

Our thanks to to the Lord for providing us with a year full of health and success. By the will and strength of God we tried to be faithful in His sacred work by being loyal and obedient to His Word.

The Church doors were open every Sunday for our faithful to come and worship God.

WORSHIP: Every Sunday, regularly, Morning Service and Divine
Liturgy were the main parts of our worship. Appropriate sermons were
delivered by me both in Armenian and English languages. Also, Divine
Liturgy was celebrated on Christmas Eve. During Lent, Arevakal or Sunrise Service was conducted every Sunday after Badarak. Lenten Vigil
Services were held on Wednesday evenings.

Other religious services: I have conducted the following services: 1. One baptism at St. George's in Waukegan.

- 2. Seven funeral services.
- 3. One funeral service at St. Mesrob in Racine.
- 4. Grave blessing on Memorial Day at our cemetery.
- 5. Requiem services in our Church.
- 6. Grape blessing at Hye Camp.

Visitations: I visited the parishioners on various occasions.

After the two major feasts (Christmas and Easter), I was given the opportunity to visit almost every family and bless their homes. My visits were used also to establishing a close relationship between the individual and the Church. Thus, one of our main topics was our commitment to our Church. Being active in the Church shows only a part of our commitment. The true commitment, however, that the Church today demands of each one of us is a religious one. I truly accept

that this is a hard decision for all of us. To give ourselves willingly and unselfishly for the service of the Lord and Mankind requires tremendous sacrifice on our part. We can only make such a decision in our lives when we have attained a new level of conscience.

Every Saturday I visited the sick at the Trinity Memorial Hospital. Also those at Veteran's, Mt. Sinai, St. Luke's and St. Mary's. Holy Communion was administered to the sick along with the prayer of healing.

I visited the Elders' Homes and spent some time talking with the elderly and learning from their experience. Holy Communion was given to all those who could not attend church services.

Here I would like to mention Mr. Kerovpe Balian's name and thank him for accompanying me everywhere as the Loosarar of our Church.

Other Visits: Upon special arrangement by the Primate, I celebrated three Masses at St. George's in Waukegan. On this occasion I have visited the sick both at homes and hospitals.

Educational: a) Armenian and Sunday schools were open despite the poor attendance. These schools are extremely important for our children because they learn their native language and grow in the spirit of the Lord.

- b) Armenian school for adults: I always encouraged the young, the adult to come and learn Armenian. It is not enough for the young to say that they are Armenians and that they feel themselves as Armenians but never know how to speak, write and read Armenian. This point has always been taken for granted. I hope this can be worked out in the future with your help and encouragement.
 - c) Choir: Our choir members have always been there

whenever we needed them. Holy Badarak, Requiem, Arevakal, both American and Armenian Christmas Eve services were made possible with their help. For the first few months choir rehearsals were being done regularly. Rehearsals help the choir members not only to sing correctly but it also helps to learn new hymns and songs, and thus, extend their knowledge in Church Music.

d) Altar Servers: Serving on the Altar is not only a duty but also a privilege. Mr. Kerovpe Balian, Armen Hadjinian, Bedros Ohanian, and also Leif Peterson served on the Altar.

- a. I presided at the Parish Council meetings
- b. I attended the Clergy Conference and the Diocesan Assembly
- c. I attended the Midwest Regional meetings in Waukegan.
- d. I attended the Regional meeting for Midwest area parishes held in Chicago.
- e. I attended Women's Guild meetings
- f. I attended the local clergy meetings

Parish Council: There were nine members on the Parish Council this year. We have had Parish Council meetings regularly. We worked cooperatively and diligently during the whole year. All of them did their best for the improvement of the Church and for the spiritual satisfaction of every faithful member.

Women's Guild: Our ladies, this year, worked very hard. The Church was always kept clean. Both the picnic and the Bake Sale were successful because of their tremendous support. We really appreciate their devotion of time and effort to the Church. On the Women's Saints Day, our ladies

hosted the members of the sister churches of the area.

Newsletter: The official newsletter of our Church "Keghart" was published regularly. The bulletin reflected extensively all the events of our Church. It provided the parishioners with every information about the Church activities. Its editor, Hampar Kashian, has to be commended for his exceptional and marvelous job. All the issues were carefully prepared and put together. Both Kathy Kaishian and Mary Haiderian typed all the materials for the Newsletter. Our appreciation for a job well done.

Visiting Clergymen: 1. Very Rev. Fr. Shnork Kasparian visited our parish and celebrated Mass in our Church. 2. A priest from Armenia paid a short visit to our parish.
