Dear Mr. Jones,

The year 2001 will mark the 1700th Anniversary of the Conversion of Armenia to Christianity. The Diocese of the Armenian Church of America is planning a Diocesan-wide celebration, which will begin with a very exciting and visually impressive Opening Ceremony.

At the stroke of midnight on December 31, 2000 – New Year's Eve – the Catholicos of All Armenians, His Holiness Karekin II, will light a torch at Khor Virab in Armenia: site of St. Gregory the Enlightener's imprisonment. The Catholicos will then travel in procession to Holy Etchmiadzin, where he will light a lantern on the Altar of Descent.

Around His Holiness will be the diocesan primates of the worldwide Armenian Church, each accompanied by a pair of youth representatives from their own diocese. After lighting the lantern with the flame from Khor Virab, His Holiness will light a similar lantern for each diocese; these in turn will be transported back to the various home dioceses by the primates and their youth representatives.

The idea is to have the symbolic "light of St. Gregory" passed from the source of our faith and heritage – Holy Etchmiadzin – to each diocesan center, and finally to every local Armenian parish and home, to inaugurate the 1700th jubilee year. In our own Diocese, the opening ceremony will take place on Saturday, January 6, 2001 at New York's St. Vartan Cathedral.

My request to you is to provide my office with the procedure we need to follow to allow me to bring this lit flame from Armenia to New York. I will be traveling on a commercial airline and I was informed that we should apply to the Department of Transportation for a special dispensation to allow me to carry this flame on the airplane. As I was also informed, such a special dispensation was last granted for the Olympic flame to be brought to Atlanta. We would also need information on where we can obtain the special container in which I can carry the flame.

As time is of the essence, I would appreciate your assistance as soon as possible.

We must all remember that the 1700th Anniversary is not just a ceremonial occasion. It is an unprecedendant and unrepeatable time of grace and calling in each and every one of our lives.

In the Footsteps of St. Gregory the Enlightener From Caesarea to Etchmiadzin June 4 to June 18, 2001

On the occasion of the 1700 Anniversary Celebration of the adoption of Christianity as the religion of the state, and at the invitation of His Beatitude Archbishop Mesrob Mutafyan, Armenian Patriarch of Istanbul, the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America plans to organize a pilgrimage in June, 2001.

This pilgrimage, entitled "In the Footsteps of St. Gregory the Enlightener: From Caesarea to Etchmiadzin" will take the participants on the journey of St. Gregory from his birthplace in Cappadocea to Etchmiadzin where became the first Catholicos of All Armenians.

It is scheduled to take place from June 3 to June 19, 2001 per attached itinerary. These dates are basically fixed as they involve participation in the celebration of the 1700th anniversary of Christianity in Armenia which takes place on June 17, 2001 in Etchmiadzin, which is also the day of remembrance of St. Gregory.

The plan is for 600 to 1,000 persons to participate, all doing this trip in unison (breaking the pilgrimage into smaller groups that come one after the other is *not* an option).

Following the visit to Kayseri (Caesarea), the group will divide into 4 subgroups, each to visit that part of the country from which their ancestors came, as follows:

- A. Adana, Tarsus, Mersin, Iskanderun, & Sis.
- B. Aintab, Marash, Kilis, Zeitun & Urfa
- C. Sebastia, Yozgat, Tokat, & Amasia.
- D. Malatia, Kharput, Arabgir, Diarbekir, Mush & Van

Some of the details as to the towns to be visited by each group is subject to adjustment.

In the Footsteps of St. Gregory the Enlightener From Caesarea to Etchmiadzin June 4 to June 18, 2001

On the occasion of the 1700 Anniversary Celebration of the adoption of Christianity as the religion of the state, and at the invitation of His Beatitude Archbishop Mesrob Mutafyan, Armenian Patriarch of Istanbul, the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America plans to organize a pilgrimage in June, 2001.

This pilgrimage, entitled "In the Footsteps of St. Gregory the Enlightener: From Caesarea to Etchmiadzin" will take the participants on the journey of St. Gregory from his birthplace in Cappadocea to Etchmiadzin where became the first Catholicos of All Armenians.

It is scheduled to take place from June 3 to June 19, 2001 per attached itinerary. These dates are basically fixed as they involve participation in the celebration of the 1700th anniversary of Christianity in Armenia which takes place on June 17, 2001 in Etchmiadzin, which is also the day of remembrance of St. Gregory.

The plan is for 600 to 1,000 persons to participate, all doing this trip in unison (breaking the pilgrimage into smaller groups that come one after the other is *not* an option).

- Following the visit to Kayseri (Caesarea), the group will divide into 4 subgroups, each to visit that part of the country from which their ancestors came, as follows:
 - A. Adana, Tarsus, Mersin, Iskanderun, & Sis.
 - B. Aintab, Marash, Kilis, Zeitun & Urfa
 - C. Sebastia, Yozgat, Tokat, & Amasia.
 - D. Malatia, Kharput, Arabgir, Diarbekir, Mush & Van

Some of the details as to the towns to be visited by each group is subject to adjustment.

Decision regarding travel agency for 1700 pilgrimage

Following our meeting on September 14, we have continued to negotiate with the two finalist travel agencies, namely, VIP Travel and Pasha/Miltur Travel. It is clear on all fronts that Pasha/Miltur would be the most cost effective and has the best management setup to handle this pilgrimage.

Pasha/Miltur also provided the larger volume discount and commission on the extras.

Per your decision, we will now proceed with the preparation of the contract, which we will share with you for your review prior signature.

Issues:

- 1. There are slight differences in price for each of the four options, resulting in price differences of up to \$200 depending on which group the person wishes to join. It is our recommendation that we have one standard price irrespective of options. The base price therefore will be \$3,240. This does not include any provision for the Diocese to cover promotional and other costs.
- 2. Not knowing how many people will participate and estimating an expenditure of up to \$130,000 for mailings, advertisements, guide to pilgrims, and other costs, it is recommended that the total package cost from New York be \$3,695. This price includes air travel (economy), visas to Turkey and Armenia (\$75), accommodation (semi-private room), two meals a day, all inland and trans-country travel by air or land, every 20th person from America free, one representative from the Patriarchate on each bus free, and all entrance fees for museums and historical sites. This calculation will make sure we break even at 300 passengers.

We will keep you informed of developments.
