominations for Chairman of the Day were asked from the floor. Aetna Tashjian declined his nomination. There being no further nominations, a Motion was made and seconded Albert Zouranjian be elected Chairman of the Assembly. MOTION PASSED.

Recording Secretary: Carol Krikorian and Catherine Minassian

Additional nominations were asked from the floor. Carol Krikorian declined her nomination for Secretary. There being no further nominations, a Motion was made and seconded that Catherine Minassian be elected as Recording Secretary of the Assembly. MOTION PASSED.

Albert Zouranjian, in addressing the Assembly, thanked the members present on behalf of himself and Catherine Minassian for electing them Chairman and Secretary, respectively.

MINUTES OF THE 1993 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY

The chairman of the Assembly called for the reading of the Minutes of the 1993 Annual Assembly, by the Recording Secretary. The initial portion of the Minutes was read and the Assembly was directed to pages 2a thru 2f in the Annual Report to review the minutes. In light of the length of the minutes a motion was made and seconded to suspend with the reading of the 1993 Minutes and approve the Minutes as published in the Annual Report. MOTION PASSED.

Additional names for nominations for Auditing Committee were entertained from the floor. There being no further nominations a motion was made and seconded to close nominations for Auditing Committee. MOTION PASSED.

All of the nominees were brought forward by the Nominating Committee Chairman and introduced to the members present. There being no further nominations, the ballot box was opened at 1:30 p.m. for elections. There was a short recess in the proceedings for the purpose of voting.

The Chairman of the Day reconvened the Assembly at 1:55 p.m. and announced that the ballot box would be closed at 2:30 p.m.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1993

Father Mampre outlined the various parts of his report which included Church Services, Sacraments, Counseling, Pastoral Visitations, Meetings attended, Cultural & Educational Programs, Church Schools, Youth Ministry, Special Activities and Assistance to Armenia. The Pastor expressed his appreciation to the Church Office staff, the Parish Council and Parishioners for their support and dedication to Holy Trinity Church. Father Mampre then asked for any questions or comments in regard to his report.

PARISH COUNCIL ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR 1993

At this time Albert Zouranjian called upon George Haroutunian, the Parish Council Chairman to address any questions regarding the Parish Council Report. Highlights of the report were reviewed.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Pastor's Report and the Parish Council Report as published. MOTION PASSED.

PARISH COUNCIL FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 1993

The Chairman called upon Phyllis Martins, Treasurer of the Parish Council to address any questions regarding the yearly financial statements of the Parish Council. A question arose on how the committee of the Trust Fund was chosen. George Hagopian, Treasurer of the Trust Fund, answered that the Trustees of the Holy Trinity Trust Fund are elected by the Parish Council and presently include the Pastor, Dr. Michael Kolligian, Jr., Gerald Ajemian, Mrs. Deran Hintlian, himself, and the standing Parish Council Chairman and Treasurer, who purchase and sell the investments to obtain as high a yield as possible, with low

risk for the church. Parishioners are welcome to give their input to the Trustees on high yield, low risk funds.

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PROPOSED BUDGET FOR 1994

Phyllis Martins, Treasurer of the Parish Council, presented the proposed budget of \$498,000 for the year 1994. A motion was made and seconded to accept the 1994 proposed budget. MOTION PASSED.

The Chairman then called upon representatives of the various church organizations to comment on their reports. Charles Dermenjian gave the report from the Trinity Men's Union. Helen Donabedian gave the report from the Senior Women's Guild. She noted a correction that Evelyn Dermenjian was Assistant Treasurer from January-December and that Dirouhi Highgas was an Advisor. Karen Martin gave the report from the Women's Guild. Deacon Gregory Krikorian gave the report from the Choir. He noted that new members are needed for our church choir. This appears to be a problem throughout the Diocese. Diran Zahigian gave the report from the Armenian School.

The Chairman noted that the new Youth Director, Leanne Dagavarian, had been present earlier, but had to leave prior to giving the reports from the ACYOA Juniors and Seniors.

The Assembly thanked the Erevan Choral Group for their concert performances that were enjoyed not just within our church, but also within the community.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the reports of the Church Organizations, as corrected. MOTION PASSED.

OLD BUSINESS

Initial discussion under old business centered on parish data for membership statistics, and if there has been growth. A formal presentation was not available, but the pastor, office staff and volunteers have embarked on a program of personal calls to parishioners during the week to encourage attendance at church on Sundays. Also, the parish council has attempted an outreach to the community that does attend church. A motion was made and seconded to establish a committee to find ways and means to increase the membership of our church organizations and church attendance. MOTION PASSED.

Progress on the parish Martyr's Monument was discussed. The Monument Committee has decided on the use of an Armenian khatchkar and

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communication has taken place with Holy Etchmiadzin to coordinate the process of obtaining a khatchkar. However, the problems in Armenia and the unclear issue of transport to the United States have made this a lengthy process. The committee is still working on this project.

The question of the status of the Unity issue within the Diocese was raised. Father Mampre answered that he had recently met with a member of the Unity committee and it appears that there is a tentative agreement on a unified By-Laws that needs to still be presented to the respective Primates and Diocesan Councils. It does not appear that these By-Laws will be ready to be presented to the 1994 Diocesan Assembly, but perhaps the process could be complete by 1995.

Discussion was raised concerning how to proceed with the roughly \$11,000. that was being held in escrow as the church pension fund. A suggestion was made to donate the money to Armenia Relief. A motion was made and seconded to leave the funds designated as Holy Trinity Pension Fund in escrow and to establish a committee to present viable suggestions to the assembly on how the funds can be used. Discussion of the motion was called and the MOTION PASSED with a vote of 25 in favor and 24 opposed.

NEW BUSINESS

The issue of absentee ballots was discussed once again. It was stated that it is unconstitutional to accept absentee ballots, but anyone wishing to amend the By-Laws may introduce an amendment to the Parish Assembly.

A motion was made and seconded that no one person shall serve on the Parish Council, Nominating Committee, Auditing Committee or as Diocesan Delegate, simultaneously. Discussion was held and Article 14B of the Diocesan By-Laws was read and it was pointed out that this would have to be presented as a Diocesan By-Law Amendment for the Assembly to consider. The motion would miss the deadline for the 1994 Diocesan Assembly. Voting was held and the MOTION FAILED.

Pastor's 1994 Annual Report

I would like to present to you my 18th Annual Report. I want to thank God Almighty for granting me another year to serve Him and His flock at Holy Trinity Church. I also wish to thank all the members of our community for assisting me in carrying out my mission in this Parish.

1. Church Services

Church Services were conducted during the year according to the canons and rites of our Church. Church Services were conducted every Sunday with sermons in English and Armenian.

I want to mention and express my appreciation to the clergymen who celebrated the Divine Liturgy in our Church:

- March 6, Fr. Arsen Barsamian, Assistant Pastor of St. James Armenian Church, Watertown
- March 12, Fr. Dajad Davidian, Pastor of St. James Armenian Church, Watertown
- March 20, Fr. Carnig Hallajian of New Jersey

March 6, 12, and 20 were the weeks I was on vacation.

- May 1, Fr. Arsen Barsamian during my attendance at the Diocesan Assembly in Houston, TX
- May 22, Fr. Karekin Kasparian of St. James Armenian Church, Westchester, NY, celebrated the Divine Liturgy while I celebrated the Badarak at St. James.
- June 5, Fr. Carnig Hallajian
- July 10, Fr. Arsen Barsamian
- August 14, Fr. Carnig Hallajian. Also visiting were eight seminarians from the Diocesan of Yerevan who are receiving their theological education at the Seminary of Lake Sevan.
- October 30, our Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, celebrated the Divine Liturgy and ordained Deacon Alexan Kouzouian as a priest of the Armenian Church renaming him Father Vasken.
 - December 11, the newly-ordained Fr. Vasken celebrated his first Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon. On this occasion, Fr. Arten Ashjian of NY, and Fr. Carnig Hallajian of NJ, were present at the Church Service as mentors of the newly-ordained priest.

On several occasions, we held Family Services in our Church with the participation of the congregation.

It is my impression that more faithful attended Church Services this year than last year. However, there is room for improvement and I appeal to our community to attend Church Services with their family on a regular basis. Sunday mornings are occasions when we should come together to pray and praise God for His blessings.

2. Sacraments and Services

During 1994, the following sacraments and services were performed by the Pastor in our Church:

Baptisms: 7 Funerals: 24 Weddings: 10, plus three performed elsewhere Betrothal Service: 3

3. Counseling Services

During the year, I conducted the following counseling and conferences essions: Prior to Baptism - 4; Family issues - 9; Personal - 65; Parishioners seeking employment - 3; Pre-marital - 11; With other clergy - 4, for a total of 96.

4. Pastoral Visitations

During 1994, I made 294 pastoral visitations to the homes of our parishioners, to the sick in hospitals, to the elderly in our nursing homes (the Armenian Nursing Home in Jamaica Plain as well as others), to rehabilitation centers, and to hospice homes to pray and conduct services for our people. Thirty-five of these visitations were to Nursing Homes and rehabilitation centers. I also visited the cemeteries to bless the graves of loved ones, conducted one house blessing, and one blessing of a new factory.

5. Meetings

During the year, I participated and presided over 145 Parish-affiliated meetings. These included our Church organizations, their Executive Committees, and delegates and clergymen of the New England region.

6. Cultural and Educational Programs

- The monthly Dajar of our Church is considered one of the best parish publications of our Diocese. It serves to educate and inform our parishioners of our Church holidays and Parish and Diocesan events. I want to inform our parishioners that printing and mailing costs of the Dajar have become quite expensive. We appeal to our parishioners for their financial contribution in order that we may continue printing our monthly periodical. During the coming year, we may also combine more monthly issues.
- On March 9, 16, and 23, our ACYOA sponsored their Lenten dinner programs, followed by the *Peace and Rest Service* in Church.

- In April, we had students from Brown University visit our Church and interview our Pastor for their term paper on the history of the Armenian people and the Armenian Church.
- During the cultural month of October, we had a violin and piano concert in our Church on October 23, performed by Anastasia Khitruk and Elena Tutulian.
- On October 9, an "Explanation of the Divine Liturgy" was given to our faithful.
- On December 11, we held our traditional Christmas Concert performed by the Erevan Choral Society, augmented by their orchestra, and conducted by our Choir Director, Fr. Oshagan Minassian. We are pleased that our Church was filled to capacity with Armenians and non-Armenians who look forward to this annual concert.
- Every month at our Church-affiliated organizations' meetings, we conducted lectures and showed videos on different events pertaining to the Armenian people, Armenia, and the Armenian Church. These lectures were given by various individuals or by the Pastor.
- I conducted Bible study at the monthly meetings of the Senior Women's Guild. We also held weekly Bible Study from 10:30 a.m. 11:15 a.m., on Sunday mornings in the Parish House conducted by Gregory Tashjian.
- We provided scholarships for higher education to worthy and needy students from our Parish. The Church also awarded partial scholarships to our Sunday School students who attended St. Vartan Camp.

7. Our Schools

As you know, we have two schools within our Parish. The Armenian School has an enrollment of 16 students, some of whom are from Azerbaijan, and 2 teachers, Sarkis Kavlakian and Aida Diloyan. From January to June of last year, there had been a third instructor to teach songs, but that position was eliminated as of September. The Armenian School is held every Sunday, from 9:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m.

The Sunday School is under the superintendentship of Seta A. Buchter, with 102 students and 12 teachers. Sunday School meets every Sunday morning from 10:30 a.m. till noon.

We have a group of dedicated teachers, staff members, and parents who help us teach our language and our faith to our children. I would like to express my appreciation to the superintendent, teachers, and staff of our Armenian School and Sunday School and urge the members of our community to encourage both schools.

8. Youth Ministry

Leanne Dagavarian resigned from her position as Youth Director of our Parish and, since October 1, Fr. Vasken and his wife, Yeretzgin Arpi, have been working hard with our youth, both ACYOA members and young adults.

- Because of inclement weather, the ACYOA Poon Paregentan celebration had minimal attendance.
- During Lent, on three different occasions, the ACYOA sponsored Lenten Dinner/Programs, followed by the participation in the "Peace and Rest Service" in the Church.
- The ACYOA Palm Sunday Banquet was very successful. Over 200 parishioners attended to encourage us. Yeznig Balian, Executive Director of the Fund for Armenia Relief of our Diocese, was our Guest Speaker.
- On November 20, following Thanksgiving Family Service, the ACYOA hosted its annual Thanksgiving Luncheon.
- In December, Fr. Vasken and Yeretzgin Arpi and Antranig and Nancy Barsamian took our ACYOA Juniors to New York City to visit and enjoy the Christmas spirit of the city.

9. Special Activities and Events.

- Martyrs Day
 - On April 22, we had a Joint Service and Program at the State House.
- On April 24, we held a Requiem Service in our Church with the participation of Armenian clergy from the Greater Boston area, followed by a silent march to the Cambridge Common where a commemorative program took place. We wish to express our appreciation to the City Fathers of Cambridge and the Police Department for all the courtesies extended to us.
- On August 13 and 14, for the first time, we had eight seminarians visit our Church and spend a weekend in our Parish where they were exposed to the way and manner we conduct our Church affairs in the U.S.A. I want to thank all the parishioners and, especially, Gerry and Rosemarie Odabashian for the courtesies extended to our guest seminarians. On Sunday, on the Feast of the Assumption of the Holy Mother-of-God, the eight seminarians served at the Altar and conducted a program in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall where we held a Reception in their honor. I wish to thank all those parishioners who made monetary and other gifts to our guest students. We also wish to thank Walter and Ed Guleserian for making available to our Parish, eight folding beds for the seminarians.

- On August 13, we had an historic visit to Boston by the President and First Lady of Armenia. The Pastor and some of our parishioners were at the airport to greet President Levon Ter-Petrossian upon his arrival. That afternoon, the President spoke to the Armenian community at Belmont High School. In the evening, Senator Edward Kennedy tendered a Reception Dinner in honor of Armenia's President and his wife at the Kennedy Library. Our Pastor and his wife were guests of the Senator.
- On August 18, the Armenian Church lost its spiritual Father. His Holiness Vasken I, who had led the Armenian Church for the last 39 years as the Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, died in Yerevan. For 40 days the Armenian Church was in mourning during which time we cancelled all festive celebrations in our Parish. On this occasion, through the efforts of our Pastor, The Boston Globe published His Holiness' picture and an article on his life. Our Pastor was interviewed on Belmont Cable television, as well as by the Religious Editor of The Boston Globe regarding the newly-elected Locum Tenens of Holy Etchmiadzin, His Beatitude Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Patriarch of Jerusalem.
- On August 28, we conducted Hokehankisd for the soul of His Holiness, followed by the Blessing of the *Madagh* in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.
- On October 2, on the 40th day of the death of His Holiness Vasken I, we conducted a Special Requiem Service presided over by His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Law, Archbishop of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston, who also offered the eulogy. We were also pleased to have with us the Very Rev. Fr. Mesrob Semerjian of CT.

Martyrs Monument

In 1995, the Armenian people will commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the Genocide of our people. For the last 12 years, we have been planning to erect a monument dedicated to the memory of our two million martyrs. We were glad that during 1994, we were able to work on this worthwhile project and choose a replica of a 13th Century khatchkar from Goshavank in Armenia, which is the most beautiful khatchkar preserved. We have commissioned Vahram Hovagimian of Yerevan, Armenia, a well-known and respected sculptor/artist to reproduce this khatchkar for us. We are grateful to Albert Zouranjian who, on September 17, hosted a Reception at his home for a group of parishioners to raise funds for this noble project. The Khatchkar Committee, under the leadership of our Pastor, includes Albert Zouranjian, Chairman, and Diran Zahigian and Richard Zeytoonjian, Committee members. George W. Haroutunian, the Chairman of our Parish Council, also serves on this Committee.

We were pleased that by the end of 1994, we had raised \$45,000.00 toward our goal of \$50,000.00. We know that contributions from our parishioners will surpass that amount before the dedication of the monument which will take place on Sunday, April 23, 1995.

• On June 5, our Parish celebrated the 25th Anniversary of Rose Mamishian's service to our Church as Secretary and Administrative Assistant. Following the Divine Liturgy, a Garden Reception was held on our Church grounds with over 250 parishioners and friends in attendance. A program praising Rose for her dedicated services was held.

• Ordination of a Priest

Following his graduation from St. Vladimir and St. Nersess Seminaries and while awaiting to be ordained a priest of our Diocese, Deacon Alexan Kouzouian was assigned by our Diocesan Primate to serve his internship in our Parish, beginning September 1. On October 29-30, the Primate ordained Deacon Alexan in our Church and named him Father Vasken after the newly-deceased beloved Catholicos of All Armenians. Many clergymen, seminarians, and parishioners attended. Following his 40 days in seclusion at the Ouzoonian House in New York, Fr. Vasken has been working with us, particularly in the areas of Youth Ministry and with our Sunday School children. We appreciate his dedication and enthusiasm. Fr. Vasken has already been assigned to a Parish where he will begin his Pastoral duties in the spring of 1995.

· Daniel and Helene Dorian Honored

On Sunday, October 30, on the 33rd Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church and Fr. Vasken's Ordination Banquet, Daniel K. Dorian, our Diocesan Delegate, was honored with his wife, Helene, by receiving an Encyclical from His Holiness, the Catholicos of All Armenians, accompanied by the St. Nersess the Graceful Medal. These were presented to Mr. Dorian for his many years of devoted service and leadership to the Diocese of the Armenian Church and the Armenian people. On this occasion, the Primate also presented a gift to Helene Dorian for her leadership and dedication to the Diocese and the Holy Trinity Church as Chairman of the Women's Guild, the Parish Council, and the Women's Guild Central Council of the Diocese.

· Visit by the Vice President of Armenia

On December 7, the Vice President of Armenia, Gagik Haroutiunian, and the governing officials of the Parliament of the Republic of Karabagh, visited our Church. A public forum was held following a Requiem Service for the souls of all those who gave their lives during the 1988 earthquake in Armenia. The Vice President spoke on the "Armenia Fund" in Church to the many Armenians who had gathered from the Greater Boston area.

10. Assistance to Armenia

The Holy Trinity Church has tried in various ways to help Armenia and the students from Armenia who have come to the Greater Boston area. From January to July, we had as a guest in our Rectory, Dr. Kevork Idenian, a dentist studying modern dentistry at Tufts Medical School. Dr. Idenian was a guest on the intersession of our Primate.

In February, we tried to assist three Armenians who were in the Boston area looking for business connections with Armenia.

On March 10, Bishop Barkev Mardirosian, Primate of Karabagh, visited our Parish and spoke in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall about the events in Karabagh and the needs of our people. From that gathering and through my personal appeal to some parishioners, we were able to raise over \$35,000.00 for the needy people of Karabagh.

This year, we were able to send \$3,700.00, to the Seminary of Holy Etchmiadzin for the preparation of clergymen for the Armenian Church. We also sent monetary assistance to the Primates of the Dioceses of Gugark and Shirak. Our parishioners also assisted and contributed in various ways, either through the Diocese or other organizations.

11. Church Office

Our Church Office is open five days a week, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Under the capable leadership of Nancy D. Kasarjian, our Executive Director, and through the dedicated services of our employees, we continue to meet the needs of our parishioners and our Church-affiliated organizations.

I would like to express my deep appreciation to Nancy D. Kasarjian, Carol Krikorian, Rose Mamishian, Seta A. Buchter, and Marian Koumjian for their professionalism and dedication to our Church. My appreciation is extended to Harvinder Jassal, Ara Dermovsesian, and Hratch Diloyan for their unselfish devotion. I must publicly praise the capability and the total commitment of our employees to their work. I also wish to express my gratitude to the many volunteers who are called upon during the year for special projects and who come and assist the Church Office when needed.

12. Appreciation

I wish to publicly express my appreciation to our parishioners for their support and dedication to the Holy Trinity Church. I wish to thank Fr. Vasken for his youthful enthusiasm and dedication to the Armenian Church and our youth; to Fr. Oshagan Minassian, our Choir Director; George W. Haroutunian, Parish Council Chairman; the members of the Parish Council; our Diocesan

Delegates; the Board members of our Trust Fund; the teachers and staff of our Schools; our Deacons; the members of our Choir; the Altar Servers; our Organist; the Executive Members of our Church-affiliated organizations; and the many volunteers who come and work at Church affairs and functions, for their dedicated service to the Holy Trinity Church. May I also thank the benefactors of our Church through whose financial contributions we are able to undertake special projects within our Parish. May God grant you all good health and long life to serve our Lord and our people through our beloved Church of the Holy Trinity.

The 1994 Parish Council respectively submits the following Annual Report to the parishioners of the Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Greater Boston. As Trustees, our responsibility is to oversee the management of our Church Parish and the many activities it undertakes to sustain itself. Our involvement in these activities has shown us that our Parish is blessed in the fellowship of the Christian spirit.

This year was one of extreme emotions. Our hearts were saddened to learn of the death of His Holiness, Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, on August 18, following a long illness.

Following Deacon Alexan Kouzouian's graduation this past May from both St. Nersess and St. Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminaries in New York, we were pleased at the Primate's request that Deacon Alexan receive his pastoral internship at Holy Trinity. The Council arranged a reasonable compensation and benefits package during this interim period. Joy filled our Church on the weekend of October 29 and 30, when we witnessed the ordination to the Holy Order of Priesthood of our Pastor's son, Deacon Alexan, who was given the name Der Vasken.

A Special Assembly was held on September 18, at which the Parish House Renovation Committee made its presentation of the project scope, proposed contractor and projected cost. Presentations were also made regarding the planned sale of two parcels of land, one in Tewksbury, MA, owned by the Church, and the other in Volusia County, FL, jointly owned by the Church and Father Papken Maksoudian. The sale of these properties was approved by the Assembly, followed by final approval from the Diocese.

The Council analyzed the cost/benefit of replacing the old mimeograph machine in the Church Office with a copy printer. We purchased a new Gestetner copy printer, which has enabled us to reduce printing costs, increase the quality of work printed, increase efficiency and produce some materials inhouse which were previously subcontracted outside.

We continue to self audit our accounting practices throughout our Church bookkeeping systems and that of all the Church organizations to be assured of proper accounting methods. We will continue to work closely with our bookkeeper for suggestions and guidance. We regularly seek new resources to simplify and expedite our bookkeeping requirements.

Arthur Panosian provided the Council with an overview of the Church sound system and recommendations on how improvements can be made. These will be reviewed on a cost/benefit basis in 1995.

A special meeting of the Executive Committees from each Church organization was held on June 1. The purpose of the meeting was to exchange ideas and discuss methods of strengthening the organizations and increasing Church membership.

Under the guidance of Fr. Vasken and Yeretzgin Arpi Kouzouian, the ACYOA Juniors and the young couples of our Parish have experienced new growth and direction. The Council supports the many new activities for the youth of our Church and the involvement of more young adults. Father Vasken, through his education and experience, has been successfully working under our Pastor throughout the parish as well as with our youth to create a bond among them and with our Church. It has been gratifying to see the results of his endeavors especially with our youth as they build a relationship with each other and the Church. The Parish Council would like to recognize the special work being done by Yeretzgin Arpi in assisting Father Vasken, especially during his 40 days in seclusion following his ordination. Father Vasken and Yeretzgin Arpi will be reassigned in the spring. We take this opportunity to wish them much success and happiness in their new assignment.

The Church heating system has been tested and is being monitored. At this time, no leaks from the radiant heat system have been detected. A new boiler was installed in the Parish House to replace the warm-air furnace. Such replacement avoided a possible safety hazard. The Council also locked into a line fixed price for our heating oil requirements for the season as a means of controlling operating costs.

There were a number of personnel changes over the year. Leanne Dagavarian, Youth Director, resigned in September. Rose Mamishian recovered from her fall and returned to her position on a part-time basis. Marian Koumjian has been employed as a part-time office assistant. In July, Hratch Diloyan was employed as resident custodian working under Ara Dermovsesian in meeting the custodial needs of the Church and its grounds.

The Martyrs Monument Committee negotiated a contract with Vahram Hovagimian, a sculptor/artist from Armenia. The monument is being crafted in Armenia at this time and we look forward to its arrival at our Church once proper transportation is arranged.

We had a number of special visitors during the year. Bishop Barkev Mardirosian, Primate of the Diocese of Karabagh, visited the area on March 10. On April 24, a special Martyrs Day Commemoration program and service were held in our Church attended by the Armenian community, followed by a procession to Harvard Common where a solemn remembrance was held. On August 13, the President of the Republic of Armenia, Levon Ter-Petrossian visited the Armenian community of Greater Boston. Also on that weekend, we had eight seminarians from Lake Sevan, Diocese of Yerevan, visit our Parish. On Sunday, October 2, on the occasion of the 40 days' repose of soul service for His Holiness, Vasken I, we were honored with the presence of His Eminence, Archbishop Bernard Cardinal Law, from the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston, who delivered the eulogy.

Due to the efforts of so many of our parishioners who give so much of their time, our 1994 annual Church events were both financially and socially successful.

The Armenian School Banquet was held on January 23, and was well attended. The Council thanks those parishioners who support and encourage our Armenian School program.

We hosted three Lenten Dinners, on March 9, 16, and 23, which were followed by a Peace and Rest Service in Church.

The Annual ACYOA Banquet of our Church was held on Palm Sunday, March 27, with Simon Yeznig Balian, the Executive Director of the Fund for Armenian Relief of our Diocese, as Guest Speaker.

On June 5, the Pastor and Parish Council hosted a Garden Reception for Rose Mamishian in honor of her 25th anniversary of service to our Church.

On September 11, the Annual *Trinity Festival*, our Church picnic, was again held on the Church grounds. The festivities were subdued this year as we were

in a 40-day mourning period for His Holiness, Vasken I. Many thanks to Co-Chairmen John Kefeyan and Richard Surabian for a job well done.

The 14th Annual Oriental Rug Sale was held October 13-16. Though competition has increased, this event continues to be a viable fund-raising activity for the Parish. This year's Committee of Debra Stevens, Chairman; George D. Hagopian, George W. Haroutunian, Robert Proodian, the Church Office Staff, and many volunteers, should be congratulated on a job well done.

To celebrate Armenian Cultural Heritage Month, the talented Elena Tatulian, pianist, and Anastasia Khitruk, violinist, mother and daughter, respectively, performed in our Church on Sunday, October 23.

On October 30, over 400 parishioners and friends attended our Annual Banquet which celebrated the Ordination to the Priesthood of Deacon Alexan Kouzouian and the 33rd Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church/Stewardship Sunday, honored outgoing Parish Council members John Kefeyan, William Martin, and Phyllis Martins, and presented an Encyclical and St. Nersess the Graceful Medal to Daniel K. Dorian.

On November 21, the ACYOA Juniors held its Annual Thanksgiving Luncheon following Thanksgiving Family Service. It was well attended by both parishioners and the youth of our Church.

Under the Co-Chairmenship of Helen Krikorian and Nancy Young, the 1994 Trinity Christmas Bazaar realized one of its most successful years. Through the support of our parishioners, the Bazaar was almost a sell-out. The joy each volunteer conveyed was noticed and appreciated by those who attended. The Parish Council is grateful to all participants for their efforts and dedication.

Under the direction of Father Oshagan Minassian, the Erevan Choral Society led the celebration of the Christmas season with its annual Christmas Concert on Sunday, December 11.

The Friends of Holy Trinity 1000 Club continues to sell available numbers. We are grateful to the following members of the 1000 Club Committee - Richard Zeytoonjian, Arthur Avakian, John Kolligian, John Marsoobian, and Rocky Nigohosian, for donating their time at each month's drawing and at special events. Special thanks and appreciation are expressed to Teresa Marsoobian who efficiently handles the enormous bookkeeping tasks.

None of the above would have been possible without the hard work and dedication of so many parishioners. The Pastor and Parish Council extends its appreciation to all those who give freely of their valuable time to serve as volunteers for the many activities and organizations that meet the needs of our Church.

The Pastor and Parish Council wish to publicly acknowledge and express their appreciation to the Office staff for their professionalism and total dedication to their work and to Holy Trinity Church.
