STATE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The ACYOA, which began the year with 10 to 15 members, experienced a decline in membership during the final third of 1965 and at year's end had less than ten members. This decline cannot be attributed to any one factor nor to any one person. It is important, however, that the decline be arrested and the organization revitalized. A strong and active ACYOA chapter, from which will come the church leaders of tomorrow, must be restored to the parish. We, the remaining members, will do our share to attain this objective, but we need and humbly request the assistance of our pastor and parish council as well as that of the entire parish.
