

#### SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING Sunday, November 12, 1989

The Special Parish Assembly Meeting was opened by Parish Council Chairman, George Stevoff, at 11:44 a.m. Father Kochakian led us in an opening prayer.

It was moved by Mike Vidian that all that were present would constitute a quorum. Shockey Gengozian seconded the motion. Approved.

The minutes were read by Gary Vidian, Acting Secretary, from the previous Special Parish Assembly Meeting on Sunday, October 15, 1989. A correction to the minutes was brought up by Chairman Stevoff, that any reference to the Parish Assembly Meeting in February shall be referred to as the Annual Parish Assembly Meeting. The correction was made. Chairman Stevoff then asked for any additional corrections or changes to the minutes. A motion was made by Mike Vidian to approve the minutes, seconded by Arthur Musurlian, Approved.

A motion was made by Sarkis Cherkinian that the Stained Glass Window Committee be given permission to continue with the publication of the book. The motion was seconded by Art Cherkinian.

Father Garabed Kochakian was called upon by Chairman Stevoff to elaborate on the status and need of the publication. Question and answer period followed.

Recommendation was made by Shockey Gengozian that if this issue was put to vote, she would suggest a closed ballot vote. This was accepted by Chairman Stevoff, but to be delivered later in the meeting following question and answer.

Elsie Garoukian made a motion that we have a closed ballot vote. Chairman Stevoff then clarified that closed ballot would be referred to as secret ballot. Shockey Gengozian seconded the motion. Majority were in favor of a secret ballot vote.

Chairman Stevoff acknowledged that the absentee ballots that were received, would be invalid for the vote results, due to the fact that absentee ballots are not recognized according to our stated church bylaws.

The votes were tallied by Tom Janikian and Adam Chalekian. The results were read by Chairman Stevoff: 25 yes and 24 no. Chairman Stevoff indicated to the Stained Glass Window Committee that cautionary measures should still be taken to reduce the total cost of the publication.

Sam Cherkianian made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Murad Gengozian. The meeting was adjourned at 1:36 p.m. Father Kochakian led with a closing prayer.

#### Visitations/Ministry to the Infirm

We continue to reach out to our faithful thru home visitation, especially to those who are infirm and unable to attend weekly worship. We offer prayer, administer the Sacrament to them and extend moral and spiritual support with the help of the newly formed "Good Samaritans" group of the Women's Guild. We regularly attempt to visit the shut-ins, as well as those residents in local nursing homes.

We have had many non-Armenian, as well as Armenian Clergymen visit St. Mesrob Parish throughout the year.

I continue my visitations to the South Milwaukee Parish of the Holy Resurrection, celebrating the Badarak on Saturday evenings. During 1989, a total of 15 Divine Liturgies were celebrated for which the St. Mesrob Parish was duly financially rewarded for offering its pastoral charitable service to a sister parish in need.

#### Earthquake Relief

Our Patriarch H. H. Vasken I, along with H. H. Karekin II of the Illustrious House of Cilicia, visited America in February, seeking the support of American Armenians in the rebuilding process of Armenia, following the devastating earthquake of December 7th, 1988. Along with all clergy of the Diocese, I was summoned to New York to meet with both the Patriarch and Antelias Catholicos.

Our community mobilized their efforts in packing clothing airlifted to Armenia during the month of March. Along with workers from the Holy Resurrection, St. John and St. Hagop parishes, new and used clothing was sent to Armenia.

In April, a children's gathering was held in Milwaukee for four young victims of the Earthquake. Many of our youth attended and met first-hand the survivors. This contact, all the more, re-inforced the reality of the earthquake, by touching the lives of those youngsters and their guardians and parents.

#### Educational

I have had opportunity to represent our Parish and the Armenian Church in many eucumenical gatherings, there lecturing and informing others about our faith, culture and tradition.

our 'young' church has learned the fundamentals of their Christian Faith and its particular Armenian Expression.

#### Armenian Culture

During the fall, under the auspices of the newly formed Armenian Heritage Committee (formerly the Educational Committee), Adult Armenian language classes were conducted. Mrs. Hourig Tcheurekdjian rendered her expertise to a faithful group, who attended weekly classes which ran for a 10 week period. Their interest has sparked the program to continue.

Also, this new Heritage Committee will endeavor to offer programs of entertainment, as well, regarding the Armenian Cultural experience. With their hard work, they presented a most interesting display at the Armenian Fest during July. Our thanks to Dn. Charles Hardy, Ann Cherkinian, Harold and Mariam Sahakian and Alice Hazarian for their zeal and dedication.

#### Bible Study

We have continued our fellowship of the St. Mesrob Bible Study group. For eight years of my ministry here in Racine, I have shared with these same participants the opportunity to lead discussions based on scripture by reading and studying both Old and New Testaments. This year, our Diocese mandated that all parishes should have Bible Study groups. We encourage anyone interested in learning about the 'Holy Writ' to join us when we meet.

#### Youth

The ACYOA Jrs. remain to be an active group in our Parish, assisting whenever called upon, the work of the church. One of the highlights of their community endeavors in the name of St. Mesrob, was the Walk-A-Thon for Armenian Earthquake Relief, by which they raised over \$1,000.00 to send to Armenia.

Five of the ACYOA Jrs., Magill Weber, Gina Korakian, Laura Derderian, Haig Tcheurekdjian and Joey Gabrielian attended the St. Nersess Summer Study Conference at the Seminary. This broadening experience has enriched their lives and has sparked an interest in others to attend in future years. We thank the advisors, Seta Andekian, Michael Kaprelian and Margie Korakian for lending their assistance.

With the celebration of 100 years in America, this year we enter a new decade 1990 and will close a century toward the year 2000. In the year 2001, the Armenian Church worldwide will celebrate a milestone; 1700 years of the burning of the flame of Christ in the institution called the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church.

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The year 1989 was an exciting and interesting year for the Parish Council who in keeping with the by-laws of the Diocese, strive to communicate with all organizations and individuals within the parish to keep a free flow of knowledge of our activities, responsibilities and requirements. We reviewed our expectations with the various parish organizations and proceeded to meet with the executive bodies of all of them.

At these meetings, we reviewed relationships, goals, expectations, responsibilities and any other questions that arose. It afforded the organizations an opportunity to have a dialogue with the Parish Council with a clear understanding of the relationship that should exist. Parish Council Members participated in the question and answer sessions which allowed them to have insight into the respective organizations.

The meetings set the stage for the relationship that currently exists which should continue in the future. It is a relationship based upon openness and understanding for each other's responsibility.

The Parish Council also met with the parish's salaried employees and reviewed the duties and responsibilities which again were for the benefit of the Parish Council Members as well as the employees.

In keeping with a policy of openness and exchange of information, the Parish Council called for a special parish assembly at which time all items of interest either to the parish council or any members of the parish were discussed. The purpose of the special assembly as announced was for informative purposes only at which time no formal business would be conducted. As a result, an issue did arise which was subsequently resolved in a special assembly that was convened for that purpose. The Parish Council feels strongly that open communications with all members and organizations is the proper manner in which to answer and resolve questions that arise. We sincerely urge all parishioners to communicate with us directly on any issue that concerns them.

Some of the issues addressed by the Parish Council and not totally resolved are the formation of a "Outreach Committee" and "Long Range Financial Planning Committee." We find a need to communicate with individuals in our community who are not members and relay to them our desire to have them join our parish. There is also a need to have current parish members more involved in the activities of the parish. On the financial side, it is important that we review the demographics of the parish and determine where our revenues will be coming from, not only this year and next year, but five and 10 years into the future so we may arrange or perhaps rearrange our financial position not only with the expenses that will arise, but the amount and source of the revenues.

The Parish Council is also committed to preparing a revised "Parishioners Handbook and Policy Manual" which was last printed in 1985. The manual serves as a guideline for many questions that arise and becomes especially valuable to new members.

A review of our financial condition for 1989 which is contained elsewhere in this annual report will reflect the Parish Council's diligent concern for the ever important financial stability of the parish.

The Parish Council recognizes there are continuing financial concerns which fall into the area of repairs and maintenance but feel with proper planning, the concerns should be surmountable. Our Projects Committee continues to oversee the maintenance of our physical structure with proper diligence. Their single largest need has been and continues to be the need for volunteers to assist during the summer months.

Once again, our Festival Committee has performed outstandingly creating a successful festival and as importantly giving us a sense of direction for the future by answering many of the questions which have arisen as a result of our relocating at the new festival site.

Both the Stained Glass Committee and the Organ Fund Committee have completed their designated projects and have been dissolved with all excess funds turned over to the parish treasurer. We thank both of these committee members for their services.

The Ways & Means Committee continues to plan activities in the name of the Parish Council and will be available to all parish organizations for their suggestions for activity and fund raising projects. Several functions were performed directly by the Ways & Means Committee. Their detailed activities appear elsewhere in this report. We extend our appreciation to them also.

To enumerate all of the parishioners who have served with us for the year would fill this report. We wish to thank all of you that have given so generously of your time, talent and money. The strength of our parish is derived from its membership and this Parish Council is proud to have played its part in maintaining the St. Mesrob Parish in its leadership role.

#### Armenian Portraits of Faith

The beginning of the Book

With the available finances remaining after the fabrication and installation of the beautiful stained glass windows, thought was given by the Stained Glass Committee to expanding on a project to further promote the artistic and educational value of the windows which presented the Armenian Church, her history and faith. The idea of the publication of a book, showing the windows replicated in full color with a commentary explaining the imagery, theology and meaning of each window in the Armenian tradition, came forth from the Window Committee. The project was presented by the Window Committee to the Parish Council (1986) for consideration and approval and received endorsement. Thus plans moved ahead.

Committee member, Ardis Cherkinian, Treasurer, presented the idea to a local publisher, E. J. Hill of Racine, for guidance. Emily Hill met with members of the committee and the pastor to draw up a plan. After receiving the number of windows and the nature and scope of the project, she was able to better advise the Window Committee how to proceed.

The committee then decided areas that needed to be addressed -

- authorship of text
- photography of windows
- design of book
- layout/typesetting of text
- editorship and proof reading
- procuring bids of printers and varied processes
- marketing of publication

The committee asked Fr. Garabed to author the text, since he had worked with the artists during the fabrication of the windows. He agreed to do this task and offered his work as a donation to St. Mesrob. The publishing, which encumbered the layout, typesetting and bidding, was offered by Emily Hill, as a gesture of good will, because she had a close friendship with Ardis and Ann. The editing, which gave shape to the text, was done by Ann Cherkinian. All the photography work, shooting the slides and then retaking them was done by Peter Sherinian. Proof reading was done by Yeretzgin Roberta Kochakian. Also numerous iterations of the text (numbering 16 versions) were passed on to readers of other publishing houses, i.e. Magraw Hill of NYC, Harcourt Brace, by Mrs. Hill.

Bids for printing of the book were procurred by the publisher from Tru-Line and Angel Printers, both local printers. Specifics in printing were the following:

- Color Separations

- Prep Charges

- Press

- Stock (Paper)

Bindery

- Case Binding and Shipping

After several negotiations over the three years of production, and thru the efforts of Sam Akgulian, the present price for the entire project was reduced from \$20,710.00 to \$16,300.00 from Tru-Line. At present, available finances from the initial donations for the fabrication of the windows (over a three year period, gathering interest) is \$18,934.00.

Additional funding from benefactors outside Racine was suggested to lower our costs and this was pursued. Two additional donors, each gifting \$1,000.00, helped defray the total costs by another \$2,000.00. They were Mr. William Nahikian of Racine and Mr. and Mrs. George Krikorian and son, of Worcester, Massachusetts.

After printing, books will be given as gifts to the original donors of the windows. The remaining (approx.) 450 books would be sold (price to be determined) and would become a source of revenue for the St. Mesrob Parish, until the supply is depleted.

This publication has a multi-faceted value. The courage of this committee and the individuals involved to produce such a volume is certainly a worthy endeavor to be commended. It is a 'first of its kind' Art-Theology Book ever to be produced anywhere. It will certainly be a noteworthy contribution to the Universal Armenian Church in this diocese, other dioceses and our own local parish and area, as well, all in the beloved name of St. Mesrob Church of Racine. For too long, we have lived in ignorance regarding the tradition of art and its relationship with theology and history in our church. This volume presents in a clear, concise and beautifully graphic way the faith of our church, as it should properly be expressed in the Armenian Church anywhere, as it is portrayed in her sanctuaries with images, icons and stained glass windows.

This project culminates three years of research and now will open new windows of our faith to those who until now were in the dark. For the future of our church, it is a teaching tool, for non-Armenians, it will be a "Story Book" of our own faith and for us, it will remain an invaluable treasure. We, of St. Mesrob, indeed, have given birth to the Armenian Portraits of Faith, that will always remind us of our Christian Heritage.

It is the recommendation of the Window Committee, that a special group of experienced individuals be appointed and charged with the marketing of the book. All Armenian Churches could be informed of its sale. Already, the Diocesan Book Store has expressed a desire to purchase 25 copies for sale. As this is a limited edition, 500 copies, if properly marketed, could be sold quickly.

All the color separations, which become our property, may be used for future reprinting or other types of projects, to promote our stained glass windows, i.e. Note Cards, Post Cards, Bulletin Flyers, etc.

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Our gain will be, yes the recovery of revenue in sales. Most importantly, the esteem and the pride of our humble parish and community will be our contribution to the life of our beloved Church and Faith in Christ, Our God.

At the end of church we all formed a big circle and we all hugged the persons to the left and right of ourselves. An Armenian bond was formed and a feeling of love, friendship, and caring filled the room. This is a time I will never forget.

We did, learned, and gained so much at St. Nersess. Everyone, I think, had a good time and have certain little things that they will remember about St. Nersess. I can say that I've found out many new things about myself I've never known before. I also learned more about dealing with my problems and situations. My eyes have opened just a bit more to what life is really like and what is happening around me. I wish there were more places in the world like St. Nersess because just maybe the world could be a little more peaceful and aware of what's happening to the people. I realize that I am going a bit overboard, but I want everyone to know that St. Nersess has benefitted me and everyone else who have attended and will benefit those who may consider attending. I hope that just maybe I will be able to attend next year because it was an unforgetable experience.

# Reflections on the Saint Nersess Experience

When I got to St. Nersess I didn't know what to expect, mainly because I didn't know anybody except the Racine people and Yeretzgin Diane. Once we got there we had some free time for registration and meeting new friends, getting rooms, books and looking around.

At around 8:00 p.m. on the first day we had an orientation. To me the orientation was a very good idea for the new comers (like me) to learn and understand about St. Nersess. Then Father Mardiros called off our names and we stood up and told everyone where we came from, what church we attended and if we had a job. After that all of us made posters on subjects we liked.

The outings included the beach for the day and the fireworks. Everyday we had morning service and evening worship. On a daily basis we had Armenian language, Armenian folk singing, lectures, clean-up, group discussions and Bible study.

During Bible study we studied the Gospel of St. Mark. I remembered when Jesus got angry with the merchants selling pigeons in a temple and Jesus turned the tables over and said, "This is my home. You don't sell things here. You come here to worship".

At one of the lectures the topic was on the Life of Christ. He died for us to forgive our sins and told us there was life after death. He did his preaching in 3 1/2 years. Jesus was the Son of God. Two thieves were hung on the cross with Jesus. One of the thieves asked Jesus to remember him in His Kingdom and to forgive his sins. The other thief didn't believe in Jesus.

In our Bible study we studied about the twelve Disciples. The twelve are: Peter, James, John, Andrew, Matthew, James, Bartholomew, Thaddeaus, Simon, Thomas, Phillip and Judas. I learned a little history on each of the Disciples which was very interesting.

Then we had to brainstorm possibilities of what she could do. Things like abortion, adoption, and other things. Then we all had to decide on one thing that she would do. My group decided adoption and so did most of the other groups.

Everyone had Armenian language classes. I learned a little. We also had Bible Study classes everyday.

I had a great time and I hope to go back again next year.

# Reflections on St. Nersess

To put into words my ten days at St. Nersess is very difficult -new ideas have made their way into my head all day. In those ten
days my image of God completely changed. Instead of being some unknown force controlling our lives, I saw Him in the 25 other kids
I spent my time with. We were from all over North America -- different
in personalities and ideas. After seeing all the differences work
out, I knew God must be responsible.

One of the best two and a half hours I spent at the seminary were during a discussion on death and dying we had one morning. It was really hot that day and we were sitting in the basement recreation room. I was sitting sandwiched in between about 4 people on a couch made for 2, and I was sure the ceiling fan above me was going to fall the way it was shaking. We talked for a long time — about our friends, families and what our reactions to death and suicide were. I didn't ever have any immediate family members die so I wasn't sure what to think. So I looked around the room. Every face in the room told a story. Squished on a couch or lying on the floor, no one made eye contact. Staring off into space or at other people's shoes, I saw reactions change and tears fall.

I'm not sure how it ended or even what really happened, but one thing I do know is that I felt a common bond with every person in the room. I know that no matter how different any of us are, we all had a better outlook on life after going to St. Nersess. I felt proud to be a part of St. Nersess after those ten days and proud to be an Armenian.
