PASTOR'S REPORT FOR 1974

Another year has passed in the life of the Holy Resurrection Armenian Apostolic Church in South Milwaukee. We thank God for the many blessings that He bestowed upon us.

The following is a general report of the Pastor's activities from 1973 through 1974:

We had two Baptisms, three weddings and eight funerals.

- (1) Visitations to the ill were made at Trinity Hospital each Friday on a regular basis, as well as on other week days whenever we were notified that there was a patient. We also visited other hospitals, i.e., St. Luke's, St. Francis, Lutheran, Deaconess and others to pray and give comfort to all who were recuperating from their illness.
- (2) During the past year, we visited Armenian homes as much as possible, with particular emphasis given to visiting all parishioner's homes for the annual home blessing. Some parishioners were asked to set a time convenient for them, but they did not return our call.
- (3) We conducted Divine Liturgy and Morning Services at Holy Resurrection Church every Sunday, except those Sundays when we were in Waukegan, Ill., as per a directive from his Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the Diocesan Primate, or whenever we were attending a Diocesan Convention.
- (4) We conducted Sunrise and Lenten evening Services.
- (5) We presided, guided and supported by our presence, all the Parish Council meetings as well as all other organizational meetings.
- (6) We attended and participated in the activities of our ACYOA and Sunday School children.
- (7) We had Choir rehearsals every Wednesday and rehearsals for our Altar Servers every Thursday.
- (8) We approached Deacon Harold Baylerian to supervise and teach our Acolytes.
- (9) We supported the education of our community by attending, guiding and participating actively in all sessions of the AGBU Armenian School.
- (10) We organized and supported the start of a new library in our Church under the name of Holy Resurrection Armenian Church and AGBU Library. Our Church balcony is now being utilized for this purpose upon the approval of the Parish Council.

- (11) We conducted Bible Study classes every Wednesday for South Milwaukee and Racine and also provided the transportation personally.
- (12) His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom, appointed us to serve as president of the activities among the seven Armenian Churches of the Midwest.
- (13) We participated in Good Friday Services at United Methodist Church of South Milwaukee and at a Thanksgiving Service at St. John's Catholic Church.

This past year, the Choir had an enjoyable and interesting year. We participated in the Divine Liturgy, starting with the Morning Service, Aravodian Jamerkootune and the Divine Liturgy - Gomidasian version. This was accomplished with the guidance, encouragement and patience of Father Arshag.

On February 13th, Mary Lewis and Mary Ambrookian attended an executive meeting of all Church affiliated organizations.

Beginning on February 27th, the Choir participated in the Lenten Services. On Palm Sunday, April 7th, a special Choir plate collection was taken at the request of the Choir Central Council. The amount of \$36.00 was collected and sent to the Council.

At our April 24th general Choir membership meeting, I made a suggestion for the choir to sponsor Searagan in a concert as a project for the Choir. It was voted "yes" and plans began immediately for the concert to be held on Sunday, September 29th. Later, the date was changed because it was conflicting with St. John's anniversary celebration. The date was set for Sunday, September 15th and the concert was held at the Red Carpet Inn. With the great help of Father Arshag, Mary Lewis, Ruth Kashishian and the Choir members, it turned out to be a great success.

Memorial Day, May 27th, the Choir sang Requiem Services at the cemetery.

At our annual Madagh, held July 21st, the Choir assisted with the Madagh Blessing Services.

The 28th Annual Choir Assembly was held November 1, 2 and 3 at St. Leon's Armenian Church in Fairlawn, New Jersey. No one was able to attend.

Several of our Choir members were on committees for the 50th Anniversary of our Church which was held November 29, 30 and December 1. In order to support the 50th Anniversary, the Choir asked the four area church choirs to participate in the Divine Liturgy, with Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan acting as Celebrant. Three special rehearsals were held. The Choir did a good job that day.

On December 24th, the Choir presented its annual Christmas Eve Service. In conjunction with Christmas Eve, the feast day of St. Stephen, the Proto-Deacon, was celebrated and Deacon Harold Baylerian and Acolytes were honored. Refreshments were served by the Choir.

Weekly rehearsals were held every Wednesday evening. We had two executive meetings - February 17th and May 15th. Two general choir membership meetings were held - April 24th and August 21st. Father Arshag attended all rehearsals and meetings.

This year, our sources of income were the proceeds from the soda machine and Searagan's concert.

Our main project for 1975 will be getting new robes. After repeated correspondence with the Diocese, we finally received robes which did not fit properly and they were returned. The money was refunded.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity again to thank Father Arshag for his time, guidance and above all, his patience with us. He has been instrumental in starting the Choir with the Gomidasian version of the Badarak. To each Choir member, a thank you for all your cooperation and help given to me and for attending regular rehearsals to make this a successful year.

A New Year's resolution -- JOIN THE CHOIR. We need male voices. This is ours, all cours. This is your Church. We need you -- the Church needs you and above all, you need the Church.

The Holy Resurrection Sunday School began 1974 with the annual Christmas program on January 6th. During Lent, the students were again given mite boxes, the proceeds of which annually support an Armenian girl at the St. Tarkmanchatz School in Jerusalem. On Easter Saturday, the teachers prepared a Communion Breakfast for the children. As in the past, the students again presented carnations on Mothers' Day to the mothers in the parish. The semester ended with the graduation of six students and a picnic in Grant Park.

Classes resumed in September with an approximate enrollment of thirty, including the students who had graduated and had voluntarily returned to study the Soorp Badarak and church traditions. As not to interfere with the Fiftieth Anniversary Celebration in November, the staff decided to cancel the Thanksgiving Dinner for this year. However, in conjunction with the Anniversary, our Sunday School sponsored a joint church school session in which the neighboring Armenian churches were invited to attend and participate.

Also in November we were both pleased and fortunate to have Miss Valerie Goekjian, head of the Council for Religious Education at the Diocese, with us for an evening to discuss the curriculum and general Sunday School procedures.

Sunday School, under the direction of a capable teaching staff, continues to guide and train students in the doctrines of both the Christian faith and the Armenian Church. The teaching staff hopes to make this organization grow even stronger in the future in order to facilitate learning and to propagate the Armenian

HOLY RESURRECTION AND AGBU LIBRARY 1974 REPORT

The Armenian - English Library located in the Church balcony has made significant progress in the short time it has been in existence.

Initiated by, and under the general supervision of, Father Arshag, and sponsored by Holy Resurrection Church - and the AGBU - the library now contains over 150 volumes, including paperbacks. The Library Committee members are: Helen Barsamian, Margaret Cohen, Margaret Kademian and Mary Haidarian. Furnishings at present consist of six attractive bookcases, a large reading table, a smaller table and eight chairs.

A great deal was added to the attractiveness and comfort of the library by the beautiful wall-to-wall carpeting donated by Paul Bogosian of Milwaukee. Special thanks also go to Sam Hadjinian, who donated his services for the complete installation of the carpeting. Dr. Myron Bashirian donated \$100.00 to the library as a memorial to his father, and donations in lieu of flowers were requested by the Bashirian, Jigarian and Yelanjian families. Father Arshag has donated over fifty hard cover and paperback books, and a number of individual book donations have also been made.

Helen Barsamian is using her library skills to catalog and arrange the books, newspapers and periodicals so they will be readily available to users. Library materials can be charged out presently, and just as soon as the cataloging is completed, an open house will be held to familiarize everyone with the contents of the library and to promote full use of the reference material.

At the "open house", visitors will also be informed of the plans and needs of the library to build its collection into a valuable storehouse of Armenian facts, folklore, history, literature, language, art culture and religion that will be available and used for reference, enjoyment, self-improvement and ethnic culture.
