PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In consideration of the criticism about the length of our annual membership meetings your Parish Council this year has decided to present a general summary of the reports of its various auxiliary organizations and committees together with the Council's annual report.

If any member wishes to have more detailed information about any subject such information will be made available to the meeting through the responsible parties.

I wish to remind you that as members in good standing of our Church, it is not only your right to question and criticize the activities and the decisions of your Parish Council and its auxiliary bodies but it is also your duty to do so without any consideration as to your personal relationships with the persons involved. Those of us who have accepted responsible positions to serve our Church must also be aware that our decisions can always be subject to the criticism of the members who have elected us. It is through such constructive criticism that past mistakes can be corrected and/or future ones can be avoided.

<u>MEETINGS</u>: The Parish Council met 20 times since taking office and each meeting started promptly at 8:30 p.m. and lasted about for two hours. Compared to previous years and due to the co-operation of the members, a considerable amount of meeting-time was saved and none of the questions discussed were left undecided.

SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLY: In order to keep in close touch and consult the members, the Parish Council tried to organize Special Parish Assemblies every three months. On the 23rd March and 22nd June, two such Special Meetings were held but the attendance proved to be very discouraging for holding further such meetings.

EASTER MASS: For the better accommodation of the worshippers in 1969 the Easter Mass was celebrated, with the permission of the Primate, in this Hall. Your Parish Council needs your comments on this decision for their future guidance.

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24TH APRIL: As usual the commemorative meeting for our martyrs was organized under the auspices of our Church with the participation of the Armenian Evangelical Church, the Armenian General Benevolent Union and the Armenian Revolutionary Federation.

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VISIT TO H.O.M.: The Parish Council Chairman was invited to attend the 59th anniversary meeting of the H.O.M. (High Oknutyan Miutyun). I was instructed by the Parish Council to accept the invitation and attend the meeting which I did.

<u>COMMEMORATIVE PLATE</u>: After a lapse of about ten years of His Holiness Catholicos Vasken First's visit to our Church finally in 1969 a plate was installed in our Church commemorating this visit. The Parish Council thanks Mr. N. Alexanian for the donation of this plate.

<u>CUFFLINKS</u>: According to a local custom every year cufflinks are donated by the Parish Council members to the retiring members of the Council in appreciation of their services. Somehow this custom was neglected within the past few years and in the Special Parish Assembly of the 23rd March, cufflinks were distributed to those members who had served the Council since 1965 and were present at that meeting.

FINANCIAL: The attached statements certified by your auditors present our financial position. As your Parish Council, we feel proud that for the first time, since the building of this hall, we now have **1** surplus of about \$11,400. We would even have shown a much higher surplus had it not been for certain repairs which had been deferred during the past years which we had to take care of in 1969. However, I must warn you that this surplus should not discourage our potential donors by leading them to think that our Church is no longer in need of their help. The fact of the matter is that this surplus is far from being adequate as a Reserve Fundh which we desparately need, in an expanding community such as ours, for our future investments.

<u>CHURCH SERVICES</u>: Every Sunday, except on two occasions, when Rev. Tashjian was away for the ACYOA convention in March and for the Diocesan Assembly in May, High Mass was celebrated in our Church. And on the Sunday of the 16th of November our Primate the Most Rev. Bishop Torkom Manougiar was the celebrant priest.

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During the year, ceremonies were performed for 31 Baptisms, 23 Marriages, 16 Burials and for requiem mass for 59 families.

As this is the end of my term, I would like to express my thanks to our Suffragan Eishop, The Most Rev. Vache Hovsepian, to Rev. Tashjian and to all my colleagues in the Parish Council for their help and co-operation in theperformance of my duties. I would especially also like to thank Mr. J. Yeretsian who proved himself to be a very exceptional Secretary. And due to the secretarial and technical help which was accorded to us through Mr. Horasan's office, I can say that we have been able to keep the most accurate minutes of Parish Council meetings as compared to any previous year.

The Parish Council would also like to thank Mr. Y. Boyajian for his services which have always proved to be beyond the call of duty.

In 1969, the Choir Master, Mr. Minas Selian retired after serving the Church Choir for 10 years. At the Convention of the Diocesan Church Choir the Primcte the Most Rev. Bishop Manougian and the Parish Council Chairman, thanked Mr. Minas Selian for his services.

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It is desirable that those of us who wish to sing in Church should first consider to become registered members of the Church Choir in order to secure and preserve unity and uniformity.

MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE

It is preferable to have a Committee under this name but in 1969 the Parish Council did not feel the need to form such a Committee because Mr. Victor Catchick's professional guidance was considered sufficient.

The pkeep and the repair of our Church had to be neglected for the past few years because the Church was in debt. However, in 1968 after the successful settlement of an insurance claim not only was the debt paid off, but the necessary maintenance work started which incessantly continued in 1969. In 1969, alone the cost of such repairs was approximately over \$2,000.00.

Mr. V. Catchick has been very helpful in guiding and advising us and providing the necessary workmen and checking the results. The Farish Council is very grateful to Mr. V. Cachick.

PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE

Considering that during the past Assemblies, there has been a demand to establish a Public Relations Committee, Dr. N. Cehlanli and Mr. A. Cavouk were asked to consider the possibility of forming such a Committee but no activities were reported.

IMMIGRATION COMMITTEE

Mr. G. Elmassian was asked to organize a Committee with the object of helping the newcomers but no activities were reported.

PROJECT 1980 COMMITTEE

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This Committee was formed under the Chairmanship of Mr. G. Elmassian with the object of studying the long term policy or the needs of our Church in this expanding community. This Committee had three meetings and in the last meeting it was decided, for the time being, to help the A.G.E.U. School Building project but no activities were reported in this respect.

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I submit that this Committee be considered one of the most important Committees of our Church and in the event of its not functioning properly that it be re-organized.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

This Committee was set-up by Dr. N. Ceylanli, Mr. G. Elmassian and Mr. V. Bedrossian for finding and registering new members to our Church. No activities were reported by the committee; but through the individual efforts of Rev. Tashjian, the number of our members was raised from 232 to 255.

We must admit that compared to the total Armenian population in our city this number is very low. This Committee must be re-organized and efforts must be made to make it clear to certain people that paying annual dues to our Church is like paying Income Tax to our Federal Government. If we need a Church, we must be willing to support it and never condescend to benefit from the services of a Church which is being supported by others.

DELEGATES

Mr. J. Pederian, Mr. A. Cavouk and Mr. H. Selian were elected as delegates to our Diocesan Assembly in 1968 for a term of 4 years. Unfortunately, only Mr. J. Pederian as a delegate and myself as the Parish Council Chairman attended the 1969 Diocesan Assembly. The proceedings of the Assembly were extensively reported in the "High Yegeghetzi " to which you are all subscribers. There is no decision to report which specifically concerns our Church.

It is desirable that our Church be properly represented in the Diocesan Assembly. In future, those who do not have the intention of performing their duties should not declare themselves candidates not only for this but for any other position in any other Committee. This is a most elementary principle for the proper functioning of an organization. No force can be exerted on any one to work but where there is no intention or willingness, the chance must be given to those who may wish to work.

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VISIT TO ETCHMIADZIN

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Among the great number of tourists who visited Soviet Armenia in 1969 on the occasion of "Mironortnuyun", our Parish was fortunate to have Mr. A. Cavouk and Mr. J. Pederian as dolegates.

CHURCH HOSPITALITY

Mr. J. Pederian who was in charge of this function every Sunday did his best and meticulously performed his duty in organizing the plate collections and in securing an atmosphere of orderliness for the worshippers.

CIRCULARS

The job of printing and mailing our circulars has been taken care of voluntarily by Rev. Tashjian in addition to his clergical responsibilities.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Mr. Y. Boyadjian, Mr. A. Cavouk, Mr. V. Vartanian, Mr. A. Baltayan and Mr. J. Civajian (resigned) are the members of this Committee. They have been requested to find candidates for:

a) Parish Council membership

b) Auditors

c) Next Assembly's Nominating Committee

The Committee will directly report to this Assembly.

AUDITORS

Dr. N. Ceylanli, Dr. M. Sakarya and Wr. M. Artinian were elected as auditors in our last year's Assembly. The books of the Parish Council and the auxiliary bodies were submitted to their examination. The Parish Council will approach with an open mind any suggestion that the auditors may present to this Assembly. I submit, with all due respect to the present auditors that in future, auditors be preferably elected from amongst those members who are professional accountants or bookkeepers.

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AUDITORS (Cont'd.)

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I also suggest that one of the auditors provide professional guidance to our Treasurer, during the year, so that our accounts may be kept in accordance with the accepted accounting principles.

CONCLUDING REMARKS:

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In 1969, we tried to establish an organizational structure through various committees. Some of these committees, as it is obvious from this report, need to be re-organized.

However, the structure must be solidly established: first, because it is more democratic; secondly, because by making members participate in the management of their Church affairs we make them more attached to the Church.

For the better involvement of the remaining passive members, we must encourage their constructive criticism.

I wish the very best of luck and success to my successor in 1970.
