

Dear Parishioners:

"As ye sow, so shall ye reap." -

We are now planting our seeds for the future of our youth in this church. Our new Armenian School teacher, Susan Dadian, and our Sunday School teacher, Mary Hayalian, are very enthusiastic and eager for a new beginning with our young people and will begin classes on Sunday, February 9, 1986, at 10:00 am.

Our visiting clergyman, Very Reverend Papken Anoushian, has an infectious enthusiasm for our church and its congregation. We have extablished a series of dates on which he will visit this community for the remainder of this year. You will find a listing of these dates enclosed. He knows our strengths and our weaknesses and wishes to work with us to grow together. In fact, he is surprised that with all the adversity that our parish has faced in the past years that we still exist and remain strong.

Yet unfortunately, we continue to face adversity to this day with some of our own members. Some of you feel that the church is obliged to serve your every need whenever you call and yet you hesitate or refuse to support your church when it calls you. Signing checks with "dues paid in full" when enclosing one-quarter or one-half of the amount necessary to be considered full payment is one way that you sadly shirk your responsibilities.

Another is that some of you parishioners feel that your attendance at church is not necessary. We have young couples that get married in our church and then remain non-members without any financial contributions to the church until they would like to have their child baptized.

Some parishioners choose to stay away from the Annual Assemblies and then complain all year long that the dues are too high. You parishioners expect the church to host important events such as the annual picnic, which is a major source of revenue for the church, and then beg-off stating "I'm too busy" when asked to help. This leaves the same individuals to toil and perservere to get the job done when they themselves are also very busy, but not so busy nor proud to ignore the needs of their church.

You expect the Parish Council to keep the doors open and the bills paid, but you offer us little or no assistance in getting these important duties accomplished. Many are quick to complain when matters are not quickly expedited. Please keep in mind that we are few in number and have our own lives and responsibilities to think of as well. We are simply doing the very best that we can on our own. Page Two

It has been very easy for some of you to be a non-member or a marginal member and yet reap the full benefits as dues-paying members of our church. The days of the "free ride" are over. The time has come for us to take a significant choice in our lives. If we are to be members of this church, then we must decide to support it. The church in turn has many benefits and services to offer its members. We members will continue to enjoy these services and benefits at a reasonable cost, if any cost at all. Non-members should not be allowed to receive these same services at a low rate, but should have to pay dearly for them since they give nothing to our church physically, financially nor spiritually. Additionally, some of our members proclaim themselves a hardship case regarding dues payment. Only the Parish Council can decide who is a hardship case after reviewing a written request which is sent to them as agreed upon at previous Annual Assemblies. To date, no requests have been received by the Parish Council. Therefore, everyone is expected to pay the full amount of dues as many of you do now.

Remember, to be allowed to vote at this year's assembly, you must have your dues paid in full.

If some of you feel that you will be better off remaining as a non-member, please reconsider. You will soon find out that you would have been far better off paying the reasonable dues rates of \$4.00 per week and enjoying the benefits of membership, than to pay the very high rates as a non-member for those same services.


If you choose to do some comparing, you will find that our dues assessment is the lowest of any Armenian church in southeast Wisconsin, and that our benefits, such as a beautiful church building with its own private cemetery; the services of a young, energetic, enthusiastic priest; a dedicated group of fine choir members and altar servers; and our close ties with the Diocese; rank very highly as compared with those of the other churches. The choice is then yours.

We expect to see and hear from you on Sunday, February 9, 1986. The Annual Assembly will follow a brief fellowship in the church hall after Divine Liturgy.

The church is going to survive very well with those of you who choose to make a partnership for the future with her. The young people we now have in church will serve as our inspiration and in time, they will be joined by others. The Very Reverend Papken Anoushian will be visiting all of us in our homes to get to know us better on a personal level. New groups will spring up and old friendships will be renewed as well as new friendships made. We urge you to cast aside your barriers and share in the light with your friends at Holy Resurrection.

Very Reverend Papken Anoushian opened the meeting with a prayer at 1:10 pm. Parish Council Chairman Leif Peterson entertained nominations for Chairman of the meeting. Charley Kademian was nominated. The chair then entertained a motion to close the nominations. Charley Kademian was unanimously elected Chairman.

CharCharley Kademian then asked for nominations for Secretary of the meeting. Terry Ann Peterson was nominated as was Malina Bedrosian. There was a motion that the nominations be closed. The nomination was seconded. Terry Ann Peterson was elected Secretary.
