The undersigned together with Bishop Papken and Dr. Essefian, chairman of the Parish Council, were privileged to represent St. Mary's Armenian Church of Washington, D. C. at the 72nd Annual Diocesan Assembly held May 3-4, 1974 in St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral in New York City.

Dr. Essefian was elected English secretary of the Assembly and Col. Juskalian served as chairman of the Nominating Committee.

Excerpts highlighting the Primate's annual message follow:

"We have more parishes with facilities undreamed of a generation ago; we have more members; we have more and more varied activities...

"To say we have more priests than ever before is only meaningful to dramatize our growth. The critical consideration is that we need more, many more.....

"We are fortunate in the establishment and existence of St. Nersess Theological School; it has not only yielded graduates for service in our Church, it stands as an effective mechanism by which new candidates can be continually prepared. Three of its graduates are already active in our parishes, and two others are on their way within a year....

"But priests are not made overnight. It takes years, and this only after the proper candidates are found.... We cannot do this alone; it is the responsibility of all of us.... We must be alert to the potential in our own communities; we must seek out young people who show an inclination. We have the school; we have unlimited possibilities of service; we must find the candidates that surely exist in our communities....

"The oneness of our Church remains a paramount consideration. To achieve that oneness demands in fact the sacrifice of all the unworthy personal prejudices which in the course of time have hardened into even less worthy convictions....

"Our budget today is about four times what it was a mere decade ago. Ten years ago about 75% of our budget was provided by the parishes. Last year our headquarters itself was responsible for raising more than half the budgetraising in fact twice as much as the entire budget ten years ago....

"Our Diocesan Center is relied upon today more than at any time in our history....by all people who look to the Armenian Church as the authentic center.... of Armenian life in America....

"The Diocesan Endowment Fund has been established....and a very encouraging beginning made toward securing the future of our Diocesan life....

"Ours is a great mission, worthy of our commitment and our sacrifice, raising itself like a towering steeple above the difficulties that tend to immobilize us....."

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT - 1974

In March a Spaghetti Party was given by the Sunday School to the children, their families and friends. In June a Family Fun Night was given for the children and their parents, which proved to be a huge success. The children attended Mass in the Franciscan Monastery and toured the place.

In the fall a class for Seniors was set up for the older children. Miss Vergine Barsoumian volunteered to be instructor.

On December 22nd the Women's Guild gave a Christmas party for the Sunday School children, whose annual Christmas party was postponed to Sunday January 5th.
