PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT.

Der Guregh, in one of his first sermons to us, stated that the end of a year and the advent of a new year was a time to take stock, a time to see where we had been and a time to set the course for the direction in which we move in the new year.

This report is the account and evaluation of our past year and an attempt to point out some of our future needs.

It was a difficult year, as was the year before, without the services of a full-time priest. The total responsibility of carrying the work forward depended on the lay members of our community. We want to take this opportunity to thank the congregation for remaining faithful, trusting, hopeful, and for being patient for the past few years.

Your Board of Trustees has met regularly and done its best to carry forth the work it was entrusted. We have collected membership dues... kept up official records...prepared bulletins and other matters...organized and carried through preparations for the annual Madagh...sponsored several functions throughout the year...hosted two Midwest regional meetings...arranged for the assignment of a full-time parish priest... taken care of bills incurred by our parish...assisted with arrangements for weddings, funerals and christenings...cooperated with all of our church organizations...and acted as liason between our community and our visiting pastor and with the Diocese. We have extended our hospitality to visiting clergy and dignitaries. I extend in behalf of our parish our thanks to all the members of the Board who worked diligently and gave of their time and effort.

We wish also to express our thanks to all the church organizations for continuing to be actively involved in our church work. We want to thank the Ladies' Aid for making our task easier by serving at funeral receptions, Midwest Regional meetings, Madagh, etc.

We want to thank all those who served weekly at the altar, with particular thanks to Deacon Charles J. Hardy, as well as our subdeacons, acolytes, members of the choir, Sunday School teachers and Armenian School staff.

We wish to thank the Very Rev. Vasken Tatoyan for serving our needs during the past two years and to the Rev. Krikor Hairabedian for his weekly Bible Study on a voluntary basis.

We are happy and grateful to have the Rev. Guregh Yetenekian as our Parish Priest. This does not mean that we can all now breathe a sigh

of relief and drop out of the picture expecting Der Guregh to do all which took many to do previously. It means we can act as a team again, he being the quarterback and we providing the guarding and blocking to open up a path for him to lead us to our set goals.

The Building Committee is to be commended for the long hours of deliberations and planning for our new church. The congregation has shown faith in their work by continuing with their pledges even without the services of a full-time priest.

While much of our efforts in the past has been to keep ourselves together physically, we hope that we will begin to think about and look for more ways to serve our older people and our youth. Our Church is in difficulty from the Diocesan level to the local level with our youth. The National ACYOA has requested permission to disband. We must take a stand in our local parish and strengthen our youth organization. We must look for ways in which young people can become more actively involved in church life. One only has to note what portion of the monies collected has been spent on youth activities to see what importance we have given this matter to date. We must remember that the youth is our future congregation.

Our sincerest thanks to the Altar Society, a group which was appointed by Hayr Soorp, for their contribution of time and professional service. Two newly-formed committees whose contributions will be important during the year are the Membership Committee and the Madagh Re-evaluation Committee.

I'd like to express my personal thanks to all members of the Council for their fine cooperation and service; and to the outgoing members Peter Gengozian, Benjamin Kamakian, and Adam Chalekian, our deepest gratitude for their two years of service.

DEACON'S REPORT

From a check of the church records of the past year, 1971, the following facts are noted:

1. Attendance -- 180 Average (Sundays with Priest)
-- 85 Average (Sundays with No Priest)
2. Baptisms -- 6
3. Funerals -- 8
4. Weddings -- 3

The above figures follow quite closely those of the previous year.

I mentioned the need for an altar society in last year's report. It is my pleasure to report that our church once again has an altar society consisting of the following members: Mrs. Gene Chardukian, Chairman; Mrs. Elizabeth Derhovsepian, Mrs. Edward Kaprelian, and Mrs. Mary Katibian. The Parish Council contributed an initial sum of \$100.00 to the society so that it could immediately begin its work. The altar society has undertaken the repairs of the altar of the crucifixion with the assistance of several parishioners. It has also sewn the deacon's black robe, the sub-deacons' stoles (corars), and purchased slippers for the acolytes. A number of parishioners have contributed to the cost of these items. The altar society has also taken a complete inventory of all church vestments and altar vessels.

A junior acolyte society was also formed during the past year. It consists of ten boys who have met with me to learn the rubrics of the liturgy. These boys are now regularly holding candles.

The senior acolyte society has also met several times. There are also ten boys in this group. They are in the process of learning the censuring and the litanies.

We hope that with the help of God, all of these activities will be expanded in the months to come.

During the past year your Building Committee worked diligently toward achieving one objective: the completion of plans for our Church complex. We're happy to report progress in the following areas:

1. Plans and Specifications. After a number of revisions your committee was able to accept a building design to meet our overall needs.
2. Contract Bids. Following rejection of the early bids, we have managed to get the contract figures down to a point our Parish can handle financially.
3. Financial. We estimate over and above our own resources, we will have to borrow about \$160,000 to pay for the total project. The F & M Bank has agreed to loan this sum at a 6% interest rate on a 20-year basis. We feel fortunate having secured a loan at a favorable interest rate.

With the overall support of our membership we can look forward to the realization of our goal during 1972. We are very encouraged by the progress made so far. At present it appears we may be able to break ground about March 1. If we do not run into any unexpected delays, we should be able to use our new facilities some time during the Fall or Winter of 1972.

While it appears our building goal will be reached in 1972, the real success of our planning lies in the continued support of all members. Now more than ever all members must re-evaluate their pledge and give according to their means and their conscience.
