


PARISH COUNCIL ASSEMBLY Sunday October 9, 1988

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 p.m. by Chairman Mel Hagopian, with an opening prayer led by Der Hayr.

The Parish meeting minutes from May 29, 1988 was read and approved with 68 in attendance.

Mel Hagopian reported that from 1983 to the present we have been running \$3,000.00 a year in the red. As we do borrow from the Permanent Trust the said money is returned to the Permanent Trust and as a result we are always in a deficit. In 1988 we borrowed \$10,000.00 from the Permanent Trust in which we will not be returning so that we don't run in a deficit. Mel also pointed out that \$63.00 of the \$75.00 dues is sent to the Diocese. Some parishioners gave their opinions and disapprovals on the \$5.00 assessment and should not have taken place without a Parish Assembly. A letter that had been sent out to Parish members stated if they did not pay the \$5.00 they would not be eligible to vote at the Annual Parish Meeting. Mike Garoukian requested a clarification on the \$5.00 assessment to be presented at the next meeting. Mel reported he and his crew will again seek dues from parishioners and also the Ways and Means Committee will be helping to generate more funds.

Sam Kaprelian, Treasurer gave his report through October 1988. Out of the 250 members, 69 pledge on a weekly basis and 10 pledge a flat sum. The average weekly plate is \$55.00. Cash balance as of October 3, 1988 is \$6,749.43. Estimated expenditures for October 1988 will be \$8,000.00, November 1988 \$7,000.00, December \$8,500.00. Budget \$109,000.00, and will begin 1989 with \$5,000.00 cash. Sam then handed each member a copy of his financial report through October 9, 1988.

Sam Akgulian reported the altar curtain is now being operated manually and hopefully a permanent rod by November 1988.

With regards to the air conditioner, Sam Akgulian reported United Mechanical would install a 15 ton unit for \$14,100.00 for the Sanctuary only. This price does not include the electric power wiring. Mike Garoukian made a motion to take up to \$15,000.00 out of Permanent Trust and was seconded. Elsie Garoukian made a motion that members in attendance constitute a quorum and a secret ballot take place. This was done with 34 voted NO and 17 voted YES for the air conditioner.

Mel Hagopian announced February 19, 1989 the date for the Annual Parish Council Meeting in the church hall. All should have their budget completed and due by December 5, 1988.

July 9, 1989 is the date for the Festival on the Lakefront.

Elsie Garoukian questioned why special committees, i.e., stain glass, organ, do not turn in excess monies to the Parish Council. These special committees are appointed and not elected.

Mary Ann Injasoulian stressed and pleaded for members and workers for the Woman's Guild.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:40 p.m. with a closing prayer.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

By God's grace as your spiritual shepherd, I have completed another year of ministry in our Lord's vineyard of the St. Mesrob Armenian Church of Racine. As the Church of Jesus Christ, we have endeavored to live out His message of good news and promise of salvation attempting at all times to choose what is right, seeking the wisdom to determine among you all what is good in the eyes of our Heavenly Father.

From the altar of God and fountain of worship where we weekly offer ourselves at prayer, it is my hope that we have hopefully found what we seek -- choosing what is right and understanding our mission as Christians -- that is to seek the good in this world. However, in the flesh of my own body I am subject to failure, weakness and imperfection and knowingly or unknowingly I may have not been at all times what I should be. If I have failed you in any way, I ask for your prayers and patience and above all forgiveness of any offenses. The responsibilities placed upon my shoulders at ordination are the primary focus of my life and I seek to choose what is right -- as I pray weekly at the Badarak

I continue my visitations, as assigned by our Primate, to the St. George Church of Waukegan and Holy Resurrection Church of South Milwaukee as visiting pastor in the absence of a permanent priest.

This year I had the privilege to join the volunteer staff at St. Luke's Hospital as an 'On Call Chaplain'. I have offered and received as well many blessings through this ministry.

Educational

We have been invited to address and speak to various non-Armenian groups about our church, culture and people.

Our Church School in their weekly classes and on going religious programs continues to provide and teach our youth the essential building blocks of our Orthodox Faith. In May we were saddened with the death of our dear friend and former co-ordinator Ms. Hunaz Hazarian in May of 1988. She truly left an indelible mark and spirit with

both the students and staff members and that spirit lives within our hearts always. Replacing her is the present Co-ordinator Lauren Chalekian who served as assistant with Hunaz. Lauren's expertise and sound capabilities has enabled a smooth transition. To her and her dedicated staff of teachers and workers, we extend our sincere thanks. The Christian education no dcubt is 'the foundation' of the future of our parish here in Racine.

Bible Study sessions are still conducted under our guidance, twice a month. We encourage all who wish to learn more of Holy Scripture as understood in the Armenian Orthodox Tradition to attend.

We conducted a successful Adult Armenian Language semester for 3 months. With an enrollment of 14 students much progress was made in teaching the basics of conversation.

Eleven of our young boys were prepared for service in the Armenian Church as Altar Servers. Twice a morth they gathered to learn the fundamental rubrics of serving as acolytes and were subsequently ordained by the Primate Abp. Torkom on April 16th. He is one of our community's worthy teachers and to him we all offer our thanks. On the occasion of the Primate's visit in April, Deacon Charles Hardy was awarded by the Diocese the St. Vartan Award, for his many years of dedicated service to the St. Mesrob Community.

On the same occasion, Ms. Janet Cherkinian was presented by the Pastor and Primate the "ST. MESROB MASHDOTZ" Award for 25 years of dedicated service as our parish organist. To both Dn. Chuck and Janet we offer our prayers and good wishes.

Our young adults have had the opportunity to once again attend the summer sessions of the St. Nersess Seminary Summer Studies Conferences held at our Seminary in New York. Attending this year were:

ARMENIAN EARTHQUAKE AND RELIEF EFFORTS

On December 7, 1988, 4 major cities and 158 villages and towns were devastated in Armenia by the worst earthquake to strike since the 15th century (1400's). The world Armenian and non-Armenian communities and nations were truly numbed and paralyzed by the loss of life which numbers in the 10's of thousands and the unimaginable destruction. Major relief efforts have taken place in every corner of the earth to come to the aid of the survivors. Virtually, every nation has participated with financial and physical assistance. The responses both monetarily and with supplies has truly been overwhelming. Already worldwide, one billion dollars collectively in money and supplies has been given; but this is only a fraction of what it will take to recover the physical restructuring of Armenia -- not to mention the long range recovery of physiological and emotional trauma; but at least it is a beginning.

Locally Armenians of SE Wisconsin have collaborated efforts to continue our tasks in a humanitarian way. In Racine alone over \$40,000.00 has been realized in cash contributions. Both St. Mary's and St. Luke's hospitals have sent medical supplies. Milwaukee area residents have contributed in excess of \$75,000.00 in cash, plus supplies. The area Armenian Church communities and philanthropic groups have formed a coalition to continue relief efforts gaining the support of Governor Thompson and all assistance the State of Wisconsin can provide.

This is a satisfying beginning, but only a beginning. The work and needs will continue 5 to 10 years down the road. We must stand ready and respond to every form of assistance necessary, whenever and however possible.

In Conclusion

As the year begins we are confronted with such pressing problems as a church faced with:

- a) The shortage of priests
- b) The lack of adequate teachers and leaders
- c) The ever existing indifference to our Christian call and ethnic roots and identity.
- d) The declining interest and involvement of so many in the Armenian Church communities.

Let us not lose sight that for almost 1700 years we have lived as a Church under oppressive forces and have survived. Our survival for tomorrow depends upon knowledge, knowledge of who we are, what we have offered to the world and what we have yet to give. As an Armenian Church community, we can only bear fruit if the tree of life is a healthy one nourished by our faith. Let us reflect on the words of scripture wherein we read.

"Build yourselves up on your most holy faith,

Pray in the Holy Spirit;

Keep yourselves in the Love of God

Wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life."

(Jude: 20-21)

During the year 1988, one major project was completed. A new altar curtain rod and track and motor was installed. We now have a permanent track that was made for our heavy curtain and a motor that opens and closes the curtain very smoothly.

When the year 1989 began, the Parish Council was over \$10,000.00 in debt. We had to borrow from the Permanent Trust Fund to keep our church operating. I am pleased to report that after spending around \$3,800.00 for the track and motor, we now owe the Permanent Trust Fund just under \$10,000.00. We are looking forward to our projected budget for 1989, and cutting this deficit in half.

Our Festival Committee should be given a large "Thank You", for their many hours of labor. They have gained some very valuable experience this first year "downtown", and are also looking forward to Armenian Fest 1989.

It is also with sincere gratitude that our Parish Council acknowledge all of our dedicated church organizations, who have contributed so much for the success and operation of our church.

Our Projects Committee, though small in number, really do a Herculean job of keeping our church clean and up-to-date.

We on the Parish Council are eagerly looking forward to 1989, and the challenges before us. We know with the love and help of our parishioners, our Christian committment will continue to grow.

It has been an extreme pleasure to serve as your Parish Council Chairman, and I want to thank my colleagues on the Council for their support and help.

Educational Committee

The Educational Committee though inactive has been fortunate to retain the services of its treasurer Deacon Charles Hardy. Presently we are searching for individuals who would be willing and interested to serve on this committee. The work of the Educational Committee is to oversee and implement Armenian Language instruction for all ages, to promote and plan programs on Armenian Culture, Music, Arts and Literature to the community for their cultural enrichment and developmental appreciation of their Armenian Heritage. With the acquisition of a new VCR and screen we have begun to build a resource of educational videos on Armenian topics. These goals can only be successfully achieved by the active participation of our community.

During this past year from January to April, Fr. Garabed conducted weekly Adult Armenian language class centering on conversation with some attention given to grammar and vocabulary building. There was an enrollment of 14 students who faithfully attended and strengthened their knowledge of the Armenian language. It was our hope to continue this during the following year; however, the services of a teacher could not be successfully procured. This "extra ministry" of the pastor indeed has been appreciated, however, he only or alone cannot do everything. He must have help! If there is anyone who cares to come forward to teach Armenian, please let that person approach the pastor or any parish council member.

The status of Armenian language education and cultural development is very weak here in this parish and in general throughout the midwest. There are presently NO Armenian Schools or programs of any sort being conducted within any of our midwest diocesan parishes. This is an alarming factor. In claiming Armenian ancestry as a prideful quality at the same time becomes an embarrassment when we ourselves know little about who we are.

This report has been presented to stimulate our thoughts and hope-fully arouse interest for future activity.
