#### ARMENIAN COLLEGE OPEN HOUSE

Primate of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America

**PROPOSAL:** To organize a program for New York area college students at the Diocese, in which they meet once a month to discuss Armenian and college issues.

- 1) The official title of this program will be "Armenian College Open House."
- 2) The proposed beginning of the program would be February 6, 1991 and the program would continue once every month until May, 1991, thus ending the spring semester. It would be a Wednesday night event from 7:30 11:00 in "G" Hall at the Diocese.
- 3) The four months would serve as a trial period to see if the program is successful and worthy of continuance. Success is based on the number of students who attend and the increased popularity over the four months.
- 4) The evening would begin with a reception and buffet dinner 7:30-9:00. Group discussion and lecture 9:00-10:00. Music 10:00-11:00.
- 5) Prior to February 6, a number of New York area colleges will be contacted with special emphasis on Armenian clubs. Background of the program will be given with a follow up outline of the details of the program.

## Rationale of Project

- 1) There are many Armenian students attending colleges in the New York area. Some belong to Armenian clubs, some attend church and many do neither. A program like this gives Armenian students the opportunity to interact with other Armenian students from different schools.
- 2) Through interaction new ideas and current situations of the Armenian youth on and off campus can be developed, analyzed and improved upon.
- 3) Bringing Armenian youth together in a religious atmosphere is also seen as a positive attribute of this project.
