DIOCESAN DELEGATE'S REPORT

The 85th Annual Assembly of the lastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America convened on May 7-9 at St. Mark Armenian Church in Springfield, Mass.

Father Untzag Nalbandian and Dr. Berdj Harabedian represented the Holy Ascension Armenian Church of Trumbull, Ct.

In his address to the delegates, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian pointed out that there were three specific areas which would be the focus of the conference.

- 1) the needs for a greater number of priests and assistant priests
- 2) the Armenian church must deal with various major threats to family life, which is the foundation of a healthy Christian society
- 3) Armenian general education is the means to teach our children the Christian values of our people

The delegates were also informed about a new outreach program of hospitality called "My Kinsman", for our college students living away from home.

The Assembly approved the report of the Diocesan Council and the 1987-1988 budget. The proposed budget is \$1,966,000.00.

The issue of unity was discussed and the Assembly reaffirmed the guidelines for the unification of the Armenian Church of America adopted in 1982.

At the conclusion of the assembly, the Diocesan banquet took place at the Springfield Marriott. The presentation of "Friend of the Armenians" award to the Hon. Micael S. Dukakis was made by his Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian.

The presentation of "Armenian of the Year" was awarded to the late Mrs. Alice Kavookjian.

The final address and benediction were given by the Primate.

The 86th annual assembly will be held in Boston, Mass. on May 12-15.

The Armenian Language School Report for calender year 1987

I am very pleased to report that the Armenian Language School is open and is functioning very successfully, thanks to Derhayr, the teachers, the students, the parents, the Parish Council and the church community in general.

The Armenian Language School, during the '86 - '87 academic year had six classes with twenty one students under the guidance of superintendent and teacher Marie Yapoujian, along with the help of the following teachers: Maria and Samuel Agulian, Yeretzgin Seta Nalbandian, Antranig and Rita Chaghatzbanian, Lisa Misakian, Salpi Tokatlian, Arsha Khachadourian and Virginia Kalfayan.

Besides the classroom activities, the year will be remembered by the Vartanantz play which the students presented on February 22nd., and in which every student had a part to perform. The show was produced and directed by Maria Agulian. The costumes were prepared by the parents and teachers of the Armenian school. This performance was an unforgettable experience for the children as they learned about the Armenian history during the fourth and fifth centuries by performing the parts of the important Armenian figures of that time and realized how Christianity played an important role in the preservation of the Armenian nation.

The '86 - '87 academic year ended with a closing "Hantess" on June 12, 1987. The text was conceived by Lisa Misakian and the Armenian touches were added on by Maria Agulian. Once again the students, the teachers and the parents were all involved to insure the success of this event. The show was about current television programs presented in Armenian. This was a good opportunity for the students to realize that Armenian is not an out dated language, but that it could be as useful and interesting as we learn how to use it.

The '86 - '87 school year was a big success, as it was the first year in which we had so many students in 6 classes. The superintendent and the teachers all worked very hard to make it a memorable year.

Salpi Tokatlian was elected as the new superintendent of the Armenian Language School for the academic year '87 - '88. Maria Agulian and Salpi Tokatlian spent many hours in developing and modifing the curriculum provided by the Armenian Language Lab of the Diocese to better suit each of our classes. / Con'd ... The purpose of the Armenian Language School is to introduce the children to our heritage, teach them how to read, write and speak Armenian, and above all else to arouse the Armenian Spirit in them. While all these are not easily achieved, we feel whatever is accomplished will help our future generations. Thanks to all the students, the parents, Derhayr, and the church community for supporting and giving us the opportunity to accomplish this task.

We would also like to thank Derhayr and the Parish Council for assigning the room next to the kitchen to the Armenian Language School. As the number of students and the number of classes increase, we find the need for new classrooms and learning enviornments necessary, as some of the classes end up in the hallways, or in the areas behind the alter where the physical facilities do not enhance learning.

A special thanks to all the teachers without whose dedication we would not have a school; and in particular to Maria Agulian who gave so much of herself in time and effort to make the Armenian Language School as exciting and progressive as it is now.
