PASTOR'S REPORT

1983

Thanks to the Lord for giving to us a year full of peace, health and prosperity.

The following is a report of my activities, the beginning of which pertain to that of worship and the Sacraments:

- 1. (a) WORSHIP: Both Morning Service and Divine Liturgy were a part of our Worship Service every Sunday.

 Sermons were delivered both in Armenian and English. During Lent, Sunrise Service was performed each Sunday after Badarak. Vigil Services were held on every Wednesday. Special Services were held in our Church on American and Armenian Christmas Eve.
 - (b) SACRAMENTS: One child was baptized during 1983 by me and confirmed by the Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manooqian.

There were four funerals. Grave Blessing was performed on Memorial Day with the participation of our Choir members.

2. VISITATIONS:

I visited as many families as possible. Visits to the sick, along with the administration of Holy Communion, were done at Trinity Memorial, Mt. Sinai, Veteran's and Lakeview Hospitals.

I have visited the Elders' Home and administered Holy Communion on Christmas and Easter to all those who couldn't attend Church Services.

Home Blessings were done along with the help of our Loosarar, whom I deeply thank.

3. EDUCATIONAL:

(a) Armenian School: The school was reopened to teach children their native language. The work done in this field was satisfactory. More can be done in the future, if we get the full support of each parent.

- (b) Sunday School: This school also worked to do its best in giving our children the proper spiritual nourishment. A pancake breakfast was sponsored by Sunday School.
- (c) Armenian School for Adults: This School tried to bring adults together to teach them the basics of the Armenian language. The attendance was poor, therefore, needs encouragement and more interest.
- (d) Choir: The Choir members were present each Sunday to sing Badarak. They also participated in both American and Armenian Christmas Eve Services. Rehearsals were done whenever needed. Both Requiem and Sunrise Services were sung by them. I would like to see more people joining our Choir.
- (e) Altar Servers: Our Altar Servers, Kevrope Balian and Armen Hadjinian, along with Candle-bearers, Bedros Ohanian and Mr. and Mrs. Granec's two sons, did their best to aid the priest during Mass.
- (f) Women's Guild: Women's Guild members devoted their time and effort to bring forth the expected success. They worked very hard to make the Bake Sale a success. They worked very diligently for the picnic. Whatever they did was for the upkeeping of our Church. The Church was always clean and nice. On the Women's Saints Day, our ladies attended Services which were hosted by St. Mesrob Armenian Church in Racine. The Lenten and Martyrs' Day dinners were given by Women's Guild. During the Lenten Season, a Lenten film strip was shown by Terry Peterson.
- (g) Meetings and Conferences: Parish Council meetings were held regularly every month. I would like to thank all of them for giving much of their time and effort for the service of our people.

I attended the Annual Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly, which were held in Palos Heights. I also attended the meetings which were held by the Women's Guild.

- (h) Newsletter: We published KEGHART regularly. KEGHART bulletin reflected all the past events and pertinent information regarding the functions of our Church. During the past two years, the formal Newsletter of our Church has shown a considerable improvement. Its editor, Hampar Kaishian, worked hard to make the upcoming issues more and more attractive, beautiful and interesting. Kathy Kaishian typed the materials for our Newsletter. We thank both Hampar and Kathy for their marvelous job.
- (i) Chorale: Wisconsin Armenian Chorale which was sponsored by the three Armenian Churches of this area came to its end because of its poor attendance. We should mention also that the Chorale received full support and encouragement by the So. Milwaukee Choir members who attended every rehearsal.
- (j) Miscellaneous:
- 1. Leif Peterson and Armen Hadjinian received the first four minor orders of our Church at St. Mesrob Armenian Church in Racine by the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian. I was one of the sponsors of that group ordination.
- 2. On the Sunday of the Discovery of the Holy Cross in October, we had a cultural program after Church Services. After a brief introduction about culture in general, a whole program was carried out.
- 3. On Martyr's Day dinner a lecture about the 1915 massacre of the Armenian people was given by me.

I would like to thank all those who helped us morally, physically, and financially. Let this year be another year of blessings and successes. Let our Lord give each one of us strength and courage to carry on His sacred work.

The above officers were not elected but accepted the offices on February 14, 1983.

Fellowship: This year, the Women's Guild Served fellowship alternately each month with Sunday School, Choir and Parish Council. This arrangement has been working out very well and will be continued.

Altar Flowers: Because of the poor response for altar flowers in the past, silk flowers have been purchased for the altar. However, fresh flowers were ordered for requests.

Dinners: On Sunday, March 13th, the Women's Guild sponsored their annual Lenten dinner. The dinner was well attended and a very nice program was presented by Father Zenob and Terry Peterson.

On April 24th, the Parish Council sponsored the Martyr's Day Dinner. The Women's Guild prepared and served the dinner, which was followed by a lecture program by Parish Council.

Baby Shower: On May 22nd, the Women's Guild held a baby shower for our Yeretzgin Hasmig. It was a happy and beautiful day for Yeretzgin and all the women shared in her happiness.

On June 16th we started baking for the picnic. The Women's Guild thanks all of our members for coming to Church on Thursdays during the months of June and July to help bake and prepare our bakery items. Thanks to all the women who helped us bake and also for working at the picnic in either the sweet booth or the kitchen. Everything that was made for the picnic was sold.

Bake Sale: The annual Women's Guild Bake sale was held on Friday, October 28th, and was once again, a tremendous success. Thank you again to all the women who helped bake, all of our members who donated to the bake sale, and also those who prepared lunches and donated grape leaves, etc., for us. All of these donations helped to make our bake sale a success - a success of \$2,000.00!

Sacristy: There have been two new items made for our Church this year. The table in the Sacristy was in need of a new floor length tablecloth, and we now have a new covering for the table that has been sewn by Rose Hadjinian. Rose also made a new skirt for the Tomb, which is used during Holy Week. She used the antique lace from the old skirt and applied it to the new one, and we will appreciate it during Holy Week.

The Women's Guild also purchased two pair of ornate slippers which were needed and will be used on the Altar.

HyeKamp: Women's Guild received a letter from HyeKamp requesting that all churches in the Midwest prepare and send one complete meal for about 150 Hye Kamp participants during the week of Hye Kamp. Our Women's Guild complied with their request and sent enough ham, french fries, rolls, milk and pudding to be served during one of their meals.

Purchases: The Women's Guild has purchased a chafing dish, an extra insert deep pan, and two large plastic salad bowls with tongs, for use for our buffet dinners. The two salad bowls match our round, oval and square trays and will compliment our buffet table.

Sunshine: Get well cards and sympathy cards were sent to all of our members during the year.

Funerals: We were requested to serve four Requiem Dinners this year.

Cleaning: During the year, the guild did the dusting, cleaning, etc., with the Sacristy being taken care of by Namzar Kaprelian. In December, the guild had the church professionaly cleaned by Mr. Al. Stelzer.

Parish Council Donation: This year, as in the past, the Women's Guild will present Parish Council sixty percent of their savings. These figures will be found in the financial report.

Thank you: In this last paragraph, I would like to thank Father Zenob Nalbandian, our President of the Women's Guild, for being part of our organization and for being with us during our meetings and taking part with us in all of our functions throughout the year. I must also thank Yeretzgin Hasmig. She came to help us during our picnic and bake sale preparations. We learned a lot of secrets about baking from her and appreciated all her help.

My thanks to Arsha Boyajian - our Kitchen Chairman. With her expertise with large quantity reciepes, we knew everything we baked would be the best..and it was. Arsha, you never get tired - Thank you!
