Approaching merchants to donate merchandise for sale at the Bazaar in return for publicity. Utilization of the several rooms of the Diocesan Complex for exhibits, sales and rug auctions. Approaching City Government and induce it to attend our Anniversary Celebrations.

Mrs. Agababian and Dr. Ordjanian advised the Chairmen of the various Committees who were present at this Meeting to arrange for and hold their own separate Meetings to resolve their individual problems and come to their own conclusions. They assured the Committees that they will have the full and complete cooperation and assistance of the Executive Committee.

Meeting was called to order at 6:15 pm by Alice Antreassian.

Members present: Co-Chairmen of Grand Bazaar, Mrs. Lily Agababian, Dr. Nikit Ordjanian; and especially invited to this first meeting Floraine Halejian, Mary Pernice, Lily Ajemian, Isabel Kay (who brought with her the minutes, except those notes of the Food Committee, from the last Cathedral Bazaar held in 1969) and Frank Zotian, all of whom in the aggregate represented the Management Committee of the Cathedral and/or had been active in previous bazaars, either in their respective churches or for the Cathedral.

Following items were on the agenda for discussion which followed:

- 1. Saturday night's dinner
- 2. Sunday afternoon dinner

- 3. Problem of a la carte food being served all day Saturday and all day Sunday.
- 4. Who will prepare the food, and how much, by each church.

Item 1.

Menu will be filet mignon; rice pilaf (or baked potato); string beans; salad (served from a wheeling cart possibly);dessert (ditto), and coffee - all for \$7.50 "Saturday Night Special" Following problems were raised and solved:

Supply of ice - no problem since no drinks would be served; soda is delivered in coolers.

china would not be used; Holy Martyrs Church had used plasticware at their bazaar which was durab le and good-looking. Mrs. Pernice would come to next meeting with necessary information

Supply of carts - Mr. Zotian would check into this, as well as

Maintenance -

 a special section for dinner guests would b e roped off possibly; each diner would receive a ticket which will be picked up by waitress. This would be discussed again when decorations committee finalizes their layout of auditorium. Mr. Zotian stated that necessary number of men would be on duty both days to do heavy work and constant clean-up.

Item 2.

Menuwill be shish kebab, bulghur pilaf, peppers/onions; dessert/coffee all for \$4.00. Mr. Zotian thought shish kebab could be cooked in garage, using St. Gregory's machines plus another church's. Mr. Turekian would be consulted on this. Suggestion was made that Mr. Peter Ajemian who has been active on the Jersey Dzeranotz picnics be contacted for helpful information. Mrs. Pernice suggested that meat be purchased already cut up and delivered in plastic containers. Their experience showed this was the best method - they paid 89¢ per lb Suggestion was made that the St. Thomas Men's Club be asked to marinate meat.

#### Item 3.

The Saturday dinner would be served commencing 6:00 pm. Quantity to be purchased and prepared will be resolved the week before. Sunday's dinner would be served immediately following church services. Both days, commencing with 12 noon, a la carte food will be sold to be eaten there or taken home. Suggestion was made that clear plastic boxes be used to prepare in advance all dessert and other non-perishable food items. Suggestion was made that the same boxes be used to prepare mezzeh plates in advance and sell them for \$3.00 ea.

#### Item 4.

It was finally decided that each church would be given a quota of food items to make, of those foods which are most popular, and that, where possible, they adhere to it. Other food items will be at their own discretion. Also, that they be asked to donate the food, but if this is not possible, then the Bazaar Committee would reimburse them. The committee proceeded to allocate quantities to the churches based on their expertise and size. The forms would go out to the chairladies along with an invitation to attend the next meeting or send a representative. Much assistance will be needed from all churches for the 2-day bazaar and the food preparation necessary beforehand for the two dinners. Suggestion was made that personal representation be made at the various church meetings to get firm commitments. Also that committees such as the ACYOA (possible waiters,waitresses?), the Men's Clubs (marinating of meat, etc.) be asked to come to the meeting also.

The request was made by the committee that in addition to the respective chairladies/chairmen of all the church committees, that Mrs. Arax Kirishjian of the Cathedral Guild be asked to attend, as well as Mr. Vartkes Turekian and his wife, Siran. It was noted that Siran would make an ideal Hostess for both days, taking charge of the waiters, overseeing the clearing of tables, etc. Notices for next meeting will be sent to all mentioned.

Meeting date for next meeting was set for Tuesday, at 7 pm, at the Diocese, February 27. Meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.

# MINUTES OF Second Meeting of Food Committee held Tuesday, February 27, 1973 at Diocese

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Alice Antreassian.

List of members present is attached.

Mary Pernice read minutes of previous meeting; minutes accepted as read.

Mr. Zotian stated it would be too expensive to get additional carts, and that the 8 we had would be sufficient. A week before Bazaar weekend, he will determine number of clean-up men to have on hand for the 2 days. Mary Pernice reported on the plastic plates -- 500 would cost \$15, and she will make further inquiry on delivery time.

A. Antreassian gave report on Emerson picnic quantities. They use 1,000 lbs of meat, 200 lbs of rice, and order additional pastries from Mendik's of New Jersey. Shish-kebob machine would be borrowed from Flushing Dzeranotz in addition to the St. Gregory one.

Discussion followed on serving time of dinner for Saturday night and Sunday. It was decided to have 2 seatings for Saturday because of limited space (250 for dinner at one time) -- one at 6 and one at 7:30 pm. On Sunday, shish-kebob would be served from 12 noon until 5. Mr. Turekian will order the filet mignon and lamb from his usual source, Hagopian Bros.

Allocation of food to be made was then discussed. Mrs. Kuzujian asked that the allotment of kharpert kufteh (1,000) be eliminated from St. Gregory and instead their ladies would prepare the food in the kitchen both days. This was accepted by members. L. Agababian suggested other churches take on additional kufteh. M. Pernice agreed to take additional 250 for Holy Martyrs Bayside allotment. Holy Cross Washington Heights would be asked to take additional 250 also. St. Leon's Church has agreed to underwrite all their food expense.

Mrs. Kirishjian will check into refrigeration problem - calling companies and submitting report to chairman within 2 weeks.

500 dozen lahmajun will be ordered. L. Agababian said all food should be in Diocese before Friday.

Rough outline of floor plan was shown to committee. Mrs. Yardum said there must be area where tickets are sold; no money should be used for sale Dr. Ordjanian invited committee to attend March 7 meeting where complete floor plans would be shown.

Floraine Halejian will be asked to contact ACYOA members for waitresses/ waiters, 17 -22 years old. Mrs. Turekian will contact Decorations Committee F. Zotian suggested buffet food, a la carte, be sold until 6 pm, and that after that only the filet mignon dinner will be served. On Sunday, both the shish-kebob dinner and a la carte food will be sold simultaneously. Committee agreed. V. Parseghian suggested the dinner on Sunday be cafeteris style - one ticket for one serving. Donations were then discussed. D. Boyajian suggested receipts from Diocese be given for tax deduction to those companies donating large amounts. Mrs. Kirishjian will write to Columbo for cheese, etc. donation. Mrs. Agababian suggested that personal contact be made by individual who is familiar with someone in company. Mrs. Bedrosian announced she would like to make a \$100 donation towards expense of salad greens for the dinner, or wherever the Committee wished to use it. Committee accepted her generous donation. A. Antreassian will speak to Jimmy Yacoobian (St. Gregory Parish Council chairman) an in-law of the Golden Cow people for donation of pasterma or sujuk.

F. Zotian stated waiters should be given a free dinner that night. T. Dabakian suggested lahmajun. Tabled for next meeting.

Dr. Ordjanian told committee that booths would all bear names. Mrs. Parseghian suggested a simple floor plan be available for each person attending Bazaar to facilitate their finding the booths.

Ann Hovsepian volunteered to help with sending flyers out when necessary. Flyers will contain the hours of both seatings for Filet Mignon Dinner and list the a la carte items available on both days.

Next meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 27, at 7 p.m. in Council Room of Diocese.

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned at 10 p.m.

# MINUTES OF Third Meeting of Food Committee Tuesday, March 27, 1973 at Diocese

Meeting was called to order at 7:45 pm by Chairman. List of members present is appended hereto.

Secretary Dickie Boyajian read minutes of previous meeting. Motion made to accept minutes as read and corrected; motion seconded.

Welcome extended to members of Holy Cross (N.Y.) parish who were attending for first time. Zaven Demirjian (its Council vice-chairman) questioned allotment of food donations by individual churches. This was answered. He then announced that Holy Cross Ladies would donate pagharch and boorma for Bazaar. Unfinished item from previous meeting was resolved - waiters helping on Saturday night would not be given a free filet mignon dinner.

### Following reports were given:

- Vartkes Turekian: St. Gregory has its own shish kebob machine; one machine would have to be borrowed -- from Holy Martyrs. Office Juck would take care of this would take care of this.
  - -Vote taken by committee on number of pounds of shish kebob to purchase = 1,200 pounds.
  - -He requested help for Thursday and Friday to cut the filet mignon and prepare kebob. Frank Zotian suggested getting one man from due each church. Mr. Davidian volunteered and would try to bring someone with him. Lily Agababian would contact Mark Markarian of Holy Martyrs. Chairman would contact churches.
  - -Ten men would be needed for Sunday to help in skewering and cooking. Bette Yardum suggested letters go to Men's Leagues and M/M groups. Chairman will contact.

-Announced that St. Gregory ladies would donate all food they were preparing for the Bazaar.

#### Lily Ajemian:

- Questioned distribution of Filet Mignon dinmer tickets. Decision made by committee that set number of tickets would be sent to each parish council chairman for distribution by him. Lily Ajemian would receive all ticket reports and monies.
- TAt least 10 bus boys would be needed. Chairman to contact ACYOAs and youth groups of churches.
- "Checked on hostesses: Siran Turekian; Mary Kuzujian; Yevkine Kalajian Floraine Halejian.
- -Who will serve dinner: St.Gregory ladies will dish out food onto plates; men waiters will serve to dinner guests.

Page 2. 2 Lily Ajemian (continued) -Will need 4-6 girls to help in setting up tables for 7 pm dinner; then to clear and reset for 8:30 setting. Chairman supplied her 4 people. they are to report to her that night no later than 6 pm. Araksi Kirishjian volunteered to get two more to help her. 2 Mary Pernice: -They will order the plastic dishes and cups for kebob dinner. - Will need bus boys for Sunday - about 10. -Sarah Kapikian will help her and Bette Yardum. -Lily Agababian will see about setting up tables on Plaza in the afternoon for shish kebob dinner there. Araksi Kirishjian: -Donation received from Kayseri Basterma of 25 lbs. Committee voted to purchase additional 100 lbs at \$3.25 per lb. Chairman to send letter confirming this, and subsequent delivery to Diocese. -Protestant Minister, Rev. Sulahian, agreed to let us use their refrigerator for Bazaar week. -Diocese would followup with Evyan president regarding old St.Gregory TK mefrigerator; if repairs negligible, we would use. -Letter to be sent by Chairman to Evyan requesting donation of perfume. > Fourth Meeting of Food Committee Tuesday, April 25, 1973, at Diocese

Meeting was called to order at 7:50 by Chairman. Members present were: Floraine Halejian, Mary Pernice, Sarah Kapikian, Anne Hovsepian, Anne Kondrajian, David Davidian, M/M Vartkes and Siran Turekian, Lily Ajemian, Rose Dinkjian, Dickie Boyajian, Zaven Demirdjian, Alice Antreassian, and co-chairmen of Bazaar, Lily Agababian and Dr. Nikit Ordjanian. Secretary read minutes of previous meeting. Motion made to accept minutes as read; motion seconded.

Items discussed and their resolution:

Assistants to cut meat Thursday and Friday evenings: Mr. Davidian will come Thursday evening and bring an assistant with him; Simon Eksouzian (Alice's brother) will come Thursday. Lily Agababian said Mark Markarian will come Thursday, and Friday night if needed. She will also ask him to assist Vartkes on Sunday. Mary Pernice had commitments from 10 men from Holy Martyrs to help with shish kebob on Sunday, in 3-hour shifts. A.Antreassian will contact churches directly for help in cutting meat Friday night.

- Tablecloths linen ones will be used for Filet Mignon dinner, and the Decorations Committee is taking care of this; paper ones will be used on Sunday and on Saturday before the dinner.
- Followup on churches' donations: Sarah Kapikian volunteered to take care of New York churches; Rose Dinkjian, of New Jersey churches.
- Price of shish-kebob dinner: After lengthy discussion, it was decided to make it a shish kebob plate at \$4.00, which will not include dessert and coffee, as originally decided. This was brought up because of the skyrocketing food prices.
