

PASTOR'E ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1976

Dear Parishioners:

Once again I have compiled a report concerning my activities as your spiritual Father and leader of the community of South Milwaukee. My Parish Council Chairman, Mr. Herbert Barsamian, along with the aid of the other members of the Parish Council, have labored, prayed and maintained our beloved Church, and we have thus had another successful year.

The following is my annual report as the President of the Parish Assembly:

RELIGIOUS SERVICES AND SACRAMENTS

According to our Diocesan By-Laws, which reads under No. 42.A -- the Parish Priest shall ... "... conduct religious services and administer the Sacraments in accordance with the Canons and the traditions of the Armenian Church."

I remained faithfully bound to my religious duties, and accordingly, performed the following religious services: Ι have conducted --

- 1. Three Baptisms in our Church.
- 2. Four Funeral Services in our Church.
- 3. 26 Requiem Services at our Church.
- 4. One Baptism in Waukegan at St. George Armenian Church.
- 5. One Funeral Service in Waukegan, at St. George's.
- 6. One Funeral Service in Racine at St. Mesrob Armenian Church.

7. One Funeral Service in Chicago at St. Gregory the

8. Tuice Weddings in our Church.

MORNING SERVICES were conducted every Sunday, promptly at 9:30 A.M. (whether or not any parishioners were present). I began the DIVINE LITURGY at 10:00 A.M. I preached an appropriate sermon at 11:20 A.M. each Sunday in two languages -- Armenian and English. My sermons were always prepared according to our Church calendar regarding the correct manner of worship, with a spiritual meaning, how to perform all the good deeds prescribed in the Holy Scriptures, and how to prescribe ourselves to the Ecclesiastical Councils and the Holy Fathers of the Armenian Church for the advancement of the spiritual life and the good order in the parish.

During Lent, SUNRISE SERVICES were conducted on Sunday mornings and on each Wednesday evening at 7:30 P.M. In addition, the Divine Liturgy was conducted on VARTANANTZ DAY. MEMORIAL DAY SERVICES were held at our own cemetery. All services held Guring Lent, i.e., Sunrise and Lenten Evening Services -- were conducted in English with the exception of the hymns, which were sung in Armenian. Both Armenian and English sermons were

preached during every Service that I conducted in order to please both the younger and older generations.

HOSPITAL VISITATIONS

DIOCESAN BY-LAWS ARTICLE 42.B reads under the 'Parish Priest' "To visit the people of his parish, to comfort the sick, the needy, and the bereaved of his flock, and to perform all the good deeds prescribed by the Ecclesiastical Councils and the Holy Fathers of the Church for the advancement of spiritual life and good order in the parish." -- Accordingly, I visited the ill at Trinity Memorial hospital on a regular basis (especially on Fridays) and also during the weekdays, as the occasion arose. With the same spirit, I visited the following hospitals: St. Luke's and St. Mary's in Racine -- in Milwaukee County --Mt. Sinai, St. Mary's, St. Luke's, St. Francis, County General, Veteran's, Cameo Nursing, South Milwaukee Nursing Homes and Columbia hospital. According to our weekly Church Bulletin records, my patient visitations came to approximately 150. This does not include the visits I paid to parishioners at their homes. Holy Communion was administered to many. Counciling and prayers of healing were given according to the needs of each patient.

HOME VISITATIONS

Home visitations were made by me, with Mr. Kerovpe Balian accompaning me as Jamgoch - Loosarar of our Church. I blessed the homes of our parishioners during the months of January and February in 1976. This proved once again to be an enjoyable and God-pleasing experience between Pastor and parishioners. This practice has taken place for five consecutive years since my arrival in South Milwaukee in 1972. The arrangements for each home visit were made either personally by myself or by phone. Very few evaded participation in this Church tradition, and I will not be deterred from attempting to visit them again next year. Entering the homes of the people is a symbolic expression of the Church to ask God's Divine Blessings and protection for the members of the family of each home. Thus, through the priest's help, God blesses each home and those who dwell therein. My home blessings could be more fruitful if a member of the Parish Council or the Women's Guild could join me in the home visitations, or at any other time during the year. Surely, this could be a gratifying experience for all of us. Therefore, I suggest that it would be most beneficial to have a home visitation committee.

VISIT OF SISTER CHURCH -AS DIRECTED BY THE PRIMATE

From July of 1975 through December, 1976, I visited St. George Armenian Church of Waukegan, Ill. A special arrangement had been made since 1973 between their Parish Council and our Pakish Council that I visit St. George parish the last Sunday of each month. I have conducted the Divine Liturgy as well as Madagh and Grape Blessing Services for them. My religious services were also extended to pay visits to their hospitals and homes as often as there was a need.

ARMENIAN EDUCATION UNDER THE AGBU SOUTH MILWAUKEE CHAPTER, which consists of a majority of our Church members, once again sponsored the following organizations under my immediate supervision -- this is the third year.

Adult AGBU Armenian School - Wednesday night (1 hour)
Children's AGBU Armenian School - Saturday morning (2 hours)
AGBU Yerevan Dance School.

4. Holy Resurrection AGBU Library.

The Saturday AGEU Armenian School of South Milwaukee received \$1,000 from the Midwest AGEU District office. Keep in mind, that the above listed organizations are <u>all self-supporting</u> organizations.

<u>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u> in our Church Services has always been my primary concern. I searched and was able to find a benefactor, who donated funds for a Digital Clock, which has been installed this year on the left front wall of the Church. The digital clock numbers make it much easier for all the parishioners to follow the sequences of the Divine Liturgy by referring to the numbers in the blue Soorp Badarak book and the corresponding numbers shown in the digital clock.

<u>ACYOA JUNIORS</u> -- Unfortunately, we do not have any seniors, but our junior youth were very active during the Easter season by reading the Epistles during Divine Liturgy. In many phases, they had a great deal of fun also. I attended their meetings and activities. (See ACYOA report)

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> -- Once again, the Sunday School children, through the labors of their Superintendent, Miss Terry Ann Hadjinian and her staff, along with my spiritual blessings and participation in their activities, have increased their knowledge of our Faith. The Sunday School students read and participated in the reading of the Book of Daniel, the Washing of the Feet Service, with the boys acting as acolytes while attending Divine Liturgy and participating in Holy Communion and they have contributed much to our Church by their participation in all Church Services. <u>SECRETARIAL OFFICE WORK</u> -- I have special thanks and heartfelt prayers to Mrs. Mathew Kademian for all of our church typing and the assistance she has given me.

<u>MEETINGS AND PROVISIONS</u> -- Article 42.D reads: -- The Parish Priest should... "...To ensure, by careful supervision, the proper observance of the provisions of these By-Laws (of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, N.Y.) and the proper execution of the decisions of the Parish Assembly and the instructions of the Primate and the Diocesan Council.

I presided, guided and supported almost all the Church-affiliated organizations. I attended all the meetings, except when I was unavailable due to unforeseen circumstances, or during my vacation.

<u>PARISH COUNCIL</u> -- This year, we had nine Parish Council members. The achievements this year were similar as they were in the past. (See the Parish Council Chairman's report and projects that were accomplished). There were some important decisions, such as to elect Non-Parish Council members at the General Assembly as coordinators for: (1) the Picnic, (2) the Madagh, (3) the New Year's Eve Party, (4) Membership, (5) the Name Day of the Church, and (6) Public Relations. Yet, the list can be lengthend. Why did I propose these functions? Some of us will ask the question ---"What will the Parish Council do?" In two parts, let me explain ---

PART ONE: I am proposing this with a positive intention. We have to involve and distribute the work of our Church which has too many facets as we all know. It is like a golden chain once you start counting them they are all attached to one another. The Parish Council has a load in hand, as it is true to the other Church organizations. After all Parish Council with the Pastor are aids and leaders in charge of the entire parish.

I often wonder what has happened to the former and all the previous Parish Council members. Even to an extent that we don't see them, they don't see us. Why? Because we have not learned how to create in our office terms the job for them.

PART TWO: It is time that we meet with our Church family on a regular basis to determine what our mutual needs are. Advisors do not always do their jobs. Each group needs more active members compared to the potential number of parishioners we have. Many are not active except for the picnic or the bake sale. Let us utilize our potentials in other areas fulfilling the needs of the Church.

What I am saying, is that we have to have a purpose to use modern social techniques; to organize the separate, but able members of the body of the Church within the Parish; and the serving of all members for a LOVING, united effort on the part of the parish, each doing his part; and to involve representative of the members directly, and the parishioners, generally, in an organized effort for the survival.

In conclusion, in all human organizations, we are working with people who have a great number of potential abilities and experiences to share with each other and the projects which will arise should be a challenge to the Parish Council. This could really be an extension of how much we have helped them in their education and experience. I wish that each one of you could work in a small but effective way with other people on either moneymaking decisions or on religious matters that we often have. Believe me, look around -- some do and some don't put the knowledge into practice for the good of all. Let's take a look into our past practices -- maybe we can still learn.

<u>WOMEN'S GUILD</u> -- This year too, our ladies did a lot of work and really produced. I have to give much, much credit to our Chairman, Mrs. Arshalooys Boyajian and her staff for their heroic, continuous work. I have to thank all the ladies who put the kitchen to use -- without whose diligent labors, we were going to miss a lot. (See Women's Guild report).

<u>SOCIAL MEETINGS</u> -- I personally entertained and provided transportation and 50 cent luncheon gatherings for the social meetings with our Golden Agers this year, during the months of June and July. We had 13 to 25 in attendance.

COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

- a. There was a Kitchen Banquet held on February 28.
- b. I gave a lecture to Kiwanis Club about brotherhood.
- c. I served at the Kiwanis Club Pancake Festival to show that I am a part of the Non-Armenian local community.
- d. I gave a lecture at Masonic Temple in Evanston, Ill.
- e. I participated and preached in neighborhood church services on three occasions -- Good Friday, Thanksgiving Day and World Day of Prayer.
- f. I conducted services at South Milwaukee Nursing Home.
- g. I am a member of the South Milwaukee Clergy Association which meets once a month.
- h. Once again, I attended the South Milwaukee City Commissioner's Banquet where I offered the Invocation and Benediction -this is my fourth consecutive invitation by Mayor Grobschmidt. On Memorial Day, I was on the official platform, along with the South Milwaukee City officials, -- I gave a talk while Senator Proxmire was presiding.
- i. I conducted Services and preached a sermon at our Church on the occasion of the Armenian Women's Saints Day.

CONVENTIONS AND MEETINGS

- a. I attended the Diocesan Assembly with our delegates in Philadelphia, Pa. at St. Sahag & St. Mesrob Armenian Church. During the two-day proceedings, I was elected to act in the capacity of Secretary.
- b. I attended the Diocesan Parish Council Regional meeting on December 12 in Evanston, Ill.

- I attended the Choir convention in Detroit, Mich. on c. November 5, 6 and 7 with two of our choir members. (See Choir report).
- I participated in activities and attended meetings, as well d. as the Hye Kamp. I celebrated Divine Liturgy and blessed grapes with His Grace, the Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manooqian.
- I attended the Proposals Committee meetings held in Racine e. and in Waukegan.
- I attended the Youth Retreat at Hye Kamp in Elkhorn, Wis. f. on July 31. (See Report page)

SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

I presided at the re-election of the Auditing and Nominating Committees on August 1, 1976, because we were told by the Primate that our former Assembly did not follow the By-Laws.

I attended a special assembly between the Diocesan Primate and the St. John's Armenian Church Greenfield, Wis. Parish Council to discuss the need of a parish priest.

PARISH COUNCIL -- CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

1976 - 1977

My passing as chairman is an experience which produces mixed feelings - pleasure over whatever accomplishments may have been achieved and regret that passage of time has not allowed completion of our other goals.

Efforts to create a constructive and meaningful program were greatly hindered by our late approval to office and caused problems which we had to resolve immediately. Many of our efforts were hampered, to some extent, by inside and outside pressures, Too many projects and goals had to be set aside to accommodate weekly events. We have made numerous efforts to establish committees to direct these operations, but with little success. If we expect to accomplish a constructive program, we better find the time and address ourselves to the needs of this Church and affiliated organizations. I hope you will give your new Parish Council the support it needs.

There were suggestions that we discontinue the Ladies Aid this year due to the lack of interest and volunteers. Therefore, a new Ladies Aid was formulated with the knowledge and consent of Father Arshag and the Parish Council. It was suggested that new direction and programming be pursued and/or altered to meet the need of our Church. The image that the Ladies Aid is strictly the "work detail" of the Church is mistaken. I hope this committee will create a new image for the future Ladies Aid, for they are a vital organization in this church.

As you will read to the pages which follow, the creating of a new budget will cause a new financial burden on every family and person associated with this Church. We must work toward removing the roadblocks which have made it increasingly difficult for us to operate profitably and the escalating costs we are going to face in the near future. We realize that only through efficienty and constant controlling of our costs can we maintain an effective Church for you. But with your help and support (so badly needed), we can overcome all our difficulties.

I would like to thank Father Arshag for his guidence and assistance this past year. A special thanks to the individuals listed below:

Grace Hadjinian and Kappy Kaprelian: For their handling of the Church's financial problems and pledges.

Peter Tamuzian: For his assistance and printing materials.

Matt Kademian: For his ingenuity in solving the custodial problems.

Esahag Haidarian and George Balian: For correspondences and recording of our minutes.
