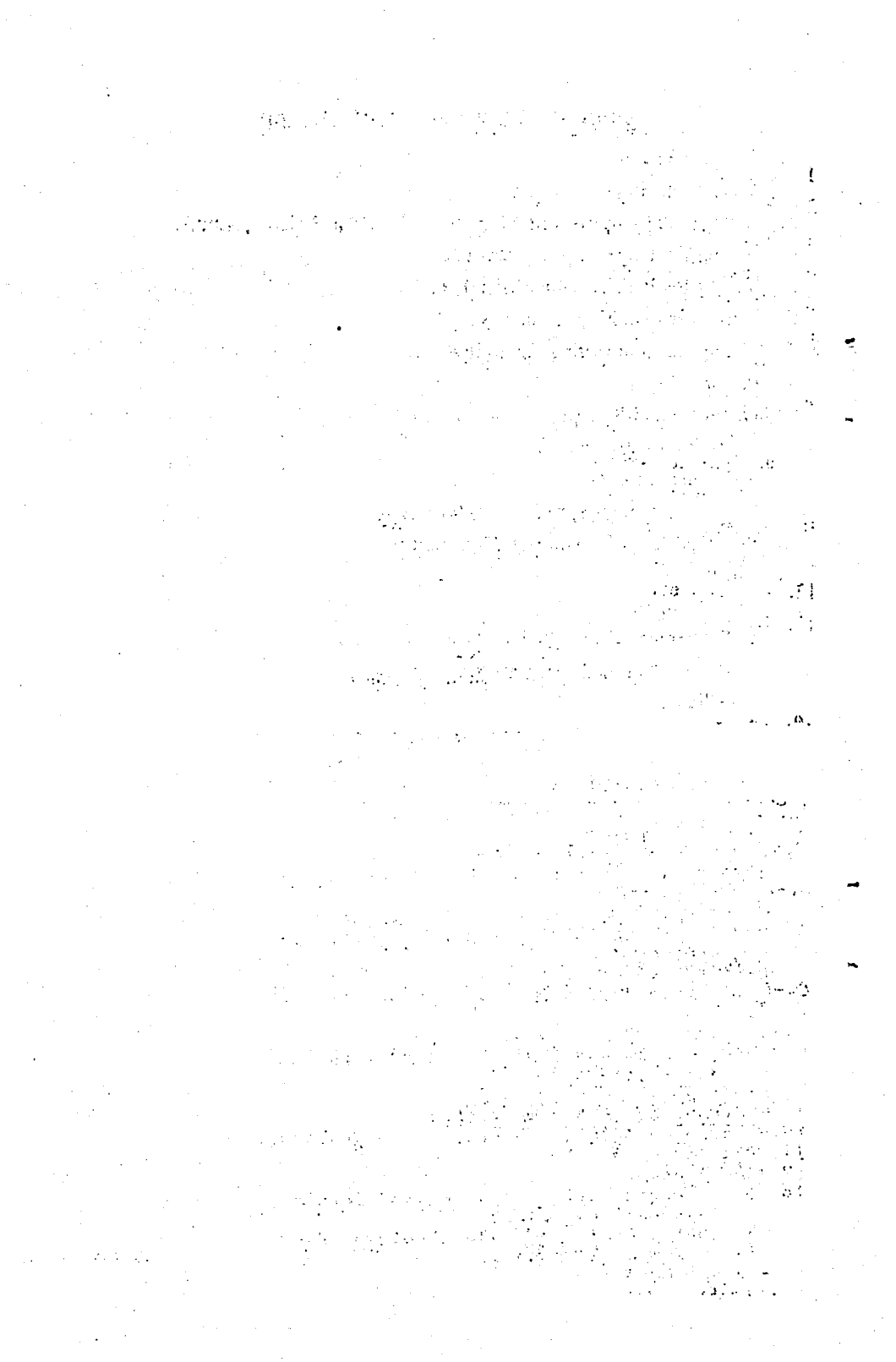

Minutes of Annual Parish Assembly Sunday, February 5, 1995

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Greater Boston was held on Sunday, February 5, 1995, following Church Services, in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall.

Due to inclement weather, a count was taken to make sure there was a quorum. There were ninety-five (95) members present, and ninety (90) ballots were cast.

The Assembly was called to order by George Haroutunian, Chairman of the Parish Council, at 12:55 p.m. He thanked the members who had made an effort to attend the meeting.

The opening prayer was offered by Reverend Father Mampre A. Kouzouian, Pastor, who asked those present to join with him in reciting the prayer in English and Armenian.

William Martin, the Chairman of the Nominating Committee presented the slate for the day's Tivan as follows:

Chairman: Aetna Tashjian and Albert Zouranjian

Additional nominations for Chairman of the Day were asked from the floor. Aetna Tashjian declined his nomination. Since there were no further nominations, a Motion was made and seconded for Albert Zouranjian to be elected Chairman of the Assembly. MOTION PASSED.

Recording Secretary: Catherine Minassian and
Julia Stephanian

Additional nominations were asked from the floor. Catherine Minassian declined her nomination for Secretary. There being no further nominations, a Motion was made and seconded that Julia Stephanian be elected as Recording Secretary of the Assembly. MOTION PASSED.

Albert Zouranjian, in addressing the Assembly, thanked the members present on behalf of himself and Julia Stephanian for electing them Chairman and Secretary respectively.

The Chairman of the Assembly asked if the Minutes to the 1994 Annual Assembly should be read, or if they would be accepted as presented. A Motion was made and seconded that the Minutes be accepted as they were printed in the Annual Report and mailed to the parishioners. MOTION PASSED.

William Martin, the Nominating Committee Chairman, was called upon to read the nominees for elective office as put forth by the Nominating Committee.

All of the nominees were brought forward by the Nominating Committee Chairman and introduced to the members of the Assembly. There being no further nominations, the ballot box was opened at 1:30 p.m. for elections. There was a short recess in the proceedings for the purpose of voting.

The Chairman of the Day reconvened the Assembly at 1:45 p.m. and announced that the ballot box would be closed at 2:30 p.m.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1994

Father Mampre outlined the various parts of his report which included Church Services, Sacraments, Counseling, Pastoral Visitations, Meetings attended, Cultural and Educational Programs, Church Schools, Youth Ministry,

Special Activities and Assistance to Armenia. The Pastor expressed his appreciation to the Church Office Staff, the Parish Council and Parishioners for their support and dedication to Holy Trinity Church.

Father Mampre reported that during the past two years the Parish Council has taken attendance during Sunday Services and that there has been an improvement in the attendance since 1993.

A delegation of six clergymen and eighteen laymen representing the Diocese of the Armenian Church were elected to go to Etchmiadzin. Father Mampre has been chosen as a delegate clergy to attend the meetings in Etchmiadzin to vote for a new Catholicos. He will be leaving the end of March and returning in April in time for Easter Services. He announced that Father Vasken has been named as Pastor of St. Mark Armenian Church in Springfield, MA and will be going there in April. However, Father Vasken will stay at Holy Trinity until Father Mampre's return.

Father Mampre also stressed that more help is needed in Armenia and we should do all we can to send it. Any members who would like to send gifts with him to Armenia should get in touch with him.

Father Mampre asked for any comments or questions on his report.

PARISH COUNCIL FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 1994

Al Zouranjian next called on George Haroutunian, Chairman of the Parish Council, to address any questions with regard to the Parish Council's Report.

George thanked the members of the Nominating Committee for their work in obtaining the slate of nominees for the various offices. he also brought to the Assembly's attention the fact that the Annual Report was printed in a smaller booklet, thus saving on the expense of reproducing the Report.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Pastor's Report and the Parish Council Report as published. MOTION PASSED.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the organizations' reports as recorded. MOTION PASSED.

OLD BUSINESS

Gregory Hintlian gave the financial report for 1994 and the budget for 1995. Since there were no questions, motion was made and seconded to accept the financial report and budget. MOTION PASSED.

He then gave a report of the Renovation Committee. The estimated expense of the renovation is \$288,000. The Committee has approached the Bank of Boston to obtain a construction loan. The amount of the loan would be about \$200,000. The present interest rate would be 10-1/4%, and would be for a term

of 25 years, payable after three years. Nothing has been finalized and more investigation is being conducted. Aetna Tashjian asked the legality of borrowing the money from the Trust Fund rather than the bank, thus avoiding the interest to the bank, and saving the Church that money. George Hagopian will look into this and report at a future time.

The 1000 Club will be one of the major fundraisers for the Renovation Project. All the members who have given their time and energy to the 1000 Club were thanked for their dedication.

Father Vasken gave a report on the many activities of the ACYOA Juniors and the young couples of the Church. They are planning meetings and trips to get the young people together and have gotten a very good response so far. Both Father Vasken and his wife, Arpi, were thanked for their hard work.

A question was brought up about the two pieces of property that were to be sold. A broker has sent a contract to sell the land. An appraisal is being sought and all the documents are in place. When the price is right, the sale of the property will be completed.

The next item discussed was the Martyr's Monument. Al Zouranjian introduced the sculptor, Vahram Hovagimian, who has started the project. The stone was selected and is in the shed behind the Church. To date, more than \$50,000 has been donated for the Monument. Rose Tufenkjian gave \$3,000 to bring the fund over the top. However, the additional money will be used in the upkeep of the Monument. It will be located to the right side of the walkway going toward the Church, facing the street. It will be 30 feet off the sidewalk, and 30 feet in from the walkway. The unveiling is scheduled for April 23, 1995. A discussion was held on the location of the Monument and motion was made and seconded to let the Committee decide on the proper location. MOTION PASSED.

Diran Zahigian was called upon to report on the Committee's decision for the \$11,000 that is being held in escrow in the Retirement Fund. Since the money had been refused by Reverend Papken Maksoudian, it was recommended that we put the money back into the General Fund. Motion was made and seconded to close the books on the \$11,000 and return it back to the General Fund. MOTION PASSED.


Congratulations were extended to those elected to the Parish Council and Nominating Committee.

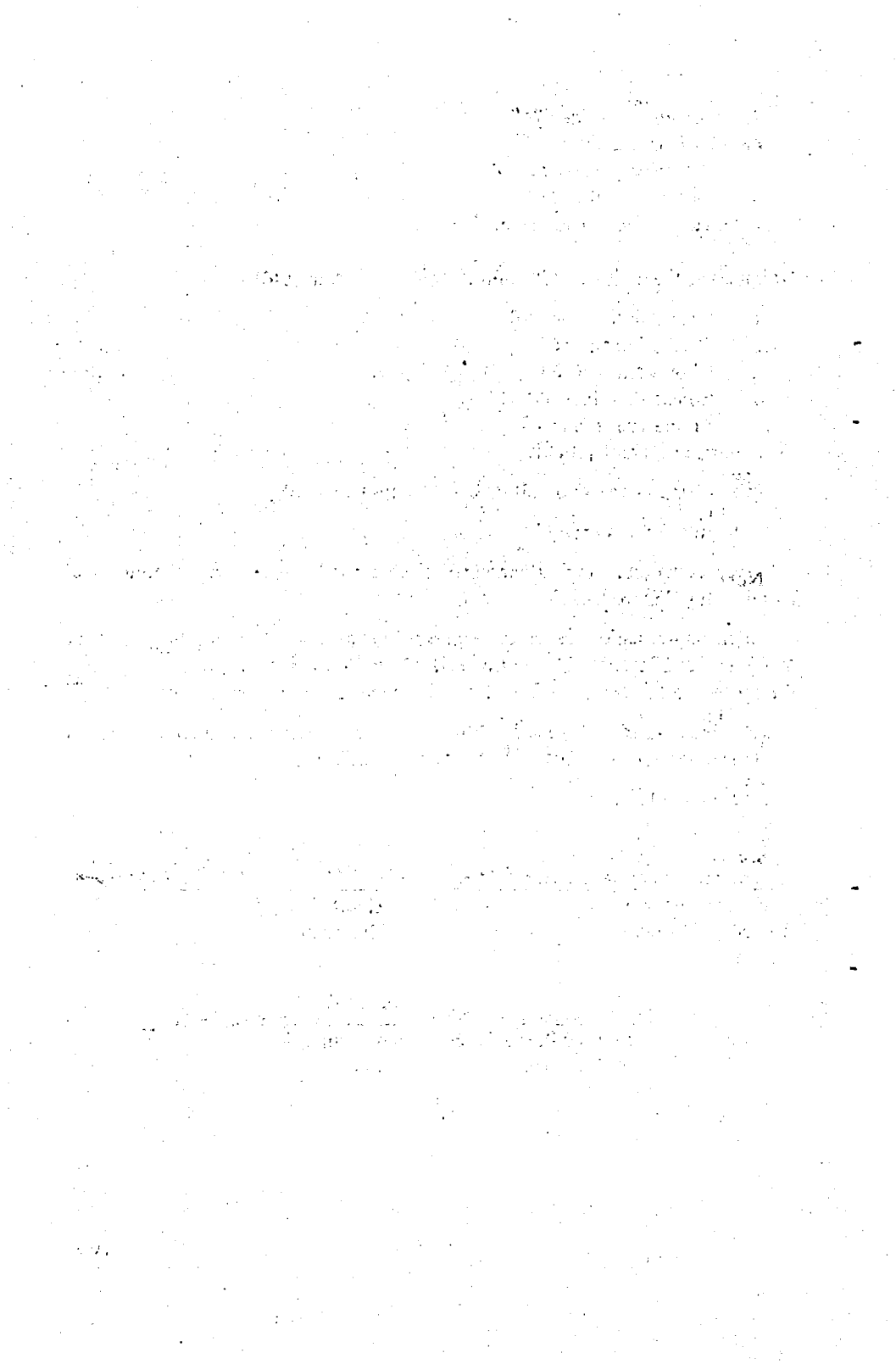

Pastor's 1995 Annual Report

I am presenting to you my 19th Annual Report as Pastor of the Holy Trinity Church. I would like to thank God Almighty for giving me the good health to serve Him and His flock of the Holy Trinity Church for another year. My appreciation and gratitude go to each and every member of our Church for your cooperation and support, and I pray that God may lead us together to serve Him.

- 1. Church Services

The Church is the center of our community life where we come together to praise His name and to receive His blessings. According to the canons and the rites of the Armenian Church, Church Services were conducted every Sunday and during holy days. Sermons were given in English and Armenian.

I want to express my appreciation, particularly to Father Vasken Kouzouian, who was my assistant from December 1994 to April 1995. In April, Father Vasken was assigned to his own Parish of St. Mark in Springfield, MA. On behalf of our parishioners, we thank Father Vasken and his Yeretzhin, Arpi, for their youthful dedication to our Church and to our young people. May God guide Father Vasken in his path to serve Him and our people for many years to come.

During this year, the following clergymen celebrated the Divine Liturgy in our Church:

- November 5, Father Arsen Barsamian of St. James Armenian Church, Watertown
- November 12, His Grace Bishop Houssig Bagdasian of St. James Armenian Monastery in Jerusalem.

The following clergymen visited our Church during the year:

- March 22, Archbishop Zaven Chinchinian, Primate of the Diocese of Egypt, accompanied by Fathers Arnak Kasparian and Carnig Hallajian
- May 9 and 10, the Very Rev. Fr. Jirair Tashjian of Paris, France
- June 7, Archbishop Shahan Sivadjian of Constantinople
- August 3, the Very Rev. Fr. Yezras Nercessian of St. Petersburg, Russia
- October 25, Fr. Mesrob Aramian of Yerevan
- November 14-17, Archbishop Houssig Santourian, the Canon Sacrist of the Cathedral of Holy Etchmiadzin, was a guest in our Parish. At the Women's Guild meeting, Archbishop Santourian spoke about Etchmiadzin.

• November 16, Archbishop Kude Nakashian, Primate of Paris, France, accompanied by Fr. Carnig Hallajian. Archbishop Nakashian spoke at the Senior Women's Guild Luncheon/Meeting.

On various occasions, I conducted services for our children speaking to them about Feast Days, and administering Holy Communion. Church Services were also conducted on various occasions for the Senior Women's Guild whose members received Holy Communion as a group. During Holy Week, I conducted services according to the calendar of the Armenian Church. On different occasions, I also held Family Services in our Church with the active participation of the faithful.

I want to express my appreciation to the Very Rev. Fr. Oshagan Minassian, Choir Director of our Church, as well as to our Deacons, Altar servers, Choir members, and organist for their assistance and devotion to our Church.

As I have stated in my previous reports, it is important that on Sunday mornings we come together in our spiritual home as members of one large family of Christ to worship together, to thank God Almighty for His blessings, to renew our commitment to Him, and to be strengthened by Him. It is essential that our parishioners attend Church Services on Sunday mornings.

2. Sacraments and Services

During 1995, I performed the following sacraments and services in our Church:

Baptisms: 21	Funerals: 29
Weddings: 11	Betrothal Service: 1

3. Counseling Services

The following counseling services and conferences were held by me during this past year: pre-marital counseling - 13; personal & family counseling - 11; pre-Baptismal counseling - 1; and 80 conferences for various purposes.

4. Pastoral Visitations

During 1995, I made 258 pastoral visitations to hospitals, nursing homes, homes of our parishioners, rehabilitation centers, and hospices. I also visited cemeteries for grave blessings. During these visitations, I prayed for the sick; I gave them hope and courage and took the message of the Gospels to our people. On different occasions, I shared the joy and happiness of our families and, at other times, I shared their loss and their sorrow.

5. Meetings

During the year, I participated and presided at 185 Parish-affiliated meetings which included our Church organizations, their Executive Committees, and Standing Committees. I also had meetings with our delegates, joint meetings with the New England Regional Council, and with clergymen of New England.

6. Cultural and Educational Programs

During the monthly meetings of our Church-affiliated organizations, I spoke to them on different subjects as the need arose:

- February 13, prior to the National Ecclesiastical Assembly, I spoke to the Trinity Men's Union members on how the Armenian Church has elected the Catholicos of All Armenians throughout the centuries. At subsequent TMU meetings, I spoke on the prevailing conditions in Armenia that I had seen during my visit in April and showed the video on the election and enthronement of the Catholicos of All Armenians, giving explanations.

- April 18, at the Women's Guild meeting, I spoke about the National Ecclesiastical Assembly held in Etchmiadzin.

- During the monthly meetings of the Senior Women's Guild, I conducted Bible study for their members.

- Bible Study was also conducted Sunday mornings, in the Parish House, from 10:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m., with Greg Tashjian serving as its leader.

- During the Lenten season, the ACYOA Seniors sponsored three Lenten Dinner/Programs which were followed by a Lenten Service in Church. On March 22, Archbishop Zaven Chinchinian of Cairo, Egypt, Fr. Arnak Kasparian, and Fr. Carnig Hallajian participated at the Lenten Dinner/Program. Also, a lecture and discussion on "The Sanctity of Life and Abortion," by Rev. Dr. Stanley Harakis was held on March 30.

- April 23, on the 80th Anniversary of the Genocide, a memorial concert was held in our Church with the participation of the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra under the direction of the Very Rev. Fr. Oshagan Minassian.

- On December 10, our traditional Christmas Concert was held in our Church with Father Oshagan Minassian conducting the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra.

- The *Dajar* monthly publication of our Church was regularly printed and distributed to over 1,500 families. The *Dajar*, which contains both educational and informative articles, is known in the Diocese as one of the best Church news publications.

- We provided scholarships for higher education to worthy and needy students of our Parish. Scholarships were also given to Sunday School students who attended St. Vartan Camp.

7. Our Schools

Our Parish has both a Sunday School and an Armenian School which provide Christian education and teaches Armenian culture to our children.

The Armenian School is held every Sunday, from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m., and has an enrollment of 17 students with two teachers, Sarkis Kavlakian and Aida Diloyan. I wish to express my appreciation to the Armenian School teachers and to the Board members.

The Sunday School, with an enrollment of 113, has a dedicated teaching staff of 20 who teach religion, culture and history to our children. Classes are held every Sunday from 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon. The Superintendent of our Sunday School is Seta A. Buchter. I want to express my appreciation to Seta for the enthusiasm and leadership she gives to her teachers and Sunday School students. My gratitude, also, to the teachers and the staff of the Sunday School for their dedication and devotion to our children.

8. Youth Ministry

Until April 1995, Father Vasken was in charge of the Youth Ministry in our Parish. I am happy to inform you that he had created a good rapport with our youth and young adults. He won their love and trust as well as that of their parents. Since Father Vasken's assignment to his own Parish, Seta A. Buchter, our Sunday School Superintendent, and Catherine Minassian, a member of the Parish Council, are voluntarily serving as Advisors to the ACYOA Juniors. They have helped with meetings and functions the youth have undertaken guiding them as need be. I have also been present at a portion of the ACYOA meetings and activities.

- As in the previous years, the ACYOA held their Poon Paregentan celebration.

- During Lent, the ACYOA Seniors sponsored three Lenten Dinner/Programs followed by the "Peace and Rest Service" in our Church.

- On Palm Sunday, the ACYOA held their Palm Sunday Banquet and Program.

- On November 19, the ACYOA Juniors sponsored a Thanksgiving Luncheon.

- During the Christmas season, the ACYOA Juniors held a dance for

ACYOA Junior members in the New England Region.

We continue to look to fill the part-time position of Youth Director for our Parish. Candidates who have been interested are looking for a full-time position.

9. Election of Catholicos

On January 14, with our Diocesan Delegates, I participated in the Special Diocesan Assembly to elect 24 delegates to represent the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America at the National Ecclesiastical Assembly in Etchmiadzin. The Special Diocesan Assembly elected 18 lay delegates and 6 clergymen to represent our Diocese; I was one of the six priests elected.

On March 28, I travelled to Etchmiadzin to take part in the deliberations of the National Ecclesiastical Assembly and to elect the Catholicos of All Armenians.

I actively participated in the Assembly and took part in the election and enthronement of the Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians. His Holiness Karekin II of the Catholicate of the Cilician See was elected as Catholicos of All Armenians. On behalf of our Church, we wish to congratulate His Holiness and wish him a healthy, long life to guide the Armenian Church.

I returned to our Parish on April 12, Holy Wednesday, to conduct Holy Week Services in our Church. During my absence, Father Vasken took care of the needs of our Church.

10. Assistance to Armenia

While I was in Armenia to take part in the elections of the Catholicos of All Armenians, I was able to distribute monetary gifts to various institutions and needy individuals through the generosity of our parishioners. On my return, I gave a full report of the financial distributions that I made in Armenia which was printed in the June/July 1995 issue of the *Dajar*.

I am glad that through the initiative and leadership of one of our delegates, Aetna Tashjian, and his wife, Araksie, we are raising funds in our Parish to purchase a generator for an orphanage in the Dilijan region of the Diocese of Gougark. This gift to the children of Armenia will be channeled through our Diocesan Fund for Armenian Relief (FAR).

We also contributed \$3,400.00 to the Seminary of Holy Etchmiadzin for the preparation of clergy for the Armenian Church.

11. Dedication of Khatchkar

On Sunday, April 23, on the 80th Anniversary of the Genocide of our

people, we unveiled and dedicated the beautiful khatchkar, that graces the entrance of our Church, to our two million martyrs. The dufa stone was brought from Armenia and carved by the master artist-sculptor, Vahram Hovagimian. The khatchkar is a replica of a 13th century khatchkar. I wish to express my appreciation to the Chairman of the Monument Committee, Albert Zouranjian, the members of the Committee, Diran A. Zahigian, Richard Zeytoonjian, and George W. Haroutunian, and to all those who contributed towards this project to make it a reality.

12. 80th Anniversary of the Genocide

On Sunday, April 23, after the unveiling of our khatchkar, a silent march, in memory of the martyrs, started in front of our Church, with the participation of 1,000 Armenians. In the evening, a commemorative program was held in our Church with our guest speaker, Dr. Gregory H. Adamian, Chancellor of Bentley College. The Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra, under the direction of Father Oshagan Minassian, presented a memorial concert which was preceded by a Requiem Service.

13. Special Events

- Senior Women's Guild - On September 24, our Senior Women's Guild celebrated the 90th Anniversary of its founding. A special booklet, printed for this occasion, was distributed at the Banquet and Program that took place in the Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall. Our appreciation to the Chairman of the Senior Women's Guild, Helen Donabedian, for her devotion and leadership. Our Senior Women's Guild is one of the oldest organizations in the Armenian community of Greater Boston.

- "Man of the Year" Banquet - On October 22, at the Annual Banquet of our Church, Diran A. Zahigian was honored as "Man of the Year". Diran, a former Parish Council member and Diocesan Delegate, with his wife, Zabelle, have worked very hard and for many years for the betterment of our Parish. We congratulate Diran and Zabelle on this occasion.

- Mrs. Deran S. Hintlian and Mrs. Charles Talanian Honored - On November 17, at a private dinner/reception, His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, our Primate, presented the St. Gregory the Illuminator Medal and a Pontifical Encyclical issued by His Holiness Karekin I to Mrs. Hintlian and Mrs. Talanian for their generous contributions and benevolence to the Armenian Church. We congratulate the recipients and wish them a healthy, long life.

- Restoration of the Parish House - As you know, the restoration of the exterior of our Parish House took place during this year. It was a necessary project which was undertaken by our Parish. I want to thank the Committee for

its dedication to this project. I also wish to thank all the parishioners who have generously contributed towards our fund-raising. We still owe a considerable amount to the bank and I trust that our parishioners will generously contribute to pay our outstanding loan. I want to express my special appreciation to Steven Panosian, the contractor for this project, and to Edmond J. Danielson, the architect who advised our Committee.

14. Church Office

Under the capable leadership of Nancy D. Kasarjian, our Executive Director, and through the dedicated services of our employees, our Church Office, open Monday-Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., continues to meet the needs of our parishioners and our Church-affiliated organizations.

I would like to express my deep appreciation to Nancy D. Kasarjian, Carol Krikorian, Rose Mamishian, Seta A. Buchter, and Marian Koumjian for their professionalism and dedication to our Church. My appreciation is extended to Harvinder Jassal, Ara Dermovsesian, and Hratch Diloyan for their unselfish devotion. I must publicly praise the capability and the total commitment of our employees to their work. I also wish to express my gratitude to the many volunteers who are called upon during the year for special projects and who come and assist the Church Office when needed.

15. Appreciation

I wish to publicly express my appreciation to our parishioners for their support and dedication to Holy Trinity Church. I wish to thank George W. The 1995 Parish Council respectively submits the following Annual Report to the parishioners of Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Greater Boston. As Trustees, our responsibility is to oversee the management of our Church Parish and the many activities it undertakes to sustain itself. Our involvement in these activities has shown us that our Parish is blessed in the fellowship of the Christian spirit.

This was truly a year of change and hope. The most significant event was the election of our new Catholicos, His Holiness Karekin I. Der Mampre, as a delegate, actively participated in this event by being present in Armenia in early April when the nomination and final election were held. We pray the theme of His Holiness' visit to the United States of "A New Era - Church, Youth, Community," becomes a reality in all respects.

Our Parish was blessed with Der Vasken Kouzouian and his wife, Arpi, spending time with us, in training, while awaiting a permanent assignment to St. Mark Armenian Church in Springfield, MA. While they were with us, our youth organizations flourished with religious and social events. It is now the responsibility of all of us to maintain the momentum and encourage and support our Parish youth. We hope and pray for God's guidance as Der Vasken and Arpi not only grow in their faith, but their marriage as well.

This was also a year of giving as our parishioners reached deep into their hearts and pockets to make special contributions for the Khatchkar memorial, in honor of our martyrs who lost their lives in the 1915 Genocide, and the ongoing

Parish House Restoration project. This united effort is a true indication of the strength of our Parish. As we age, so does our Church and the years ahead will again need the help of all parishioners for additional major projects to include: repair of chronic Church dome problems, the inside restoration of the Parish House, upgrading the Church's heating system, improvements to Shahe Hall, and replacement of tiles and carpeting inside the Church, to name but a few.

We thank the Khatchkar Committee, consisting of Chairman, Albert Zouranjian, George W. Haroutunian, Diran Zahigian, and Richard Zeytoonjian. We all enjoyed watching the sculptor, Vahram Hovagimian, complete the carving on the Church grounds and had great pride on April 23, on the 80th Anniversary of the Genocide, the day of its dedication. It now rests as a silent but strong reminder of man's inhumanity to man as close to two million relatives died innocently at the hands of Ottoman Turks.

Our Parish House is located in the Cambridge Historical District. As such, we are required to comply with original design criteria in any exterior work we do to the Parish House. This requires painstaking effort and a dedication to quality which were displayed by the Restoration Committee, consisting of Gerald Boghosian, Sarkis Boghosian, George W. Haroutunian, Gregory Hintlian, Dr. Michael Kolligian, Jr., William H. Martin, and Albert Zouranjian. Under the guidance of our architect, Edmond J. Danielson, and contractor, Steven Panosian, the Parish House Exterior Restoration is complete and perfect. Greg Hintlian was instrumental in securing the required bank financing of \$200,000 for the project and, also, organized a golf outing, the income from which was used for the restoration project. The Council expresses its appreciation to each member of the team and thanks all those parishioners who have either made direct contributions or purchased the special 1000 Club tickets.

The annual Church events held in 1995 were all enjoyable:

The Couples' Club held a Valentine's Day party which was attended by 80 members. Mark and Karen Sahagian, who have led the Club for years, passed the responsibility onto new co-chairmen, Jack and Judy Bichajian and Dan and Lisa Dorian.

On April 9, the ACYOA held their Palm Sunday Dinner. The late John Soursourian was honored for his 49 years affiliation with the ACYOA.

On September 10, our Annual Trinity Festival was held on the Church grounds. The Committee, chaired by John Kefeyan, served our traditional Armenian foods with tables set up outside between Johnson Hall and the Parish House. The weather was beautiful and everyone enjoyed being outdoors with friends and family. The Charles and Nevart Talanian Cultural Hall was available for those who wanted to dance to the great music of the Hye Echoes.

Under the guidance of Deacon Gregory Krikorian and with the cooperation

of Sunday School Superintendent, Seta A. Buchter, over 20 Sunday School students are participating in a Junior Choir program. It is a joy to hear these children's voices when, on occasion, they join our Choir in Church on Sundays.

Our Fifteenth Anniversary Oriental Rug Sale was held October 12-15. The Council expresses its appreciation to Chairman Joyce Martin Jones and all volunteers.

On Sunday, October 20, the Annual Church Stewardship Banquet was held, celebrating the 34th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church. Diran A. Zahigian, a long-standing member of the Church, was recipient of this year's "Man of the Year" award.

The ACYOA Juniors held their Annual Thanksgiving luncheon with all the traditional trimmings on November 19.

The "Trinity Christmas Bazaar" was held Friday, December 1, and Saturday, December 2. It was great to have Helen Krikorian, Roxy Antriassian, and Shirley Spencer chair this year's event. They and the many volunteers who, throughout the year give freely of their time, did an outstanding job making the Bazaar a success, both financially and socially.

The Parish celebrated the Christmas season with its annual Christmas Concert, Sunday, December 10. Once again, the community filled the Church for the performance of traditional Christmas and Armenian works by the Erevan Choral Society and Orchestra under the direction of Father Oshagan Minassian.

The maintenance of the Church complex continues to be the ongoing effort of the Building and Grounds Committee. The leak in the main dome, repairs to the concrete facade at the base of the Church, upgrades and repairs to our heating system, and drainage problems in the parking lot are among the projects being addressed.

The following also occurred during the past year:

- A continuation of our outreach program with our various Church organizations, as the Council met with the Tivans of each organization to discuss a number of issues to include: ways to increase membership, youth attendance, financing, and other pertinent items.

- The purchase of two new computers, with increased speed, expanded memory and a multitude of software packages, has enabled us to: (1) increase the quality of materials produced in-house; (2) produce some materials in-house which were previously subcontracted outside; and (3) meet the expanding needs of the parish as it undertakes additional special projects.

- The purchase and installation of a new Church software program and input of all data.

- The purchase of a water-filtering system for the main kitchen in Church complex.

We would like to acknowledge and appreciate the hard-working people in the service of our Church; namely, our Executive Director, Nancy D. Kasarjian, for her capable leadership; Carol Krikorian, Secretary and *Dajar* Coordinator; Seta A. Buchter, Sunday School Superintendent & Office Associate; Rose Mamishian, Administrative Assistant; Marian Koumjian, Office Assistant; Harvinder Jassal, Bookkeeper; Ara Dermovsesian, Head Custodian; and Hratch Diloyan, Resident Custodian, for their professional hard work, above and beyond the call of duty. Each person is vital in his/her separate role and all work together to see that the Church and all its needs are met on a day-to-day basis.

The Pastor and Parish Council thank all the parishioners who serve as volunteers for the many activities held during the year and whose efforts, through the Church-affiliated organizations, support our Parish.
