Archbishop Calfayan was born in Izmir, Turkey, in 1893. He was educated in Christian Brothers schools in Turkey and Port Said, Egypt. He was ordained on June 10, 1923 by the late Elise Tourian, patriarch of Jerusalem. He served as pastor of St. Nicholas Convent Palestine and, in 1925, was appointed primate of the Marseilles, France, Church, He became pastor of the Union City Church in 1927 and served as acting primate from 1933 to 1939.

He first came to Paterson, N. J. in 1929 and served as pastor until 1941. On Oct. 5, 1941 he consecrated the present church which he was largely responsible for establishing. He returned to the Paterson parish in the fall of 1952. From 1942 to 1948, he served as primate

of the California diocese. The St. Gregory's First Class

Medal was awarded to Archbishop Calfayan in 1935 by Catholicos Khoren I at Etchmiadzin for his outstanding service to the church. In the same year he was consecrated bishop and elevated to arch-bishop in 1945.

One of the first to realize the importance of the youth in the Church in this country, Archbishop Calfayan organized the Sons and Daughters of the Armenian Church in the 1930's and the Young Couple's Clubs after World War II.

### CHURCH AT FALLS PLANS SERVICES TO HONOR SAINT

Battle Fought 1,500 Years Ago to Be Commemorated at St. Sarkis

St. Vardan will be honored at the divine liturgy and special services in St. Sarkis Armenian Church, Ninth and E. Falls Sts., tomorrow at 9:30 a.m., celebrating the first battle for Christianity by any nation in history. The Rev. Khoren Mamigonian will officiate.

Known in Armenian history as "The Battle of Vardan," after the young Armenian nobleman who led the Christian forces, the battle fought in 451 A. D., is commem-orated by both Orthodox and Protestant Armenians throughout the

Leo Dardarian Sr., of the parish council, will act as chairman of the evening celebration in the church hall beginning at 7 o'clock.

"We are proud to celebrate this significant event in Armenian history which occurred over 1,500 years ago," said Mr. Dardarian. The battle has been credited with preserving Christianity in the Near East and Middle East. It also has a cultural significance for Armenians, since it is one of three major events, all occurring within 150 years 15 centuries ago, that many Armenians believed produced the Armenian individuality which has persisted for 1,500 years despite numerous persecutions against their religion.'

"The three events," Mr. Dardarian said, "were the adoption of Christianity as a national religion in 303, the invention of the Armenian alphabet and the resulting literary movement, including translation of the Bible into Armenian, and the battle of Vardan."
"The battle actually was a mili-


Dorothy L. Fettes and Republican-Liberal John M. Kilencki had won over Jarvis in the 22nd district by five votes.


