MINUTES OF ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

Sunday, February 8, 1981

The Annual Parish Assembly of St. Mary's Armenian Apostolic Church of Washington, D. C. convened in the sanctuary at 12:45 p.m. following a light luncheon directly after worship services. The meeting was called to order by Dr. Edward Onanian, Parish Council Chairman, who asked our Pastor, Father Vertanes Kalayjian, to offer the opening prayer. The roll call was then read by Parish Council Secretary George Derderian, and, out of 164 duespaying members, 72 were present, thus constituting a quorum.

Col. George Juskalian and Mrs. Oghda O'Gulian were elected to serve as Assembly Tivan chairman and secretary respectively, and they proceeded to the chair to carry out their duties.

The first order of business was the Minutes of the 1980 Assembly, which had been sent to the parishioners January 25th as part of a package of reports accompanying the invitation to the annual meeting. There being no questions or comments, the minutes were accepted as submitted.

REPORTS

Pastor's Report: Father Kalayjian reviewed in Armenian his written report, which was submitted in both languages. He remarked that 1980 was a successful year and noted a change in the complexion of worshippers — many new faces although the number of members remained substantially unchanged. He referred to his absence from St. Mary's last summer when he served as the Director of Camp Nubar and his desire to return there for the 1981 season, subject to the approval of the Parish. He appealed to the parents to take a more active interest in enrolling their children in the schools for the continued viability of our religious and ethnic heritage. With regard to the addition to the Church, he expressed his thanks to those participants in the construction and those who have pledged their financial support. He mentioned two outstanding examples of support: one, a totally anonymous donor of \$2,500; and the other, a young student, carrying a very heavy scholastic workload with limited funds from a part-time job, who approached a Parish Council member for the purpose of becoming a dues-paying member and making a weekly pledge of financial support for the Church.

Parish Council Report: Dr. Onanian referred to the written report and made a few observations, namely, the composition of the Parish Council -- nine members versus seven members -- which will be considered later in the meeting; and the Church finances. He explained that the Church operated with a deficit of \$6,000 in 1980 due in part to the lower proceeds from the Bazaar, no increase in dues-paying members, and escalating operating expenses.

He reported that we were able to meet the deficit from contingency funds, but he stated that we would be in serious straits should the deficit be repeated in 1981. There being no questions, the Chairman declared both the Pastor's and the Parish Council reports accepted as given.

Diocesan Delegate Report: Mr. Abraham Bodurian had nothing further to add to his comprehensive written report. Dr. Onanian, the second delegate, noted that the 1980 assessment figure in the Diocesan budget item should have been \$6,000 as it appeared in the Treasurer's Report. Prefacing his remarks about the Diocesan budget picture, he mentioned one bright note -- that the Cathedral mortgage will be paid off in three years. Dr. Onanian, who is now a member of the Diocesan Budget Committee, then announced that the Diocesan budget is "skyrocketing" and it is anticipated that the Parish assessments will be increased. If the higher assessments are too much for the Parishes to meet, he said that consideration would have to be given to curtailing the CRE and Language Lab programs. Der Hayr voiced his strong feeling that any reductions should be applied to projects other than the critical CRE and Language Labs, which he felt should remain untouched. He appealed to the Chairman that this be conveyed to the Diocesan Council, and Dr. Onanian stated that Der Hayr's views would be made known at the appropriate time in the Diocesan Budget Committee's deliberations.

Women's Guild Report: Mrs. Avedikian offered to answer any questions with regard to the written report in the absence of the Chairlady. She mentioned the effort of the Women's Guild members to conduct future meetings in Armenian in deference to their new Chairlady, Mrs. Hnazant Tahmazian. Her remarks were well received by the Assembly, and the report was accepted as submitted.

Church School Report: Yeretzgin reemphasized one statement in the written report to the effect that there was a need for more students. The report was accepted as submitted.

Armenian School Report: Dr. V. Adrian Parsegian reviewed the written report. He stated that, happily, the school's finances - thanks to community support were in excellent condition, and funds had been set aside toward furnishings and equipment in the new classrooms. He then expressed his disappointment that, although the school was prepared to teach a larger number, there were only 25 students currently in attendance. Mr. Vartkess Balian stated that a 25-student enrollment is sad indeed, and he suggested that a committee be formed to contact parents in order to determine why their children are not being sent to school and to solve any problems that may exist in this regard. His remarks were loudly applauded. Several other opinions were expressed at this point, some of them being: the possibility of holding both schools on Sundays in view of the overworking of a small group who spend all day Saturday in Armenian School and thus give up Sunday School; the duplicating and mailing of the curriculum to those students who cannot attend Saturday sessions as another solution; the forming of car pools to get more children to school; the shortening of school hours, which caused Dr. Parsegian to state that a minimum of three hours is a must for the school to function effectively; calling a special meeting to consider the amalgamation of both schools to which Mrs. Jean Jamgochian, one of the teachers, responded that her experience showed that, although Saturdays may be inconvenient, the results were well worth the trouble. A motion was then made by Mrs. Isabelle Goshgarian and duly seconded that "The Parish Council establish a committee to determine what the problems are regarding attendance to the Armenian School and to make recommendations for a resolution." One opinion expressed during the discussion was that the problem was not Saturdays or Sundays but that learning Armenian was a low priority in the children's lives. Another pertinent comment by Mrs. Rita Bush was that the school had canvassed the community as to a convenient time, and they had approved the status quo of the present arrangement. An amendment to the motion was offered by George Derderian that "the Sunday School be included in the motion," which was seconded. Both the amendment to the motion and the motion were carried. The report of the Armenian School was accepted.

<u>Choir Report</u>: Dr. Hratch Semerjian repeated the need for a choir director as shown in the report. Dr. Onanian responded that the two-year effort to find a choir director has proved unsuccessful thus far but the search is continuing.

ACYOA, Jr. Report: Accepted as submitted.

Hye Club Report: Mr. Mike Tashjian thanked all who supported the Hye Club's activities, and the written report was accepted.

Ararat Avak Society: Mrs. Elizabeth Kevorkian reported that the Society, which was formed in 1977, aims to bring together senior citizens for a monthly luncheon. They accept donations, which provide funds to operate the program. Their treasury balance was \$678, but \$200 was given to the Church in June, and their current balance is \$478. She mentioned that they sponsored a visit to the Harlequin Theater, subsidizing one half of the cost, as another activity of the Society. She thanked Yeretzgin and Father Kalayjian in particular for their efforts in providing entertainment to the group.

BUILDING PROJECT

1. <u>Building Fund Committee Report</u>: The written report was reviewed by Dr. Onanian who touched upon the parish house expenses and the continuing effort to raise funds for our new building addition. He brought the Building Fund report up-to-date by stating that the figures show that \$45,000 has been spent for the construction to date, and the total of pledges receivable and cash available amount to \$135,000. Dr. Onanian stated it was desirable to pay off the project without a loan and that it would take an additional \$100,000 over and above the current pledges plus the cash on hand to do so. He informed those present that, if success is achieved in raising the necessary funds, chances are good that everything -- the downstairs hall, kitchen and school -- could be paid off by the end of 1983. He referred to the invitation from the Primate and the Parish Council to the dinner to be held February 14th and the hope to raise additional funds through two-year pledges up to 1983 at the dinner. He mentioned a planned telephone-a-thon as another means of raising funds. There were no questions, and the report was accepted.

2. Construction Committee Report: Mr. Jerry Hekimian, the Chairman of the Committee, reported that the builders are now up to the roof, and they hope to have the roof on by the end of March. He informed the Assembly that Mr. Sarkis Satian has taken on the responsibility of Manager of Construction, at no cost to the Church, and he has been in daily attendance at the site supervising the work, scheduling, and the myriad of other activities related to the construction. He expressed his appreciation to Mr. Satian, and those present enthusiastically applauded Mr. Satian's very meaningful contribution. In response to a query by Der Hayr, Mr. Hekimian stated that the second level floor would indeed be safe enough for the Primate to perform the blessing ceremony upon his visit to the Parish the following week.

Armenian Adult School Report: Dr. John Gueriguian reviewed the English-written report on the School, which concentrated on both Armenian Language and culture, and outlined the course of study for the 32 students presently attending. He stated that there is a considerable demand for their packets of study, which he and Dr. Parsegian have prepared. One packet was in fact sent to Paris and packets are being readied for distribution within the United States. The fee is \$50 per student/per semester via correspondence course and \$35 with an instructor in a classroom. No questions were posed; however, George Derderian made a suggestion, which was met with a hearty round of applause, to commend Dr. Gueriguian and Dr. Parsegian for their splendid program.

Election of Parish Council, Auditing Committee, Nominating Committee and Diocesan Delegates:

Prior to the elections, reference was made to the resolution of the motion accepted last year on the composition of the Parish Council -- seven members instead of nine. Dr. Onanian stated that, although seven is an ideal number, due to the lack of volunteers to carry out some of their chores, a ninemember Parish Council would be a more workable group. Accordingly, he made a motion that the Parish Council be comprised of nine members. For purposes of continuity, those first four who received the highest votes would serve two years, and those two who received the lowest votes would serve one year. The motion was seconded and carried.

Mrs. Margot Hekimian then submitted the list of candidates and announced that two names had been inadvertently omitted from the ballot for <u>Parish Council</u> (Sarkis Satian and George Berberian). George Berberian's name was subsequently withdrawn at his request. The ballot for <u>Auditing Committee</u> also omitted some candidates' names (Raymond Babigan, Vartkes Broussalian and Albert Manian). Subsequently, Gary Avedikian withdrew his name. With regard to the <u>Nominating Committee</u>, one name, George Semerjian, was added from the floor to the slate. The ballot for the <u>Diocesan Delegates</u> was increased by three nominations from the floor, namely, Dr. Ohannes Sahakyan, George Derderian and Vartkess Balian. Mr. Bodurian withdrew his name, and the nominations were then closed. The results of the subsequent balloting are shown below:

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

1. <u>Membership Dues</u>: Dr. Onanian reviewed the weekly pledge status of the parishioners as they relate to our operating expenses and stated that we fall short of our Church's needs. He stated that our annual budget is now over \$50,000, and we have had to rely on our Bazaar proceeds to underwrite part of our operating costs. He moved that the resolution, which was submitted in the Supplemental Report, be accepted. The resolution reads

"Resolved: (a) that effective with the 1981 membership year, the annual dues for the voting membership shall be \$100 per member. (b) That parishioners currently contributing in excess of \$100 annually be urged to increase their pledge by a minimum of \$1 per week.

The motion was seconded, and approximately ten members expressed their views during the ensuing discussion. The resolution was carried by a vote of 44 ayes and 3 nays.

2. Col. George Juskalian submitted a resolution regarding a study made by Father Mesrob Semerjian. The resolution, which appears in the Supplemental Report, was carries as submitted. It states

"Whereas there continues to be a shortage of priests within the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America - a situation which has existed for many years and results in several parishes being without permanent pastors for months and even years at a time, and

"Whereas Father Mesrob Semerjian, in a recent study which appeared in the November 15, 1980 issue of the Armenian Mirror-Spectator and in the November 20, 1980 issue of the Armenian Reporter, proposes a solution whereby former celibate priests who withdrew from the priesthood in order to marry might be reinstated on an individual case-by-case basis:

"Be it resolved that the parishioners of St. Mary's Armenian Church of Washington, D. C. support the findings and recommendation of Father Mesrob Semerjian and request that the Primate give these findings and recommendation his urgent and favorable consideration."

Treasurer's Report: Jack Arzoomanian, the Treasurer, offered to answer any questions regarding the written report. In response to a question on visiting clergy expenses, he explained that Der Hayr did not receive any salary while he was at Camp Nubar last year and the funds were used instead for the visiting clergy. The report was accepted as submitted.

<u>Auditing Committee Report:</u> Mrs. Anahid Semerjian confirmed the written report of the Auditing Committee.

Proposed Budget: With regard to the proposed Expenses in the budget, Dr. Onanian explained that the Stipend figures are determined by the Diocese and reviewed the other expense items on a line-by-line basis. He gave a detailed explanation on the last two separate items -- church window (pigeon problem) and ceiling fam (exhaust system). Discussion followed on the latter two items, and a motion was made by Sarkis Satian, seconded and carried, that these items be considered separately from the rest of the budget. The balance of the budget of \$53,500 was accepted as proposed.

The church window and ceiling fan items were then brought up. Mr. Satian made a motion that "Mr. Vartkess Balian make a study of the possibility of renovating the existing sanctuary and downstairs hall and prepare a comprehensive renovating plan by the end of June." The motion was seconded. Following a discussion period during which Mr. Balian, who accepted the responsibility, estimated the study would take approximately three to four months, the date was changed to September 1st. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Memorandum of Understanding with Der Hayr was reviewed. Dr. Onanian discussed Der Hayr's request for a leave of absence to again direct Camp Nubar this summer. During the discussion, Mrs. Jean Jamgochian stated her views on Der Hayr's work at Camp Nubar as she witnessed it and expressed her sincere belief that the sacrifice of the Parish in giving up Der Hayr for the summer was well worth the positive impact it had on the youth at the camp. A motion to accept the Memorandum of Understanding was subsequently carried.

The election results were then announced to the Assembly (see Elections).

There being no other business, Col. Juskalian called upon Father Kalayjian for his closing prayer. Der Hayr, prior to the blessing, thanked the Women's Guild for the luncheon and the ACYOA Juniors for their babysitting chores during the meeting. He also expressed the appreciation of the Parish to Mr. Bodurian and Dr. Onanian for the fine service they had rendered during their incumbency as Diocesan delegates, and voiced a similar expression of thanks to Dr. Charles Kumkumian and George Derderian for their valuable contributions to the Parish during their service as Parish Council members.

The meeting then adjourned at 5:10 p.m.

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Memorandum of Understanding Between the Parish Council of St. Mary's Armenian Apostolic Church of Washington and Reverend Vertanes Kalayjian

We agree that the following monetary and related considerations shall apply to Reverend Kalayjian's services as Pastor of St. Mary's Church during the period set forth herein:

Stipend and Allowances

Basic Stipend \$13,440
Service Increment 4,800
Membership Increment 960
Car Allowance 3,400

\$22,600 plus clergy insurance and IRA

The parish will assume the payment of all utility expenses [heat, light, water and telephone] at the parish house.

A deduction of \$75 will be made from Reverend Kalayjian's stipend to complete payment of the auto loan made to him in 1977.

2. Vacation

In accord with the Diocesan vacation schedule, we agree that Reverend Kalayjian shall be allowed to take leave on two Sundays while on vacation. Leave may be accrued with the prior consent of the Parish Council. There was no leave balance outstanding at the close of 1981.

In addition, he shall be allowed to take leave on the Sunday of the Diocesan Assembly weekend, provided his return to Washington for services should prove inconvenient. A similar policy shall apply in the event he chooses to attend the ACYOA and/or Choir Assembly. An allowance shall be provided by the parish toward his lodging and travel expenses in the case of the Diocesan Assembly only. In the case of the Choir and/or ACYOA Assembly, it is expected that those organizations will provide a lodging and travel allowance.

This memorandum of understanding becomes effective on January 1, 1982, and continues through December 31, 1982, provided it received the approval of the annual Parish Assembly.

The following is a summary of my activities as your Parish Priest, which I humbly offer to God and to you. At the conclusion of the year 1981, I completed the fifth year of my service as the Pastor of St. Mary's Parish.

A. Sacraments and Services

 The Divine Liturgy, special services and the Sacraments were celebrated, conducted and administered according to the church calendar and the its needs.
 In 1981 we had 11 baptisms, 3 weddings and one funeral.

2. Counseling and Social Services

The areas covered were: Personal and Family counseling, Job placements, Housing, Immigration and Naturalization, Health care, Nursing Home, Armenian Heritage Research guidance, Personal recommendations.

B. Office Activities

- 1. Office Hours. We were fortunate to have for the second year, the dedicated services of Mrs. P. Whitty as our part-time secretary. The office hours were 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. which she graciously extended quite frequently. The afternoon office hours and most of the evenings, I personally used to carry on my pastoral duties.
 - Publications. The Parish newletter, Shnorhali, was published five times during the year. Shnorhali size special bulletins were published for April 24, Christmas, Easter and Dedication of the new building. Sunday bulletins were also published. Numerous special bulletins, fliers, letters, questionnaires were mailed for more effective contect with the parishioners. I thank Miss Mary Vertabedian and Mr. John Krikorian, who helped with the publication of Shnorhali and the Sunday Bulletin respectively.
- 3. Consultations. I continued my efforts to solicit ideas and suggestions, through private and group consultations, during and outside of office hours. The subjects covered a variety of organizational and community matters.
- 4. Public Affairs. On a few occasions, I happily represented the Parish and/or the Diocese during public affairs and receptions and conveyed the goodwill of our parishioners. I was also invited to lecture on the Armenian history at a public school. I attended the Diocesan Assembly which was held in May in Boston, Mass.

C. Organizational

- 1. Parish Council. I met with the Parish Council at all regular and special meetings including the summer months. I would like to express my appreciation for the dedication they have manifested throughout the year. Special recognition is due to the Chairman, Dr. E. Onanian for his dedication and leadership.
- 2. Auxiliary Organizations. I continued to work closely with the church organizations and presided over regular and special meetings: Womens' Guild, Choir, Church School, Armenian School, A.C.Y.O.A. Jr. and Sr., Hye Club, and Ararat Avak Society.

I would like to express my deep gratitude to the respective chairmen, chairwomen, advisors and workers who made it possible for these organizations to function effectively.

D. Educational Activities

- a. St. Nersess Summer Study Conference continues to be an extension of our religious education endeavor. Our youth continue to benefit from the program and come back spiritually refreshed and highly motivated. I thank the Parish Council and the Womens' Guild for their continuous support.
- b. For the fourth year, but to a limited extent we offered our Annual Spring Lecture Series and other lectures throughout the year. We shall continue our efforts in these areas.
- c. Lenten evening services offered not only time for worship but also an opportunity for meditation.
 As in the past this year again, we have invited guest speakers to offer the meditations. Other opportunities were afforded to parishioners to deliver sermons.
- d. Deacon's training program was started as a pilot program. I intend to continue this on a regular schedule.
- e. Camp Nubar. During the months of July and August, which included my vation period, I served as the Director of the A.G.B.U. Camp Nubar. Through prior arrangements with the Primate, Very Rev. Mesrob Semerjian served our parish as visiting pastor. I returned for two weeks in July and August, including four Sundays to attend the parish needs.
- f. Altar Care and Mas. With the help of Mrs. A. Kumkumien, Mr. Simon Kumkumian, Miss A. Manigian, Miss A. Kavookian, and Mrs. Julie Oskoian, the altar received good care. We also thank the ladies who continuously (and anonymously) have prepared and donated the Mas during the past year. May they continue their services in good health.

g. Seminar and Workshop

In conjunction with the Sunday School and the Choir we sponsored a Seminar and Workshop to promote understanding and appreciation of our church doctrines, rituals and practices. Even though the immediate objective was the education of our teachers and choir members, we invited the community to participate. The program was well received and appreciated.

Bible studies which had started in 1980 continued until mid-February with 7 students.

h. Visiting Clergy

Personally and on your behalf we welcomed among us the following clergy:

His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, The Primate, on two occasions. Both related to our building project.

His Eminence Archbishop Vatche Hovsepian, Primate of the Western Diocese, who offered the opening prayer at the House of Representatives in April.

Very Rev. the pastor of the Armenian community of Moscow, U.S.S.R, who was attending a conference in California.

Very Rev. Mesrob Semerjian who was the visiting priest during my summer absence.

Rev. Karekin Kasparian, the pastor of the Armenian Church in Westchester, N. Y., who was here as a lecturer for the choir workshop.

The Most. Rev. Archbishop Sion Manoogian, the former Primate of our Diocese, who was visiting from Holy Etchmiadzin. He was our guest udring an Avak Society gathering and spoke to us.

Most of the visiting clergymen were hosted at the Parish House.

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i. Special Acknowledgement

You may notice that I avoided mentioning the names of any individuals to whom I feel particularly grateful, for the assistance they have given to me personally and for the devotion they have manifested toward the church. I would like to make one exception; I would like to thank Yeretzgin, both as her pastor and husband, for her loving patience and endurance which she has always shown, both as Superintendent of the Sunday and Armenian Schools and as a gracious hostess whenever she was called upon.

E. Some Thoughts Along The Way.

It is said that politics is the art of identifying the possible and pursuing it with the broadest consensus of opinions. To a certain extent we have managed to do that, even though I do not consider myself or members of our Parish Council as politicians. What has really happened is that most of the time the situations have dictated their own solutions and we have done our best to take care of them. Generally speaking, ours has been a caretaker stewardship; so far, our achievements are nothing to be ashamed of. In fact we should feel proud of them. However, at the end of my five-year stewardship I would like to raise some questions with the hope that together, we may come up with some answers or solutions. My concern is that at a certain point personally or collectively, we may reach a level of incompetence which may cause stagnation and retreat, loss of momentum, drive and energy to reach for a higher level of accomplishment. It is said that "Christianity is not believing the impossible but doing the incredible."

A few years ago our present status concerning the Building Project was considered impossible to achieve, but now that is is here, I find it to be incredible! In other words we have known ourselves to be doing the incredible throughout the centuries. As Emerson said, "Self-sacrifice is the real miracle out of which all the reported miracles grew." We have done that too! What, is my hang-up then?

My concern is that we move ahead, utilizing our new building as the vehicle or the means to accomplish more in our spiritual and ethnic cultural life. "The church is a workshop, not a dormitory; and every Christian man and woman is bound to help in the common cause." I shall be more specific:

1. Religious Practices and Programs

I have consistantly refused to associate attending church every Sunday or only on special occasions with one's being religious or having faith in God. That is a very personal and private matter with which a person has to deal individually. But there is such a thing as a breaking point. We cannot go on neglecting our communal fellowship and corporate worship without endangering our personal religious faith. In the final analysis, what the church does collectively reflects upon the individual and what the individual may or may not do ultimately decides the character of the church.

We are moved by the beauty of our services and are proud when non-Armenians emphasize the deep spirituality of our hymns and sharagans, the soundness of our doctrinal and dogmatic positions; yet most of us remain religious illiterates. Instead of being force-fed worth-while programs occasionally, we should be following a consistent, well-organized program for self-enrichment and growth. We have limited our participation in religious activities to a mere Sunday morning attendance. Is that enough? Is it impossible to do more? Before you answer, please remember - - we have done the incredible!

2. Social and Cultural Concerns

- a. Ours is an ethnic church. By definition that presents certain limitations, but the limitations need not be a handicap. True, we have no missionary work as the term is understood in other religious groups. But what about the missionary work that needs to be done within our own ethnic group? Statistics show that there is an enormous task, a real challenge facing us. There are an estimated five thousand-plus Armenians in the Metropolitan Washington area and that number is increasing every year. By my generous estimation, between the two churches functioning in this earea, we can claim only one and a half thousand Armenians who are in touch with the church or the church with them. What are we doing to help? What is our sustained, long-range program to claim them for the church, for Armenianism?
- b. With the ever-increasing number of our people, we are also facing some social and cultural issues: the well being, the acclimation of our brethren to their new environment, their orientation toward the religious and cultural life of the Armenian community, their meaningful participation and contribution to the well being of that community. More often than not, they are left to themselves to find their way. That process has been found to be hazardous because it takes years for them to find the right road -- to the church -- to the Armenian Community life. I am afraid that some have been known to lose their way -- sometimes permanently.
- c. Our lack of sustained, meaningful programs is also causing the estrangement, if not the alienation of the next generation. We cannot afford to let that go unchallenged. There is a glaring discrepancy, a rift if you will, that is developing between the generations. I can sympathize with the youngsters who hear something on the altar, something else in the Sunday or Armenian School and then witness among adults a callous disregard for them all, or at least a left-handed treatment of the things they were taught were sacred, virtuous, and essential to life.
- d. Our community identity as something religious and ethnic is worth reexamining. Most of our confusion stems from an over-emphasis here and there, and quite often, no emphasis at all. We have to decide whether or not we are our brothers' keepers, here and there and everywhere. Do we all share a common destiny, goal, purpose and objective? If so, what is it? If not, what is it that binds us together? And that is not all; how much of it is being communicated to our children who shall be our leaders of tomorrow, the bearers of the torch which was lit by our fathers - St. Gregory, St. Vartan, Shnorhali, Nareg and the hosts of heroes and martyrs down through the centuries.

3. Our Priorities and Committments

After all the rhetoric on our priorities, what the church does collectively shall determine the reality or the existence of such an order. An individual is influenced by this collective body which is called church as much as, and even more than he ever hopes to influence its course of action. The church therefore is a collective steward that administers what is permanent and valuable. That administration demands more than just good will or good intentions. The Biblical truth is worth repeating. "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also," or the other way around, "Where your heart is there will also be your treasure." It is said "Stewardship is what a man does after he says "I believe."

Within three years we managed to raise funds to make the building possible. The secret is very simple - - we had a priority, our heart was in it and we responded to it. Pure and simple. In the light of all this, what does our Annual Budget tell us? I hope I am not being too harsh in saying that in looking at our budget items, we can see that it is designed to do the minimum; pay the utility bills and the salaries so that the church doors remain open. That is not an insignificant objective, but the question is, is that enough? If not, what do we do next?

4. Proposals

I am well aware that by now you might be asking what now? Indeed I have raised many questions and have not attempted to answer them.

Let me offer a few answers or suggestions:

a. The Endowment Fund

We have just announced the formation of an Endowment Fund Committee to coordinate any and all gifts and bequests that will benefit both our church and the Diocese. I propose that we make a budget item an annual contribution to the Endowment Fund. These contributions, in due time will give us secure and permanent income. I further propose that we confirm the existing Endowment Fund Committee as a permanent body of the parish with the Parish Council retaining the duty to fill any vacancy that may occur.

b. <u>Canvassing</u>

I propose that a committee be established to canvass the Washington Armenian community. The canvassing will have two objectives:

- 1. To tell the people about St. Mary's Armenian Church and its programs.
- 2. Increase actual participation by soliciting their membership to St. Mary's Church.

c. Cultural and Educational Committee

To initiate, to coordinate and to implement any and all educational and cultural programs that will aid the spiritual and cultural growth of our community, I propose the establishment of a Cultural-Educational Committee. Within their responsibilities will be to organize cultural activities, lectures, seminars, workshops, retreats, etc.

d. <u>Social Service Committee</u>

To meet the needs of our community we need a group of people who would assist people in their various needs in housing, jobs, immigration problems, etc. I propose therefore to form such a committee which will have the above responsibilities.

These committees shall be elected annually by the Parish Assembly for a term of two years. They shall be accountable to the Parish Council on budgetary issues according to the bylaws. They shall report their activities to the Annual Membership meeting. In case of a vacancy the Parish Council shall make the appointment from a suggested list presented by the respective committees.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Calendar year 1981

The highlight of the year was the completion and dedication of the building addition which brought to reality another dream of our parish. The construction of this building has provided us with 6 additional rooms for teaching purposes, a library, improved administrative facilities, an expanded social hall, and, starting next summer, an air-conditioned chapel in which to conduct Sunday services.

The construction of this addition was carried out over a 12-month period. During this time, the members of the Construction Committee (Jerry Hekimian, Sarkis Satian, and Vartkess Balian) put in many days and hours on this project. Through their individual and collective efforts, the cost of construction was reduced considerably. We are indebted to them as we are to Mr. Raffi Petrossian who prepared and donated the mechanical drawings for this project.

Although the building is now in full use, some finishing work remains to be done, the responsibility for which was assumed by the Parish Council in late November. Arrangements are being made to complete all remaining work in the very near future. We are also continuing our efforts to furnish the building. In this regard, it should be noted that a portable altar, which will be used both by the Sunday School and for summer services, presently is under construction. The cost of the altar is being assumed by two parishioners. Also, when the winter storms are behind us, the process of landscaping will begin under the direction of Norig Asbed.

Construction of the addition was, of course, only the first phase of our building project. Phase 2 is the renovation of our kitchen and the old social hall. Now that we have had some experience with the additional floor space, we are in a better position to prepare specifications for the work which remains. Mr. Vartkess Balian has developed preliminary plans for the renovation which the Council has not been able to review as yet. The process of review and consultation with church organizations should begin soon after the Parish Assembly.

Oversight of the construction project, combined with a variety of related housekeeping activities in the old building, occupied a large portion of the Council's time during the past year. Berj Koukeyan assumed responsibility for maintenance of the building and parish house, and will be involved in the finishing work required in the new building. Berj has been assisted in his efforts by several volunteers, with Tom Magarian again being a major contributor of time and equipment. In the absence of a full-time custodian, volunteer efforts are more important than ever if we are to keep the church building and grounds clean and presentable and our equipment in working order.

A variety of social and cultural activities were undertaken during the year, including a Madagh on Martyrs Day, a spring lecture series, two very successful picnics, and a joint sponsorship with the AGBU of the Ardavazt Theatre Company's production of The Eastern Dentist. The major activity of the parish, however, was the bazear which, without question, was our best ever. A combination of masterful public relations, superb cooking and baking, talented craft work, adequate facilities, perfect weather, and plenty of perspiration helped to make this a memorable event. As usual, we are deeply indebted to the women of our parish whose dedication made it all possible. Planning for the 1982 Bazaar began in mid-November when the Committee met to review and consider improvements on this year's performance.

As our women know very well, one of the key people during Bazaar week is our custodian, Howard Green. This year, Howard not only did his usual outstanding job during the bazaar, but he also managed to put out a trash fire following the conclusion of bazaar activities. If Howard had not detected the fire and acted as promptly as he did, it would have done serious damage to our new building. The damage from the fire has been estimated at \$2,550, a claim for which has been filed with our insurance company.

The Council spent considerable time reviewing the needs and concerns of both the Armenian and Sunday Schools. An Ad Hoc Committee chaired by Dr. Adrian Parsegian was appointed early in the year to conduct the survey requested by the 1981 Parish Assembly. The results of that effort, and subsequent developments, appear in Dr. Parsegian's report.

Our efforts to secure a new Choir Director again failed to produce results. In early June, we had a lengthy discussion with a candidate, who outlined a plan for the growth and musical development of our choir. Unfortunately, the financial outlays required to implement the plan are beyond our means at this time. There were no development in this area during the second half of the year. Fortunately for all of us, Dr. Hratch Semerjian continues to serve very capably as an interim director.

In early July, the Council met with Colonel Victor Arzoomanian, Director of the Armenian Church Endowment Fund, who outlined the aims of the Fund and requested designation of a Parish Director to assist him. Soon thereafter, Mrs. Mary Perkins and Colonel George Juskalian accepted the responsibility of serving as parish directors. They have been joined in their efforts by Robert Fesjian, Esq.

New furnishings were provided for the church offices and a computerized mailing list was finally secured. With regard to the mailing
list, we are indebted to Mr. Raffi Karahisar whose efforts made it
possible. We should note also that a one-man campaign by Dr. Ohannes
Sahakian produced \$1,250 in contributions toward a church computer.
This money will be held in reserve until an assessment is made of
our needs in this area.

Turning to finances, a combination of rising costs and some indirect costs of construction produced a deficit of \$1,200 in our operating budget. Our operating costs rose from \$48,400 in 1980 to \$54,400 in 1981. One-fourth of this increase stemmed from higher Diocesan dues, while another fourth was due to higher utility costs. We were fortunate indeed to have had a record-setting bazaar; without it, our deficit would have been consideraly higher and we would have exhausted a large portion of our reserve funds.

Pledge income reached a new high of \$21,700 in 1981, but our receipts in this area are still far short of what is needed to eliminate our longstanding reliance on the annual bazaar to meet operating expenses. For 1982, we will need at least \$30,000 in pledge income to balance our budget, which will be at the \$60,000 level. We already have initiated efforts to expand our base of support, but will need a considerable amount of volunteer help to undertake a meaningful community-wide appeal for funds.

During the past few years, many of our parishioners have responded very generously to requests for both operating and capital funds. Their numbers must grow, however, if we are to continue to improve our facilities and maintain our program of service to the Armenian community. The number of volunteer workers must grow also. The talent to help us reduce costs and operate more efficiently certainly is present in our parish. All that is needed is the desire to make the time to serve the church.

Thank you for your support during the past year, and hopefully for a greater degree of support in the year ahead.

REPORT ON THE 79th ANNUAL DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

Presented to St. Mary's Parish Assembly Washington, D.C.

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The 79th Annual Assembly of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America was held on Thursday through Saturday, April 30 - May 2, 1981 at St. James Armenian Apostolic Church, 465 Mt. Auburn Street, Watertown, Massachusetts and hosted by the same church

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This Parish was represented at that convention by its Pastor, Rev. Fr. Vertanes Kalayjian, by its parish Counsel President, Dr. Edward Onanian and by its two diocesan delegates, Vartkess M. Balian and Dr. Ohannes Sahakian, by Yeretzgin Anahid Kalayjian representing the Sunday and Armenian Schools and by Mrs. Queenie Avedikian, representing the Women's Guild.

At its opening session on Thursday afternoon at 2 P.M., the Assembly was presided over by his Eminance Abp. Torkom Manoogian, the Primate. Judge Vincent Gurahian of Weschester, N.Y. and Mr. Ed Chapin of Bayside, New York were elected Assembly Chairman and Vice Chairman, respectively, while Mr. Hagop Nazarian, Holy Martyrs Church, English Language Secretary; and Fr. Zanob Nalbandian, Holy Ressurection Church in South Milwaukee, as Armenian Language Secretary.

His Eminence Abp. Torkom Manoogien, Primate, in his opening address on Thursday, April 30, stressed several important issues; namely, the training of Armenican born young Armenians for the priesthoold, the education of our children under the Armenian Language and Religious Education programs, the growth of the Diocese as a result of the addition of new church buildings, the establishment of a new Diocese in Canada, and finally, church unity and he said specifically that; "The question of unity in the Armenian Church is one of ecclesiastical, discipline and not a question of two sides, because there are not two Armenian churches. And it is not a question of two sides coming together to compromise, but a question of the faithfulness of those who consider themselves the children of this same and one church.

We hope that the spiritual hierarchy of Antelias will cease considering itself a side, cease offering proposals for the re-consideration of the position and rights of the Catholicos of all Armenians, and of the question of the canonical subordination of the Dioceses. It was just such proposals that were made to Catholicos Vazken I by the See of Cilicia. The response of the Catholicos of all Armenians (December 16, 1980) to the letter of Catholicos Khoren of Antelias (September 16, 1980), communicated patriarchal disappointment while it cautioned everyone to bewere of the traps that distort the spirit and nature of the Armenian Church.

On the question of unity with the separated brethren of the Armenian Church, the Assembly adopted a proposal offered by Holy Martyrs Church in Bayside directing "that Unity discussions with the Prelacy shall resume and continue without letup until an agreement acceptable to the Diocesan Assembly has been reached.

However, the Assembly refused to go along with that part of the proposal that called for the election by the Assembly of a new Diocesan Unity Committee to carry out the discussions, opting instead to retain for negotiating purposes the presently existing seven-member committee.

The need to attract qualified candidates to the clergy of the Armenian Church was another topic of major concern.

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A proposal by the St. James Armenian Church in Watertown directing the Primate and Diocesan Council to create a Department of Recruitment was defeated. This proposal called for the allocation of \$10,000 for expenses of a search committee to find candidates to serve as director of recruitment. It also called for an annual budget of \$100,000 for the operation of the department, once organized.

A substitute motion, also filed by members of St. James Church, was then accepted. This motion dropped the provision for the \$100,00 annual operating budget, but provided \$10,000 to fund a five-member Committee established to organize a Department of Recruitment in the Diocese. The five-member committee is to be appointed by the Primate and the Diocesan Council no later than June 15.

The adjusted budget of the Diocese for 1981 for the first time exceeds \$1 million. Diocesen Council treasurer Louise Simone explained to the delegates that Diocesen Revenues have increased, but they have not kept pace with the more repidly increasing costs.

Mrs. Simone announced plans to hold one more large raffle in 1981 to raise funds to pay off the remainder of the mortgage on the St. Vartan Cathedral in New York City.

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On the income side, the Diocesan Budget for 1981 shows a modest increase in parish dues (which make up slightly over-one-third of the budget) and a doubling of the income of the Diocesan Centers (presumably from an increase in rent paid by tenants). To balance the 1981 budget, a Primate's Campaign will be launched, with the goal of raising \$155,000.

On the expense side, the Budget includes allocations for Religious Education, Armenian language education, youth groups, public relations, as well as the costs of administering the diocesan center, the St. Vartan Cathedral and Cultural Center. Many programs had to be cut because of financial considerations, according to George Mekenian, chairman of the budget committee.

Several proposals to amend the by-laws of the Armenian Church of America were offered by the various delegations. Most of them were rejected by the delegates, as was a proposal to appoint a committee to completely rewrite the bylaws of the Church. Sooren Gozmanian of St. John Church in Southfield, chairman of the Proposals Committee, presented the amendments.

On Saturday, several groups held meetings at the East Junior High School, including the Diocesan Language Lab, the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America, and the Ladies Auxiliaries.

In its final session on Saturday afternoon May 2, the Assembly paid tribute to two veteran members of the Diocesan Council who stepped down after many years of service: Judge John K. Najarian, member for the past eight; and Crosby Goshgarian, who has been a member of the Council for 16 years, and served as chairman for six. The Assembly also commended for their services two other outgoing members of the Council, Fr. Houseig Bagdasian and George Stevoff, who did not run for reelection.

Very Rev. Arshen Ayvazian of Holy Trinity Church in Cheltenham, Pa., was realsoted to a four-year term on the Diocesan Council. The other newly ellected members are: Rev. Karekin Kasparian of St. James Church in Westchester, Edward Berberian of St. James Church in Watertown, Sarkis Bedevian of St. Leon Church in Fair Lawn, and Zarvin Kasparian of the Church of our Saviour in Worcester. Continuing their terms on the Council are Rev. Mampre Kouzouian, Very Rev. Paren Avedikian, Louise Simone, and Crosby Kazarian.

Col. George Juskalian from our Parish was reelected as a Trustee on Diocesan Board of Trustees.

In one of the lest items on the agenda of the meeting, the delegates accepted the invitation from the Holy Ressurection Church in New Britain, Connecticut to host the 80th Diocesan Assembly in 1982.

The 79th Assembly of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America came to a close at 6:00 p.m., Saturday, May, 1981.

Besides representing our church as a Diocesan Delegate, T was once invited to our Parish Council meeting before the Diocesan Assembly meeting to be informed of all the issues pertaining to Armenian Apostolic Church, Eastern Diocesa.

Also, on June 25, 1981, I was invited to be present at a meeting concerning the Armenian Church Endowment Fund presented by Col. Victor Arzoumanian of 12 invitees only one person besides me was present. A second invitation for the Church Endowment Fund was called on, but I would not make it due to a previous engagement.

ST. MARY'S ARMENTAN SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORT

As you are all aware, we have drastically altered the schedule of the Armenian School from the Saturday classes of recent years. The survey of parents conducted by the Educational Planning Committee showed an overwhelming preference for a Sunday program both for religious and language instruction. There was a strong desire to come to the Church only once a week. So after much discussion and planning, we are experimenting with an abbreviated curriculum running from 12:30 to 2:15 PM which retains formal classroom instruction in language but omits crafts and some of the cultural program.

Judging from the number of students, the new schedule is a Fifty students are officially enrolled; of these, about success. thirty five attend reliably. For these students, there are seven classroom teachers in addition to the Principal, Yeretzgin, who teaches Assembly. We have been able to divide the students into seven corresponding grade levels, including an adult class, in order to create learning groups with students of comparable skill.

It has become a virtual cliche in reports such as this to express thanks to the many people who have contributed to the success of the Armenian School. But how else does one acknowledge the extraordinary and widespread support that the School enjoys? When I think of all the good deeds that have been done during the past twelve months, I feel frustrated over the weakness of these public thanks and I worry that I will omit someone whose work has been essential.

Nevertheless, I will try to do the subject justice by mentioning the following individuals and groups:

Yeretzgin, for her typically indefatigable exertions in planning and teaching both Armenian and Sunday Schools;

our teachers, for maintaining the discipline needed to follow a serious course of instruction while given severely limited time;

The Educational Planning Committee for patiently surveying and

evaluating the educational needs of this community;

the Sunday School Staff and Committee, especially its Chairman Joseph Vartabedian, for conscientiously working with the Armenian School to allow a much-enlarged Sunday program;

the Parish Council and its Chairman, Edward Onanian, for helping the Armenian School set itself up in its new quarters and for

assurance of financial support if needed;

the Snack Ladies who prepare a nutritious meal for our students to tide them over until the end of school;

the many parents and non-parents who have given their financial support to allow us to keep down tuition costs;

the Ladies Guild who prepared our Christmas Hantess dinner, then

made a very generous donation; and

the parents who bring our students to School each Sunday, who watch to see that homework is complete and who make sure that their children develop a serious attitude to the work we all share. Thanks.

Karekin Kasparian on Armenian Church History. Around the same time, we were active in the Dedication Services for our new building. At this time, we would like to again congratulate Mr. Arto Hovanessian who received the rank of "stole bearer" from Achbp. Manoogian on Dedication Sunday.

We are happy to hear that the Parish Council will place a plaque on or near the organ in memory of our former choir director the late Mr. Edvart Sourian, whose guidance and perseverance can never be duplicated.

For the 3rd year in a row, our choir has set the Christian tradition of travelling to Baltimore to celebrate the Birth of our Lord with the Baltimore Armenian Community, who are not as fortunate as we are to have a local Armenian Church. This year, we rented a 15-passenger van that carried all of us together. We sang folk songs and enjoyed the trip.

. All in all, we have experienced a memorable year and without the support of every member, it could not have been possible. At this time, we would like to thank the Altar Servers: Ashod Krikorian, Gary Avedikian, Simon Kumkumian, Yenovk Pashalian, Levon Andonian, Greg Kumkumian, Arto Hovanessian, Vatche Tamazian, and David Andonian. We also thank Dr. Hratch Semerjian, whose valuable and dedicated services as our acting-choirmaster cannot be numbered. Without his services (and patience) our choir would not have been so successful. We are still looking for a full-time choir director, however. Also, thanks to Secretary/Acting Chairman Mrs. Queenie Avedikian and Treasurer Mrs. Clara Andonian who have kept the strings tied. Finally, thanks to the choir members, whose dedication and continued service and support throughout, made this year profitable and enjoyable. Looking forward to enother enjoyable and good year!

BUILDING FUND COMMITTEE REPORT

Calendar Year 1981

We are pleased to report that the flow of pleages and donations which began in 1979 continued through 1981 and, combined with income from other sources, helped us meet most of the costs incurred to date in the construction of our building addition. That's the good news. The other side of the story is that our appeal for support must continue in order to permit repayment of a construction loan and to finance the renovation of our kitchen and the old hall.

Pledge payments and donations in 1981 amounted to \$51,000. In many instances, parishioners who had met 3-year pledges made earlier in the campaign increased their pledges, with payment of these additions promised for 1982 and 1983. As a result of new pledge activity, the amount of receivable pledges at year's end is \$41,980, compared to \$44.581 at the beginning of 1981.

In addition to pledges and donations, the Committee received \$2,700 as contributions in lieu of flowers. We received also our share of the Bazaar income for both 1980 and 1981. Interest income was nearly \$6,000, most of which was realized early in the year. In December, \$5,000 was transferred to the Building Committee from the Parish Council's contingency reserve to take advantage of the high interest rates available through our money market fund.

Fund raising efforts during the year included a dinner in February, a film showing in April, a telethon in May, and the dedication banquet in October. The net receipts from these activities amounted to \$2,200; the contributions and pledges received through these efforts are included in the totals cited earlier.

In order to complete construction, we found it necessary to negotiate a 4-year loan of up to \$50,000 at a rate of interest 2 points greater than the prime rate. We have borrowed \$29,600 to date, but have made four monthly payments on the loan. Accordingly, at year's end, our loan balance stands at \$25,453.

Construction costs during the year amounted to \$175,000. In addition, nearly \$2,000 was expended for furnishings including 125 folding tablet chairs; 48 folding chairs; 6 blackboards; 2 coat racks; a conference table; and table and chair caddies. In addition, furniture for Der Hayr's and the secretary's offices was delivered, for which payment will be made in 1982.

The Committee continued to meet the monthly mortgage payments of \$390.35 on the parish house. In connection with the house also, this was the year during which the major appliances decided to die.

During the summer, we found it necessary to replace the dishwasher and the clothes washer and dryer. In December, we made arrangements, including payment, for replacement of the furnace, humidifier, and water heater. As we have noted in other years, the Committee plans to direct its share of each year's Bazaar proceeds toward meeting the mortgage payments and any major expenses arising at the house.

In our report for 1980, we stated that "our goal is to raise by the end of 1983 the funds necessary for the construction of the new building and the planned expansion of our social hall and kitchen." Your generous support to date has brought us a long way toward attainment of this goal. With your continued support, it will be realized.
