We cannot be recognized as a bona fide church council by the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America unless we get commitments from five or six individuals. We already have commitments from three. Being recognized as a church council of the Diocese in no way obligates us to work for the establishment of an Armenian Church in Atlanta (though that could be one of our far-reaching goals); it does, however, provide us with the means of periodically having an Armenian priest visit our city for celebrating the Divine Liturgy (Badarak), baptizing, performing marriage ceremonies, etc.
