REPORT OF ALL CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS AND PASTORS' REPORT

Pastor Fr. Zenob Nalbandian's Report for 1982

We thank the Infinite for giving us the opportunity to come together for prayer in His House and to enjoy all His goodnesses. There is no doubt that the Church is a place where people must come together to worship God; and we did it regularly every Sunday without interruption.

- 1. a) Worship: On regular Sundays we have had Morning Service and Divine Liturgy along with sermons both in Armenian and in English languages. On special Sundays (Feasts) Antasdan also was done. During Lent Vigil Services were held on Wednesdays. On Armenian Christmas Eve a special service was held where Choir members sang all the Christmas carols. We have had a service on Armenian Christmas too.
 - b) Sacraments: In 1982 we were fortunate to have seven weddings in our Church. Three infants were baptized and confirmed. There were five funerals.
- 2. Visitations: I was given the opportunity to visit almost every family of my parish. Visitations are important both for the parish priest and the parishioner. The parish priest becomes more and more involved in his parishioner's life by visiting them. On the other hand, the parishioner makes the priest and the Church a part of his life, a member of his own family. It enables the priest to understand better the difficulties of his member and to seek for remedy.

I have visited the sick at the Trinity Memorial Hospital every Saturday. I have been also at Veteran's Hospital, Mt. Sinai and St. Luke's. Upon request, Holy Communion was administered to the sick along with the prayer of healing.

I have visited the Elders' Home and have administered Holy Communion both on Christmas and Easter to those who couldn't come to Church.

I thank Mr. Kerovpe Balian, the Loosarar of our Church who came and helped me on my Home Blessing visitations.

3. Educational:

- a) Armenian School: The Armenian School once again under the superintendence of Mrs. Grace Hadjinian tried to instill Armenian spirit in our children's heartsby teaching them their native language, the language of the their ancestors.
- b) Sunday School: Mrs. Mary Hayalian did her best in educating our children in religious matters. We had a lot of students coming almost regularly each Sunday. On feast days the children were given Holy Communion. Pancake breakfast was sponsored by Sunday School.
- c) Armenian School for Adults: In spite of the poor attendance I tried to keep the Armenian School for Adults open. Learning the native language is important for every individual. Students have been taught the grammar along with the vocabulary. I like to see more and more Armenians attending to this very important class.
- d) Choir:

 Our Choir members came regularly every
 Sunday to partake of Holy Badarak.During
 Lent, they came to participate in the Vigil Service by reading and singing. Rehearsals took place every other Tuesday.
- e) Altar Servers: The two dedicated altar servers, Mr. Kerovpe Balian and Armen Hadjinian served
 at the altar regularly helping me with
 Badarak and other Church Services. For a
 short time Leif Peterson too; served at
 the altar.
- 4. Women's Guild: Our Women's Guild members devoted their energy and time to keep the Church work going smoothly. They kept our Church clean and nice. They worked hard and succeded to obtain the best result. The Lenten and Martyrs' Dinners were given by them.

 During Lenten Season a Lenten Film Strip was shown by Terry Peterson. On Martyrs' Day Dinner Prof.

 Jacob Ghazarian was invited to give a lecture about the 1915 massacre of the Armenian people.

The Women's Guild members worked hard continuously for a successful picnic. There is no question that the Bake Sale was an outstanding event. All these came to reality with the help of all members.

- 5. Newsletter: We published KEGHART newsletter regularly. We recently appointed Hampar Kaishian as the editor of Keghart. He is doing a real professional job. He gave our newsletter a new appealing look. People from different places helped improve Keghart by making donations. Keghart has now its own and separate account in the bank. We thank Hampar for the beautiful job. We thank also Kathy Kaishian for typing all the materials for our newsletter.
- 6. Lectures : A lecture and a slide presentation was given by

me at a "One Day Retreat" at St. John Arm. Church. in Greenfield. The subject was "The Divine Liturgy".

On Women's Saint Day in Waukegan I gave a lecture about the role of Armenian Women.

At Hye Camp I had "Open Discussion" with our Armenian youth.

I gave a lecture at St. Mesrob's Church in Racine at a one-day Choir regional training Seminar sponsored by the A.A.C.C.A. The subject was about the history of the feast of Theophany.

7. Chorale : The newly formed Wisconsin Armenian Chorale was only a dream which came true. It is sponsored by the three Armenian Communities of Wisconsin. The of the Chorale is to teach Armenian folk songs to the Armenian people. The first meeting and rehearsal was held on Nov. 30 at our Church. We like to see more Armenians attending.

I want to extend my thanks to all the organizations of our Church. I thank the Parish Council members for being and working with me during the whole year. All our members, according to their abilities and talents, worked hard for the growth of our Church. I thank all the members of our Church and every individual for supporting us morally, physically and financially.

Let the grace of our Lord and the love of God be with you all throughout the year.

ANNUAL SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

You are aware I am sure, that Sunday School is the most important organization in any church because they are our future parishioners.

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Our Sunday School has ten children. The attendance is down, while we have ten children only two or four show up every now and then. In the past I have been teaching the Old Testament from the Bible. This year I have been teaching the 1st Book of Matthew of the New Testament. It seems the children like the Old Testament better.

We have purchased a new flannel board and a picture book of the Divine Litury or Holy Badarak. These are visual aids and very helpful. We teach the parts of the Badarak so they will know the meaning and what the priest is doing at the altar.

It is very important that the children take Communion once a month. We are planning that first Sunday of the month of Sunday. The fellowship that Sunday will be sponsored by the Sunday School.

During Lent we usually give out mite boxes to the children to save their money during Lent, and and turn them in on Palm Sunday. This money is sent to Jerusalem to help an Armenian orphan. This year, however, the Diocese has asked that each child give \$4.00. The money willbe used for the needy children.

I want to thank Grace Hadjinian for her assistance with the children. She has been a great help. I will not be teachin. Sunday School in the future, but I would like to say it has been a fulfilling and very rewarding experience.
