Vertanes Kalayjian the following were part of the profile of the Parish:

- •The Parish includes the Maryland and Virginia suburbs and Baltimore community in addition to Washington proper. The Armenian population grew to approximately 8,000.
- •Baltimore City and the surrounding suburban Armenians organized an Assoc. of Baltimore Armenians. Periodic Church services are conducted in a local host church by the Pastor of St. Mary's Arm. Church with a contingent of the Church Choir participating. The Baltimore Armenian Community numbers approximately100 families, they have a Woman's Guild and Sat. Armenian School with active social and cultural programs.
- •St. Mary's dues paying/voting membership has increased from 110 to 275.
- •A building attached to the church was built to accommodate classrooms and office space and library. Over 350 thousand was spent without a mortgage.
- •Over 600 Thousand was raised and contributed to the earthquake relief over 4-year period.

- •The Parish Celebrated the 25th Anniversary of the Pastor Rev. Vertanes Kalayjian ordination to priesthood. With a pontifical Encyclical he was given the honor of Avak/Archpriest and to wear the pictoral cross.
