Although they are few in number but they are dedicated. They have had several rehearsals in the past but that is not enough. They will continue their work. They should be taught how to read and sing, and how to perform the ceremony and so forth. We still need other altar servers.

9. ACYOA Seniors:

Our Senior youth has been active during my four month residence in Midwest.

I was invited to read a lecture for them about the Divine Liturgy. The group is planning to have more and various activities in the near future.

10. Parish Council:

I want to extend my special thanks to the Parish Council for their service rendered to me and to my family. They made all the arrangements for us to move to Midwest. I appreciate their sacrifice and devotion to their church & nation.

I already worked with them for a short time. I hope we will be working together diligently for the growth and flourishment of our church and of our people.

11. Women's Guild:

Our ladies have been very active. They have done a lot of appreciable work. Bake sale was only a dream which became a reality in a very short time. The result was very satisfactory. We owe this success to the diligent members who worked continuously very hard in order to make it a special and unique one. They will have other activities too, but first they have to increase the members, the dedicated workers.
