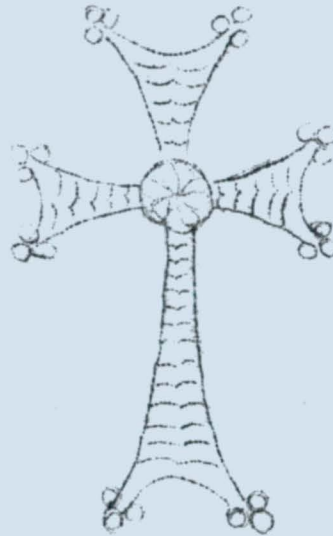

## RECTOR'S THOUGHTS

One more year came to add to our personal, social and ecclesiastic life. A year full of work, whose count each of us should take to see the results, and from that judge our standing situation. Of course our personal life belongs to us, our social life depends on our own conscience, but here, the thing that interests us is our christian-life account. This question comes to us direct, if we have any humanly minor thinking. Some of you speak very beautifully, but you don't work and act as you speak. Some always compare themselves with others and, then there are others who always fight against their brothers and sisters to cover their own inferiority complex. But they don't realize that they are destroying themselves and their children. And then there are also, the people who work with much devotion, without making any noise, but they are being criticized and condemned.

The church is eternal, she existed yesterday, she is today, and she will be tomorrow. The proof? Twenty Centuries, because the Head of the Church is Christ, The Son of God, Himself. We, as christians, with our acts are mortal subjects to the judgement. Christ came to give to humanity, Love and Good Will. Very clearly He told us, don't judge others, so you be not judged. How you judge, you also shall be judged. It is right for all of us to remember another word of The Son of God, Take the log out of your own eye before saying something about the speck in your brother's eye. Here, for the sake of the people who work in this church and are being gossiped about by a small group of people, and on behalf of the truth, I quote the following words of Jesus, "Blessed are those who suffer for me."

Today, these thoughts are coming to us because, this is the New Year of the ecclesiastical and spiritual life. We have an obligation to give the count of our past, not on the material ground, which is of much importance to some of us who forget that this is a church, but we should take the count of our spiritual and christian life. We as a spiritual leader and father, love you all with the same christian love. Especially every Sunday and generally on every occasion we gave you the message of the Holy Bible, sometimes with love and softly, and when we saw that you needed other ways, we gave strictly. We tried to lead you from your namely christianity to the conscience christianity. We had and we have "Prodigal Sons" who sit far away and don't want to hear our Love and Good Will messages. Instead they ridiculed and gossiped about their spiritual father and those who are faithful sons and laborers in their church-home. With their acts, they gave pain to our heart, but we in our pain are rejoiced and strengthened. Because we believe that the Father of the Bible who returned the Prodigal Son, will in the same way return to the church these, our dear sons, who are struggling against themselves and return harming only themselves.

This church doesn't belong to anybody or any group. She is the "Bride" of Christ, and we are her beloved children. There is no greater or lesser person, we are all the same in the church. This was told to us by the Head of Church, Christ. This is the way our forefathers believed and they left us this faith. Our personal egos today have become a cause that drives some far from christianity. In our church we have our small personality clashes. Is not christianity the doctrine of love, peace, humbleness and equality? In the church we speak, we argue and we fight about money more than Christ. Money is a way, but it is not the main motive or goal in the church. Unfortunately Christ is forgotten. The temple of money is bourse and bank. We must change church into CHURCH, with our rebirth, putting out from the church all the talk, arguments, misunderstanding and especially the money. "Blessed are those who make a treasure in heaven," which means to have evangelic and spiritual soul in the church. Money is the way to make resplendent and fruitful the work of God. Don't come to me and don't tell me that you are not going to give money to the church. Here, you show me the poorness of your spirit and the nakedness of your mind. Because God, for the success of his work, has all the ways in this world. God doesn't need your pettynesses. Jesus said, "Blessed are the givers."

Jealousy is the mother of all evil. Unfortunately for no reason, we have a lot of it among us. Why this jealousy when, praise God, we have such an easy and comfortable life?

In the church the persons are not the law, and we haven't a right to make our personal laws and obligate others to them. The Bible has it's laws. Our Holy forefathers gave us laws, we should follow them very faithfully. Only the general meetings can make local laws, without contradicting the original laws. We are, and we should be, the subjects of the law. Any organization and especially the Holy Church expects this from the individual. In the last three years we gathered everything in the church under the law of the church. But some of the people revolt against the law and try to destroy it, which is absolutely wrong. Please follow the Bible, your christian conscience and the By-Laws of your church.

With love, each member should go forward and serve his church, because the church is his Spiritual Mother. To decline from the service of church means immaturity. Each server will receive his unforsaken reward from heaven, and they will receive our appreciation and recognition. Everytime that I receive any declining letter from our members, for their sake my eyes fill with tears....

Therefore, serve your church, especially, serve unselfishly, with love and humbleness, without noise and raise yourself in front of God and people. Every month you have 648 hours for your physical and material needs. You work 160 hours and you rest 488 hours. From that total can you not give 18 hours a month for your spiritual life and nourishment?

You are good and faithful people, but if we put in a little effort, we can be worthy of eternal adoption from God. Why don't we make these efforts? As we leave the year 1971 behind us, with all its pains and happiness, lets make 1972 our devotional year, be a New Man and turn church to her real meaning and have a successful and spiritual year. Thank God that he brought us to this day. God's Blessings to all those dear people who, last year worked with love for His Holy Church, helping me.

God bless you all and give you renewed life in Christ.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Under the excellent guidance and leadership of our Hayr Soorp, Very Rev. Vazken Keshishian, we are pleased to report that our church has progressed. Together we planned and worked hard, and when we saw that we were enjoying the work, we were encouraged to keep up this momentum. Financially, 1971 was truly a banner year for all of our organizations. This is born out by the Financial Statements printed on the back pages of this report. In a year of economic uncertainties, unemployment, and rising costs, this was quite an accomplishment. The membership of this church should be quite proud of its support. Tribute must be paid to the fine leadership of the Executive bodies of all the organizations, for without their foresight and positive approach the above would not have been possible.

Let us now look back at our accomplishments in 1971.

We instituted a new bookkeeping system. We can now tell at a glance, how we are doing financially at any given time. It has enabled us to have one control center. For the first time, the Parish Council knows how each organization is performing.

A utility room was added this year. Everyone knows how valuable this has been for storage.

Shelves were built in the kitchen pantry. An asset to the Ladies Aid, for now, staple goods can be stored.

The kitchen and Sunday school rooms were painted.

A cold drinking water fountain was installed in the foyer.

We have started the remodeling of the office with expectations of completion of the near future. New lighting fixtures have been installed. Plush carpeting, through the courtesy of Mr. Paul Bogosian, adds color and warmth.

With Hayr Soorp's help, we were able to restore the original stone of our church and put it in a proper place. It denotes the only Armenian writing on the front of our church.

And finally, after many years, we have succeeded in obtaining all the property deeds. They are all now in the Safety Deposit Box.

These were the projects that were completed this year. Others were started and, hopefully they will be finished in 1972.

This has been an active Parish Council.

We participated in two Regional meetings with a Diocesan Representative and four Midwest Regional meetings.

Our church was the host to all the South Milwaukee area churches for Good Friday Services.
