#### In the Footsteps of St. Gregory the Enlightener From Caesarea to Etchmiadzin June 3 to June 19, 2001

On the occasion of the 1700 Anniversary Celebration of the adoption of Christianity as the religion of the state, and at the invitation of His Beatitude Archbishop Mesrob Mutafyan, Armenian Patriarch of Istanbul, the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America plans to organize a pilgrimage in June, 2001.

This pilgrimage, entitled "In the Footsteps of St. Gregory the Enlightener: From Caesarea to Etchmiadzin" will take the participants on the journey of St. Gregory from his birthplace in Cappadocea to Etchmiadzin where became the first Catholicos of All Armenians.

It is scheduled to take place from June 3 to June 19, 2001 per attached itinerary. These dates are basically fixed as they involve participation in the celebration of the 1700th anniversary of Christianity in Armenia which takes place on June 17, 2001 in Etchmiadzin, which is also the day of remembrance of St. Gregory.

The plan is for 600 to 1,000 persons to participate, all doing this trip in unison (breaking the pilgrimage into smaller groups that come one after the other is *not* an option).

Following the visit to Kayseri (Caesarea), the group will divide into 4 subgroups, each to visit that part of the country from which their ancestors came, as follows:

- A. Adana, Tarsus, Mersin, Iskanderun, & Sis.
- B. Aintab, Marash, Kilis, Zeitun & Urfa
- C. Sebastia, Yozgat, Tokat, & Amasia.
- D. Malatia, Kharput, Arabgir, Diarbekir, Mush & Van

Some of the details as to the towns to be visited by each group is subject to adjustment.

To be successful, the tour operator must have a strong presence and proven track record of the highest level in Turkey, Armenia and the United States. Given this requirement, tour operators with complimentary strengths may choose to bid jointly. Tour operator must have bank surety, preferably through USTA.

#### **Notes**

- 1. International Flight Carriers: Only International IATA carriers are acceptable. All flights must be non-stop from point of international U.S. departure to Istanbul. All prices to be quoted for tourist class travel, with option to upgrade travel to business and first class. Surcharge for each must be defined in the contract.
- 2. Connecting Flights: The travel agent is expected as part of the tour operation to provide <u>direct</u> connecting flights from the point of departure of the traveler in the U.S. to the international gateway departure point; it is understood that the cost of this addition will be charged to the traveler.
- 3. **Bookings**: the tour operator will provide all bookings and travel related services as part of the basic cost.
- 4. Group Leaders: The plan is recruitment of participants through the parishes and Armenian institutions in the U.S. These same parishes and institutions will provide respective group leaders. Proposals should forsee one free group leader for every 19 full paying travelers.
- 5. Local Flights: All travelers have to be flown on Wednesday June 6 from Istanbul to Caesarea by plane. The groups going to Adana and Aintab will need to be flown from there to Erzroum on Tuesday June 12. Finally, all travelers will need to fly from Yerevan to Istanbul on Monday, June 18.
- 6. Hotel Accommodations: Istanbul and Caesarea (Capadocea) 4 stars; all other accommodation 3 star and subject to each room having independent inbuilt bathroom with hot water. Costing to be done on the basis of double occupancy, with option for single rooms. Tour operator must specify in contract the surcharge for single room. *Important*: All hotel accommodations must be secured for the travelers until the time of departure of the buses to the airports with no surcharge to the traveler.
- 7. Food and Beverages: package must include breakfast and one full meal at the hotel. Additionally the tour organizer has to make arrangements for the midday meal at an appropriate restaurant, and the cost of this meal, including soft drink, must not exceed \$10 per person.
- 8. **Buses:** All buses should have air conditioning, lavatory, and provision for long haul travel. The buses are expected to accompany the group throughout their journey up to their departure from Yerevan.
- 9. **Travel Guides:** The Patriarchate of Istanbul will provide one representative per bus. This guide must be provided with free accommodation and meals, and travel. Additionally, the tour operator will provide a professional guide for each bus, fully fluent in English at no cost.
- 10. **Border Crossing:** All efforts will be undertaken to arrange for the exceptional opening of the border point at Igdir border checkpoint. If that fails, the group

- may have to travel via the Ardahan border checkpoint to Georgia and on to Armenia. The operator must be ready to provide transport whichever way the permission is given.
- 11. Visas: Travel agent must secure entry visas prior to departure from the U.S. for each traveler to enter Turkey and Armenia and if needed, for transit through Georgia. Visa costs should be included in the price of the package.
- 12. **Program**: The program committee is working on finalizing the itinerary. In all cases, it will involve the daily use of buses, which must be available for the activities of each day.
- 13. Extensions: This trip is a religious pilgrimage in which minimal provision is made for tourist activities. Tour operator should include in proposal the following options as add-ons for a specified extra fee: 3 and 7 day extension in Turkey and 3 and 7 day extension in Armenia, and provide specifics of the itinerary for each; tour operator should keep in mind that the participants have visited the Armenian religious sites already.
- 14. **Promotion:** The tour operator is expected to design and provide for the printing of 2000 posters 16x24 inches (4 colors), and 100,000 brochures outlining the itinerary, details and conditions, and including registration form. The Diocese will be responsible for 2 mailings to its 40,000+ database. The Diocese will further design and arrange for placement of advertisements of this tour in relevant Armenian media at no cost to the tour operator.
- 15. Package specifications: the cost per traveler must include all airport fees and taxes, all entry fees to sites, all visa costs and any other mandatory expenses. The only expense per traveler will be that of the mid-day meal and travel insurance, which would be optional.
- 16. **Reports**: the tour operator must provide monthly updated reports on the those who have signed up, including full names and mailing addresses, and details of what each has signed up for.

- Visit by "Gaghant Baba" (Santa Claus).

#### **JANUARY 14, 2001**

Opening Ceremony of the 1700th Jubilee in all our parishes.

The torch brought from Khor Virab. Armenia (where St. Gregory the Enlightener spent 13 years) by the Primate should be passed to all parishioners with a special Jubilee logo candle made by the Diocese. These candles could be ordered through St. Vartan Bookstore.

Passing the light symbolizes the passing of St. Gregory's faith, vision, and commitment to our Lord Jesus Christ, as well as to the present and future generations of the Armenian nation.

You may want to sing a hymn dedicated to St. Gregory (select one from this resource booklet), while the congregation come to receive the light from the priest at the end of the Badarak.

#### **FEBRUARY 4, 2001**

Feast of the Sons and Grandsons of St. Gregory the Enlightener (actual feast is on February 3). After the Badarak in the church hall read about this feast and on conversion of Armenia to Christianity.

Have a quiz show (enclosed in this booklet) for your school's children. You may also open the quiz to parishioners. In advance a committee should be formed to organize this. You may want to give this responsibility to your school's principal. The winner will receive a prize.

Think about sending the winner to Armenia with the Diocesan Pilgrimage in June 2001.

#### March 17, 2001

Women Saints Day throughout the Diocese.

This year Sts. Ashkhen and Khosrovitookhd will be honored. DRE (Department of Religious Education) is preparing a special booklet on these saints which will be published in time.

APRIL 1, 2001

St. Gregory the Enlightener's commitment to the pit [Moutn i Wirap] (actual feast day is March 31).

After the Badarak, in church hall have a uplifting afternoon.

Have a bread and water lunch; charge \$5.00 or \$10.00 per person, and donate all the proceeds for the maintenance of Khor Virab Church, or for the renovation of any church in Armenia. You may also give the money to "Sister Parish" projects.

During lunch turn off the lights, use only candles. Remember, St. Gregory passed 13 years with bread and water alone, and a candle light. For 13 minutes meditate on the theme of <u>sacrifice</u>, and pray. The priest, or someone else, should be the facilitator. Then break into groups to discuss each and everyone's commitment to your local church. The pastor should assign 3-4 group leaders in advance. Prepare a big poster for the parishioners to write their commitment on it and hang the poster on a wall in your church hall throughout the year, so that others may see and add on it. It also will be a reminder for all about their commitment.

Learn and sing one of the enclosed hymns dedicated to St. Gregory. In advance the priest can choose some poems both in English and in Armenian to be recited by school children and/or adult parishioners.

- Encourage 17 parishioners to join the Diocesan Pilgrimage in June 2001 to historic and present Armenia.
- Encourage 17 parishioners to go to Jerusalem as Pilgrims.
- Have 17 of your parish's children become pen pals with 17 children in Armenia
- Adopt a sister parish in Armenia. If you can't contribute \$3000 a year for this program, try to raise \$1700.
- Let your pastor visit St. Vartan Cathedral and meet the Primate with 17 or more parishioners, who have never been at the Diocese before. Advance appointment with the Canon Sacrist of St. Vartan Cathedral and the Primate is required.
- Let your Parish Council visit 17 new/non-active families.
- Have 17 ACYOA Junior age/member teens go to Christmas caroling to 17 families and nursing homes.
- Make a Bible available in every home.
- Bring 17 new or non-active families into the life of the parish.
- Increase your church's membership by 17 or more new dues-paid members.
- Encourage 17 or more parishioners to donate blood through the Red Cross.
- Bring joy to 17 needy and or sick children; visit them with toys and candies.
- Bring joy to 17 elderly, senior citizens, shut-ins, and lonely individuals; visit them, send them flowers or cards during major feast days (Christmas, Easter, etc.)
- Encourage your Armenian and Sunday Schools to send 17 school bags to children in Armenia.
- Increase membership within each of your organization (ACYOA Jr., ACYOA Sr., Choir, Women's Guild) by at least 17 new members.
- Increase the number of your Armenian and Sunday school by 17 additional students each.
- Have a vocation Sunday to emphasize to emphasize the importance of the Priesthood. The goal is to encourage young men to consider priesthood.
- Honor those who bear St. Gregory's name. (Give a lighted candle after church service on Sunday).
- Recruit 17 new altar servers, acolytes, and readers.
- Start a Junior Choir with 17 teenagers.
- Teach 17 new hymns (sharagans) to your choir and congregation.
- Select 17 prayers from Armenian Church's prayer books, services and recite either after Badarak or in the church hall prior to the blessing of the coffee hour table, on 17 different Sundays.
- Have an ecumenical service dedicated to the 1700<sup>th</sup> Jubilee. You may have this in a non-Armenian church, to expose the milestone to non-Armenians. (A uniform

ecumenical service prepared by Very Rev. Fr. Daniel Findikyan will be sent to you).

- Have a 17-hour parish retreat on St. Gregory's vision and commitment to our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. (Contact DRE)
- Start a "Parish Mission Program" within the Parish. (See the enclosed outline on page ?)
- Start 17-week Bible study sessions on five focus areas of the Diocesan Council (i.e. Worship, Youth, Stewardship, Communication, Leadership). (Contact DRE)
- Have a series of 17 lectures on Armenian Church history, faith and culture.
- Assist in any way you can a mission parish in our Diocese.
- Teach the Armenian Alphabet to 17 or more new teens/youth, who do not attend Armenian language classes of your parish.
- Have an essay contest for the youth (ages 12-17) on "How the Armenian Church influenced my life?"
- Assign 17 or more new/non-active parishioners in Sunday worship to xxxx the plate, give the Kiss of Peace, distribute candle, Mahs bread.
- \* We realize that parishes may have planned their own events in regard of the 1700<sup>th</sup> Jubilee. However, these are only additional ideas/suggestions put together for your benefit. You may want to select some of them or encourage your organizations to do in 2001 and beyond.

Whatever is suggested here is in direct line with the vision of St. Gregory the Enlightener, the mission of the Armenian Church and the intent of our Diocesan Council.

### I. AT HOLY ECHMIADZIN December 31, 2000-January 1, 2001

His Holiness will be inviting the heads of the hierarchical seas of the Armenian Churches and all the Diocesan Primates asking them to bring with them two young people, one male and one female ages 18-28 to be in Holy Echmiadzin on December 29. On December 31<sup>st</sup> in the evening His Holiness and his entourage will go to Khorvirab and His Holiness will descend to the pit and light the candle and after ascending the pit he will the procession will bring the light to Holy Echmiadzin and at midnight of December 31<sup>st</sup>, with a special ceremony His Holiness will light a designated lantern which has been placed on the Altar of Descent and during the ceremony, each primate will lead his youth to receive the lantern from His Holiness, at which time the two young people will carry the light to New York City to St. Vartan Cathedral.

#### II. AT ST. VARTAN CATHEDRAL January 6, 2001

The Primate will be the celebrant of the Divine Liturgy on the occasion of the Armenian Christianity at St. Vartan Cathedral and two young people from each parish will be invited to come to St. Vartan Cathedral at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy there will be a special opening ceremony of the 1700<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Christianization of Armenia. Each Primate will present a lantern brought from Armenia to each delegation from the parishes at which time the young people, ages 18-28, who brought the light will light their lantern.

### III. AT PARISHES January 14, 2001

At the end of Badarak in each parish, there will be a special opening ceremony where the Pastor with the two young people who brought the light in the lantern, from St. Vartan Cathedral, will invited everyone who attended Badarak to light their candles from that lantern. The lantern will remain lit in the church during the entire year of 2001.

The Diocese of the Armenian Church to be distributed to the parishes will present special candles.

#### a. How to select young people.

On November 12<sup>th</sup> in each parish there will be a collection of names of young people ages 18-28 which will be placed in two boxes (male and female). At the conclusion of Badarak these boxes will be brought in the chancel of Church where in front of the community the Pastor will select two Sunday school students to draw from each box and announce the selected names. These names will be submitted to the Primate on November 13<sup>th</sup>. These names will again be placed in two boxes one male and one female.

On November 19<sup>th</sup> the Primate at the conclusion of the celebration of Badarak will have two young people draw the names from the boxes. These two final youngsters will be invited by the Primate to go to Echmiadzin. The other youngsters will be invited to come to New York City on January 6<sup>th</sup> to receive the light.
