### REFLECTION OF 1970

In our last year's report, we finished by asking for God's guidance for the year 1970. And truly God helped us and the year 1970 became very fruitful for our Church and our community like we never had before.

#### SOORP BADARAK & SERMON

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Almost every Sunday and on other feast days, we celebrated Divine Liturgy. During the Lenten Season, we had Evening Services and Holy Week Services. For the first time in our Church on New Year's morning, we had Holy Badarak.

We participated in the Inter-Clergy World Prayer Week and Good Friday, we preached at St. Luke's and the First Congregational Church.

During this year, our Church was resplendent and radiant with people.

Again, we had an average of 123 adults and children attending Church each Sunday. We have as Church members 156 persons, 28 widows, one widower, 20 retired couples, seven (retired) single people, 19 employed single, 28 employed couples; 52.7% nonworkers, 47.3% workers. We were also happy to welcome 10 new members this past year.

Every Sunday and on every occasion, we preached in Armenian and English. We performed Soorp Badarak out of town on several occasions, such as in Europe, during our vacation, East St. Louis and various other places.

#### SACRAMENTS

During 1970, we performed funeral services for six of our parishioners; Services were also performed in Racine and in Europe. We gave spiritual messages to the bereaved families. We performed 98 Requiem Services. We performed five Baptismal Services, two marriages and one marriage in the Chicago Church and one engagement service.

#### VISITS

We visited the majority of our parishioners' homes during the entire year. We visited 38 sick people at various hospitals. On 17 occasions we visited the ill at their homes to give comfort and administer Holy Communion to them. We blessed the homes of families who called us.

We would like to repeat once more -- If you have someone who is ill at home, please call us.

#### MEETINGS

We presided at all of the Church's organizational meetings. A total of 160 meetings were held. We brought to these meetings constructive ideas for the Church, community and individuals as well.

#### INSIDE CHURCH ACTIVITIES

We gave our active participation with ideas and words to all the Church organizations' activities that you will find listed on the following pages of this book.

#### PARISH COUNCIL

It was a great pleasure for us to work with our Parish Council members. They were very comprehensive and we worked very harmoniously together for the benefit of both our Church and community.

We appreciate especially, the Chairman, Arthur Barsamian's devoted leadership. We would like to express our special congratulations to Russell Kaishian, who, with his group, wrote a new page in Madagh history, and to the other members of the Parish Council, who were always ready to do any work. It is hard for us to accept the fact that the majority of them are going out of office today. It was a pleasure to work with them. We hope that the accomplishments of the newcomers will surpass those of this outgoing group.

### LADIES AID

Again, this year, they worked very hard for their Church. The Chairlady, Mrs. Arous Kaloustian and her energetic group did an excellent job helping their church.

#### ACYOA

Our boys and girls, with their enthusiasm, are everywhere in the Church activities, under the advisory of the indefatigable Rose Esaian. Every evening during Mission Week, under our leadership, a rally and discussion period was held with fine participation by all.

### SUNDAY SCHOOL

Sunday School is a beehive of children learning together the meaning of brotherly love. This place is very important and it should be the center of all our thoughts. Rose Esaian, as superintendent and her staff, Esahag Haidarian, George Kaprelian, Margaret Kademian, Terry Hadjinian and Helen Barsamian are trying to do their best for our children.

#### ARMENIAN SCHOOL

Yevkin Karian very faithfully is continuing her teaching of our children every Saturday. In her absence, Rose Tanelian and Mary Boyajian taught the children during the summer. We personally teach the adult class each Tuesday.

#### CHOIR & ALTAR SERVERS

Choir members attend every Sunday very faithfully and sing the Holy Badarak, having as their Choirmaster, Hampar Kaishian and Organist, Mary Ambrookian.

### THE 1970 PARISH COUNCIL'S REPORT

The responsibilities of the Parish Council of Holy Resurrection Armenian Church is to guide the parish in its spiritual, educational, and financial endeavors in cooperation with the parish priest and under his leadership. The Council strives to set a good example to the rest of the congregation by taking a personal interest in all activities of the parish.

This report is to let you know how this year's group of elected trustees met and kept that responsibility. The report is not an accounting of the many scheduled events and visitations that took place during the year 1970. A calendar of events is published elsewhere in this book, and the success or failure of the function can also be determined by looking at the report by the Treasurer. Therefore, this report will not be redundant.

The General Assembly meeting held Sunday, January 18, 1970 elected a group of Parish Council members to join hands with the 1969 elected members who were finishing out the second half of their term of office. These combined elected officials formed the Parish Council membership for 1970.

A great deal of responsibility is placed on the shoulders of these elected members. That responsibility lies far beyond just coming to church on Sunday, counting the offering and seeing to it that we make a profit at the end of the year. Making a profit is easy - we simply collect the money and spend as little as possible. But we've got to go beyong that this church has got to be more than just a place to come and pray, or simply to pay your dues. The church is also the home of our Armenian community and of our parishioners.

So it behooves the General Assembly (you people) to elect members to the council who are adaptable, conscientious, concerned, dedicated, and above all, without prejudice or animosity toward any individual or group. In that regard I'm afraid that you have let yourselves down all too many times in the past. Individuals have been elected to this high office to run the affairs of your church who have very strong personal feelings, and will not comprimise on a situation. You elect people who can not or will not attend a meeting. These same people do not come to church on Sundays - and when they do come, they do not attend as a trustee, but as a regular parishioner. You Consequently, elect people who accept jobs but will not do them. the burden falls on the few hard workers who then must work doubly hard for their unconcerned partners.

Maintaining this church is a difficult task - keeping faucets from dripping, shoveling snow, supplying heat, providing screens for windows, sweeping floors, repairing the roof, carring out trash, and changing lightbulbs are only a few of the hundreds of things that have to be done. The Council members you elected by and large fulfilled their responsibilities, and many more you will never know about, without asking for any recognition.

However, there are a few amongst us who are always conveniently absent, dressed too clean to work, or have to go home because they are expecting company. I would like, at this time to give special credit to Mr. Sam Hadjinian, who willingly and without being asked treats this building and loves it like he does his own home. He is always willing to help other organizations when they need his help. I'm sure that needs no elaboration - for you have all benefited by his help. Grace Hadjinian is also in line for a great deal of credit for her dedication and her ability as a secretary. Armand Bendian for the many and long devoted hours; Kappy Kaprelian for his consistency and the effort and time he put in administering the books of the Church; Hoyle Green and Tony Cifaldi, who attend church and our various functions, and in spite of the language barrier patiently watch and listen and enjoy comradeship and fellowship with you; Russell Kaishian who did such a fine job on our Madagh; Esahag Haidarian, your Vice-Chairman, who also doubles as a Sunday School teacher; our elder statesman, Mihran Hayalian, who also heads the Cemetery Committee, cuts grass, cleans up or does whatever is asked of him. Here also I gratefully acknowledge the generous donation to our church by the Tomazar Association.

This group of Trustees you should be exceptionally proud of, for among the accomplishments they can boast of are paying off the furnace bill, co-ordinating and working at the most successful Madagh in the history of this church, consolidating the various and sundry accounts into one general grouping, purchasing a much needed movie projector, obtaining a slide projector, paying our Diocesan dues, and currently making plans for remodeling the basement, office and kitchen areas. We also have a very fine financial outlook for 1971.

The parish house tenants are very happy and are enjoying the privilege of living in our home. In fact, they have requested an extention of their lease beyond the one year already granted them.

Our Assistant Treasurer, Armand Bendian, is devising a simple and yet efficient system for pledge and donation records. A new bookkeeping system is underway for next year, being prepared by Grace Hadjinian.

My congratulations go to these trustees whom I've had the pleasure of working with for two years. Any success we have enjoyed is due mainly to the effort and time these fine people have devoted to the Church. They worked hard, and they took pleasure in serving you. Having a good Parish Council is important, but what is equally important is the help and devotion of all our parish members, but not just financial support. Little things like straightening chairs, emptying ash trays, picking up coat hangers, cutting grass, shoveling snow all help a lot. This is your Church, your home - it does not belong to just the Parish Council. Please treat it as you would your own home. I'm sure then that it will be a lot easier to get good trustees, because they will know they are not just being asked to be a custodian. Parish Council Report Page 3
